## Nazis Again Attack and Maltreat Jews in Berlin

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, July 28—Emboldened by Germany's economic difficulties and undeterred by the presence in Berlin of the American secretary of state Stimson or the British Premier MacDonald, a band of Nazi storm troops yesterday attacked and maltreated Jewish pedestrians in the heart of the Friedrichstrasse district not far from the Nazi headquarters in Hedemannstrasse.

The disturbance, which took place shortly after the reception of Premier MacDonald, occurred in one of the busiest parts of the city at midday. The latest outbreak of anti-Jewish violence is causing serious concern in the business world and in Jewish circles.

## Gruenbaum and Orthodox Rabbis Clash Over Kehillah Rights

WARSAW, July 28—A sharp conflict has arisen here between Deputy Isaac Gruenbaum and the Union of Orthodox Rabbis as the result of a letter circulated by the ministry of religion granting rabbis the right to vote at meetings of Jewish communities when executives are elected. On behalf of the Jewish National Council, Deputy Gruenbaum has addressed a protest to Slawomir Czerwinski, minister of public worship, indicating that the letter is illegal because only elected member of the communities are entitled to vote at elections, and not co-opted members such as the rabbis.

The minister's letter, it is believed, is intended to support the Jewish clerical element, particularly in the small communities where the rabbis would have the decisive vote as regards the election of presidents. The Union of Orthodox Rabbis, replying to Deputy Gruenbaum's criticism, points out that the minister's letter merely reestablishes the old existing right of the rabbis to participate in the election of community presidents, a rabbi often being elected as president.

## English Zionists Pledge Support To New Zionist Executive

LONDON, July 28—Wholehearted support of the new Zionist Executive under the leadership of Nahum Sokolow, president of the World Zionist Organization, was pledged today by the English Zionist Federation. Simultaneously the Federation expressed the conviction that the illustrious services of Dr. Weizmann, the former president, Jewish National Home's destiny in "make it imperative that he resume in the near future his role in moulding the Palestine."

## Last Nazi Pillar in State Governments Falls With Resignation of Franzen

BERLIN, July 28—The last Nazi pillar in any of the German provincial governments fell today when M. Franzen, minister of education of Brunswick, resigned. Franzen was one of the two Hitlerites who had been ministers, the other being Dr. Wilhelm Frick, the notorious minister of interior and education in Thuringia who was recently ousted.

During the time that Franzen was minister Brunswick became a hotbed of anti-Semitism. Only a month ago the province enacted a stringent law forbidding the practice of schechita. By the passage of this law, which became effective July 1, Brunswick joined Bavaria as the only two German states in which schechita is illegal.

Last November the Brunswick government, at the behest of the Hitlerite leaders, raided the meat factory that supplied the department stores of the Jewish-owned firms of Tietz, Karstadt and Schocken and 20,000 tons of meat were confiscated. This was said to be part of the Nazi government's program of benefitting the small traders at the expense of the larger concerns.

During the sensational anti-Jewish riots in Berlin last October simultaneously with the opening of the new Reichstag in which the Nazis have 107 seats, Franzen was the center of a perjury charge. Among the 108 Nazis who were arrested after the outbreak was one M. Guth. Franzen sought to have Guth released on the plea that he was a member of parliament and hence immune from arrest. The police, however, quickly established that Franzen's explanation was untrue and he later admitted he had lied.

## Agency Sends Greetings to New High Commissioner

LONDON, July 28—Dr. Cyrus Adler, retiring joint chairman of the Council of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, today telegraphed, on behalf of the Agency, heartfelt congratulations to General Arthur Grenfell Wauchope, High Commissioner-designee of Palestine.

In his telegram Dr. Adler gave General Wauchope the assurance of the Jewish Agency's firm intention to cooperate loyally for the recognition of the Palestine Mandate and expressed the hope that General Wauchope's term in office would be marked by growing prosperity of the Jewish National Home and of Palestine as a whole.

General Wauchope, who is now commander of northern Ireland, will succeed Sir John Chancellor as High Commissioner on November 1.

## Deny British Officials Barred From Wedding Palestine Women

JERUSALEM, July 28—A sensational report in today's issue of the Hebrew daily Doar Hayom to the effect that senior British officials in Palestine had been secretly instructed not to marry Palestine women turned out to be the result of a misconception of a standing government order.

In replying to inquiries by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency it was officially stated that the report was baseless. It appears that the Doar Hayom had misconstrued a standing order to Britishers joining the British section of the Palestine police who are obliged to agree not to bring their wives to Palestine nor to marry in Palestine because of the absence of adequate quarters for married officials.

