## 700,000 Jews to Get Work in Russia Through New Jewish Five-Year Plan

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Moscow, Dec. 8.—Nearly 700,000 more Jews in Russia will find employment on the land, in factories, in the government service or as subsidized students, according to a new five year plan for the Jews announced here today by the Comzet, government department for settling the Jews on the land and establishing them in industry.

According to the plan 135,000 Jewish youths will join Soviet industrial enterprises in the next three years in addition to the 30,000 Jewish students now supported by the government. The number of subsidized students will be increased to 65,000. The plan also provides for 55,000 unemployed Jews and for 20,000 of the estimated 27,000 small Jewish traders.

Fifty thousand Jewish artisans will be converted into factory workers by 1933 while 10,000 Jewish professional men will be required to take to productive physical labor. The total number of Jews to be converted into industrial laborers in the coming three years is 450,000, including 80,000 in heavy industry, 25,000 in building work, 6,000 railway workers and 11,000 in auto transport.

Aside from those to be taken into industrial work the plan provides for the appointment of 145,000 Jews in the government employ and 65,000 on the land. The number of Jewish artisans will be decreased to 66,000 because many of them are becoming industrial laborers.

The plan forecasts that the Jewish population of Russia will be 2,853,000 by the end of 1933.

## Hear Britain Has Agreed to White Paper Modifications

London, Dec. 8.—The British government has agreed to a number of modifications in the White Paper in the course of negotiations with the Jewish Agency, the Daily Telegraph reports. The paper says these modifications are aimed at appeasing the widespread resentment aroused among Jews over the White Paper. The negotiations are to be resumed shortly, the Telegraph says.

## Jewish, Arab Policemen Cited for Bravery in 1929 Riots

Jerusalem, Dec. 8.—Seventeen Arab policemen and eight Jewish policemen were cited today for bravery during the riots of 1929. They received the thanks of the High Commissioner. None of the Jews cited were connected with divisions outside of Jerusalem.

## American Heads Australia's First Reform Congregation

Melbourne, Dec. 8.—An American, Rabbi Jerome Mark, formerly of Selma, Alabama, today became the leader of the first Liberal Jewish congregation in Australia. Rabbi Mark had come to Australia at the behest of the World Union for Progressive Judaism. The new congregation was organized yesterday and Rabbi Mark named minister.

## Vaad Leumi Puts Off Elections of Asefat Hanivcharim to Jan. 15

Jerusalem, Dec. 8.—The Vaad Leumi today again postponed the elections of the Asefat Hanivcharim, the Jewish elected assembly, from December 15 to January 15 because of uncompleted negotiations between the Sephardic community and the farmers over separate ballots. The Asefat Hanivcharim is the body which elects the Vaad Leumi which in turn is entitled to one representative on the political committee of the World Zionist Organization.

Meanwhile the Polish-Jewish Federation has decided not to nominate an independent ticket. M. M. Ussishkin, head of the Jewish National Fund, will lead the General Zionists' ticket.

An abstract of the reply the British government submitted to the Jewish Agency regarding its protests against the new Palestine policy was debated at the Vaad Leumi meeting with Pinchas Rutenberg presiding. The Jewish Telegraphic Agency understands that the general sentiment of the Council is to reject the British reply as a basis for an understanding. At the same time the Council insists that Rutenberg go to London to aid in the Jewish Agency's negotiations with the British government.

Last week the Vaad Leumi adopted a resolution urging Rutenberg to go to London but he informed the Zionist Executive in London that he was not coming because the negotiations had been initiated without his approval.

## Warn Immigrants Not to Come to France Because of Crisis

Paris, Dec. 8.—A warning to immigrants who contemplate coming to France to give up their plans because of the existing crisis was framed in a resolution adopted at the congress of the League to Combat Anti-Semitism. There were 120 delegates in attendance. Bernard Lecache, prominent writer, was elected president of the League. Georges Pioch, Socialist leader, Shalom Schwarzbard, Pierre Parof and Marcel Kahn were named members of the executive in addition to the old-existing French committee.

