Palestine May Legalize Entry Of All Jews Who Arrived Irregularly Since Last Census

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM, July 21—All Jews who entered Palestine in an irregular manner since the last census of population was taken will have their entry legalized by permitting them all to register as immigrants, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learned today. This is to be part of a general amnesty in connection with the approaching census.

The presence in Palestine of a large number of Jews, variously estimated at between ten and twenty thousand, who entered or remained in the country irregularly, forms one of the difficult problems for which a solution must be found before the forthcoming census. While the Immigration Department considers the figure to approximate perhaps as high as 20,000, mostly Jews, Jewish authorities are inclined to accept less than half of this figure for Jewish "delinquents."

The majority of those in this category came on tourist visas and remained beyond the three months period. Of these, many have taken steps to qualify as immigrants. In recent years this element formed a substantial part of the Jewish immigrants into the country, the monthly immigration figures showing a considerable number of Jews who have received permission to remain permanently.

During 1930, 1,306 persons who entered Palestine irregularly eventually received permission to remain as immigrants. To this number the Immigration Department added another 3,000 who entered Palestine as travelers on tourist visas or by evading the passport controls.

Both Sir John Hope Simpson's report and the subsequent White Paper referred to the presence of a large number of immigrants who have evaded the law, but did not specify what proportion of the six or seven thousand were Jews, and what proportion were Syrians, Egyptians and Arabs who managed to evade frontier control.

Reading to Aid Drafting Of Indian Constitution

LONDON, July 21—Lord Reading, former Viceroy of India and one of England's greatest statesmen, has been appointed one of the Liberal Party's representatives to the round table conference on India which will meet here in September to draft a constitution for India. Lord Reading played a prominent role in the first Indian round table conference.

Professor Cassuto Marks 25th Year of Scientific Activities

FLORENCE, Italy—July 21—Prof. Umberto Cassuto, noted Italian-Jewish savant and historian, is now celebrating the twenty-fifth anniversary of his scientific activities. Dr. Cassuto is professor of Semitic languages at the University of Florence and was for a time also Chief Rabbi of Florence. He has published a number of historical works, of which "The History of the Jews in Florence During the Renaissance Epoch" received official praise from the old scientific academy "Dei Lincei" in Rome.

Palestine Revisionists Will Back Jabotinsky Secession

JERUSALEM, July 21—If the Palestine Revisionists have their way the Revisionists will secede from the World Zionist Organization, in which they have been the opposition, and create a new Zionist Organization. The executives of the Palestine Revisionists, the Brith Trumpeldor, the Revisionist youth organization, the Revisionist workers and the editors of Haam, the Revisionist Palestine organ, today cabled to Vladimir Jabotinsky that "we are with you as the creator of a new Zionist Organization."

Immediately after the conclusion of the Zionist Congress, Jabotinsky took a six months leave of absence from the Revisionist party because of internal differences as to the Revisionist attitude to the Zionist Organization. A serious split exists in the party ranks on the question of whether the Revisionists should remain within the Zionist Organization, and if they do remain, to what extent they should participate in the work of the Organization.

A world Revisionist conference to discuss this question as well as Jabotinsky's leadership of the party is to be held in December. The Palestine Revisionist conference, to decide on the same matter, has been postponed from July 27 to July 31. At the annual conference of the Palestine Revisionists last November in Tel Aviv a resolution was adopted called upon the World Executive of the Zionist Revisionists to take immediate steps to secede from the World Zionist Organization. This resolution, however, did not have the united support of all Palestine Revisionists.

The division among the Palestine Revisionists is the same as that in Europe, with the followers of Dr. Richard Lichtheim of Germany and Meer Grossman of England, favoring the carrying on of Revisionist principles within the Zionist Organization, while the adherents of Jabotinsky want to create a new and independent organization.

Reports of Outrages on Jews Of Kurdistan Exaggerated, British Colonial Office Finds

LONDON, July 21—Reports of outrages upon the Jews of Kurdistan were today termed exaggerated in a statement by the British Colonial Office to J. M. Rich, secretary of the Board of Deputies of British Jews and of the Joint Foreign Committee of the Board and of the Anglo-Jewish Association. The Colonial Office's statement was based on an investigation made by the acting High Commissioner of Iraq.

The statement of the Colonial Office says "with reference to your inquiry regarding the Jewish situation in Kurdistan, I am directed by Lord Passfield to inform you that the acting High Commissioner for Iraq has caused the matter to be investigated, and reports that there are in Amadaya not 30 but 81 houses of Jews who are known to have been quite happy at the end of May. The only incident recorded there in the last six months is the murder of one Jew on a near-by mountain. Arrests were promptly made from three villages and blood money was recovered in full."

