## Russian Godless Start Anti-Rosh Hashonah and Yom Kippur Drive Two Months in Advance

MOSCOW, July 29—Although Rosh Hashonah and Yom Kippur are nearly two months away, the Jewish section of the League of the Godless today began its annual campaign against these high Jewish holidays. Four Yiddish pamphlets came off the press today for distribution among Jewish workers in the towns and cities and Jewish colonists in the agricultural regions.

A special edition of the Apikores (Atheist), the Yiddish atheist monthly, went to press yesterday, a fortnight ahead of time, in order to make it available for the anti-religious campaign. An extraordinary control commission has been organized to investigate the effect of the campaign among the Jewish artisans and colonists.

The atheists have taken for their slogan this year "Jewish workers, stay away from the synagogue on Rosh Hashonah. Remain at work in field and factory on Yom Kippur in order to help carry out the Five Year-Plan." Special shock brigades will be organized to mobilize the workers for the anti-Rosh Hashonah and Yom Kippur campaign.

The early start of the drive against the high Jewish holidays is in line with the protest voiced last year by the Yiddish Communist press. The papers complained that it was futile to expect any results from the anti-religious propaganda when it is called into use only twice a year, just before Passover and on the eve of Rosh Hashonah and Yom Kippur. They pointed out that anti-religious campaigns only on the eve of the holidays achieved an effect opposite from that desired because the Jewish villagers and colonists who might otherwise ignore the holidays are reminded of them by the agitation against them.

It is believed that the League of the Godless has launched its drive against the observance of the Jewish holidays now in an endeavor to overcome this criticism.

## Hint Foul Play in Drowning Of Vilna Jewish Worker

VILNA, Poland, July 29—Pinchas Szwedki, 20 years old, the only Jewish worker in the government tobacco factory at Vilna, was drowned today while bathing with fellow Polish workers. In Jewish circles here there is a suspicion that Szwedki was the victim of foul play because he had recently suffered persecution at the hands of Polish workers in the factory.

## 30 Jews Injured in Anti-Semitic Outbreak in Lublin

WARSAW, July 29—The third serious outbreak of anti-Semitism in Polish cities in less than two months occurred today at Lublin where thirty Jews were seriously injured in a riot started by members of the National Democratic party. The trouble began at a football game between the Christian team Unia and a Jewish team Shtern.

During the game a fight broke out between Jewish and Christian onlookers. The clash rapidly spread from the football field to the city itself, the most serious attacks taking place in Kolatastrasse. Prompt action by the police, who arrested a number of the anti-Semites, prevented further casualties.

A similar outbreak occurred in Radom on June 15 as the outcome of a football game. Ten Jews were injured and considerable damage was done to Jewish property. A week earlier three Jews were seriously injured in Zloczew in an attack instigated by the National Democratic athletic organization, Sokol.

## Ask Socialist Congress to Aid Russian Socialist Zionists

VIENNA, July 29—An appeal for the organization of a powerful movement of protest against Soviet Russia's persecution of Zionist Socialist prisoners and to take special action to afford them active help was made today at the Socialist International Congress by the foreign delegation of the Zionist Socialist party of Russia.

The plea points out that a new wave of arrests of Zionist Socialists is now going on throughout Russia. This campaign does not spare even those who have already suffered five or ten years of imprisonment and exile in the farthest corners of Siberia, the Urals and the Solovetzki Islands, it was stated.

The prisons are again overcrowded and cells meant for four are packed with twenty or more prisoners who suffer humiliating physical and moral treatment, the appeal declared. The arrested Zionists resort to such last desperate means as hunger strikes but even twenty day strikes bring no substantial amelioration in their treatment, it was charged.

The Russian Zionist Socialist delegation presented a detailed memorandum citing lists of their members who have been arrested, the places to which they have been exiled and a record of the hunger strikes to which they have resorted. The memorandum contains many first hand descriptions of the sufferings endured by the Zionist exiles and prisoners.

