Jews Protest Submission of Commerce University Officials To Demands of Anti-Semites

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

Vienna, Dec. 18.—The right of the anti-Semitic student German student body at the World Commerce College to be the sole official representative of the German students was recognized today by the rectorate of the University which also ratified the constitution of this student organization. The rectorate will, however, permit the formation of student organizations of other nationalities but only with minorities' rights.

The Jewish students and Jewish leaders of Vienna are planning to appeal to the courts against the University officials' action in submitting to the anti-Semitic students' demand. The constitutionality of this action is also to be questioned.

In November the anti-Semitic students at the World Commerce University attacked their Jewish classmates and ousted them from the lecture rooms when the college authorities rejected the anti-Semites' demand for an extension to the World Commerce University of the privilege accorded the anti-Semites at the Vienna University where the German student body is the sole official student organization.

Illegally Resident Arabs In Palestine To Be Deported

Jerusalem, Dec. 18.—A list of the names of the 300 Arabs from Transjordan who entered Palestine illegally having been completed, they will be tried shortly and probably deported, it is learned here today. The list was compiled by the police following Jewish representations made to the authorities that while Jewish immigration was prohibited Arab migration from Transjordan was unchecked.

Most of the illegally resident Arabs are employed by the Shell Oil Co., the Nesher Cement Co., and similar enterprises.

Nazis Rout Guests at Ball of Heine Club in Dusseldorf

Dusseldorf, Dec. 18.—Amid catcalls and shouts of "down with the Jews," a band of Nazis today attacked guests at a ball sponsored by the Heine Club. Although but few of those present were Jews, the literateurs and scientists in attendance were terrorized by the hooligans. The uproar continued until the police cleared out the entire hall. The Club is seeking to raise funds for a monument to Heinrich Heine in his native city.

Anti-Semitic Minister Fined For Slur On German Jews

Berlin, Dec. 18.—The unfrocked minister, M. Muenchmeyer, a leader of the National Socialists, was sentenced to pay a fine of sixty marks today on a charge that he had stated the "Jews are the Asiatic desert sons of flatfooted Indians." The charge was preferred by the Central Association of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith.

Muenchmeyer, who was recently acquitted by the highest German court for having said "a Jewish republic deserves a Jewish president," the reference being to President von Hindenburg, gained notoriety some years ago as the pastor of the Protestant church on Borkum Island, who led the anti-Semitic agitation in that island resort.

Ussishkin Hopes Washington, Youngest Capital City, Will Help Jerusalem, the Oldest

Washington, Dec. 18.—That Washington, the youngest capital and city of justice, freedom and liberty, will come to the aid of the oldest capital, Jerusalem, the city of peace and holiness, was the hope expressed by Menachem M. Ussishkin, world president of the Jewish National Fund, at his first mass meeting outside of New York here last night, in referring to the political crisis in Zionism.

Saying that he was greatly thrilled on viewing the original of the Declaration of Independence, Mr. Ussishkin declared that "the American people having had to win their own independence can be relied upon to sympathize with the Jewish hopes of independence."

Referring to the negotiations now in progress between the Jewish Agency and the British government, Mr. Ussishkin declared that he was opposed to any compromises but voiced confidence that, if the Zionist leaders remained firm, the people who had produced Shakespeare, Byron and Balfour would not violate the sacred promise.

He criticized the Brith Sholom, society of Palestine, and quoted the Biblical injunction, "Hoemes Vehoshalom chovu" (to love truth and peace). Pointing out that this praise of truth comes before peace, Mr. Ussishkin stated "we want peace with the Arabs but we cannot surrender the truth to obtain peace. The truth holds priority over all else. If we Jews wanted to give up the truth for peace, this is not the first opportunity in our history that we have had to do so. Israel's uniqueness among the nations is that it always placed truth foremost and was prepared to suffer for it."

Vienna Archbishop's Office Joins in Pre-Christmas Appeal for Boycott of Jewish Firms

Vienna, Dec. 18.—The office of Cardinal Piffl, archbishop of Vienna, today joined the pre-Christmas campaign of the Austrian anti-Semites for an economic boycott of Jewish firms. Circulars are being sent out in the name of the Church Building Society urging Austrians to buy only from Christian and Aryan-owned firms.