Mr. Rich's inquiry was based on a Jewish Telegraphic Agency dispatch from Jerusalem on June 30 reporting that Jewish refugees from Kurdistan reaching Jerusalem had complained of outrages upon the Jewish population in Kurdistan, including a number of murders and the kidnapping of Jewish women. In Amadaya, the refugees said, five out of the 30 Jewish families living there had been murdered, and two Jewish women had been kidnapped.

The Colonial Office's statement points out that at Zakho, where there are 220 Jewish families, no crime against them has been reported in the last six months, save the robbery of donkeys and groceries from a Jew by a Turkish, not Iraqi, bandit. No case of any kind has been reported within the last year affecting the 180 Jewish families at Agra Qadha, while at Dohug, one Jew was murdered by outlaws in the last six months, and three of these have been arrested and steps to round up the remainder are already progressing, the Colonial Office reports.

Jewish Fast of Tisha

B'Ab Begins To-Night

The fast of Tisha B'Ab, which is observed by Jews throughout the world in commemoration of the destruction of the First and Second Temples, begins at sundown tonight and ends at sundown tomorrow. Besides abstaining from food, Orthodox Jews will observe the fast by special services in the synagogues to-night and tomorrow morning. The reading of the Book of Lamentations, the authorship of which is attributed to the prophet Jeremiah, known as "the great Lamentor," is the principal feature of the service.

By a peculiar coincidence, to which the pious attach special significance, the destruction of the First Temple, which marked the downfall of the first Jewish Commonwealth and the destruction of the Second Temple, which brought the Second Commonwealth to an end, occurred on the ninth day of the month of Ab. The First Temple was destroyed by the Chaldean monarch Nebuchadnezzar in the year 586 B.C. and the Second by the Romans under Titus in the year 70 of the Christian era.

It has become a custom to make contributions on this fast day to philanthropic causes and to Jewish educational institutions. Special Tisha B'Ab services will be conducted in the Jewish religious schools affiliated with the Jewish Education Association and the Book of Lamentations will be recited by the children.

New England Zionists Cable

Support to Nahum Sokolow

BOSTON, July 21—Following a specially convened meeting of the administrative committee of the New England Zionist region under the chairmanship of acting president James D. Glantz, a resolution pledging support to Nahum Sokolow, newly-elected president of the World Zionist Organization, was cabled to him. Plans were also made to start an immediate membership campaign to call in all outstanding pledges on the American Palestine Campaign.

Bench and Bar Eulogize

Newburger at Last Rites

Funeral services for former Supreme Court Justice Joseph E. Newburger, who died on Sunday in his seventy-eighth year, were conducted yesterday afternoon by the Rev. Dr. Louis I. Newman at Temple Rodeph Sholom. The Rev. Nathan Meltzof, cantor of Temple Rodeph Sholom, conducted a memorial service at the home of Justice Newburger. Burial was in Union Fields Cemetery.

Justice Newburger had been president of Temple Rodeph Sholom for twelve years until 1896. A delegation of trustees of the congregation escorted the body from the temple pulpit to the cemetery and led the memorial service at the home. Members of the board of trustees of the Hebrew Orphan Asylum, of which Justice Newburger had been president, also attended the funeral.

The honorary pallbearers at the funeral included Chief Judge Benjamin N. Cardozo of the Court of Appeals; Associate Judge Irving Lehman of the Court of Appeals; Presiding Justice Edward R. Finch of the Appellate Division; former Presiding Justice Victor J. Dowling of the Appellate Division and Federal Judge William Bondy.

In eulogizing Justice Newburger, Supreme Court Justice Peter Schmuck declared from the bench that "he goes to his rest assured of the respect and gratitude of his fellow citizens." He praised Justice Newburger for "application, industry and perseverance" and as "a true, loyal and unselfish friend."

Italy Hails Dr. Eisenstadt

As Second Cesare Lombroso

ROME, July 21—Where Cesare Lombroso, Italy's famous criminologist and alienist left off, Dr. Jacob Eisenstadt, once a penniless Polish Jew, but now granted Italian citizenship by a special royal decree because of his important scientific contributions, carries on. The struggling young scientist who came to Naples a decade ago friendless, poverty-stricken and with no resources but his exceptional abilities is now being hailed as one of modern Italy's greatest scientists.