## Roumanian Leader Advocates Separate Jewish Representative in the League of Nations

Bucharest, Dec. 8.—The Jews are entitled to their own representative in the League of Nations because despite their peculiar situation they form a distinct nation, says Dr. Constantin Stere, former leader of the Peasant Party in Bessarabia, writing in the current issue of the Curierul Israelite. Dr. Stere affirmed the need of Jewish political groups, especially in countries where they suffer persecution.

He appealed to the Jewish intellectuals to aid in the fight on anti-Semitism. Supporting Jewish minority rights he sees no difference between the Jews and other minorities except that the Jews do not form a compact territorial mass. He also advocated Jewish minority rights because of the special cultural interests of the Jews.

The Jews, he finds, are a valuable element for unity between minorities and majorities.

## Report Bentwich May Resign as Palestine Attorney-General

Jerusalem, Dec. 8.—The reported application by Norman Bentwich, attorney-general of Palestine who is now in London, for an extended leave of absence has given rise to rumors here that this is preliminary to his resignation. On the other hand it is said that the Colonial Office has requested him to remain in office in connection with pending legislation.

Ever since the riots of 1929, Bentwich has been under continual fire from the Arabs because he is a Jew. While the Shaw Commission was sitting, an attempt was made to assassinate him.

## Chintschuk, New Soviet Envoy to Germany, Orthodox Jew's Son

Berlin, Dec. 8.—Leo Chintschuk, the new Russian ambassador to Germany, who arrived here today to assume his duties, is the son of Orthodox parents. Born in Poltava in 1868 he was excluded from the gymnasium because of his political activities and all of his endeavors to obtain admission to a secondary school failed because he was a Jew.

He then went to Berne, Switzerland, where he studied at the university, returning to Russia in 1893. He was arrested and exiled to Siberia. During the Bolshevik revolution Chintschuk became a Menshevik and took a keen interest in Jewish affairs. Later, however, he joined the Bolsheviks.

## Freiberg Gets High Legal

### Post in Cincinnati

Cincinnati, Dec. 8.—Leonard H. Freiberg, president of District Grand Lodge No. 2, International Order of B'nai B'rith, has just been appointed special assistant in charge of the civil division by Robert H. Gorman, Hamilton County prosecuting attorney-elect.

Freiberg is chairman of the investigating committee of the Cincinnati Bar Association and has been vigilant in maintaining the high standards among attorneys here. He was Democratic candidate for prosecuting attorney in 1926 but lost.

## Dedicate \$100,000 Franks

### Memorial House in Chicago

Chicago, Dec. 8.—The \$100,000 Robert E. Franks Memorial of the American Boys' Commonwealth of Chicago was dedicated today with elaborate ceremonies. The building, which will be conducted and controlled by the Young Men's Jewish Charities of Chicago, was erected to honor the memory of Robert E. Franks by his father, the late Jacob Franks.

Moses Levitan, chairman of the memorial committee of the Y.M.C.C., declared that the opening of this building in the heart of the Jewish section of Chicago's west side marks a forward step in boys' work in this city.

## Find 300 Arab Laborers

### in Country Illegally

Jerusalem, Dec. 8.—Following strenuous Jewish representations that more Arabs than Jews enter Palestine without passports, the police listed today nearly 300 Arabs from Haurana and other points in Transjordan who entered without permits and are employed at various enterprises in the country.

## Einstein to Receive J.N.F.

### Delegation on Steamer Friday

Professor Albert Einstein today radioed to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency from the S.S. Belgenland that he would receive a delegation representing the Jewish National Fund on board the steamer Friday morning. The Belgenland is due Thursday.

The Jewish National Fund, which is the land-buying instrument of the Jewish Agency, was recently criticized in the White Paper. The delegation that will wait on Professor Einstein will consist of Menachem M. Ussishkin, world president of the Jewish National Fund; Elias Epstein, secretary of the head office; Sol Lamport, treasurer of the Jewish National Fund of America; Emanuel Neumann, president of the Hebrew Trades Free Restaurant of America; and Isaac H. Rubin, secretary of the Jewish National Fund of America.

