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VIENNA ANTISEMITIC DEMONSTRATION PASSES WITHOUT DISTURBANCE:
STRONG POLICE CORDONS PREVENT ATTACKS ON JEWS: GOVERNMENT
FUNDS FOR JEWISH ROTHSCHILDS WHILE AUSTRIAN PEOPLE STARV-
ING READ ANTISEMITIC SLOGANS DISPLAYED AT MEETING.

Vienna, June 26th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

No disturbances have occurred in connection with the antisemitic open-air demonstration held here to-night in protest against the verdict of the Constitutional Court annulling the regulations of the University authorities under which the antisemitic student organisation enjoyed special privileges and against the use of State funds to save from bankruptcy the Credit-Anstalt, of which Baron Louis de Rothschild is President (actually the Vienna Rothschilds provided a sum of 30 million schillings - £870,000 - the Austrian Government providing 100 million schillings, and the Austrian State Bank another 30 million schillings, in that way wiping out the heavy deficit of the Credit-Anstalt and saving Austria and the greater part of Europe from a gigantic financial disaster).

The Government gives money to save the Jewish Rothschilds, while the Austrian people are starving! was the inscription on scores of banners carried at the demonstration, which was attended by many thousands of people.

Huge forces of police were brought out, forming a cordon round the meeting, and a strong police cordon was also thrown round the entire cafe district, effectually preventing any attempt by the demonstrators to attack the Jews frequenting the cafes.

JEWS ALSO HOLD MASS MEETING TO PROTEST AGAINST ANTISEMITISM
AT VIENNA UNIVERSITY: ANTISEMITES AND COMMUNISTS FIND WAY
INTO MEETING BUT ARE EJECTED ON ATTEMPTING DISORDER:
UNIVERSITY RECTOR WARNS ANTISEMITIC STUDENTS AGAINST
CONTINUING AGITATION WHICH MAY RESULT IN GOVERNMENT DE-
PRIVING UNIVERSITY OF ITS AUTONOMY: UNIVERSITY WILL BE
REOPENED WEDNESDAY IF ORDER ASSURED.

Vienna, June 27th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

A Jewish mass meeting was held here this evening to protest against the continuing antisemitic campaign at the University. A number of antisemites and Communists who managed to find their way into the meeting were ejected when they tried to create a disturbance.

The Rector of the University has issued a statement warning the German-race students against continuing their anti-Jewish violence, pointing out that if they do not desist, the Government may withdraw the right of autonomy at present enjoyed by the University, as the Governor of the Vienna Province, Herr Seitz (who is also Lord Mayor of Vienna City), and the Jewish Community are urging it to do, and order the police to enter even the University halls to put down the fighting and arrest the student aggressors. In addition, it is pointed out, the Jewish students have established a self-defence organisation, so that the fighting will not be all on one side.

The University will be reopened on Wednesday if order is assured, it is stated, and there will also be a partial reopening of the other High Schools.

CALM RETURNING IN SALONICA: GOVERNMENT CENTRAL ORGAN IN ATHENS
FIERCELY ATTACKING ANTI-JEWISH AGITATORS: JEWISH COMMUNITY
INTENDS TAKING LEGAL ACTION AGAINST INCITERS.

Salonica, June 27th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

Calm is now returning in Salonica. The central organ of the Venizelos Government Party in Athens is conducting a fierce campaign against the anti-Jewish movement, and the local Salonica press is also now changing its tone, and becoming more moderate. The Nationalist organisations are still continuing their threatening attitude, however, despite the demand of the Government that the agitation should be stopped.

The Jewish Community intends to take legal action against all those responsible for the anti-Jewish incitement. Adequate measures for maintaining order have been taken by the authorities.

CUZA AND THE JORGA GOVERNMENT: CHEERED BY GOVERNMENT DEPUTIES
WHEN RECALLING IN CHAMBER HIS COLLABORATION YEARS AGO
WITH JORGA ON ANTISEMITIC PLATFORM: DEMANDS EXCLUSION OF
JEWS FROM ARMY AND INSULTS JEWISH DEPUTIES: "ADEVERUL"
HINTS AT GOVERNMENT SUPPORT OF CUZA.

Bucharest, June 27th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

Prolonged applause from the Deputies of the majority Party greeted Professor Cuza, the antisemitic leader, when in speaking in the Chamber to-day in the debate on the King's speech, he recalled the collaboration which years ago had existed between himself and the Prime Minister, Professor Jorga, when they had jointly led the antisemitic Party of that time.

Professor Cuza was moved to the recollection of those old days, when Deputy Theodore Fischer, the leader of the Jewish Party, rose in protest against his allegations that the Jews were a disloyal element, and his demand that they should therefore be excluded from the army. He hurled insults of a personal character against the Jewish Deputies and invoked Professor Jorga's past to suggest that the Prime Minister's views on the Jewish question are not dissimilar to his own.

