MEXICAN ANTI-JEWISH DEMONSTRATION PASSES WITHOUT DISCREER:
PRESIDENT AND MEMBERS OF GOVERNMENT DECIDE AT LAST MINUTE
NOT TO TAKE PART: BANNERS CARRIED DEMONITIO. "VORACIOUS
YERASLITES" AND DEMANDLING DEFORTATION OF ALL JEWS PROM
MEXICO: MEXICO CITY LITERALLY COVERED WITH POLICE MOUNTED
AND ON FOOT RESPING EYE ON DEMONSTRATORS TO PREVENT SMALL
GROUPS BREAKING AWAY AND STATTING NIOTS: ALL JEWISH SHOPS

Mexico City, June 1st. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

Thousands of Mexicans attended to-day the mass demonstration arranged by the Union of Mexican Small Traders, ostensibly against foreigners, but actually against Jews. The marchers assembled near the American Consulate with bands and banners slowly moving through the central district towards the National Palake where the President of the Republic, Senor Rubic, and all the members of the Government were present.

Although they had promised to attend the demonstration, the President and the members of the Government decided, however, at the last minute that they would not take any part in it, pro-

bably realising the complications which might ensue.

The demonstrators carried banners with inflammatory inscriptions, mostly anti-aller, although some were definitely anti-Jevish. The "voracious Israelites are the plague of our country", one banner read, aid another demanded wholesate deportation of all Jews from the country. Speeches were delivered denouncing the foreigners and acousting them of taking the bread but of the mouths of the Mexicans, and swallowing up all the riches of the country.

it is understood that the Government is deeply impressed by the importance of the foreign business interests in the country revealed by this demonstration. All Jewish shops in the city were closed and adequately protected. A group of demonstrators who tried to force a British shop to close was quickly dispersed

by the police.

Extraordinary precautions were taken by the authorities to prevent trouble. The city literally swarmed with police, mounted and on foot, armed with rifles and fixed bayonets. No excesses occurred, the police taking stringent precautions and keeping a particularly watchful eye on the demonstrators while they were dispersing to prevent any small parties getting away and starting ricting.

ANTWERP JE'S EXCITED OVER MEXICAN ANTI-JEWISH KOVEMENT:
PHOTEST EMERTING ARRANGED BUT POSTFORMS ON INTERVENTION
OF MEXICAN CONSUL PROMISING TO OBTAIN STATEMENT FROM
HIS GOVERNMENT ON MEASURES TAKEN BY IT TO STOP ANTIJEWISH PERSECULION.

Antwerp, June 1st. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The reports of anti-Jewish persecution in Mexico have caused a great deal of excitement among the Jewish population of Antwerp. A protest meeting was arranged, but was postponed at the last moment on the intervention of the hexican Consul, who promised to notify his Government of the feeling of indignation existing among the Jews of Antwerp, and to ask it what measures it has taken to prevent such anti-Jewish persecution recurring.

Antwerp Jews have also recently experienced a similar movement to that which has been going on in Maxioo. Many Jews who have been unable to earn their livelihood at their own trade, because of the crisis in the diamond industry in which the Jews of Belgium have been largely represented, have taken to street-trading, and (according to a report in the J.T.A. Bulletin of May Zist.) the Belgian street-traders resent their competition, and clashes between Belgian and Jewish market-traders have been frequent in the last few weeks, resulting at times in serious fighting. The local authorities in several of the Antwerp suburbs have taken a hand, it was added, and are refusing to allow the Jewish dealers to stand at the pitches they she held in the market-places.

HITLERICUS APPEAR IN AMSTERDAM: INSULT JEWS PASSING IN STREET AND HAVE TO STEE POLICE PROTECTION TO ENABLE THEM TO ESCAPE FROM INCENSED JEWS AND MON-JEWS.

Amsterdam, June 1st. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

Amsterdam has had an unacoustomed experience this week, with a number of Hitlerists from Germany descending upon the city and trying to engage here in the kind of molestation of Jews in the streets that has become frequent in Germany.