## National Avukah Convention

### in Boston, Dec. 25 to 28

Boston, Dec. 8.—The national Avukah convention will meet this year in this city, sessions beginning on Thursday, December 25, and extending for four days through Sunday, December 28. It is expected that large delegations from all over the country will attend the several events planned here by a committee headed by Morris Michelson, one of the national Avukah vice-presidents.

The plans include, in addition to the several convention sessions to take place at Temple Israel and Harvard University and discussion groups, an informal reception on Wednesday evening, Friday evening services, walking tours of historic Boston, Lexington, and Concord on Saturday and Sunday mornings, a formal dance at the University Club on Saturday evening, a reception to the honorary committee at the Hotel Statler on Sunday afternoon, and the convention climax on Sunday evening, a huge youth meeting, sponsored by the Boston Junior Hadassah organization, to which all the youth groups of the community are invited.

## Cooperation with Jews Means

### Less Government Aid, Arabs Told

Jerusalem, Dec. 8.—United action with the Jews will result in a reduction in the government's financial assistance to the Arabs, a district officer is reported to have told the Arab villagers who joined the Jewish settlers in the Emek in memorializing the authorities for assistance because of damages suffered from the plague of field mice.

The Davar, which reports the above incident, says that the government ignored the joint Arab-Jewish petition by arranging for seed and fodder loans in each village separately. The Davar asks who empowered the district officer to say what he did.

## Orange Planters Offer More

### Jobs With Wage Cuts

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Jerusalem, Dec. 8.—The orange planters at Petach-Tikvah and elsewhere have undertaken to assure the employment of a larger number of Jewish laborers in the orange groves if the Jewish Federation of Labor will agree to a reduction in the wage scale from four to three shillings daily, the Vaad Leumi was informed today.

It is pointed out, however, that the planters had formerly agreed to a cut of half a shilling daily, while the present proposal would make it impossible for the Jewish laborers to exist.

## Jewish Children of Chicago's

### West Side Get Free Meals

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

Chicago, Dec. 8.—So that Jewish children of the West Side may have the strength to study at school and so their fathers might have more courage and strength to search for work, the United Hebrew Trades Free Restaurant has inaugurated a plan whereby school children and their parents residing in the Lawndale neighborhood, are being fed three times a day.

Groups of children come there every morning with their school books under their arms and after having their breakfast, they depart for school. Their places are then taken by their parents. Old and young are seen in a constant line awaiting food there.

Fourteen Jewish labor organizations, affiliated with the American Federation of Labor, headed by Al Green, chairman of the United Hebrew Trades, are in charge of this free restaurant.

## U. of Chicago Gets \$10,000

### from Jewish Organization

Chicago, Dec. 8.—The Chicago Philanthropic Club, an organization of Jewish organizations, each year will give \$10,000 to the cardiac clinic of the University of Chicago to aid in the treatment of heart diseases, it was announced today.

The women have organized an occupational therapy committee to obtain jobs for persons suffering from heart ailments. Another committee has been formed to teach needlework to women who are afflicted with the disease, to make them self-supporting.

## Sibulkin Heads Jewish

### Center at Port Chester

Port Chester, N. Y., Dec. 8.—Samuel Sibulkin, for the last two years director of the Jewish Center in Akron, Ohio, has just taken over similar duties at the local center. He has served in the Stuyvesant Neighborhood House in New York City; Jewish Social Service Bureau in Brooklyn, Jewish Big Brother Association in Cleveland, and in the Akron Center.

## Lipsky Honored by Jewish Leaders for Thirty Years of Work in Zionist Cause

At a testimonial dinner at the Hotel Astor, Sunday night, Louis Lipsky received his meed of praise for thirty years of service in the Zionist movement. Messages from colleagues in all parts of the world and speeches by those present contributed to the appreciation of his efforts.