## Chancellor Hopes U. S. Will Go Wet Again to Create Market For Palestinian Wines

JERUSALEM, July 29—The hope that the United States would go wet again and thus provide a market for the abundant and excellent Palestine wines was expressed today by High Commissioner Chancellor at the ceremonies accompanying the beginning of the grape crushing season at Rishon Le Zion, the site of the world famous wine cellars established in 1882 by Baron Edmond de Rothschild of Paris, the nestor of Palestinian work.

The High Commissioner described his visit to Baron Rothschild in Paris while he (Chancellor) was en route to England in May. He said that he expressed appreciation to the Baron for the good relations existing between the Arabs and the Jewish settlers in the colonies supported by the Palestine Jewish Colonization Association (PICA).

Palestine's wine products, which hold second place in agricultural production, are grown and bottled by the old Societe Cooperative Vigneronne of Rishon Le Zion and Zichron Jacob. The wine industry is the second oldest in Palestine. The export of wines is largely from the Rothschild vineyards. In 1922 wine exports from Palestine were valued at over \$200,000. Two years ago this figure had fallen to a little more than \$100,000. In 1928 over 2,500,000 litres of wine were manufactured at the Rothschild wine presses in Rishon Le Zion. In the five colonies of Rishon Le Zion, Rehoboth, Ness Ziona, Gadera and Zichron Jacob 16,421 dunams are given over to grapes.

## Lord Melchett Left Only \$5,000,000, Will Shows

LONDON, July 29—The will of the late Lord Melchett, industrialist, statesman and Zionist, who was reputed to be one of the richest men in England, was made public today and showed that he had left but \$5,000,000. This sum does not include his land holdings in Palestine nor his famous art collection, which together are believed to be valued at more than \$1,000,000. He controlled companies with a combined capital of \$600,000,000 at the time of his death on December 27, 1930.

One-fifth of his estate, or one million dollars will go to the government in duties. The will provides that \$250,000 be given to his widow, and \$500,000 to his son Henry, who succeeds to Lord Melchett's title. The Palestine properties are left to Lady Erleigh, the wife of Viscount Erleigh, who is the son of Lord Reading, former Viceroy of India. The balance of the estate is divided between his other two daughters.

## Jabotinsky Remains Revisionist Chieftain, Grossman Asserts

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, July 29—Vladimir Jabotinsky remains the leader of the Zionist Revisionists although he has absented himself for six months until the party's convention in December, Meer Grossman, vice-president of the Revisionist Union, declared today at a press conference in the Revisionists' headquarters.

Immediately after the Zionist Congress a serious split in the Revisionist ranks became known when Jabotinsky, founder of the party, announced that he was taking a six months leave of absence because of internal differences regarding the future Revisionist attitude toward the World Zionist Organization.

Mr. Grossman said today that the Revisionists are confident that "all our differences will be settled satisfactorily," and added that "there are no figure heads in the Revisionist organization." At the press conference it was also announced that the Revisionists will continue their independent political activities, including propaganda among members of the British Parliament.

The division in the Revisionist party arises from the fact that one group headed by Jabotinsky favors seceding from the World Zionist Organization and the creation of a new independent Zionist Organization. In this stand Jabotinsky and his followers were recently given support by the editors of the Haam, the Revisionist organ in Palestine, the Brith Trumpeldor, the Revisionist youth organization, the executive of the Palestine Revisionists, and the executive of the Revisionist workers.

Another group lead by Grossman and Richard Lichtheim of Germany advocate propagating Revisionist principles within the World Zionist Organization.

## Prof. Max Liebermann, One Of World's Greatest Living Painters, Passes 84th Year

BERLIN—Professor Max Liebermann, the president of the Berlin Academy of Art and one of the greatest living painters in the world, has reached his 84th birthday.

