Russia Acts to Raze Ancient

Jewish Ghetto in Derbent (Jewish Telegraphic Agency) MOSCOW, July 9-The Soviet government today instructed the city ad-ministration of Derbent, a fortified

seaport in the Soviet republic of Dagestan (Caucasus) to abolish the Jewish ghetto there which dates from me-dieval times and to let the 500 Jews living in this ghetto to find better The destruction of the quarters. ghetto will be a further step in the emancipation of the Iews of Derbent. The city of Derbent was founded by

the Persian king Kohbad at the beginning of the sixth century to protect Persian territory against the raids of the Chazars who were later converted to Judaism. In 733 the entire city was converted to Islam. The Jew-ish population is descended from the military colony established between 530 and 578 A. D. When Derbent was one of the lead-

ing cities of the Chazar empire, the Jewish population was an important element. The number of Jews decreased when the Tartar raids began and later when Shah Nadir forced the Jews to accept Islam on the pain of death. In 1813 Derbent came into the possession of Russia.

Until recently Derbent was the religious and cultural center of the Caucasian mountain Jews. A century ago Derbent boasted of 435 Jews and this number was tripled by 1886. Entered as 2nd Class Matter No. 2004. Plenary Session of Zionist Congress to Vote on Important Committee Resolutions Today (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BASLE, July 9-After a brief session this morning at which one resolution was adopted, the Zionist Congress adjourned its plenary session until tomorrow morning in order to give the various commissions more time to complete their labors. It is expected that all committees will have their resolutions and reports ready for submission at to-

morrow's session. In the meantime everything points to the creation of a coalition administra-tion without Dr. Chaim Weizmann and with the Revisionists excluded. The po-litical commission, which has been in continuous session since yesterday, when it held a joint meeting with the steering committee, is expected to adopt a communities, is expected to adopt a compromise resolution on the issue of a Jewish majority in Palestine saying that the Congress hopes that British policy will act in accordance with the ultimate aim of Zionism for a Jewish majority in Palestine. It appears likely that the Revisionists

will vote for such a resolution but they will not join the Executive, although they may support it after it is elected. The American group headed by Judge Julian W. Mack, the Mizrachi and a great number of the General Zionists are endeavoring to break the deadlock in this direction. The Laborites have not yet definitely committed themselves as to their attitude.

Last night the Laborites received telegraphic instructions from the Jewish them to continue their support of Dr. Weizmann. If, however, a situation is created which makes support of Dr. Weizmann impossible the 80 Laborite delegates are then empowered to vote for a coalition administration without the Revisionists. JEWISH DAILY BULLETIN Orthodox Rabbis Condemn Birth Control: Conservative Groups

Refer Issue to Committee (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONG BRANCH, N. J., June 9-Re-solutions favoring the five-day working week, condemning discrimination against Jews in employment and in educational institutions, commending President Hoover's accomplishment of international debt suspension, endorsing world disarmament and condemning the Michigan alien registration law as "incompatible with the spirit of the American Constitution," were passed at the closing session of the Rabbinical Assembly of America yesterday.

Rabbi Israel H. Levinthal of the Brooklyn Jewish Center was re-elected president of the Rabbinical Assembly. Other officers elected were Rabbi Jacob Kohn of New York, vice-president; Rabbi Benjamin Birnbaum of Chicago, treasurer; Rabbi Leon S. Lang of Newark, recording secretary, and Rabbi Si-mon Greenberg of Philadelphia, corresponding secretary.

The question of birth control roused

a controversy at the rabbinical convention, and after a discussion it was referred to the committee on the interpretation of the Jewish law, which is to study the question and report at next year's convention.

A resolution was also adopted to appoint a committee to define the attitude of Conservative Judaism towards the Cyrus Adler's suggestion to make the last day of Succoth a Seminary Day was also adopted. It was also decided to maintain a rabbinical summer school and to publish a Jewish scientific jour-

nal Rabbi A. M. Heller of Brooklyn introduced resolutions pledging support to Palestine and European relief and to cable greetings to the Zionist Congress in Basle. These resolutions were adopted.

Endorse Debt Moratorium

Rabbi Moses Abels introduced resolutions endorsing a debt moratorium as furthering international good will, a fiveday working week as just and helpful to Sabbath observance and protesting against groups and religions in industry and colleges as un-American. The rabbis petitioned both employers and the government to take immediate and adequate steps to relieve the present distress. On motion of Rabbi Morris Silverman of Hartford the convention went on record as being opposed to any calendar change which might endanger the Sabbath.