This is the first time that the cardinal's office has openly associated itself with the anti-Semitic racial campaign. The Church Building Society is under the protectorate of Cardinal Piffl and the circulars were sent out from his palace.

Simultaneously this same society is approaching Jewish firms with a plea for donations.

The Vienna Neue Welt today publishes a protest from various Jewish firms protesting against the action of Cardinal Piffl and also protesting against the Vienna municipality, which is controlled by the Socialists, for permitting its poster department to accept such circulars for display in public places calling for a boycott of Jewish stores.

Find Temple of Artemis in Ancient Palestinian City

Jerusalem, Dec. 18.—A large colonnaded court and the beautiful temple of Artemis, one of the principal deities of Greek mythology, were uncovered today at Jerash, the ancient Greek city of Gerasa, in Transjordan, by the joint expedition of Yale University and the American School of Oriental Research in Jerusalem.

Jerash, believed to be the Biblical Ramoth Gilead, as late as the second and third centuries of the Christian era was a flourishing center of Greek civilization devoted to the special worship of Artemis. The ruins were first found in 1806.

The debris reaching down twenty feet and the magnificent stones that have fallen from the walls of the temple, one of the best preserved buildings of Roman times, made the clearing difficult, but the portico and corridors uncovered by the excavators indicates that the base of the great altar will be found soon. Two fine mosaic floors with inscriptions were laid bare and hundreds of coins were turned up in the remains of buildings from Arab, Byzantine and Roman times.

Later buildings and debris cover the newly discovered small temple with an altar and column base. Dozens of plundered tombs complete with doors and great locks and chains, all containing the remains of interesting of-

**Colonial Office Probing Ban
On Sunday Work at Haifa Bay**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

London, Dec. 18.—The British government is entirely uninformed about the recent order of the High Commissioner of Palestine suspending all Sunday work on the Haifa Bay construction work, the House of Commons was informed today by Dr. Drummond Shiels, under-secretary for the Colonies, in response to a question from James Hall, the recently elected Labor member from Whitechapel.

Mr. Hall demanded that the government take steps against the High Commissioner's action. Dr. Shiels said that Lord Passfield, Colonial Secretary, is communicating with Sir John Chancellor regarding the matter and when a reply is received the question will be considered by the Colonial Office.

The action of the High Commissioner in this regard means that Jewish and Moslem workers must either work on their respective Sabbaths or else forfeit a day's pay.

**Christians Urge Non-Jews
To Aid Jewish Hospitals**

A group of Christians, headed by Bishop Manning, has issued a statement to non-Jews on the occasion of Chanukah, in which they call on Christians "as a mark of the friendly relations between Christians and Jews" to make good will contributions to the National Jewish Hospital at Denver. Martin Conboy, a prominent Catholic layman and a board member of the National Conference of Jews and Christians, and Mrs. Oliver Harriman joined with Bishop Manning in issuing the statement.

Justice Samuel D. Levy of the Children's Court is chairman of the New York Committee of the Hospital. Ben Altheimer is the national treasurer, and Paul Felix Warburg is treasurer for New York.

**Hoover and Leaders of Jewish
Community Eulogize Mosessohn**

Funeral services for David N. Mosessohn, editor of The Jewish Tribune and executive chairman of the Associated Dress Industry of America, who died on Tuesday, were held yesterday in the West End Synagogue. Rabbi Nathan Stern, who officiated at the services, was assisted by Rabbis Nathan Krass, Israel Goldstein and Elias Solomon, and the Rev. Max Grauman, cantor. Many prominent New Yorkers, including non-Jews, were the honorary pallbearers at the services. Burial took place in Mount Carmel Cemetery.

Tributes From Notables

President Hoover wired from Washington the following tribute to Mr. Mosessohn: "I am shocked to learn of the death of my friend, David N. Mosessohn. His distinguished contribution to Jewish culture and his outstanding leadership in service of the noblest ethical ideals will cause him long to be remembered gratefully by his fellow-countrymen of all races and creeds."

