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FUTURE OF REVISIONIST MOVEMENT: NO SECESSION FROM ZIONIST ORGANISATION MR. MEER GROSSMAN DECLARES: EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE IN LONDON CAN TAKE NO OTHER COURSE THAN STATUS QUO MARKED OUT AT LAST BASLE CONFERENCE: EXTENDING ORGANISATION IN PREPARATION FOR NEXT REVISIONIST WORLD CONFERENCE IN DECEMBER: NO TRUTH IN SUGGESTION THAT MR. JABOTINSKY BEEN KEPT FROM EFFECTIVE LEADERSHIP: NO MEMBER OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE CALLED INTO QUESTION HIS POSITION AS LEADER AND THERE IS NO PERSONAL ANIMOSITY OR RIVALRY.

London, Sept. 1st. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

I am aware that various reports are circulating touching the controversy which is proceeding within the Revisionist Union regarding our future relations with the Zionist Organisation, Mr. Meer Grossman, who is in charge of the work of the Executive Committee of the Zionist Revisionist World Union in London, declared in a statement to the J.T.A. to-day with regard to reports which are current concerning an impending split in the Revisionist movement over a demand by Mr. Jabotinsky and his supporters that the Revisionists should leave the Zionist Organisation and create an independent Zionist Organisation.

Some of these reports are of a sensational character, such as that we are being forced to transfer the head office from London, Mr. Grossman continued. There is no truth whatever in this. The bald facts are that a discussion regarding our future relations with the Zionist Organisation is going on within the Revisionist Union. The course which this discussion was to follow was decided at the recent Revisionist Conference in Basle, where decisions were reached, which it was hoped, would prevent the discussion becoming the property of the sensational press. It was further decided that the head office was to remain in London until the meeting of the Revisionist World Conference.

Moreover, the Basle Conference agreed that our work in the meantime was to proceed on the lines laid down at the various Revisionist Conferences, i.e., status quo. The Executive Committee in London as such can therefore take no other course than that marked out at the Basle Conference. The office will remain in London in accordance with the Conference's decision.

Meanwhile, the Executive Committee in fulfilment of the wishes of the Organisation as expressed at Basle is proceeding with its work in an orderly fashion. It is extending its internal organisation, arranging the periodic conferences in various countries, and preparing for the Revisionist World Conference in December.

It is also continuing with its political work in London and abroad, which is regarded as of the utmost importance at the present moment. Further, it is initiating important economic work which will have a direct connection with Palestine and will be closely bound up with Palestine immigration. The Executive Committee is determined, that no developments, not in agreement with the decisions of the Revisionist Conferences, shall divert it from its work.

I particularly desire to say, Mr. Grossman concluded, that there is no truth in any suggestion that Mr. Jabotinsky has been kept from effective leadership of the Party. No single member of the Executive Committee has called into question Mr. Jabotinsky's position as leader, nor is there any personal animosity or rivalry on the part of any of the Executive Committee.

Mr. Jabotinsky's Attitude.

. . . An indication of what is going on in the Revisionist Union was furnished by Mr. Jabotinsky in an interview with the J.T.A. published about six weeks ago in the J.T.A. Bulletin of July 23rd.

The Revisionist Party will now have to decide whether to continue its work for the revival of the present Zionist Organisation or whether it will create a new Zionist Organisation, he said.

On the most essential details complete harmony has already been established among the leading Revisionists. All agree that the Revisionist Union should continue its independent political activities and that the Revisionists should no longer be affiliated to the existing Zionist Federation. The question as to whether the Revisionists should participate in the next Congress will be left open until the Shekel Campaign for the Eighteenth Zionist Congress in 1933 is launched.

The only point on which unanimity between the Revisionist leaders has not been reached is the question as to whether their representatives should attend the meetings of the General Council of the Zionist Organisation. This question was not put to the vote, although it could have been settled at the Revisionist Conference at Basle, which was held immediately after the Zionist Congress. I feel that this might be attributed to the undue pressure on the part of delegates who were tired out by the fortnight's struggle at the Congress. It would not have been in accordance with Revisionist traditions to decide such a crucial problem without unanimous consent. For this reason I proposed that the question should be left open for settlement until December, when the World Conference of the Revisionist Party will meet. The ten Revisionist representatives on the General Zionist Council will in the meantime attend the meetings of this body, while I personally will take a much needed rest until the Revisionist Conference in December.

I have nothing to say about the results of the Seventeenth Zionist Congress, Mr. Jabotinsky went on. I did not re-enter the Congress hall after the resolution on the Judenstaat formula was rejected. I tore up then my delegate's card, and I am no longer concerned with anything that happened at the assembly. I consider the behaviour of the Revisionists at the Congress to have been tactful, firm and wise. I am at liberty to say this, since I was not responsible for the Revisionist tactics.