A German motor car drew up outside a restaurant in the Rembrandtplein, flying the Hitlerist flag, and the occupants displaying big swastika badges. People'of Jewish appearance were insulted, and they kept up a continuous shout of "Dirty Jews! Down with the Jews!". Finally a crowd of Jews and non-Jews made a rush at the Germans, and it was only under strong police protection that the Fitlerists were able to make their escape.

NEW PALESTIME ORDINANCE FOR PROTECTION OF TENANTS ON LAND AND SQUARTERS IS IN ACCORDANCE "1179-PRIME WINTSTER'S PERHUARY ETTER TO DR. "EIZMANN DR. DRUMMOND SRIELS EXPLAINS IN HOUSE OF COMMONS: BUT CONTROL OF LAND TRANSACTIONS WILL TAKE EFFECT ONLY PROM DATE LAND DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY BEGINS TO OPERATE.

London, June 2nd, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). In accordance with the last sentence of paragraph 12 of the Prime Minister's letter to Dr. Weizmann of the 13th. February, an ordinance was promulgated on Friday last to pro-tect tenancy and occupancy rights including the rights of squatters throughout Palestine, Dr. Drummond Shiels, the Under-Secretary of State for the Colonies, said in the House of Commons this afternoon, in reply to Colonel Howard Bury, who asked whether any ordinance had been promulgated in Palestine. to stop the alienation of Arab holdings or what steps had been taken to prevent further additions being made to the number of landless Arabs.

As stated in the preceding part of that paragraph, Dr. Shiels went on, the centralised control of land transactions will take effect as from such date only as the authority charged with the duty of carrying out the policy of land development

shall begin to operate.

. In giving effect to the policy of land settlement, as contemplated in article 11 of the Mandate, it was said in *the paragraph in question in Mr. MacDonald's letter to Dr. Weizmann, it is necessary, if disorgandation is to be avoided, and if the policy is to have a chance to succeed, that there should exist some centralised control of transactions relating should exist some centrelised control of transactions relating to the acquisition and transfer of land during such interimperiod as may reasonably be necessary to place the development scheme upon a sure foundation. The power contemplated is regulative and not probibitory, although it does involve a power to prevent transactions which are inconsistent with the tenor of the scheme. But the exercise of the power will be limited and in no respect arbitrary. In every case it will be conditioned by considerations as to how best to give effect to the purposes of the Mandate. Any control contemplated will be fenced with due safeguards to secure as little interference as possible with the free transfer of land. The centralised control will take effect as from such date only as the authority charged with the duty of carrying out the policy of land development shall begin to operate.

The High Commissioner will, pending the establishment of such centralised control, have full powers to take all steps necessary to protect the tenancy and occupancy rights, including the rights of equatters, throughout Pelestine.

Dr. Shiels' statement appears therefore to refer to two distinct ordinances, one for establishing some centralised control of land acquisition and transfer, which will take effect only from such date as the authority charged with the duty of carrying out the policy of land development in Palestine begins to operate, and the other, which was enacted on Priday, giving the High Commissioner of Pelestine full powers, pending the establishment of such controls of Pelestine Stops to protect the tenancy and occupancy rights, including the rights of squatters throughout Palestine, which has entered into force immediately. into force immediately.

With the return to Palestine this morning of the High Commissioner, Str John Chancellor, a Gazette Extraordingry will be published to-night, the J.T.A. learns, notifying a 20 per cent. remission of the tithe for 1930, in addition to the 30 per cent. remitted last July and a 50 per cent. rem mission for 1931. The reduction does not apply to the orange groves, but further relief is being considered for both years on the crops destroyed by locusts, field-mice and drought.

ALIEN REGISTRATION IN AMERICA HELD UP BY INJUNCTION OBTAINED IN FEDERAL COURT BY OPPONENTS OF MICHIGAN BILL: FIGHT TO BE STARTED NOW TO ABOLISH BILL ON GROUND OF UNCONSTITU-TIONALITY.