Professor Liebermann, who belongs to one of the most distinguished Jewish families in Germany, is a brother of the late Professor Carl Liebermann, the famous chemist, and of the late Professor Felix Liebermann, the historian and authority on English Constitutional history, who died in 1925. He is also a cousin of the late Walter Rathenau, the German Foreign Minister, who was assassinated by anti-Semites in 1922.

He is the dean of German painters and the greatest representative of German impressionism. He was a great friend of Joseph Israels, the Jewish painter in Holland, who was known as the "Rembrandt of the Nineteenth Century," on whom he has written the most authoritative work. He has written a number of other important essays on art, which are collected in a volume of "Collected Writings."

A few weeks ago, the National Gallery in London acquired one of his works from the famous Cassirer Collection in Berlin.

During the monarchy in Germany, Liebermann was denied all official recognition because he was a Jew. His election as president of the Berlin Academy of Art was vetoed by the Kaiser. When the Republic was established, however, the Academy again elected him as its president, and although the term of office of the president is limited by law to three years, the law has been specially suspended by Act of Parliament in his favor.

When Professor Liebermann celebrated his 80th birthday in 1927, the occasion was one of nation-wide observance. The President of the Republic, Field-Marshal von Hindenburg, sent him a message in his own handwriting through the Federal Minister of the Interior, who brought him at the same time the Order of the Shield of the Eagle of the Empire. "Your life-work," President Hindenburg wrote, "is of undying importance in the history of art. You have opened up a new road for a whole generation of artists, who follow in your steps. In token of the great debt which the German people owes you, I hereby confer on you the Shield of the Eagle of the Empire."

"I was born a Jew, and I shall die a Jew," Professor Liebermann has declared in a statement published in the C. V. Zeitung, the organ of the Union of German Citizens of Jewish Faith. "The other day," he went on, "I looked out at the old Jewish cemetery in the Schoenhauser Allee, and as I looked out I said to myself: It is a very fine thing to know that your grandparents

## Mrs. N. Mosessohn, Widow of Jewish Tribune's Founder, Dead

Rabbi Jonah B. Wise of the Central Synagogue and Dr. George S. Leikin, former chief rabbi of Kazan, Russia, officiated yesterday morning at the Riverside Memorial Chapel at funeral services for Mrs. Theresa Mosessohn, widow of the late Dr. Nehemiah Mosessohn, Jewish scholar and founder of the Jewish Tribune. Mrs. Mosessohn died Tuesday morning of heart disease at the Montefiore Hospital. She was 78 years old.

Mrs. Mosessohn was born in Odessa, Russia, and came to this country forty-three years ago. The Mosessohns lived first in Texas, then in Portland, Oregon, where the deceased was prominently identified with Jewish and general charities. Even after she moved to New York thirteen years ago she was still associated with Portland philanthropies and was honorary president of the local Jewish Ladies Aid Society.

## Golub and Nathan Straus, Jr. Mourn Lee K. Frankel

Additional tributes to the late Dr. Lee K. Frankel, internationally known health authority and Jewish leader who died in Paris last Saturday, were paid today by Nathan Straus, Jr., and Dr. J. J. Golub, director of the Hospital for Joint Diseases. Mr. Straus said Dr. Frankel was "an outstanding American of the finest type. In the midst of a busy and successful business career he found ample time to serve his people, his country and humanity."

Dr. Golub said "in Dr. Frankel's death the world lost a man who was at all times keenly interested in human welfare in this country and abroad. I had the privilege of traveling with him in Eastern Europe in the work of furnishing relief to the war sufferers of Poland, Russia, Lithuania and Latvia, where and when he helped formulate a constructive program of medical relief for communities whose dwellers were then still living under the most primitive sanitary conditions.

"He was an understanding leader, possessed of original and accurate thoughts on the trends of modern medicine and public health. His contribution to the public health fields is outstanding and lasting."

