EVE OF SEVENTEENTH ZIONIST CONGRESS: ALMOST ALL DELEGATES
ALREADY IN BASIE: BUSY HOLDING GROUP CONFERENCES.

Basle, June 28th. (Jowish Telegraphic Agency).

The large hall of the Muster Messe Building where the
Seventeenth Zionist Congress will be opened on Tuesday night,
looked to-day, three days before the opening, like a great
basear, thronged by hundreds of delegates and visitors from all
parts of the world. Almost all the delegates to the Congress
have already arrived and are busy attending Conferences of their
prespective groups.

About 258 delegates are expected to attend the Congress, made up of 87 General Zionists, 20 Labourites, 50 Revisionists, 36 Mizzechists and 7 Radicals.

THE WEIZMANN QUESTION AT THE CONGRESS.

Basle, June 28th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

Although the General Zionists, numbering 87 delegates, constitute the largest single group at the Congress, they are not united among themselves on the issues before the Congress, particularly the question of Dr. Weizmann's leadership. The majority, including most of the American delegates of the present Brandeis-Mack Administration of the Zionist Organisation of America, are trying to bring about a coalition of all parties, including the Revisionists, but eliminating Dr. Weizmann and the avowed Weizmannists.

Dr. M. D. Eder, the President of the English Zionist Pederation, is endeavouring on the other hand to concentrate the General Zionists round the British Empire delegation, with a view to constituting a bloc committed to continue the Weizmann as leader if he is willing to continue to serve. In opposition to the Revisionist attitude, Dr. Eder is aiming to get all groups to agree to postpone discussion on the ultimate aim of Zionism and to concentrate on immediate practical questions.

A coelition Executive, without the participation of either the Revisionists or of Dr. Weizmann was suggested to-day at a Conference called by Deputy Gruenbaum, the leader of the small Radical group which was strended by the Radical delegates, the Falestine Labour delegates, the delegates of the English Zionist Federation and the South African delegates. Deputy Gruenbaum explained that his purpose was to achieve unity between the various groups in their attitude towards the Zionist Executive. All the Zionist fractions except the Revisionists were invited to the Conference, but it was sparsely attended, and the General Zionists of Palestine were conspicuously absent.

No definite conclusions were reached, on account of the attitude of the English Zionist Federation delegation, who declared that they do not consider the Weizmann issue disposed of. The Radicals, however, are definitely committed against any continuation of Dr. Weizmann as leader.

The Palestine Labour delegation declared that they stand for an anti-Revisionist coalition, but that they do not identify themselves with any movement, either for or against any particular person, since the important question to them is that of programme.

Basle, June 28th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). How to enable the General Zionists to present a united front was the question considered at a meeting of the American delegation, steened by both the Brandelsist and the Weizmann-ist groups, in the American Zionist Organisation held this evening and continuing till midnight. It was decided to propos to the Conference of General Zionists convened for to-morrow It was decided to propose (Monday) by Dr. Schwarzbart of Cracow, the leader of the General Zionists of Western Gelidia, that it should adopt the programme of the Administration of the American Zionist Organisation on the point that instead of a President of the Zionist World Organisation there should be a Presidium, thus disposing of the Wrighmanton there should be a Fresholum, thus disposing of the Weizmann issue. If the American programme is accepted by the other General Zionist groups, the American delegation will formulate more definite proposals. The submission of the extaining programme is impossible owing to sharp differences between the former Lipsky Administration and the present Brandeis-Mack Administration in the American Zionist Administration over the Weizmann question. The Lipsky group; including Mr. Jacob Weizmann question. The Lipsky group; including Mr. Jacob Fischman, the editor of the "Jawish Morning Journal", and Dr. Margoshes, the editor of the "Day", claim that the American programme is now untenable, and cannot bind the delegates, while the Brandeisist group now in control of the Administration, led by Judge Juliah W. Mack, Mr. Robert Szold, and Mr. Jacob de Reas, insist that the programme stands.

The spectre of Revisionism is hovering over the majority of the American delegates, Mr . Fischman says. A rumour has been going round even that Mr. Jacob de Haas and Mr. Abraham Tulin have been officially negotiating with Mr. Jabotinsky, but this was categorically denied at to-night's meeting.

If there is not to be a Jewish State in Palestine, then we religious Jews have nothing to do in the Mizrachi or in the Zionist movement, was the view expressed to-day by a large number of speakers at the continued session of the Mizrachi World Convention here, in discussing a preposal by Rabbi Fishman, one of the three members of the retiring Mirrachi World Presidium, that the Mizrachi should alter its official programme to read: The Mizrachi aim at the establishment of a Jewish State in Palestine on the basis of the Torah and Jewish tradition.