New York. June let. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The setting up of machinery for alien registration which had been started in the State of Wichigan under the privations of the Allen Registration Bill adopted by the State Englature and signed by the Governor of the State, Mr. Brucker, has been temporarily stopped, the opponents of the Bill obtaining an injunction to-day from the Federal Court, restraining the Governor of Michigan from enforcing the Registration Act.

This temporary injunction will be followed by a legal fight in the Federal Court by the opponents of the Bill. to endeavour to get the Registration Act abolished on the ground that it is unconstitutional.

AMERICAN DELEGATES TO ZIONIST CONGRESS DO NOT REPRESENT AMERI-CAN ZIONISM NEW YORK YIDDISH DAILIES COMPLAIN; ADMINISTRA-TION CHOSE ITS OWN PEOPLE ELECTED ITSELF AND TRAMPLES ON CONVICTIONS OF ZIONIST MASSES: MOST DELEGATES ANTI-WEIZMANNIST WHICH IS CONTRARY TO VIEWS OF RANK AND FILE.

The list of American delegates to the Zionist Congress is not representative of American Zionism, the New York Yiddish dailies, "Morning Journal" and "Day", complain in editorial articles to-day.

The "Day" says, which is contrary to the views of the rank and file of American Zionism. The small group which is now administering the Zionist Organisation of America, it says further, chose its own people, elected tiself, and tramples upon the feelings and convictions of the Zionist masses.

The list of the American delegates to the Congress certainly cannot be regarded as really representative of the American Zionist masses, the "Morning Journal" writes. The fact remains, it says, that no one chose them, except the minyan of people who in turn selected the 20 delegates and 20 alternatives. The Administration of the Zionist Organisation of America exploited the privilege which the Congress election of America exploited the privilege which the Congress election regulations give in cases of agreement for presenting a unified list. We think that the whole problem of the Congress election regulations ought to be revised.

The following are the names of the 20 General Zionist delegates from America selected under the arrangement (reported in the J.T.A. Bulletin of May 27th.), by which a contest is avoided, and of the 38 seats to which America is entitled 20 are allocated to the General Zionists, 8 to the Mizrachists, 5 to the Poale Zionists, 3 to the Zeire Zionists and 2 to the Revisionists;

At the time of the elections to the last Congress in the Mack group, which has since secured control of the lays, the Mack group, which has since secured control of the American loinist Organisation, contested the results of the American elections, which gave 20 seats to the Geneval Zionists, ten to the Mizmachi, seven to the Poale Zion, four to the Zeire Zion and the Fitachduth, and only one to the Mack group. Mr. Jacob de Haas, one of the leaders of the group went to the Congress and lodged a formal protest which was rejected by the Congress Court, however, on the ground that it had been presented too late.

At the 1927 Congress at Basle, the opposition lodged a protest with the Congress Court against the American delegation on the ground that it was not an elected body. American delegates, it was complained, were not elected by the Shokel payers of America, but were appointed in an unrepresent-The Congress Court decided, however, against ative manner. the protest of the Opposition, and confirmed the American representation.

The Jewish List formed by the Club of Jewish Deputies in the last Parliament, has obtained 27,500 votes in the Farliamentary elections, as far as the results already available indicate, and by a coincidence the antisemittle list of the Christian League under the leadership of Professor Cuza obtained about the same number of votes, in addition to which the even more militant antisemitic group of the Iron Guard led by Zelea Codreamu obtained 7,864 yotes.

The Government has secured ever 65 per cent. of the entire poll, and the Mational Peasants' Party, which formed the Maniu and Mironescu Governments which preceded the present Joyge Government, obtained the second largest number of votes. The other parties had a very small poll.

ex-Senatorine Mayer Ebner wrote in his paper, the "Ostjuedische Zettung, a few days ago - reported in the J.T.A. Convinced Government Will Carry Out Jewish Programme Demands Dr. Filderman Says In Communique To Jewish Population Calling Them To Vote For Government.