## "The Chaltzim" Overture Gets First Rendition in Tel Aviv

TEL AVIV, Palestine—The premiere performance of the overture "The Chaltzim" (The Pioneers) by A. M. Binder, choirmaster of the Free Synagogue of New York and professor of synagogue music at the Jewish Institute of Religion, was given here by the Palestine Symphonic Ensemble, founded and directed by Zvi Compansetz.

This was the first time in the history of music in Palestine that the first rendition of an orchestral work was presented under the baton of the composer

# Three Jews on Board as Nautilus Sails for Pole

LONDON, July 29—When the submarine Nautilus under the command of Sir Hubert Wilkins left Plymouth yesterday for its undersea voyage to the North Pole, three American Jews, all members of the crew, were on board. The three Jews who are taking the epochal journey are Oscar Blumberg, chief engineer, of New York; Harry Rothschild, familiarly known as "Baron" Rothschild, steward, of the Bronx, and Isaac Schlossbach, chief officer, of Bradley Beach, New Jersey.

While this trio of daring Jews were on their way to the North Pole in the first effort to reach the Pole under the ice, another Jew, Prof. Rudolph Samoilovich, rescuer of the Noble Arctic expedition three years ago, was not far from the Pole. Prof. Samoilovich is in command of the group of scientists on the Graf Zeppelin's Arctic cruise.

But these four Jewish Polar explorers are not the first Jews to venture into the Arctic or Antarctic regions. With Commander Richard Byrd's thrilling two-year expedition in the Antarctic was Sergeant Benjamin Roth of Brooklyn, the airplane mechanic of the company. Roth was later decorated by the United States government for heroism in saving a member of the expedition and a large part of its supplies at the risk of his life when a part of the ice barrier gave way.

One of the victims of the tragic Noble expedition, many of whose members were saved by Prof. Samoilovich, was Prof. Aldo Pontremoli, a scientific aide of General Umberto Nobile. Prof. Pontremoli, a grandson of Luigi Luzatti, was among those missing when the giant Italian airship, Italia, crashed in the Arctic. Although his body was never found science was enriched by the observations he made on the flight when his notebook was salvaged from the wreckage.

Many years before Polar exploration was made by air two other intrepid Jews, one a German and one an American, accompanied important expeditions to the Arctic. The first of these was Emil Bessels, a German naturalist. He made an independent journey to the Arctic Ocean in 1869, 40 years before the North Pole was discovered. In 1871 he volunteered to go as surgeon and naturalist with the Hall expedition which sailed on the S. S. Polaris from the Brooklyn navy yard.

The second of these pioneer Jewish Polar explorers was Edward Israel of Kalamazoo, Michigan. As a sergeant in the signal corps of the United States Army he volunteered for the Lady Franklin Bay Expedition under the command of Gen. A. W. Greeley. On this expedition he served as chief astronomer and geographer. Israel died

# Jewish Artists Invited to Submit Designs for Volume Five of J.N.F. Golden Book

JERUSALEM, July 29—Jewish artists throughout the world were invited today by the Jewish National Fund, the chief Zionist land purchasing agency, to submit designs for the fifth volume of the Fund's Golden Book. The design should express the object of the Jewish National Fund, the only text (in Hebrew letters) to be "Keren Kayemeth Leisrael, Sefer Hazahav, Kerach V" (Jewish National Fund, Golden Book, Volume V).

If possible, sketches should be submitted in water colors and the design should be accompanied by an explicit description which should also indicate the materials to be used in executing the design. The design submitted is to be for the front cover and reverse and the back, all of the size of the Golden Book, which is 66x49.5x14.3 centimeters. The volume will contain 500 pages, each 65x49 centimeters. The design is to be accompanied by a sealed envelope containing the name and address of the artist.

The judges will be Dr. Saul Tchernikovsky, famous Hebrew poet; Herman Struck, noted artist and S. A. Van Vriesland, Zionist leader. Three prizes are offered, a first prize of \$175, a second prize of \$125, and a third prize of \$75. All designs must reach the Jewish National Fund headquarters in Jerusalem not later than October 20, 1931.