## Angriff, Voelkischer Beobachter, Leading Nazi Organs, Reappear

BERLIN, July 28—The Angriff, Berlin organ of the Hitlerites, and the Voelkischer Beobachter, of Munich, the chief Hitlerite paper, appeared again today when their suspension was lifted. Both papers publish an appeal to their readers to destroy the "Jewish papers" and support the Nazi press.

The papers also triumphantly report that at the recent convention of the German Student Federation, M. Lienau, a Hitlerite, was elected president, indicating that the entire German student body will be practically ruled by a Nazi.

Despite repeated pleas of the Nazi papers for support from their followers most of the Hitlerite organs have recently suffered a decline in circulation. According to a survey by the Central Association of German Citizens of Jewish Faith, the Angriff has dropped from a peak of 80,000 last fall to about 45,000 now. The Berlin edition of the Voelkischer Beobachter, which never had more than 5,000 readers, now has less than 2,000 circulation.

The provincial Nazi papers are also suffering regular losses in circulation. "Workers, Peasants and Soldiers," the organ of the Stennes wing of Hitlerites, has now reached a circulation of 30,000.

## Would Discontinue Training Of Schochtim in England

LONDON, July 28—The board of trustees of the Etz Chaim Yeshivah (Tree of Life College) today adopted a resolution calling on the Yeshivah to discontinue training new schochtim. The action of the board was taken in view of the fact that Great Britain is overcrowded with schochtim, many of whom can find no employment. Rabbi S. I. Hillman is president of the Yeshivah.

**Approve Merger of American  
Poale Zion and Zeire Zion**

The union of the American Poale Zion party and the Hitachduth Zeire Zion has been approved by the Poale Zion world conference recently held in Vienna, according to a cablegram just received here at the headquarters of the American Poale Zion. The Poale Zion world conference also adopted a resolution favoring a union of the two Jewish labor parties throughout the world.

Last March a referendum among the members of the two parties in this country approved the union. A united Poale Zion-Hitachduth convention will be held in this country during the middle of October. Philadelphia, where the Poale Zion movement in this country was founded, was selected as the convention city.

The Poale Zion party in this country was founded in 1904. In 1907 a world federation of all Poale Zion parties was established at a conference in The Hague, Holland. The Hitachduth, which was founded in 1920, favors a Socialist Jewish commonwealth in Palestine, although it opposes the Marxian class struggle idea. The Poale-Zion and Hitachduth parties in Palestine itself united into one Jewish Labor Party in 1929.

Among the leaders of the Poale Zion-Hitachduth movement are Berl Locker in America (now a member of the Zionist World Executive), David Ben Gurion, I. Ben-Zevi, Berel Katzenelson, Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff (now head of the Zionist Executive in Palestine) and Joseph Sprinzak, all in Palestine.

**Square in Lynn Named  
For Jewish War Hero**

LYNN, Mass., July 28—The junction of Summer and Blossom Streets has been named Benjamin Sackson Square in memory of the late Benjamin Sackson, the first Jewish boy from Lynn to die for his country in France during the World War. More than 10,000 people participated in the ceremonies. The marker at the square was unveiled by Eleanor Sackson, daughter of the Jewish war hero.

**Move for National Parley  
To Fight Alien Registration**

ST. LOUIS, July 28—A resolution calling for the convening of a conference of all national fraternal organizations in America to consider ways and means of combatting alien registration bills and to cooperate with the American Jewish Committee and the American Jewish Congress to prevent the passage of such legislation in Congress was adopted by acclamation yesterday at the 27th biennial convention of the Progressive Order of the West. The same resolution protested against the Michigan alien registration law as well as all efforts to enact similar bills in other states.

Following an appeal by Max Shulman, Chicago Zionist leader, to support the American Palestine Campaign, the convention not only endorsed the drive but appropriated \$1,000 from the funds of the Order as an outright contribution and unanimously adopted a resolution calling upon all members to support the \$800,000 emergency appeal issued by the Jewish Agency.

The incoming executive board was instructed to cooperate with all agencies in the dissemination of the Hebrew language and particularly in assisting in working for the teaching of Hebrew as an elective subject in the high schools. Cooperation with both the American Jewish Congress and the American Jewish Committee in their efforts opposing discrimination against Jews in employment and the admission of Jews to colleges and universities was also voted.

Another resolution urged members of the Order to call upon their respective congressmen to vote against any bill for the change of the calendar that would affect or interfere with the religious rights of Jews and others. A new form of membership to be known as juvenile membership, consisting of boys and girls between the ages of ten and fifteen who would be eligible for insurance certificates to be issued to them in accordance with rules and regulations to be prepared by a competent actuary, was created.