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Asked how he envisaged the realisation of the Balfour Declaration for establishing a Jewish National Home in Palestine, Mr. Fenner Brockway said: The Balfour Declaration? I am opposed to it in the form in which it was issued, because it provides an opportunity for ambiguous interpretations. Besides, the Balfour Declaration was issued with a view to winning the support of Jewish capitalism, and that in itself is a sufficient reason why we should oppose it.

MR. MALCOLM MACDONALD TO REPLACE DR. DRUMMOND SHIELS AS UNDER-SECRETARY FOR COLONIES: MR. JAMES DE ROTHSCHILD TO ENTER GOVERNMENT.

London, Sept. 2nd. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

Mr. Malcolm MacDonald, the Prime Minister's son, who played a very important part in bringing about the negotiations with the Jewish Agency after the storm of protest aroused by the Passfield White Paper, which led to the Prime Minister's letter of authoritative interpretation of the White Paper, is to succeed Dr. Drummond Shiels (who has resigned and joined the Labour Opposition to the National Government) as Under-Secretary of State for the Colonies, the Political Correspondent of the "News-Chronicle" states to-day, confirming reports to this effect which have been current for several days. As the Colonial Office has again been merged with the Dominions Office, under Mr. Thomas, who was Dominions Secretary in the last Government, Mr. MacDonald will be also Under-Secretary for the Dominions. Mr. MacDonald, who is a Labour member of Parliament, has declared for the National Government, and he is to meet the Labour Party in his constituency this week, to explain to them the stand he has taken.

Mr. James de Rothschild, the eldest son of Baron Edmond de Rothschild, the "father" of Palestine colonisation, and himself the President of the Palestine Jewish Colonisation Association (Pica), is also entering the Government, as Financial Secretary to the War Office, the forecast adds. This is the post which was held, when the Labour Government came into office, by Mr. Emanuel Shinwell, the only Jewish member in the last Labour Government. At the time of its fall, Mr. Shinwell, who has joined the Labour Opposition, was Minister of Mines. Mr. James de Rothschild is a Liberal member and has repeatedly spoken in Parliament for the Jewish case in Palestine, notably in the big Palestine debate after the issue of the Passfield White Paper.

Sir Frank Boyd Merriman, who was the leading Counsel for the Jewish Agency before the Shaw Enquiry Commission after the outbreak of the 1929 disturbances, is to be the Solicitor-General in the new Government. Sir Frank held this position in the last Conservative Government under Mr. Baldwin.

Sir Henry Betterton, also a Conservative, who was a member of the Shaw Commission, is Minister of Labour in the new Government.

SIR JOHN CHANCELLOR LEAVES PALESTINE: SAILING FOR ENGLAND ON RELINQUISHING HIGH COMMISSIONERSHIP: JEWISH REPRESENTATIVES AT RAILWAY STATION TO BID HIM FAREWELL.

Jerusalem, Sept. 2nd. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

Sir John Chancellor, the retiring High Commissioner for Palestine, left Jerusalem this morning by special train for Haifa, where he will embark to-night on board ship for England.

My personal opinion was, and still is, that we had nothing to do with a Congress of an association which is merely an appendix to a non-Zionist "agency". The Executive Committee of the Revisionist Party is composed of adherents of the various tendencies prevailing in the Revisionist Party. Naturally, I have reserved for myself the right to defend before the Revisionist Conference my own point of view.

Considering that there are Revisionists who would at this moment regret a complete severance of connection with the Zionist Organisation, I do not intend to oppose such connection as a mere symbol to the extent only that Revisionists should be present at the meetings of the General Zionist Council merely as observers. I shall, however, firmly oppose any form of practical co-operation, even if as an opposition within the Zionist Organisation, considering that this body is doomed by its own fault to sink soon into impotence and insignificance. The only successor to the Zionist Organisation created by Herzl is the Revisionist Union, and all those who desire to carry on the tradition of Herzl will have to join this Union, Mr. Jabotinsky concluded.

PALESTINE DOES NOT INTEREST US AS SPECIFICALLY JEWISH QUESTION: BALFOUR DECLARATION WAS ISSUED TO WIN JEWISH CAPITALISM AND THAT IS SUFFICIENT REASON WHY WE SHOULD OPPOSE IT: STATEMENT BY MR. FENNER BROCKWAY M.P. LEADER OF INDEPENDENT LABOUR PARTY: LEFT LABOUR WING NEVER SATISFIED WITH LABOUR GOVERNMENT'S POLICY IN PALESTINE AND BEEN IN OPEN CONFLICT ON QUESTION WITH LABOUR MINISTERS.