"He was a splendid and a remarkable man, in whom was contained to a rare degree an outstanding civic consciousness, loyalty to and love for his faith and a robust, virile Americanism," declared Lieutenant-Governor Herbert H. Lehman in his tribute to Mr. Mosessohn, while Adolph S. Ochs, publisher of the New York Times, said:

"His place will be difficult to fill. American Israel is bowed with grief, for he was a valiant son, respected and admired and of wide influence."

"The death of Mr. Mosessohn was a great loss to journalism and Jewry," declared Benjamin N. Cardozo, Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals. "I learned to know and to appreciate his sympathetic interest in all things fine and high."

Maccabean Hero

Rabbi Stephen S. Wise said that Mr. Mosessohn had "the Jewish passion of a Maccabean, and in the Chanukah days the light of his mortal day is extinguished who fought throughout his too brief life for the cause and hopes and ideals of Israel with the unflinching courage of a Maccabean hero."

"Every suffering that was caused to Jewry in any part of the world found a reaction in his heart," declared Felix M. Warburg, "and if his life has come to an untimely end, no doubt his self-sacrificing devotion to these problems had something to do with it."

**Hoover and Republican Majority
Leader Deplore Attack on Meyer**

Washington, Dec. 18.—President Hoover, Representative Luce, second ranking member of the House banking and currency committee, and Representative Tilson, majority leader, all came to the defense of Eugene Meyer, newly appointed governor of the Federal Reserve, who was yesterday assailed as an "international banker" and the rejection of his nomination by the Senate demanded by Representative McFadden, chairman of the House banking and currency committee.

Voicing deep concern over Mr. McFadden's attack and deploring the attack on the Federal Reserve System, President Hoover conferred with majority leader Tilson who assured him that the House did not share Mr. McFadden's sentiments. In demanding that the Senate should reject Mr. Meyer, Mr. McFadden said "if you want to turn the Federal Reserve System over to international financiers, place Eugene Meyer in that particular post at this time."

Saying that Mr. Meyer had been closely connected during his whole financial career with banking houses of international reputation, Mr. McFadden stated that "he had a very close connection with J. P. Morgan and Company, and as head of the War Finance Corporation, and in carrying on its activities, those close relationships were actively disclosed. He is a Wall Street man."

In the course of his criticism of Mr. Meyer, Mr. McFadden also said that he is a brother-in-law of George Blumenthal, and he understood, represents the Rothschild interests and is a liaison officer between the French government and the Morgan Company.

Commenting on Mr. McFadden's objections to the appointment of Mr. Meyer on the ground that he would "turn the Federal Reserve System over to international financiers," Arthur Brisbane, in his daily column, "Today," says, "that is upside down. If Mr. Meyer did any turning, he'd turn international financiers over to the Federal Reserve System. Mr. Meyer is a first class American, an extremely able financier, and, as head of the Federal Reserve Board, he may give to finance, and some other things in this country, a leadership that they now lack."

Celebrate 275th Anniversary of First Jewish Settlement in U.S.

Boston, Dec. 18.—Boston Jews in thousands last night crowded the historic Faneuil Hall, "cradle of liberty," to celebrate the two hundred and seventy fifth anniversary of the founding of the first Jewish settlement in the United States. An impressive array of distinguished guests, including rabbis and Christian ministers, men and women in the professional and educational fields and communal leaders, joined in greetings on this historic occasion.

Praises Work of Jews

A special message from President Hoover to the meeting read as follows: "The Jewish people have brought to this country both the treasure of their ancient tradition and the pioneer spirit that looks forward hopefully into the future. They have thrown themselves wholeheartedly into the task of the nation's upbuilding. In every national crisis they have shown their loyalty and devotion to the home of their choice and have made valuable contributions in every worthwhile field of endeavor. I felicitate the gathering of those who celebrate the passing of the 275th year of Jewish participation in American life."