A plea that the appropriation of the People's Tool Campaign be increased from \$200 to \$500 created a heated debate. It was also decided that the investment of the reserve fund of the Order should be made in municipal bonds instead of in utility bonds. The retiring grand master, Joseph Schiller, was voted the sum of \$4,000. A special appropriation of \$3,000 to be used as a relief fund for unfortunate members was created.

The Hebrew Immigrant Aid Society, the Ort, the Los Angeles Consumptive Sanitarium, the Denver Sanitarium and other national Jewish institutions were endorsed. Among the messages read to the convention were those from Bernard G. Richards, executive director of the American Jewish Congress, and Dr. A. M. Blumberg of the Ex-Patients' Home of Denver.

**Prof. Gothold Weil Invited  
To Frankfurt Semitic Chair**

BERLIN, July 28—Professor Gothold Weil has been invited to the University of Frankfurt-am-Main to occupy the chair of Semitics.

Professor Weil, who is 49, is a noted Orientalist. Born in Berlin, he entered the Prussian government library service in that city in 1906 and in 1918 was appointed director of the Oriental department. In 1912 he became associated with the University of Berlin, and in 1920 was named honorary professor there and instructor in post-Biblical Jewish history and literature.

He is the author of many books on the grammar and literature of the Oriental languages. Professor Weil is a member of the curatorium of the Academy of Jewish Sciences and of its philological commission, as well as of the Academic Council of the Hebrew University at Jerusalem.

**Finds Amazing Religious Bias  
Among Public School Children**

A surprisingly large amount of religious prejudice and ignorance about faiths other than their own has been found among over a thousand children between the ages of six and twelve whose opinions on this subject were investigated for a year's time. A report giving the results of this investigation has just been issued by Dr. Adelaide T. Case, professor of education at Columbia University.

In commenting on the result of the investigation, Dr. Case attacked the American public school system for allowing such prejudiced ideas on religion to be formed among young children. Dr. Case said:

"How can there be any religious tolerance and true understanding when youngsters of nine and ten have such bitter and intolerant ideas of the other religions? Not only do we find a marked misunderstanding between Jewish and Christian, but between Catholic and Protestant children as well.

"As long as we have a school system that allows such false ideas to be formed early in the life of the child, we can plainly see that something is lacking in our educational system. Too often these ignorances and prejudices are carried throughout the adult life. It's a disgrace to allow these intolerant prejudices to develop and grow."

**500,000 Copies of Sholem  
Aleichem's Works Sold in  
Russia in Last Five Years**

More than a half-million copies of the works of Sholem Aleichem, famous Yiddish humorist, in Russian translations have been sold in the Soviet Union during the five years between 1925 and 1930, according to an article appearing in the Minsk Yiddish Zeitschrift. During those years 30 works of Sholem Aleichem appeared in Russian translations, 27 in Ukrainian translations and one in a White Russian translation.

## Tributes to Lee K. Frankel Continue from Jews, Non-Jews

From Jew and non-Jew tributes to Dr. Lee K. Frankel continued yesterday from all parts of the country. His work on behalf of the Jewish Agency was lauded by Morris Rothenberg, national chairman of the American Palestine Campaign of which Dr. Frankel was treasurer. Rabbi Jonah B. Wise, national chairman of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee's campaign, praised Dr. Frankel's work for suffering Jewry in Eastern Europe.

From his summer home in New Hampshire, Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, acting chairman of administration of the Zionist Organization of America, mourned Dr. Frankel's death as an irreparable loss to the cause of American Judaism and of the Palestine movement. Alfred M. Cohen, international president of B'nai B'rith, declared that Dr. Frankel's death creates a vacancy that will be very difficult to fill.

Homer Folks, secretary of the State Charities Aid Association, characterized Dr. Frankel as an eminent humanitarian while George J. Nelbach, executive secretary of the State Committee on Tuberculosis and Public Health, lauded Dr. Frankel's services to modern medical science.

CINCINNATI, July 28—"The death of Dr. Lee K. Frankel creates a vacancy that will be very difficult to fill," Alfred M. Cohen, international president of B'nai B'rith, declared here today. "His personality was the very finest. He was a technician but nonetheless because of that a lover of his fellow men."

"He filled a large place in worldly affairs but never wavered in his concern for his Jewish brethren who were first in his thoughts. His counsel was wise and dispassionate and dependable. It will be long ere we see his like again. His memory will be cherished by all with whom he came in contact."