The Union of Roumanian Jews issued a communique on the eve of the elections, calling upon the Jewish population of Roumania to vote for the Government list, the "List of National Unification", as it is called, in which the Liberal

Party is represented.

The communique was issued following a letter which the Minister of the Interior, M. Argebianu, addressed to Dr. Filderman, the President of the Union of Roumanian Jews, and two letters addressed to him by M. Duca, the leader of the Liberal Party, assuring him of their continued sympathy and support for the demands of the Jewish population.

Dr. Filderman is convinced, the communique said,

that the Government will carry out the programme demands put

forward by the Jewish representatives.

I have received your letter of May 20th, concerning the discussion which took place in my presence between yourself, the representative of the Jewish National Party, M. Zissu, and the General Secretary of the Union of Roumanian Jewe, M. Sarateanu (reported in the J.T.A. Bulletin of May 13th.), M. Argetoienu writes in his letter. It was only a discussion of views. The hurling off personal insults which were reported in many newspapers did not cour in my office. The report of the discussion which appeared in the "Curievul Israelit" (the organ of the Union of Roumanian Jewe) on the 11th. inst. is correct, the Minister adds.

Mr. Montague Burton, the prominent Leeds Jewish social worker, who is also active in the Zionist movement, where he is a Provincial Vice President of the English Zionist Federation, and has been a delegate to several Zionist Congresses, raceives a Knighthood. Mr. Burton receives the award as "a generous benefactor to Leeds and other universities, and for public services in the cause of industrial relationships",

Mr. Burton established in 1929 the Weissmann Chair of International

Peace at the Hebrew University in Jerusalem.

ir. Leon Simon, who was recently appointed Director of Pests and Telegraphs to the General Post Office, receives a Knighthood in the Order of the Bath. Mr. Simon is the outstanding authority on Achad Ha'am, whose works he has translated into English, and the leading exponent of his ideas. He was a member of the Zionist Commission which went out to Palestine after the promulgation of the Balfour Declaration. Mr. Albert Montefiore Hyamson, the Chief Immigration

Officer to the Palestine Government, becomes an Officer of the

Order of the British Empire.

Mr. Hyamson who was at first in the British Post Office Service and was transferred to Palestine in 1921, was at one time the Joint Editor of the "Zionist Review" which was published in London. He was the first Honorary Secretary and afterwards Vice President of the Jewish Literary Societies in England and was Vice-President of the Jewish Literary Societies in England and wai editor of the Jewish Literary Annual. He has published a number of books, among them "A History of the Jews in England", 1908, a revised edition appearing in 1928; "The Jubilee of Jewish Emancipation in England", in 1908; "Palestine, the Rebirth of an Ancient People", in 1917; and "Palestine, Old and New", in 1928. A question about Mr. Hyamson's one-time Zionist views was put during the sessions of the Shaw Enquiry Commission in December 1929, the Counsel for the Arab-side, Mr. Stoker, seking Mr. Harry Sacher whether Ar. Hyamson was a Zionisk. No. Mr. Sacher replied, You had better ask him for his views.

Mr. Stearied Hoofien, the President of the Jaffa and District Chamber of Compares, is made Honorary Nember of the Order of the British Empire. Mr. Boofien is the Manager of the Anglo-Palestine Company, and was a member of the temporary Zionist Executive in Palestine at the time of the outbreak in August 1929. when the members of the Executive were absent at the Zionist Congress in Zurich, and in that capacity he was one of the Jewish witnesses called before the Sraw Commission, whom he told in his evidence that the Jews had brought 45 million pounds into Palestine, and the Jewish immigration had brought great benefits also to the Arab population, the country having entered as a result on a new stage of development, despite some inevitable dislocation consequent on cultivation replacing grazing.