His ten years of study, research, and experimentation in psychiatry and criminology, the fields in which Professor Lombroso earned world-wide fame, have now won for Dr. Eisenstadt an appointment as professor of psychiatry at the University of Naples. In this post he succeeds his late teacher and friend, Prof. Leonardo Bianchi, head of the university's department of psychiatry.

Dr. Eisenstadt, who is only 33, was born in Mezricz, Poland, the son of Orthodox parents. When the Russian army evacuated Poland in 1915 he fled to Russia. There he studied at the Moscow high school and Moscow University. On the outbreak of the Russian Revolution he was obliged to drop his studies. After many hardships he reached Vienna and eventually Naples.

During his student days at the Uni-

Ornstein to Act for Rabbis

In Wailing Wall Matters

JERUSALEM, July 21—The Palestine chief rabbinate today appointed Rabbi Isaac Ornstein to be the rabbinical representative to whom the Palestine government shall issue instructions and other communications regarding the Wailing Wall, the pavement in front of it and the formalities to be observed with regard to the Jewish devotions near the Wall.

The appointment of Rabbi Ornstein is in line with the recommendations of the Wailing Wall Commission. Rabbi Ornstein's appointment has the approval of Rabbi Joseph Chaim Sonnenfeld, head of the Agudath Israel, which organization had urged High Commissioner Chancellors to appoint him to the position.

Palestine Jewry Perturbed

Over Census Arrangements

JERUSALEM, July 21—Palestine Jewry is in a state of considerable perturbation over the arrangements for the forthcoming Palestine census, fearing that the census forms are going to be exploited for anti-Jewish political manipulations. In particular, it is complained that the intention of the authorities to entrust the Mukhtars (the Arab headmen of the villages) with the conduct of the census in their villages will lead to the supply of exaggerated figures of the Arab population in Palestine.

Objections have been raised for weeks in Jewish quarters in Palestine to the proposed inclusion in the census questionnaire of one or more questions relating to the landed state, or landlessness, of the population. Official circles are inclined to believe that the census might yield to this, effect being given in connection with the White Paper, while Jewish circles regard any such question as coming under the head of queries with a political tendency.

The Jewish leaders insist that the census machinery is not calculated to produce answers on these questions, objecting that information supplied under certain conditions may only tend to mislead the public on such a vital question, which should be made the subject of a special investigation.

"The Palestine Arab Executive issued an appeal recently in connection with the census, calling on all Arabs, including the Bedouins, to participate in the census, 'in order to reveal the true numbers of the Arab population of Palestine, and the facts of their economic position.'"

Leo Lehman Named to Pittsburgh

City Planning Commission

PITTSBURGH, July 21—In recognition of the work he has done in civic activities, especially in beautifying roads and hillsides in and around Pittsburgh, the Pittsburgh city council today confirmed the appointment of Leo Lehman, president of May-Stern & Company, as a member of the Pittsburgh city planning commission.

Ruppin, Hexter and Vilkansky Mentioned as Jewish Advisors To Development Scheme Head

JERUSALEM, July 21—The official announcement that Lewis French, director of the Palestine development scheme, would have a Jewish and an Arab advisor created considerable speculation today concerning the persons who would be selected as advisors. In Jewish circles there was particular interest over who would be named as the Jewish advisor.

The three names most frequently mentioned as possible candidates for the position of Jewish advisor to Mr. French are Dr. Arthur Ruppin, Dr. Maurice Hexter and Isaac Vilkansky, all of whom are authorities on colonization problems and all three of whom dealt with Sir John Hope Simpson when he was making his investigation into problems of land settlement, development and immigration.

Vilkansky, who is a director of the Jewish National Fund and director of the Jewish Agency's experimental station, is known as one of the leading experts on Jewish and Arab farming. Dr. Ruppin, a former member of the Jewish Agency Executive, has been in charge of the colonization work here since 1921. A resident of Palestine since 1906, he is one of the outstanding authorities on colonization. Dr. Hexter, one of the American members of the new Executive of the Jewish Agency, has also taken a leading part in the colonization work during the past two years. He was one of the triumvirate in charge of the Palestine Emergency Fund.

Polish Yiddish Schools Send Fund Raiser to South America

WARSAW, July 21—The Yiddish School Organization of Poland (Zischo) has decided to send B. Tabatchinski as its special representative to the Argentine, Brazil and Uruguay for the purpose of conducting in those countries a campaign for funds for the Yiddish schools of Poland. Recently Mr. Tabatchinski, who is chairman of the Yiddish School Board of Bialystok, visited Latvia and Denmark in the interests of the Yiddish schools of Poland.