Warsaw, Sept. 1st. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The Palestine problem interests us only in as much as it affects British Imperialist policy, but as a specifically Jewish question Palestine does not interest us at all, Mr. Fenner Brockway, M.P., the Chairman of the Independent Labour Party in succession to Mr. Maxton, said in an interview with the Jewish press here during his present visit to Poland.

My group, the Left Wing of the Labour Party, has never been satisfied, he declared, with the policy which the Labour Government has been conducting in Palestine, just in the same way as we have not been satisfied with its policy in India, and we have been in open conflict with our Ministers on this question.

I personally consider that a large share of the responsibility for the acute situation existing in Palestine falls upon the British Administration, which has been aggravating the situation, Mr. Fenner Brockway said. Our group demanded a Jewish-Arab Round Table Conference to adjust matters between the two sides, because there is no ground for hostility between Jews and Arabs.

We appreciate the value of the Jewish colonisation in Palestine, he went on, because it is raising the cultural level of the entire Palestine population, but we cannot agree that this colonisation should be carried on at the expense of the Arab population.

The adherents of British Imperialist policy are interested in making the relations between Jews and Arabs constantly more acute, in order to enable them to play off one section of the population against the other. We are opposed to the Imperialistic policy of any Government, and we want to bring about a peace between Jews and Arabs.

Dr. Arlosoroff, the new head of the Palestine Zionist Executive, and Mr. Ben Zvi, the Palestine Labour leader, representing the Vaad Leumi, were among the big gathering assembled at the railway station to bid the retiring High Commissioner farewell. Both acted in their official capacities. A royal escort of nine aeroplanes accompanied Sir John's train.

RABBIS GIVEN FACILITIES FOR ENTERING PALESTINE: CHIEF RABBINATE'S GUARANTEE WILL BE ACCEPTED BY GOVERNMENT.

Jerusalem, Sept. 2nd. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

Facilities for the admission of Rabbis and other members of the Jewish clergy to Palestine are provided by a decision communicated to-day to the Jewish Agency, that the guarantee of the Chief Rabbinate of Palestine will be acceptable to the authorities in regard to the question of their maintenance.

ENGLISH ZIONISTS DECIDE TO SUPPORT NEW ZIONIST EXECUTIVE.

London, Sept. 2nd. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

This Conference of London Zionist Societies resolves to support the new Zionist Executive, and the President of the Zionist Organisation, Mr. Nahum Sokolov, in the tasks entrusted to them by the Zionist Congress, and calls upon all Zionists in Great Britain and Ireland to afford every assistance required in the establishment of the Jewish National Home, says a resolution adopted last night at a Conference of London Zionist Societies held to consider reports on the Seventeenth Congress.

This Conference, says another resolution, desires to express to Dr. Weizmann, the Honorary President of the Zionist Federation, its unabated confidence in him and the policy which he has pursued during his term of office as President of the Zionist Organisation, and to place on record its warm appreciation of his life-long and devoted services to the movement. This Conference resolves to convey to Dr. Weizmann its deep gratification at his acceptance of the invitation of South African Zionists to visit South Africa in the interests of the Keren Hayesod. In congratulating our Zionists in South Africa on the great distinction which is thus being conferred upon them, the Conference places on record the self-sacrificing act on the part of our Honorary President in subordinating all personal consideration in the interests of the cause.

This Conference, a third resolution says, calls upon all Zionist Societies in the British Isles to give their whole-hearted support to the present emergency campaign on behalf of Palestine, in order to avert the dangers inherent in the present economic crisis which menace our work in Palestine, and to help to redeem Palestine for the Jewish people.

70,000 JEWISH CHILDREN LEFT WITHOUT SCHOOLING IN POLAND BECAUSE JEWISH SCHOOLS HAVE NO FUNDS TO REOPEN MANY OF THEIR CLASSES; PARENTS BESIEGE WARSAW JEWISH COMMUNITY SCHOOLS AND CAUSE DAMAGE IN ATTEMPT TO GET THEIR CHILDREN ENROLLED; OWING TO ECONOMIC CRISIS CHILDREN HAVE TERRIBLE ATMOSPHERE OF MISERY IN HOMES AND PARENTS UNABLE TO FEED AND CLOTHE THEM.

Warsaw, Sept. 1st. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

About 70,000 Jewish children are estimated to have been left without schooling in Poland in the new school year which was opened to-day, because the Jewish Communities have found it impossible, owing to lack of funds, to open many of the school classes.