A message from Vice-President Curtis was also read at the meeting. Greetings were delivered by Congressman Sol Bloom of New York; Prof. Albert Bushnell Hart, eminent historian of Harvard University; Dr. Daniel Marsh, president of Boston University; Dr. Nicholas Murray Butler, president of Columbia University; Louis Wiley of the New York Times; Rabbi David de Sola Pool of New York; Paul Wolman of Baltimore, National Commander of the Veterans of Foreign Wars; Mayor Curley of Boston; and Episcopalian and Catholic dignitaries.

All of them lauded Jewish achievements in this country and pointed out the three-fold significance of the occasion as follows: its historic value, its good-will spirit and its inspiration to Jews and non-Jews for future accomplishments.

Tribute to Jews

Professor Nathan Isaacs of Harvard opened the celebration, introducing Alexander Brin, editor of the Jewish Advocate, chairman of the anniversary committee, who presided. The Rev. S. Parkes Cadman of New York, chairman of the Good-Will Committee of the Federal Council of Churches of Christ in America, delivered a vigorous oration on the religion of the Jew, paying especial tribute to the Jewish prophets and sages of old.

Representative Bloom told how Governor Peter Stuyvesant admitted the first party of 23 Jews to the Dutch colony of New Amsterdam, which later became New York, in 1655 to form the first Jewish community in America, the vanguard of the 4,500,000 Jewish population of today. After recounting how Governor Stuyvesant admitted the first Jews, "provided the poor amongst them shall not be a burden to the community,

Sees Repetition of History If Einstein Leaves Reich

History would repeat itself if Professor Einstein changes his place of residence from Germany to some other country in the event that the Hitlerites get control of Germany, Arthur Brisbane writes in his daily column, "Today." "Persecution of Jews drove many of the ablest minds from Portugal and Spain, men that could have prevented the Spanish decline into failure and superstition," Mr. Brisbane says. "Among those thus driven out were the parents of the great Spinoza. At about the same time, the wisdom of Cromwell, welcoming the Jews, helped to build the prosperity of England."

Disorderly Roumanian Students Forced into Military Service

Bucharest, Dec. 18.—All students implicated in any sort of public disorder will lose the prerogative of postponing their period of military service and will be immediately enrolled for such service, the government authorities decided today. Meanwhile the students' action in seeking to attack the house of the popular General Mardarescu Tuesday night is creating widespread indignation. Professor Cuza's part in the same demonstration is also arousing unfavorable comment.

At a press conference today, under-secretary Calinescu stated that the 18 students arrested during last night's affair will be treated as ordinary law-breakers and severely punished.

Bucharest, Dec. 18.—The Roumanian government will act only against aggressive anti-Semitism and not against anti-Semitic ideology, Virgil Madgearu, minister of agriculture, said in Parliament as a reply to the various speakers who took part in the debate on the King's message. Praising Deputy Fisher's speech of last week, M. Madgearu declined to enter into a discussion with Professor Cuza.

Deputy Michael Landau blamed Parliament for its failure to protest against Cuza's recent attack on the Jews in Parliament. He charged that the government was slow in taking measures against the student disturbances and therefore the Jewish population was unable to approve of the government's policy.

Sees Passion Play Weakening Former Christian-Jewish Cordiality in Cincinnati

Cincinnati, Dec. 18.—Arguing that it was not the Jews, but the Romans, who crucified Jesus of Nazareth, Rabbi David Philipson in a sermon before his congregation maintained that an erroneous and harmful presentation of the crucifixion was being shown in the Freiburg Passion Play, which is now being presented in this city. Rabbi Philipson expressed the fear that the play would tend to weaken the feeling of good will and friendliness that has been established between the Christian and Jewish people of Cincinnati.

Andrew H. Foppe, prominent Catholic layman, a former member of the Cincinnati Civil Service Commission and a member of the staff of the Enquirer stated yesterday that he is in complete agreement with Dr. Philipson. "It seems to me that the crucifixion is too sacred an event to be depicted as a commercial enterprise for private gain," said Mr. Foppe.