The democratic general press is expressing alarm at the close friendship which it says is being displayed in Government quarters towards Professor Cuza. The "Adeverul", for instance, asks why the Communists were not allowed to sit in Parliament, their seats being invalidated, while the Cuzists, who are just as much impossibilists and wreckers, have been allowed to retain their seven seats in Parliament. The Government announced that it would take drastic measures against all extremist movements, it says, but these measures are confined only to the extremists of the Left, while the Cuzists who are just as much out for the violent disruption of the State, are being honoured and their leader is given a high order and is applauded by the Government benches. When the elections took place for the President of the Chamber, the "Adeverul" adds, there were many Deputies who judged from Professor Jorga's attitude towards Cuza that he would like Cuza to be elected, and consequently Cuza obtained no less than 40 votes, with the Government candidate, Deputy Pompei, who has been elected, securing 120 votes.

Professor Jorga and the Jews.

In April, soon after Professor Jorga became Prime Minister, a Guizist paper, the "Gazeta Maramuresului", appearing in Marmarosch, in the Province of Transylvania, under the editorship of a priest named Barlea, reprinted an article which Professor Jorga had published in 1905 when he was associated with Professor Cuza in the leadership of the League of Christian National Defence, with the intention of showing that the Premier is in agreement with Cuza on the action to be taken against the Jews.

Since the war, Professor Jorga has dissociated himself repeatedly, however, from Professor Cuza and his views on the Jewish question, and in an interview with the London editor of the J.T.A. last summer in Bucharest, he dismissed Professor Cuza's movement as a manifestation of indiscipline by a few students who were noticed only because they made a lot of noise, while thousands of other students who sat quietly doing their work were not noticed. Cuza, he said, is not an antisemite by conviction, and is only using antisemitism to get into Parliament and be the head of a Party. The trouble in Roumania, he said, is that the Governments are Party Governments and are therefore obliged to avoid harsh measures against these agitators.

When he was in New York in January 1930, Professor Jorga gave an interview to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, in which he claimed that the Roumanian antisemitic movement was unimportant and said that the Jews enjoy under the Constitution equal rights and opportunities with the other citizens of Roumania, and their duty is to work together with the others in furthering the interests of the fatherland. As President of Bucharest University and leader of the National Party, he said, I condemn disturbances of any kind.

The Jewish Deputies and the leaders of the Union of Roumanian Jews have both expressed satisfaction with Professor Jorga's present views on the place of the Jewish citizens in the Roumanian State, and a few days ago, when Parliament celebrated his 60th. birthday, the Jewish Party spokesman lauded him as a scholar and a wise statesman.

Professor Jorga has since the war repeatedly and emphatically declared that he is opposed to antisemitism, and when he took office as Prime Minister he reiterated this in his statement to the representatives of the press, Dr. Filderman, the President of the Union of Roumanian Jews, said in discussing the new Government with the J.T.A. Taken together with the presence of M. Constantin Argetoianu as a member of the new Cabinet, Dr. Filderman went on, this is an assurance that the present Government will safeguard the peaceful existence and the civil rights of the Jewish population. If any disturbances of the peace should, nevertheless, occur, I am hopeful and confident, he said, that the Government will not hesitate to suppress them, and I believe that it will be in a position to do this.

The "Bukowinaer Volkszeitung" recalled in the same connection an interview which Professor Jorga gave to a representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency last October, in the course of which the present Premier said: One would have expected the Roumanian intellectuals to place themselves at the head of a movement against antisemitism, and to stand for a policy of far-reaching tolerance and humanity, which would allow the various nationalities to develop freely within the framework of the Roumanian State, and would secure for the Roumanian people its untrammelled development and prosperity.

I myself, unfortunately, cannot assume the leadership in the fight against antisemitism. Any initiative which I might take in this regard would only encounter the closed front of the professional politicians, and it would be either totally ignored, or it would be subjected to calumny.

Since then, the paper pointed out, Professor Jorga has become Prime Minister, and as such he can no longer decline the leadership in the fight against antisemitism.

Soon after his assumption of the Premiership, Professor Jorga, to the great satisfaction of the Jews, addressed a letter to the Patriarch of the Roumanian Church, urging him to take more drastic measures to prevent his priests engaging in un-Christian incitement against a section of the population, and not to shrink from dismissing them from their posts, if they are found engaging in such agitation.

ANOTHER ANTISEMITIC TERRORIST ACQUITTED IN ROUMANIA: STUDENT WHO ATTEMPTED ASSASSINATION OF VICE-MINISTER IN MANIU GOVERNMENT A YEAR AGO.

Bucharest, June 27th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The student Beza, who attempted a year ago to assassinate M. Anghelescu, the Vice-Minister of the Interior, in the Maniu Government, has been acquitted.