CHOCORUA, N. H., July 28—Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland, acting chairman of administration of the Zionist Organization of America, today said that the passing of Dr. Frankel "is a sharp, irreparable loss to the cause of American Judaism and of the Palestine movement. Dr. Frankel was a great humanitarian who in a long distinguished career made significant contributions to the cause of social justice."

"He was a loyal Jew and was vitally interested in the problems of American Judaism. Unforgettable are Dr. Frankel's services to his stricken fellow Jews in Eastern Europe during the World War. Dr. Frankel was one of the prime movers in the formation of the Jewish Agency for Palestine and at its last session in Basle he was chosen joint chairman of the Council. ## Detroit Stalhelm Chieftain Denies Organization Anti-Semitic or Linked With Nazis

DETROIT, July 28—Arthur Link, first commander of the Detroit branch of the Stalhelm (steel helmet), the nationalist German war veterans' association, in a statement to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency today denied that his organization is anti-Semitic, repudiated connections with the local branch of the Hitlerites and outlined the objects of his organization.

"In regard to the Jewish race," Mr. Link stated, "I want to say that there is nothing whatever in our program against this race, except that membership in the Stalhelm is limited to the Germanic race only. The Stalhelm has as its main object the fight against the Treaty of Versailles, which contains in one of its paragraphs the statement of the 'sole guilt of Germany for the beginning of the World War.'"

"The Stalhelm further is strictly opposed to the international preachings of Marxism, Bolshevism and pacifism. It is a fight for the recognition of Germany as a free power compared to the present state of affairs. The mighty convention of the Stalhelm on May 30 and 31 at Breslau, Germany, where close to 150,000 men of this organization paraded, showed how strongly the German people are following this idea."

Mr. Link said he is "only slightly informed of the objects of the Hitlerite organization" and denied any connections with the Detroit group of the Nazi, also known as Teutonia, of which Walter Hentschel is commander. Nevertheless the Verposten, the organ of the National Socialists, with editorial offices in Chicago, is published by the Stalhelm, and the Teutonia, the emblem of the latter being the Swastika.

A prominent local German newspaperman, however, has informed the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, that in German circles it is generally accepted that both the Stalhelm and Teutonia are anti-Semitic and that they are closely interlinked. He added, however, that they are generally subjected to ridicule and are not taken seriously.

## William Levy, Philanthropist, Merchant of Baltimore, Dead

BALTIMORE, July 28—Word has been received here of the death at a camp in Maine of William Levy, straw hat manufacturer and a leader in charities in this city. Mr. Levy was 74 years old.

Mr. Levy, who was chairman of the board of M. S. Levy & Sons, Inc., straw hat manufacturers, was one of the founders of the Baltimore Federated Jewish Charities, first president of the United Jewish Charities of this city, treasurer of the United Jewish Appeal and chairman of the Jewish Welfare Board of Baltimore. He was born in Manchester, England, and came here with his father at the close of the Civil War. He and his father were among the first to introduce straw hats to the United States.

## Rabbi Sees Orthodox Jewish Canadian Communities Paradox

SEATTLE, July 28—"Canadian Orthodoxy is a paradox," declared Rabbi Harry J. Stern of Temple Emanu-El, Montreal, in an interview here on the completion of a tour which he had made of the Western Canadian provinces for the purpose of intensive study of its Jewish communities. "I say that they are a paradox, because for the most part they have broken with the Shulchan Arukh and they haven't found for themselves any liberal interpretations of Judaism. The old pattern does not work in the New World, and so we have Jews cleaving to Orthodoxy who observe the dietary laws only in the breach and who appear twice a year at the High Holy Days in the House of God."

That the older generation of Western Canadian Jewry were trying to perpetuate "ghettoism" and not Judaism is the contention of Rabbi Stern, who said that they have well established Talmud Torahs and Yiddish folk schools, but that they over-emphasize language study and fail to explain the beauties and ethics and history of Judaism. According to him, they go to an extreme just as the Sunday school went at first to the other extreme in belittling the value of the Hebrew language.

In the communities that Rabbi Stern visited, he found that Judaism to many had but one purpose, that of collecting funds. "In fact, many of the audiences to whom I spoke seemed to miss something because I made no appeal for funds for any of the million things for which they are so often called upon. A visiting speaker who was trying to give them something instead of asking for something was unheard of," he said.

Rabbi Stern credits the B'nai B'rith with doing splendid work in trying to stimulate Jewish thought. He feels that the large religious organizations of the East are failing in their duty to send out regular speakers on Jewish cultural and religious subjects.