# Plan New Changes in Personnel Of Palestine Administration

LONDON, July 29—Further changes will be made in the personnel of the civil and judicial administration of the Palestine government, according to a statement today in the House of Commons by Dr. Drummond Shiels, under-secretary of state for the Colonies. He added that these changes are necessary as a result of the recent investigation of the Palestine government by the O'Donnell financial commission.

In the last year a number of important changes in the Palestine government have already been made. General Arthur Grenfell Wauchope has been appointed High Commissioner to succeed Sir John Chancellor whose resignation is effective November 1. Mark Aitchinson Young has replaced Harry Charles Luke as chief secretary of the Palestine government. R. B. G. Spicer, former police chief of Kenya Colony, has succeeded A. S. Mavrogordato as commander of the Palestine police office.

It has also been reported that Edward Keith Roach, district commissioner of Jerusalem, will be sent to a post outside of Palestine or be given a new position in Palestine, and be succeeded by J. E. F. Campbell, district commissioner of Jaffa.

# Writer Sees Bukowinian Jews in Greatest Need

CZERNOWITZ, Roumania — The need of Bukowinian Jewry today cries to heaven, according to an article appearing in a recent issue of the Bukowinaer Volkszeitung, published in this city. The province of Bukowina, of which Czernowitz is the capital, was formerly a part of the Austro-Hungarian monarchy, but since the war it has become a part of Roumania. A large Jewish population lives there.

The worst of it is that the Bukowinian Jews have no prospects for the future, says the writer, who declares that being too proud themselves to beg for aid they have not published their woes to the rest of the Jewish world, which is therefore unaware of the impoverishment of Bukowinian Jewry.

Since the war Bukowinian Jewish merchants have lost all their trade as a result of the closing of foreign markets, the Jewish intelligentsia has been gradually dismissed from government positions, and even Jewish small traders, market vendors and others have been losing every means of livelihood, according to the article. Market vendors have even been driven away from the market places when they tried to earn a meagre livelihood.

As an example of the dire poverty among the Jewish intellectual classes, the writer cites an instance of a doctor who was tried in court for charging medical fees below the fee required by law. This Jewish doctor pleaded that he had to charge such a low fee because he was starving.

Before the war, Jewish merchants were well-to-do, doing a big business with neighboring countries. Today most of them are ruined and are not even hoping for better times. If a customer comes into a Jewish store in Bukowina he buys things on credit and never pays his debt. Government officials, pensioners and wage earners must wait many months for their salaries and are therefore not in a position to pay their debts to the Jewish merchant.

The writer criticizes the Bukowinian Jewish relief organizations, whose main purpose he says is publicity seeking. The Kehillah organizations in Bukowina are bankrupt. Internal Jewish relief has been denied Bukowinian Jews because of the bad management of local institutions.

## A. D. Bearman of Memphis Elected Head of P.O.W.

ST. LOUIS, July 29—For the first time in 12 years the Progressive Order of the West elected a grand master from a city other than Chicago when A. D. Bearman of Memphis was chosen grand master at the closing session of the Order's 27th biennial convention. Former grand master B. Frank, was elected first vice-grand master. Louis Sobol of Chicago, second vice-grand master, J. L. Spector of Philadelphia, third vice-grand master, Sam Fortas of Memphis, fourth vice-grand master, C. Carshon of North Wayne, fifth, Sam Maurer of New York, sixth, Jacob Zuckerman of Cleveland, seventh, S. D. Frey of Syracuse, eighth, G. Hament of Baltimore, ninth, H. Rosenthal of Milwaukee, tenth, H. Friedman of Cincinnati, eleventh and Max Goldberg of Shreveport, Louisiana, twelfth.

Morris Shapiro of St. Louis, for 20 years national grand secretary, was re-elected. David Lipman was named treasurer and I. D. Goldberg of St. Louis grand beneficiary treasurer. Mr. Bearman, the new grand master, is an attorney. He is chairman of the B'nai Brith Home in Memphis, a member of the Federation board and chairman of the Memphis People's Tool committee.