The Convention is continuing to discuss behind closed doors the crisis in the Mizrachi movement created by the resignation of its Presidium following the threat of secession made by the German Mizrachi delegation. A large number of speakers declared themselves in support of the Mizrachi leaders in their opposition to Dr. Weizmann's statement in Berlin that Palestine should be built as a bi-national State and in contradiction to the German delegation supported Rabbi Berlin also in his action in resigning from the Zionist World Excoutive. The German delegation were censured for creating a crisis, and they were appealed to not to carry their threat into effect and thus split the Mizrachi movement.

EMPLOYMENT OF JEWISH LABOUR IN PALESTINE GOVERNMENT WORKS: TOO EXPENSIVE COLONEL HOWARD-BURY SUGGESTS IN HOUSE OF COMMONS: COMPLAINS SIMILAR WORK BEING PAID FOR AT TWO DIFFERENT HAVES ACCORDING TO WORKERS RELIGION: RAISE ARAB STANDARD TO JEWISH INDEPENDENT LABOUR LEADER FENNER BROCKWAY INTERPOSES: THAT IS OBJECT WE DESIRE SAYS DR.

London, June 29th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).
Since the Prime Minister's letter to Dr. Weizmann the Palestine Government had now to employ a number of Jews in all Government contracts and the rate of wages paid to the Jews is higher than that paid for the same work to the Arabs, who have in addition to work longer hours, and would the Under-Scoretary of State for the Colonies Look into the matter, & Colonel Howard-Bury (Conservative), the leader of the pro-rab group in the House of Commons, sated in the House of Commons this afternoon.

The words used in the Prime Minister's letter, Dr. Shiels replied, were: "With regard to public and municipal works falling to be financed out of public funds, the claim of Jewish labour to a due share of the employment available, taking into account Jewish contributions to public revenue shall be taken into consideration". That is the policy, he said, which the High Commissioner is engaged in carrying out.

Palestine Labour leader, interviewed to-day the High Commissioner, Sir John Chancellor, to complain to him of the non-employment of Jews on Government and Municipal works.

Sir John Chancellor said in his reply that no solution had yet been found of the whole question of the employment of Jews on public works. He added that he had ordered the heads of Departments, however, to employ Jewish labour. A Labour delegation has also interviewed the Deputy District Commissioner of Jerusalem, saking him to see that at least helf the public works should go to Jews. The Deputy District Commissioner promised to look into the proposal.

POLAND CUTTING EXPENSES "AXES" TRADE DEPARTMENT IN PALESTINE: JEWISH EX-DEPUTY FAUSNER RESIGNS POST.

Warsaw, June 28th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Ex-Deputy Hausner, who was previously one of the Zionist membors of the Club of Jewish Deputies in the Folish Zachist memors of the tall of Jesus hospitals in the folial Parliament, has resigned his jost as Folish Commercial Representative in Tel Aviv, in consequence, it is understood, of the abolition of the office which was created for him a few years ago, as part of the general economy cumpaign undertaken by the Government in connection with which large numbers of Government officials are being dismissed and many others are having their salaries reduced commencing in August.

ECHO. OF ANTI-JEWISH OUTBREAK AT ZLOCZOW: LEADER OF JEWISH COMMUNITY GORS TO PRISON FOR A MONTH, ON LIBEL ACTION BROUGHT BY SCHOOL TEACHER DENYING CHARGE THAT HE SHOT AT JEWISH WOMAN DURING OUTBREAK.

Motel Markowicz, a member of the Executive of the Jewish Community of the township of Zloczow, near Lods, where a serious anti-Jewish outbreak occurred on June 4th. during the Corpus Chmisti procession there, has been sentenced to four weeks! arrest, on a charge of libel brought against him by a school-teacher named Jarmickl, whom he has accused of having shot during the outbreak at a Jewish woman named Normann.

Markowicz pleaded that the case should be adjourned till the trial of the persons charged with participation in the anti-Jewish excesses takes place, declaring that the evidence forthcoming at the trial would prove his charge against Jarmicki. The Court refused, however, to consider his plea.

NUMERUS CLAUSUS ALLEGED IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS IN WARSAW SAYS YIDDISH DAILY: NO CHANCE OF JEWISH ADMISSIONS BEYOND TOX NORM PARENTS BEING TOLD BY SCHOOL PRINCIPALS IT SAYS.