"I do not see Orthodox Judaism being perpetuated," declared Rabbi Stern. "Would that it might live, but it is losing its young people, because it is unable to interpret Judaism in the vernacular. The spiritual, ethical and cultural sides have been completely ignored. Young people have not been given that interpretation which will enable them to live with dignity and pride among non-Jews."

expresses its profoundest sorrow at the sudden passing of this noble son of Israel and this gallant champion of human rights."

Morris Rothenberg, national chairman of the American Palestine Campaign, said yesterday that the "death of Dr. Frankel removes from leadership in the Jewish Agency for Palestine one of the most devoted advocates of the upbuilding of the Jewish Homeland. His services on the Joint Palestine Survey Commission and his efforts in uniting Zionists and non-Zionists were helpful in the formation of the Jewish Agency. He visited Palestine on several occasions and on his return communicated to his friends and colleagues his enthusiasm for what was being accomplished there.

"An indication of the high regard in which he was held by the Jewish people was indicated by his election, only a few weeks ago, to the co-chairmanship of the Council of the Jewish Agency. As treasurer of the American Palestine Campaign, he demonstrated his concern with the efforts to raise funds for the maintenance of Jewish activities in Palestine. To his associates in the American Palestine Campaign he represented the highest type of American Jew, who combined with his wide activities in other fields a close affiliation with the interests of the Jewish people. His keen knowledge of conditions in Palestine, his great sympathy with the reconstruction efforts there, and his own personal charm and idealism will be sadly missed by all those who worked with him."

Rabbi Jonah B. Wise, national chairman of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee's campaign, declared that Dr. Frankel was one of the "vital forces in the national and international relations and social work amongst Jews. He will be particularly missed by the Joint Distribution Committee, both from the standpoint of its problem of organization in America and administration in Europe. He was one of the pioneers of the movement and devoted himself especially to the complicated and crucial health problems which the Joint Distribution Committee had to face in practically every country in which it was engaged in work.

"It was almost entirely due to Dr. Frankel's knowledge and energy that the enormous problem of hygiene and health relief was organized for the millions of Jews in Eastern Europe. At the time the work began, there were practically no modern methods or means of fighting the variety of diseases prevalent, of which typhus was probably the most dangerous.

"Dr. Frankel remained as the guiding spirit of this particular part of the work until his death, and the Joint Distribution Committee will have to seek for a long time for a person who unites his experience, personality and rare ability. His death is a loss not only to the field of work in which he

## Congress Granted Subsidy of \$10,000 to Mizrahi Colony, Mizrahi Youth Leader Says

A decision to subsidize the Mizrahi workers' colony in Palestine, known as "Shick-Abrik," to the extent of ten thousand dollars was adopted at the last Zionist Congress. This was the information given by Zevi Karp, leader of the American Mizrahi youth organization, who has just returned to this country from the Zionist Congress at Basle and the world congresses of the Mizrahi and Mizrahi Youth organizations, in all of which he took a prominent part.

Support for the Mizrahi colony was favored by the colonization commission of the Zionist Congress, of which the American member was Mrs. Archibald Silverman. Despite opposition, the resolution was adopted at the Congress by a majority vote.

At the Zionist Congress there were 15 delegates representing the Orthodox Zionist youth organization, said Mr. Karp. At the Mizrahi world conference the youth organization was represented by forty percent of the delegates.

Mr. Karp is one of the seven American Zionists who were elected members of the administrative committee of the Jewish Agency. Yitzchak Epstein, president of the American Mizrahi Youth Organization, was elected an alternate member of the Zionist Actions Committee. A reception for both Mr. Karp and Mr. Epstein will be given soon by the Mizrahi Youth Organization of New York.

## Russian Schools Beginning to Be Infected With Anti-Semitism

MOSCOW—The schools of Russia which have hitherto been free from anti-Semitism are slowly being infected with it. From the city of Perm comes the latest story of an attack upon a Jewish schoolboy who was a member of the Pioneer organization and who has recently been admitted to the Communist Youth League. The name of the boy is Zarkhin and he is a pupil in school No. 21 in Perm.

Entering his classroom, Zarkhin found in his seat a postcard with threatening sentiments and a lot of anti-Semitic vilification. Zarkhin, a serious youngster, paid no attention to the postcard and did not take the threats seriously. He went about his business until one day on leaving a public dining room he was struck from behind with an iron bar. He sank to the ground and his assailant immediately proceeded to slash Zarkhin's face with a piece of glass, at the same time hurling at him anti-Semitic epithets.

Investigation by the school authorities revealed that the anti-Semitic pupils were directed from the outside by elements hostile to the Soviet government.