Preceding the election of officers the convention, which had been in session since Sunday, sent a message of felicitation to Nahum Sokolow, president of the World Zionist Organization and adopted a resolution expressing confidence in Dr. Chaim Weizmann. A resolution calling for the establishment of a colony in Palestine in the name of the Order at an expenditure of \$10,000 was tabled.

## Roosevelt Names A. Feldblum Impartial Head of Dress Trade

ALBANY, N. Y., July 29—Adolph Feldblum, Brooklyn Jewish lawyer, has been appointed by Governor Roosevelt impartial chairman of the dress industry to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Dr. N. I. Stone. Mr. Feldman is a director of the Brooklyn Federation of Jewish Charities and chairman of its law committee, a former president of the Hebrew Education Society of Brooklyn and a former director of the Brooklyn Jewish Social Service Bureau and of the Brooklyn Juvenile Probation Association.

Mr. Feldblum's appointment, the Governor said, is in accordance with the agreement adopted in 1930 by dress industry interests to adjust disputes, and has the approval of the International Ladies' Garment Workers' Union, Affiliated Dress Manufacturers, Inc., Wholesale Dress Manufacturers and the Association of Dress Manufacturers, Inc.

and your parents lie there, and that you, too, will lie there.

"Do you know how many years it is since I was offered a post as the head of an Academy, and the letter containing the offer went on to say that I should go and be baptized at once? I replied to these people that if it will make me paint better, I might consider being baptized.

"I have often spoken with Professor Einstein about the Jewish question," Professor Liebermann continued, "and I used to talk about it frequently with the late Dr. Paul Nathan. It is a very painful question, he said, but the solution is not simple. Zionism is attempting to find a solution. Zionism is a very noble and ideal movement, but it is not for me.

"Do you think that my cousin, Walter Rathenau, would not have been murdered if he was not a Jew?" he asked. "There is no man who can say that. Unfortunately, Erzberger, too, was murdered, and he was not a Jew.

"When I became President of the Academy I received an anonymous letter threatening that if I did not retire within three days I would be removed. I threw the letter into the waste paper basket.

"Jews should be told that they should not segregate themselves," Professor Liebermann concluded. "A certain amount of self-consciousness, if one is something and can do something and has the right amount of tact to go with it, will not harm anyone."

In a letter dealing with the question of anti-Semitism which was published some time ago, Professor Liebermann wrote that "anti-Semitism has become dangerous only since it has infected the so-called scholars, since it has invaded the universities. Honors appear to be given to individual Jews only so that the mass of Jews should be the more insulted. I consider it the greatest insult to which I can be subjected when a Christian says to me: If only all the Jews were like you! I always answer: If only all the Christians were like me!"

## Palestine Orange Groves to Be Insured for First Time

JERUSALEM.—Following considerable negotiating the Sun Insurance Office, Ltd., Alliance Insurance Co., Ltd., and the Pearl Insurance Co., Ltd., three of the largest British insurance companies, have agreed to establish a united insurance scheme for the orange groves of Palestine.

The companies were persuaded to agree to accept insurance on the orange groves when the progress of Palestine was placed before them in concrete form. The insurance plan is only an experiment and whether it is placed on a permanent basis depends on the orange growers themselves. The insurance plan covers floods, storms, gales, and catastrophes caused by human agencies such as violence and strikes.

At the present writing Prof. Fritz Loewe, one of the best known Alpinists in Germany and head of the meteorological station at Berlin-Tempelhof, is one of the chief members of the German Greenland expedition. Prof. Loewe is in charge of the provisioning of the expedition which was fitted out by the Committee for the Advancement of German Science. Prof. Loewe, one of the leaders of the Union of Jewish War Veterans of Germany, was awarded the Iron Cross for bravery during the World War.