### Numerous Tributes

President Hoover, Governor Franklin D. Roosevelt, Lt. Gov. Herbert H. Lehman, Senator Royal S. Copeland, Judge Otto A. Rosalsky, Col. Frederick Kisch, chairman of the Palestine Zionist Executive, Dr. Chaim Weizmann, Felix M. Warburg, Dr. Isaac Gruenbaum, president of the Polish Zionist Federation, Harry Sacher and Selig Brodetsky, English member of the World Zionist Executive, were among those who sent laudatory messages to the former president of the Zionist Organization of America, now honorary vice-chairman, in recognition of his influence in the cause of Zionism.

Bernard S. Deutsch, president of the American Jewish Congress and toastmaster, introduced the speakers. Dr. Richard Gottheil, Robert Szold, Jacob Fishman, Dr. S. Margoshes, Col. Francis R. Stoddard, Abraham Goldberg, Jonah I. Goldstein, Bernard A. Rosenblatt, Rabbi Israel Goldstein, Meyer Weisgal, and Mrs. Archibald Silverman, in reviewing their association with Mr. Lipsky, paid tribute to him.

Mr. Lipsky followed his acceptance of these tributes with an address covering his experiences of thirty years of participation in Jewish movements, and dwelled on the radical change in Jewish social and economic life in that time.

### Program of Cooperation

In regard to Palestine Mr. Lipsky, who is a member of the World Zionist Executive, outlined a program of cooperation between the Jewish people and Great Britain, which includes the following points: first, political and economic reconstitution of Transjordan as a part of Palestine; second, the Jewish Agency to be assigned jurisdiction over Jewish immigration and settlement, with full financial and moral responsibility, and under the general supervision of the Government; third, free purchase of land by Jewish people subject to liberal laws for protection of tenants; fourth, the unreserved acceptance of the Mandate as the constitutional basis of government in Palestine be the basis for eligibility of appointment of British civil servants in the Palestine administration; fifth, no form of legislation be considered that includes those elements of the population that refuse to accept the Mandate as such basis of government in Palestine; sixth, that grants-in-aid of Jewish education and health institutions be proportionate to the taxes paid by Jewish citizens of Palestine.

## Orthodox Jews Pray for White Paper's Withdrawal

Tel Aviv, Dec. 8.—Divine assistance was invoked today by the Orthodox Jews of this all-Jewish city to get the British government to rescind the recently issued White Paper. Praying in rotating day and night groups, a committee of Orthodox Jews is sitting in the main synagogue here reciting psalms and praying that the White Paper be torn up.

## 19 Anti-Semites Jailed for Suceava Outbreak

Czernowitz, Dec. 8.—Nineteen anti-Semitic agitators were given prison terms ranging from three to four months each today for their share in the anti-Jewish disturbances at Suceava last summer. Forty witnesses took the stand during the trial to testify that Jewish shops were attacked and plundered.

## Rabbi Teitelbaum, Mizrahi Leader, Reports on Palestine

Rabbi Aaron Teitelbaum, member of the World Mizrahi praesidium and member of the Jewish Agency, who recently returned from Palestine, in a lengthy report at a meeting of the administrative committee of the Mizrahi Organization of America, gave a survey of the present political situation in Zionism and the present conditions in Palestine.

He praised the courage shown by the entire Yishuv in the face of the recent White Paper. Rabbi Teitelbaum layed before the meeting of the administrative committee of the Mizrahi definite practical plans for immediate action for the upbuilding of Eretz Yisroel, which the committee accepted for consideration. In conclusion Rabbi Teitelbaum discussed the coming Zionist Congress and the stand of the Mizrahi at this Congress.

## Morgenthau's Son Named State Conservation Chief

Albany, Dec. 8.—Henry Morgenthau, Jr., son of the former American ambassador to Turkey, has been appointed State Conservation Commissioner by Governor Roosevelt. Mr. Morgenthau, who at present is the head of the Agricultural Advisory Commission, will succeed Alexander Macdonald as Conservation Commissioner. Mr. Morgenthau is the publisher of the American Agriculturist, a weekly with a large circulation in New York and adjacent states, and is the owner of a 1400-acre fruit and dairy farm in Dutchess County.