Dr. Tennenbaum Is One of Poland's Leading Zoologists

WARSAW, July 21—One of the greatest zoologists in Poland is Dr. M. Tennenbaum, director of the Jewish high school for boys "Le'Or." Dr. Tennenbaum is recognized as one of the leading zoological authorities in Europe. In recent years he headed a number of scientific expeditions abroad for the Polish government.

He brought back with him many rare specimens of animals, fish and birds which have been placed on exhibition in the government zoological museum of Warsaw, one of the largest of its kind in all Europe.

Find Tablet Resembling Famous Sinai Tablets on Site of Sodom

AMMAN, Transjordan, July 21—A tablet resembling in form the Sinai tablets discovered some years ago by Professor Grimme of the German Archaeological Institute have just been found at the Oriental city of Ghor, the site believed to be the Biblical city of Sodom, on the Transjordanian side of the Dead Sea, by excavators working under Father Mallon of the French Religious Archaeological Society.

The tablet that has now been uncovered is covered with an inscription that has not yet been made out. The new tablet differs from those found by Professor Grimme in that it is covered with unknown symbols and not hieroglyphics. The excavators have also found three separate layers, the oldest of which is believed to date from 2,200 B.C.

Soviet Yiddish Literary Circles Stirred by Charge Emes' Editor, Litvakov, Supports Menshevism

MOSCOW, July 21—A direct accusation charging Moshe Litvakov, editor of the Moscow Emes, the chief Yiddish Communist paper in Russia and long the dictator of Yiddish literature here, with spreading Menshevism and "national democratism" in Soviet Yiddish literature today created a veritable sensation in the entire Yiddish press of Russia.

The charge against Litvakov was made in an editorial in the monthly Minsk Shtern in connection with the forthcoming All-Soviet convention of Yiddish proletarian writers. Calling upon the approaching convention to put an end to Litvakovism, the paper openly charges Litvakov with five sins of commission and omission.

According to the paper Litvakov has for many years been guilty of hampering the development of proletarian literature, has compromised Yiddish writers and critics, has stimulated Menshevik and national democratic literature, has ignored public opinion and has fought self-criticism in literature.

These serious charges against Litvakov emanate from former leaders of the Jewish section of the Communist Party in Minsk but the sentiments are partly shared by Jewish writers in Moscow and Charkov who have always felt Litvakov's dictatorship but have never dared to fight it.

The Moscow Association of Yiddish Proletarian Writers has been placed in an uncomfortable position. While they have not yet joined the revolt against Litvakov they have refrained from taking his side although they admit that he has hampered the activities of the Association.

On the other hand, the Emes, Litvakov's paper, demands that the Association should take an unequivocal stand in this matter and characterizes the revolt against Litvakov as irresponsible, demagogic noise. The Emes admits that Litvakov has many faults but claims he does not merit such "slandering".

Guardian Urges Britain to Solve Palestine Land Problem By Including Transjordanian

LONDON, July 21—Definitely disapproving of the Palestine development scheme, details of which were made public yesterday, the Manchester Guardian today urges the British government to solve the Palestine land problem by including Transjordanian within the boundaries of Palestinian land settlement. The Guardian is the first paper to criticize the land development scheme, other papers having this far maintained silence.

The Guardian points out that the British government has now stated the Palestine land problem in such a way "which cannot be answered in the spirit of the Mandate which lays on Great Britain the duty to encourage the close settlement of Jews on the land." Palestine is a small country but the British government has made it smaller, the Guardian declares.

The Arabs can choose between the country east and west of the Jordan River and while eastern Palestine is crowded, Transjordan is empty, the Guardian declares. "The poor fellah might be happier on a new holding across the river than he was in his old village," the Guardian says. "However, the British government refuses to consider this solution and keeps Transjordan a strictly independent area, although legally it forms part of the Mandated Palestine territory."

The Guardian concludes by saying that "the development would have a better chance if the British government would change its mind on this important point."

Prof. Einstein Leads German Scientists' Tribute to Michelson

BERLIN, July 21—The leading German physicists and scientific leaders today participated in a memorial meeting for the late Professor Albert A. Michelson at Harnack House. Professor Albert Einstein, whose scientific achievements are based on the experiments of his great contemporary, eulogized Dr. Michelson's scientific and artistic contributions. Dr. Michelson was born in Posen which was once German territory.