"Here in Cincinnati the cordiality between Christians and Jews is one of the glories of our citizenship," said Dr. Philipson. "For the past seventy years and more, rabbis have been on most cordial terms with their Christian colleagues. Prejudices have reached almost the vanishing point in the public life of our city. To have all this fine feeling jeopardized by an imported medieval commercial venture is indeed a cause for deepest regret. I can only hope that the ill effects that many of us dread will not ensue, but that the fine understanding and good will among all creeds that have given Cincinnati a unique position among the cities of the land, will continue and grow in ever greater measure."

Yeshiva Students Greeting Levin Arrested as Reds

Kishinev, Dec. 1.—A number of students in the local rabbinical seminary were arrested today on the suspicion of being Communists when they gathered to give a reception to Dr. Schmarya Levin, noted Zionist leader and author, on his arrival here. The police followed them on their way to the railway station and then arrested them.

The students' story was ignored by the police and they remained under arrest until their release was effected through the intervention of Rabbi Zircelson. A number of the students were beaten by the police.

The organization of a national federation of Jewish women's organizations is being contemplated, according to an announcement made yesterday by Mrs. David E. Goldfarb, president of the Federation of Jewish Women's Organizations of Greater New York, at the annual meeting of the organization held at the Community House of Congregation Emanu-El. The call has gone out to Jewish women's organizations throughout the country, inviting delegates to attend a luncheon conference on Monday, January 26th, at the Women's Town Club.

The principal speaker at the annual meeting was the Rev. Dr. N. Pereira Mendes, minister emeritus of the Spanish Portuguese Synagogue, who spoke on "Geneva and Jewish Thought and Aspirations." Following Dr. Mendes' address the annual election of officers and directors took place in which the following were chosen: Mrs. Max L. Levenson, honorary president-elect; Mrs. Henry Bodenheimer, honorary vice-president; Mrs. David E. Goldfarb, president; Mrs. Isaac Kubie, first vice-president; Mrs. A. L. Jewish Children in Two Denver Schools Learn Chanukah Songs Instead of Christmas Carols

Denver, Colo., Dec. 18.—Jewish school children in two public schools in Denver are learning Chanukah songs, instead of Christmas carols. And instead of Christmas cards, the art classes draw Chanukah greetings.

The plan is in effect in two grammar schools, at the Cheltenham and at Colfax schools, the former having a Jewish enrollment of 98%, and the latter being almost equally divided between Jewish and non-Jewish pupils. The principal of both schools is William C. Shute.

"We do not stop at the negative virtue of mere tolerance," Mr. Shute declared. "Jewish children in Denver schools have never been asked to sing Christmas carols, but it was not until last year that I found there were typical Jewish songs for this season. With the co-operation of Mrs. Max Michaelson, past president of the Denver Section, National Council of Jewish Women, and Mrs. Belle Goldfogel, president of the Cheltenham School Parent-Teacher Association, we selected songs from Jewish hymnals appropriate for the holiday. The art instructors were given typically Jewish designs for the art classes."

\$400,000 Galland Foundation to Be Incorporated This Week

Spokane, Dec. 18.—Articles of incorporation of the Julius Galland Foundation have been prepared and will be filed at Olympia this week. The trustees of the corporation are expected to meet for organization the first of next week when steps will be taken toward getting work started on the new \$36,000 Julius Galland Home for children to be financed by the Julius Galland estate, the title to which will rest in the Julius Galland Foundation.

Julius Galland died four years ago and left a \$400,000 estate to be used for charity. About a half of the estate has been used for Jewish philanthropy and charity.

Yiddish Theatres to Reopen Next Week as Agreement Is Reached

Nine Yiddish theatres of New York will open again next week, as a result of the settlement of the differences between the managers and their employees arrived at on Wednesday. The theatres had closed two weeks ago after the managers had declared that it is impossible for them to keep the theatres open at the present wage scale and had demanded a 25% reduction of wages as a condition for reopening their theatres.

According to the settlement the chorus union will accept a 10 per cent wage cut, the dressers, doormen and ushers will accept a 15 per cent cut and salaries of actors will be reduced from 10 to 25 per cent. The number of stage hands in the larger theatres will be reduced, while the musicians will also make some concessions.