Another resolution passed by the Rabbinical Assembly opposes military training in American colleges. Prof. M. M. Kaplan secured a unanimous declaration urging synagogues not to sacrifice educational standards and qualified Hebrew teachers for the sake of economy. Prof. Kaplan also advocated a rabbinical apprentice system for young graduates, and was supported in this by Rabbis Hillel Kaewar of Denver and Charles Hoffman of Newark.

Jewish Population of Chita Drops 75 Percent in Decade

CHITA, Siberia, July 9-The number of Jews in Chita, one of the important trading centers of Siberia, has been reduced from 6,000 to 1,500 since the end of the World War. The falling off in the Jewish population is laid to two factors, the most important being the fact that the capital of the Soviet Far East-ern Republic has been moved from Chita to Chabarovsk. Another factor responsible for the re-

duction of Chita's Jewish populace is the concentration of Soviet reconstruction activities in such cities as Vladivostok and Nikolaievsk

What Iews there in Chita are the descendants of exiles sent to Siberia by came here in the 1860's and 1870's. construction of the Baikal railroad and the Russo-Japanese war led to an influx of Jewish population.

Hebrew Orphan Home Gets Ezekiel's Studio Register

An autograph album which was the Ezekiel, sculptor, of Rome, Italy, has just been presented to the Hebrew Orphan Asylum, by the estate of the sculptor, one of whose best known groups, the Jesse Seligman Memorial stands in the entrance hall of the Orphanage. The memorial was unveiled on April

Says Potential Markets Create Huge Possibilities for Future Of Palestinian Industries

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM, July 9—Because of a potential market of 16,000,000 Jews throughout the world and because Palestine's proximity to all of the Eastern countries gives them an outlet for Palestinian products, industry in Palestine has enormous possibilities for growth and expansion, M. Shenkar, president of the Manufacturers' Association of Palestine, declared today in an interview with the Palestine Daily Bulletin.

Owing to rapidity of transport and travel and relatively low shipping charges, Palestine will be able to occupy the Oriental markets, especially those of Egypt, as well as of Syria where commission agents are already distributing Palestine products, Mr. Shenkbar pointed out. Palestine's output should also find ready access to Iraq and Persia while the Indian market has already shown that large quantities of Palestine products can be sold there, he declared. The world Jewish market can be of indescribable value to Palestine industry if the proper sort of propaganda is used abroad, especially among Jewish women who should be urged to buy soap, oil, almonds, honey and wine made in Palestine, Mr. Shenkbar said.

Judaism Sanctifies Marriage

Birth control is contrary to the tenets of the Orthodox Jewish faith, according to a resolution opposing it which was adopted at the concluding session of the convention of the Assembly of Hebrew Orthodox Rabbis of the United States and Canada, or Keneseth Ho'Rabanim. The resolution declares that birth control is against natural as well as Jew-ish law and states that "Judaism not

Another resolution adopted by the Keneseth Ho'Rabanim opposes any change in the calendar which would endanger the fixity of the Sabbath. This resolution is to be submitted to the members of the different congregations, and as each congregation adopts it a notice to that effect will be sent to President Hoover and to the Secretary-General of the League of Nations.

The New York state board of regents was asked by the Orthodox rabbis in another resolution not to force students of Tewish extraction to take examinations on any of the Jewish holidays. The convention also discussed a proposal to ask officials of the Yeshiva College to be impartial to all Orthodox rabbinical organizations.

A proposal that a committee of five rabbis each from the Keneseth Ho'Rabanim and the Agudath Ho'Rabanim be appointed to settle disputes between these two rival Orthodox rabbinical organizations was also adopted

Officers of the Keneseth Ho'Rabanim were elected as follows: Rabbi Wolf Margolies, president; Rabbis Mendelsohn, Hurwitz, Epstein, Mapaz, Posner, Margolin, Sadin and Lipschitz, vicepresidents; Rabbi Joseph Halevy, secretary and Rabbi Manasseh Margolies, treasurer.

Nazis Move for More Vigorous Anti-Semitic Agitation to Retain Hold on Populace (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, July 9-A more vigorous anti-Jewish agitation throughout Germany is the latest move of the National-Socialist leaders in a frantic effort to keep the masses with them, leaders of the Central Association of German Citizens of Jewish Faith declared tonight. It is pointed out that President Hoover's war debt moratorium has frustrated the hopes of the Nazi chieftains of keeping the populace discontented and therefore they have decided to turn the interest of the masses to Jew-hatred.