Prussian Justice Minister Acts in Biased Verdict on Jew's Libel Suit Against Nazi

BERLIN, July 21—Dr. M. Schmidt, Prussian minister of justice, today ordered the state attorney to take over the prosecution of M. Kohler, a Hitlerite alderman from Glatz, who had been acquitted last month of a charge of libel growing out of his allegation that M. Elgutter, a Jewish merchant, had paid 200 marks to a group of people to break up a meeting of the Hitlerites.

In acquitting Kohler, Judge Lehman had praised him for acting in the interests of the people. Judge Lehman declared that as chairman of the Glatz Nazi party, which fights the Jews, it was Kohler's duty to convince his party members that the Jews must be fought by all means.

Judge Lehman's decision was called to the attention of the Prussian parliament on June 12 by Dr. Hamburger, a Socialist deputy, who demanded that the minister of justice take steps to remedy the situation. Today's action by the minister of justice is a reply to Dr. Hamburger's complaint.

Financial Crash Leads to Double Suicide of Prominent German-Jewish Couple

BERLIN, July 21—Germany's financial catastrophe today claimed its first direct victims when Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Jaffe, long prominent in German society, killed themselves in a double suicide pact. While the Jaffes left no explanation of their act it is believed due to the fact that on their return from a summer resort they found their life savings wiped out by the closing of the great Darmstaedter und National Bank.

Mr. Jaffe was well known as a manufacturing chemist. The Jaffe home in the fashionable Tiergarten section of Berlin was a favorite meeting place for artists, business leaders, diplomats and politicians.

2 Jews Killed in Terrific Storm in Lublin Suburb

WARSAW, July 21—Two people were killed, many seriously injured and much property damage done as the result of a terrific rain and wind storm that struck Bronowicz, a suburb of Lublin, yesterday, according to incomplete reports reaching here this morning. The neighborhood in the vicinity of the railroad station bore the brunt of the damage with scores of houses inundated and lines of communication damaged.

According to preliminary reports, a good portion of the entire railroad quarter was razed by the howling storm. The rain flooded cellars and reached up to nearly the first stories of houses. All property that was not secured was washed away by the torrent. Jewish property suffered con-

versity of Naples, he often knew hunger and privation. His rare talents interested Professor Bianci who rendered him moral and material aid. Later Professor Bianci appointed him as his assistant and he was fully launched on his successful scientific career, which has now been climaxed by his appointment to Professor Bianci's position and a royal decree granting him Italian citizenship.

Even before these honors came to him, Dr. Eisenstadt was a scientist of repute. His recent book on the influence of rational education on abnormal and criminal types is regarded here and abroad as a work of exceptional importance. His last six years have been devoted almost exclusively to preparations and experiments in connection with this opus. Assisted by a subsidy from the University of Naples he traveled abroad and spent a full year in Leningrad at the clinic of the famous Professor Bektierev with whom he carried on extensive research into the characteristics of the brain cells, on the possibilities of thought transmission and on hypnotism.

Professor Eisenstadt has advanced the theory that the human brain creates electro-magnetic rays which can be transmitted and received by other human beings, and even by animals. His recent experiments in this direction, which have aroused tremendous interest in scientific circles everywhere, are believed to substantiate this theory.

Of particular interest to the Italian scientific world are Dr. Eisenstadt's experiments on so-called "born criminals." He has endeavored to demonstrate that even "born criminals" who have inherited criminal traits from their parents can, through a specially-devised system of education, acquire new traits, be freed of their criminal instincts and become useful members of society.

By experimenting with 2,736 criminals and abnormal types in the insane asylums and prisons of Naples, he believes he has proved the correctness of his theory. In 92.2 per cent of his cases he has achieved cures and converted these abnormal and degenerate types into useful citizens.

The Italian press has hailed Professor Eisenstadt's achievements as "conferring glory upon science and humanity." One paper declared that thanks to his researches Italians "have received a ray of hope and confidence in the future of our race, whose existence has been threatened by an extraordinary growth of nervous and mental diseases."

but one Jewish girl is known to have eloped with a Turk and to have applied subsequently to change her religion under the procedure laid down by law, the Colonial Office declares. The statement adds that the acting High Commissioner in his report observes that, "considering that Jewish peddlers wander over the mountains quite alone and carry money and wares of value, the immunity enjoyed by them as illustrated by the above statistics is remarkable. The importance of the small Jewish colonies in the economic life of the mountain villages is generally recognized, and Kurdish opinion is always opposed to any kind of molestation of them."