## Yiddish Theatres Close as Managers and Unions Fail to Reach Wage Agreement

All of the Yiddish theatres of Greater New York, nine in number, closed their doors on Sunday night for an indefinite period after their managers and representatives of the theatrical unions failed to agree on wage reductions which the managers demanded as a condition for keeping the theatres open. The closing of the Yiddish theatres affects 700 theatrical employees.

### Deadlock Reached

The negotiations reached a deadlock after the stagehands' and musicians' unions refused to accept any reduction in salaries of members employed in the Jewish theatres. Other theatrical employees, such as the actors, ushers, doormen and theatre staff workers, who are affiliated with the United Hebrew Trades, were willing to adopt an agreement, provided it would be acceptable to the musicians and stage hands.

On behalf of the theatrical managers, Maurice Schwartz, director of the Yiddish Art Theatre, after a conference held late Saturday night and early Sunday morning, issued the following statement.

### Text of Statement

"Present conditions made it necessary for us to cut our prices, and in order to do this we had to seek a general reduction of all wages in all departments of each house. We placed the matter before the various unions and made the situation clear. We went so far as to ask representatives of the unions to step into our box offices and see for themselves that it was impossible for us to operate under the present conditions.

"We asked for a 40 percent reduction that would enable us not only to meet our expenses but also would allow us to remain open. At the meeting last night the United Hebrew Trades offered to meet any proposition that the stagehands' union and the musicians' union might agree upon. The latter two unions, however, flatly refused to entertain any suggestion that would in any way entail the reduction of their present salaries. In view of this we have no choice left but to close our doors, as it would be cheaper to keep the theatres closed than to remain open under present conditions.

"Although we met terrific losses each week since the season opened three months ago, we continued to operate in order to keep faith with our public."

The nine Yiddish theatres which have closed are the Yiddish Art, Molly Picon, Public, National, Prospect, Hopkinson, Roland, Odeon and Lyric. It is said that only the Molly Picon Theatre has been able to make any profit during this season.

## Cuba Planning Immigration Restrictions Like Those of U.S.

Havana, Cuba, Dec. 8.—Immigration restrictions modeled on the quota system of the United States are now being planned in Cuba. A bill to establish a quota for immigrants has already been adopted by the Cuban House of Representatives, although its adoption by the Senate is still regarded as doubtful.

El Pais, powerful Havana daily, in an editorial in a recent issue, states that immigrants, mostly from Eastern and Central Europe, have recently been flooding Cuba, competing with the natives in industry and trade and spreading "Red" propaganda among the Cuban workers. Because of the present economic crisis in Cuba, says the paper, immediate steps should be taken by Congress to make drastic cuts in immigration.

## Metropolitan Community Centers Fifth Convention Opens Dec. 13

Representatives of the principal Y.M. and Y.W.H. A.'s, and other educational institutions in New York will attend the fifth annual convention of the Metropolitan League of Jewish Community Associations, which will open its sessions on Sunday morning, December 14th, at 11 A. M., at the new building of the Young Men's Hebrew Association.

The convention this year will be devoted to a discussion of the current topic, "The Business Situation and Its Relation to Jewish Community Centers."

## Book on Tenth Year of WIZO Published

In connection with the tenth anniversary celebration of the World Organization of Zionist Women, there has appeared an anniversary book called Ten Years of Wizo, edited by Dr. Martha Hoffman, of Vienna, noted Jewish writer. The book, which consists of nearly 100 pages, contains valuable material about the history of women's efforts in Palestine, by noted experts in their respective fields. The book is illustrated and contains greetings from Dr. Chaim Weizmann; Mrs. Zipporah, on behalf of Hadassah; Lady Herbert Samuel, Lady John Simon, Blanche C. Dugale, Karin Michaelis and Dr. Alice Masaryk.