M. Mutscham, a Nazi deputy and a prominent Dresden industrialist, declared at a meeting today that synagogues will burn in order that the ten year fight of the Nazis should not be The chief Nazi organ, the in vain. Voelkischer Beobachter, today charges the Jews with sponsoring "daily mur-ders" of Nazi members. "The Jews are ders" of Nazi members. turning Germany into a murderous Russia, but we'll destroy the Jewish pest which is responsible for Germany's misfortune," the paper declares.

Saloniki Jews Moved by Offer Of Aid from Kin in New York (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

SALONIKI, July 9-An offer of help from Salonican Jews resident in New York, cabled through the Jewish Telegraphic Agency to the pogrom-stricken Jewish community of Saloniki, greatly moved the leaders of the community tonight. Deputy Bessantchi, with the cable in his hand, immediately called on Elie Benusiglio, president of the Jewish Com-munal Council, who called that body into immediate session to prepare a reply to the New York offer. In the meantime a Greco-Jewish

league has been formed to clear up the misunderstanding between the two races. The first meeting of the league will be held Saturday.

At the same time the investigation into the attack on the Campbell quarter, June 29, is proceeding slowly. Today the examining magistrate quizzed a Christian chauffeur who is alleged to have been one of the ringleaders of the attack on the Tewish quarter. Both the Jewish and Greek press are now refraining from comment on the situation at the urgent request of Governor Gonatas. The papers, however, are featuring Premier Venizelos' statement to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, reassuring the Jewish world.

The Jewish community today sent a message to Governor Gonatas expressing their unshakable loyalty to Greece following a newspaper allegation that part of the Jews of Saloniki are supporting Macedonian autonomy against Greece. The Jewish community recalled to the governor that Rabbi Jacob Meier of Jerusalem declared some time ago that the Salonican Tews are completely identified with a Hellenistic Macedonia.

Britain to Publish Details Of \$12,500,000 Development

During this week of grace. however, it is unlikely that there will be any question of adjustments or changes in the substance of the scheme because the Colonial Office considers the matter settled so far as it is concerned.

It is known that some weeks ago the Zionist Executive decided to request the Colonial Office, at the suggestion of the Zionist political com-mission, to wait with the announcement until a new Executive was elected, feeling that the retiring Executive could not at the last moment be expected to take the responsibility for such an important matter nor should the incoming Executive be placed be-

fore a fait accompli.

The Colonial Office at first hand had apparently agreed to hold off publication of the scheme's details until after the Zionist Congress and this change of mind is inexplicable to Zionist circles.

Simultaneously with the publication of the details of the development scheme in Palestine, an official an-nouncement will be made in Parliament giving the details of the proposed plan, it was learned today. It is not expected, however, that the gov-ernment will for the present ask Parliament's sanction for the \$12,500,000 loan that is to finance the scheme.

This question, it is expected, will be deferred until the director of development has investigated the situation and submitted his report to the Colonial Office in London.

A copy of a covering letter from Lord Passfield, Colonial Secretary, which accompanies the dispatch, as well as a copy of the text of the dispatch, was received here and it resulted in a heated discussion at the political commission's all-night session. The commission considers the document unfavorable.

The principal request of the Jewish Agency, which has been carrying on negotiations with the British govern-ment regarding the development scheme, namely that it should be determined in advance that Jews and Arabs should benefit equally from the \$12,500,000 fund which is to finance the scheme, is not complied with. Lord Passfield's letter merely says that the government took note of the request.

Survey Shows Jewish College Students Know Little of Jewish History of Great Jewish Names

There seems to be no evidence of the so-called inferiority complex among Jewish college students, according to a conclusion reached by Dr. Julius B. Maller, research associate in Teachers' College of Columbia University, who presents the results of a test which he gave to 200 Jewish students in secular schools who had little or no formal Jewish education, in an article appear-ing in the April-June issue of "Jewish Education." The tests comprised questions covering the background, the Jewish knowledge, Jewish attitudes and personal adjustments of the students. Other conclusions reached by Dr.

Maller as a result of this test are 1. The forms of recreation which are favorites among Jewish students are largely cultural in nature.

arity with the names of great Jews, and are badly misinformed in that connec-4. Tewish students show a fair knowl-

edge of Jewish customs and ceremonies, but extremely little knowledge of Jewish history.

5. There is little correlation between the extent of Jewish knowledge and the degree of observing Jewish practices among Jewish students.

6. The reasons given by Jewish students for observing Jewish practices are religious conviction, social pressure and national solidarity.

7. Jewish students rate themselves much more frequently to be of positive than of negative or neutral attitude toward their Jewishness. There is a marked correlation between the stu-dents' self-rating and their actual scores on a test of Jewish attitudes.