There is a numerus clausus being enforced in the Secondary schools in Warsaw, limiting the number of Jewish students aemitted to each class to four, says the Yiddish daily "Najer Hajnt" here. Several school principals are telling Jewish parents, it declares, that there is no chance of Jewish students being admitted in excess of the 10 per cent. norm, suggesting that this is due to a hint received from the central educational authorities.

There are no restrictions against Jews, however, at the secondary schools in the provincial towns, the paper adds, because these schools are experiencing a severe shortage of

students.

BIG JEWISH HEALTH CENTRE FOR EAST LONDON PROJECTED DR. REDCLIFFE SALAMAN REVEALS PRESIDING AT JEWISH PEALTH ORGANISATION ANNUAL MEETING

London, June 28th, (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The idea of a big Jewish Health Centre in the East End of London provided with a large garden, swimming baths, exercise ground, infant nursery, stc., supplying facilities for physical exercise, recreation, family welfare and health education for children and adults alike, was dwel to by Dr. Redeliffs Salaman, the well-known anthropologist, when he pre-sided yesterday at the annual meeting of the Jewish Health Organisation of Great Eritain, of which he is President (and Vice-President of the World Organisation Ose;)

randament of the world organisation over;

There was a growing need, an unlimited field for second service, Dr. Saleman said. One of their great propal blems was the clearence of slums. The proposal to establish such a Health Centre in the East End had been with them from the beginning of their work, he said, and the time had now come to consider it seriously in order to provide facilities such as are not provided by the existing organisations or by the State. Such a Centre, in addition to various other facili-ties, would also previde opportunities for the regular physic-al overfauling so essential, and for preventive treatment. The Oze, he pointed out, already has such centres in existence in Kown and in Kishineff, the first two of the kind in the world.

world. Mr. A. H. Levy, the Chairman of the Organisation, spoke of the work done by the dental clinic established recently by the organisation for the treatment of adolescents, to bridge the period after which treatment is afforded for children in the schools and before it is provided for adults by the approved societies. There had been talk of extend-ing the scope of the statistical investigations conducted by the Organisation into Jewish Community life, he went on, but unfortunately they found a great deal of reluctance among people to provide facilities. The old prejudices still exhad existed 100 years ago in respect to the supply of census information.

The Haham Dr. Gaster, a Vice-President, commented that it appeared that there was need to clear the mental slums of ignorance and prejudice before they could clear the physical slums.

Difficulty Of Obtaining Jewish Homes For Children Who Have To Be Flaced In Non-Jewish Homes Including Salvation Army

Professor Charles S. Myers, the famous psychologist, Director of the National Institute of Industrial Psychology, Director of the National Institute of industrial reventers, former President of the Pritish Psychological Society and of the International Congress of Psychology, a Vice-President of the Organisation and Chairman of its Child Guidance Clinic Committee, said that their Child Guidance Clinic was becoming famous. KRONFELD ESTABLISHES ANOTHER GLIDING RECORD: DUKE OF SUTHER-LAND RESEMBS £1,000 PRIZE WON FOR GLIDING ACROSS CHANNEL: CONGRATULARED BY KX-KING ALFONS AND AUSTRIAN MINISTER.

It seemed he would never descend, for after gaining a height of 2,400 feet, he was able to maintain it almost indefinitely. Ex-King Alfonso congratulated Herr Kronfeld, and the Austrian Minister declared that the reception accorded to his young countrymen indicated the friendly feeling which Great Britain had for Austria and which Austria warmly reciprocated.

CAMILLE PISSARRO EXHIBITION AT TATE GALLERY: DOYEN OF THE IM-PRESSIONISTS.

London, June 29th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

An exhibition of oil peintings by Gemille Pissarro, the great Jewish arkist, who died in 1903 at the age of 73, has been opened at the Tate Callery, the National Callery at Millbank.

Londoner's will have every opportunity this summer of acquiring a wider knowledge of the work of Camille Pisserro, the doyen of the French Impressionists, the Telegraph writes, for in addition to the full-dress exhibition at the Tate Gallery the Leicester Galleries have just arranged a small but most attractive exhibition of his pastels and water-colour drawings.

I had a talk with M. Lucien Pissarro, the artist's son, and himself a well-known artist, at the Leicester Galleries, the writer says, and when I remarked on the rarity of his father's early work, he reminded me that Camille Pissarro did not begin to paint till he was about thirty. After he had worked for ten years, the Franco-Prussian Wer broke out and German troops in their march upon Paris were billeted in his house and destroyed practically every picture there.

Besides Lucien Pissarro, two other some of Camille Pissarro, Paul and Ludovic, are well-known painters, and two of his grand-daughters, Pauline and Orovida, are also artists of note.