## 2,863 Jewish Immigrants Came to United States from July 1 to Oct. 31, 1930

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Washington, Dec. 8.—Two thousand eight hundred sixty-three Jewish immigrants entered the United States from July 1 to October 31 last, and 581 of this category entered during the month of October, it is shown by statistics issued by the Bureau of Immigration, Department of Labor today.

Total immigration for October, according to this announcement, was the lowest since October 1919, showing a drop of 3,850 or 21.6 per cent from the figure for the preceding month and 12,798 or 47.9 per cent less than for October 1929. This drop in immigration is attributed to the drastic instructions by President Hoover to consular officers for denials of visas to aliens who might become public charges.

## Advocate American Farms for Training Chalutzim

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Cleveland, Dec. 8.—The establishment of farms in the United States for the training of Zionist pioneers was advocated in a resolution adopted at the tenth annual convention of the Zeire Zion. Other resolutions called for support of Dr. Chaim Weizmann, the co-ordination of Zionist work among all youth organizations, especially those of the Zeire Zion and Poale Zion and a union of the Zeire Zion and Poale Zion.

Most of the session was devoted to a political debate in which David Ben-Gurion, Joseph Baratz, Chaim Greenberg and others participated. Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver commended the Zeire Zion for the romanticism it has brought into Zionism with the chalutz movement. A. Spier, national secretary, read a report showing a slight increase in membership and a gain in activities, particularly in educational work, work for the Jewish National Fund and the Palestine workers campaign.

## Aaron Horowitz Reelected Mayor of Cornwall

Montreal, Dec. 8.—Jews played an important role in the recent municipal elections in the various cities and towns of Ontario. Besides David Kroll, prominent Jewish barrister who was elected mayor of Windsor, another Jew, Aaron Horowitz, was re-elected chief magistrate of Cornwall for a second term.

Sam Mayerovitch was elected a member of the Rockland town council after having served eight years as trustee of the Rockland Public School Board and the last four years as its chairman. The Jewish alderman gained his seat in the Town Council by a large majority, though 90 per cent of the Rockland population is French (many of them readers of the Goglu and other anti-Semitic publications) and the Mayerovitches the only Jewish family in the town where the elder Mayerovitch settled 23 years ago.

## Montreal Seeks \$100,000 for Hebrew Educational Centre

Montreal, Dec. 8.—On December 14—Chanukah week—Montreal Jewry will be asked to complete the building to be known as the Hebrew Educational Centre. The campaign for funds has already received the endorsement and enthusiastic support of many Jews of Montreal.

Until construction was commenced on the Hebrew Educational Institute, the Talmud Torahs were able to accommodate only 1,200 children in the eight schools that were located mainly in the districts unable to provide their own schools. The Hebrew Educational Institute now being erected is a three-story building and contains a combined auditorium, chapel and playroom, a small assembly hall, eight class rooms and a library.

The campaign, which is for a sum of \$100,000, is endorsed by 29 synagogues, the various lodges of the Zionist Order of Habonim and the ladies' auxiliaries of many congregations. The joint chairmen of the campaign are Samuel Hart and Horace Cohen.

## Wise Sees White Paper as Culmination of Sinister Policy

The Passfield White Paper on Palestine was the culmination of a sinister policy rather than its commencement, declares Rabbi Stephen S. Wise in the first of a series of articles by prominent American Zionist leaders appearing in the New York Evening Telegram. "What Colonial Office servants had in part planned and long practiced," says Rabbi Wise, "they have at least attempted to enact into law under Passfield."

"I, for my part, am ready to charge the officials of the Palestine Administration, alike in London and Jerusalem, with having so bedevilled a situation as to deepen Arab-Jewish differences, which at the outset were superficial. Statesmanship with good will could easily have composed a situation which Colonial Office bureaucracy with ill intent has done everything to confound."

"As for Lord Passfield's White Paper, it has crystallized and even petrified the refusal of Anglo-Palestine officials honorably and fully to discharge the obligations of the Mandate. Until cancelled in substance, this will remain a blot upon England."