The attempted assassination of M. Anghelescu in the midst of the serious antisemitic outbreaks in Roumania in July 1930, caused a storm in Roumania, leading to the disclosure that the Chef de Cabinet of the then Minister of the Interior, M. Vayda-Voyvod, a man named Tazladanu, was himself a member of the antisemitic terrorist organisation, the Iron Guard, with which M. Vayda-Voyvod maintained contact through him. Tazladanu was deprived of his post, and was placed under house-arrest, and for a time M. Vayda-Voyvod, too, was expected to be dismissed. His resignation did not occur, however, for several months, until the resignation of the Premier, M. Maniu, when the Mironescu Government came into office.

The agitation which was started at the time led, however, to the uncovering of the antisemitic terrorist movement, and the arrest of the antisemitic terrorist leader, Zelea Codreanu, on the charge of extolling Beza's attempted assassination of the Vice-Minister, whom he had believed to have been endeavouring to suppress their organisation and of inciting to murder by publishing violent anti-Jewish manifestos. When the trial took place, however, in the middle of August, Codreanu was acquitted of that charge, only to be put on trial again, soon after, on the charge of having instigated the attempted assassination of the editor of the "Adeverul", M. Socor, by another student named Dumitrescu.

ANTISEMITIC STUDENTS AT MUNICH UNIVERSITY START HUNT AGAINST BAPTISED JEWISH PROFESSOR.

Berlin, June 27th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

Professor Naviasky, a baptised Jew, who is Professor of Constitutional Law at Munich University, is the victim of a big campaign for his dismissal which has been started by the Hitlerist students at the University, with the support of the Hitlerist chief organ, the "Voelkischer Beobachter", which appears in Munich. The reason given for the campaign is that the Professor said in the course of a lecture that the Peace Treaties of Brest-Litovsk and of Bucharest are just as harsh as the Treaty of Versailles under which Germany is suffering. The Hitlerist students organised immediately a demonstration in the lecture room and demanded that "the Jew must be dismissed". Students who rallied to his defence were beaten by

the Hitlerists. Professor Naviaskey tried to find another hall in which to continue his lecture, but he was set upon in the corridors by the Hitlerist students. Order was restored only when the Rector promised the Hitlerist students that he would open an investigation against Professor Naviaskey.

JEWSH PROFESSOR APPOINTED RECTOR OF UTRECHT UNIVERSITY.

Amsterdam, June 27th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

Professor Leonard Solomon Ornstein, the famous physicist, has been appointed by the Government as Rector Magnificus at the University of Utrecht, for the year beginning July 1931.

Professor Ornstein, who is 51 years of age, is Director of the Physics Institute of the University of Utrecht. He is a leading member of the Zionist-Revisionist movement in Holland. He is a member of the Curatorium of the Hebrew University in Jerusalem, and responsible for the Institute of Physics at the Hebrew University.

MIZRACHIST WORLD PRESIDUM RESIGNS AT WORLD CONVENTION IN BASLE SEQUEL TO GERMAN MIZRACHI'S OPPOSITION TO WITHDRAWAL OF ZIONIST REPRESENTATIVES FROM ZIONIST WORLD EXECUTIVE.

Basle, June 27th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The entire Presidium of the Mizrahi World Organisation, consisting of Rabbi Meir Berlin, Rabbi J. L. Fischman, of Jerusalem, and Rabbi Aaron Teitelbaum, of New York, resigned today at the World Convention of the Mizrachist Organisation, which is now in session here.

The resignation is the sequel to the determined opposition of the German Mizrachist delegation to the withdrawal of the Mizrahi representatives, Rabbi Berlin and Mr. Lazarus Barth, from the Zionist World Executive, contending that the Mizrahi must confine itself to religious and cultural activities and not take part in political conflicts. The German Delegation threatened that the German Mizrahi would break away from the Mizrahi World Organisation, if the Convention approved Rabbi Berlin's opposition to the Weizmann leadership. In order to avoid a split, Rabbi Berlin and his two colleagues in the Mizrahi World Execidium, resigned. About 90 per cent. of the delegates at the Convention, it is claimed, are in agreement, however, with the attitude of Rabbi Berlin and the Mizrahi World Presidium.

The Convention is being continued under the chairmanship of ex-Deputy Farbstein, the leader of the Polish Mizrahi, who is also Vice-Chairman of the Actions Committee of the Zionist World Organisation.

At the Conference of the German Mizrahi held in May a resolution was adopted which was practically an ultimatum to the Mizrachist World leadership. If the demands embodied in the resolution are rejected at the World Convention, it was stated, there will be a split in the World Mizrahi followed by the Opposition forming a separate Left Mizrahi Federation.

The German Mizrahi leaders claim to have the support of the Dutch Mizrahi, a large section of the Mizrahi in Czecho-Slovakia, several smaller Mizrahi groups in other countries, and considerable sections of the Zeire Mizrahi and the Hapoel Mizrahi.

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