It is the poorer Jewish children who are mostly affected, and on account of the economic crisis, these children are suffering terrible hardship because they cannot go to school. The atmosphere in their homes is one of indescribable misery and desperation. The parents are unable to provide them with food or clothing, and many of them are running wild. The schools used to provide the children with meals and with clothes, and to-day, crowds of Jewish parents, anxious to obtain these opportunities for their children by getting them admitted to those few classes which have been reopened, besieged the Jewish Community schools in Warsaw, creating riots in some cases, and one of the schools was badly damaged in the crush. The Warsaw Jewish Community had announced that only a few of the classes would be reopened, and that therefore only a few children could be enrolled, but great crowds of Jews, nevertheless, came with their children in the hope of obtaining admission for them.

About 45,000 Jewish children in Poland who attend the schools, of the two Jewish educational organisations, the Hebrew Tarbuth Organisation and the Yiddish School Organisation, Zisho, may also be left without schooling in the new school year, in addition to those who were attending the Jewish Community schools, it was announced last week, because both organisations have no funds with which to continue their work. The teachers have not received salaries for months, it was stated. The subsidies granted by the foreign Jewish organisations, especially by the Joint Distribution Committee, have been reduced. The Polish Municipalities, which have been giving subsidies to the Jewish schools, have now removed them from their budgets, because of their own financial difficulties, and a large number of Jewish schools are in danger of being evicted from their school buildings, because they have not been able to pay their rent.

BERLIN JEWISH COMMUNITY FEARS WAVE OF SUICIDES AMONG ITS OFFICIALS WHOM IT IS COMPELLED BY FINANCIAL NEED TO DISMISS WITHOUT ANY POSSIBILITY OF FRESH EMPLOYMENT FOR THEM.

Berlin, Sept. 1st. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

In view of the continuing wave of suicides among German Jews, owing to their desperate economic position, (four cases occurred in Berlin to-day, apart from others in the provincial towns - Joseph Molling, a well-known banker, Manfred Katz, a dentist who was being evicted from his home, and Madame Erna Gerson and her 11 year old daughter Ruth) the Berlin Jewish Community is in a state of consternation over its decision to dismiss a large number of its officials, because it has no means of paying their salaries, and must take drastic economy measures, fearing that these dismissed officials, having no other employment open to them, will be moved to join the increasing number of Jewish suicides in Germany.

At the same time, the alarm of German Jewry over the dangers confronting them on the political side is added to to-day by the announcement made by Deputy Goebbels, the Hitlerist leader in Berlin, that a new big Hitlerist offensive is to be launched this autumn, which he is convinced will be successful in establishing a Hitlerist Government in power. The Hitlerist Party, he declared, has now 600,000 members enrolled on its books, besides another 200,000 storm troops.

There are, however, acute party differences, it appears, in the Hitlerist ranks, and it is believed that the Party may split, following the action of two of the chief leaders, Deputy Franzen, who was Minister of the Interior in the Brunswick Government, and Deputy Groh, the Chairman of the Hitlerist fraction in the Brunswick Diet, in announcing officially that they have left the Hitlerist Party. They have done this as a protest against an order sent out by Hitler that Deputy Rust, another prominent Hitlerist in Brunswick, should be the next Minister of the Interior in Brunswick instead of Deputy Franzen.

The entire activist group of the Hitlerist Party throughout Germany is protesting against the dictatorial attitude of Hitler in appointing and dismissing his leaders in the various States, and it is said that they are considering a secession en masse.

JEWISH REPRESENTATIVES IN POLAND MOURN DEPUTY HOLOWKA VICE-PRESIDENT OF GOVERNMENT PARTY ASSASSINATED BY UKRAINIAN INSURRECTIONARIES: TRIBUTES IN JEWISH PRESS TO HIS FRIENDSHIP AND UNDERSTANDING FOR JEWISH MINORITY: JEWISH REPRESENTATIVES ATTEND FUNERAL.

Warsaw, Sept. 2st. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

Representatives of the Agudath Israel, the Central Unions of Jewish Merchants, of Jewish Small Traders, and of Jewish Artisans, and many Rabbis and delegations from Jewish Communities in the provincial towns followed to-day the funeral of Deputy Tadeusz Holowka, the Vice-President of the Government Club of Deputies, who was assassinated this week in Lemberg by Ukrainian insurrectionaries. Deputy Rabbi Dr. Thon, the President of the Jewish Club of Deputies, sent a message of condolence in the name of the Jewish Club of Deputies, to the President of the Government Club of Deputies, Colonel Valeri Slawek. Deputy Rabbi Lewin, of the Agudath Israel, also sent Colonel Slawek a memorial address which he could not deliver himself because it was in a Christian cemetery.

The Jewish press pays tribute to Deputy Holowka as the man who has been in actual charge lately of the minorities problem in Poland, and a warm friend of the Jews.

We mourn his tragic death, says "Unzer Express", because he was one of the few men in Poland who had a definitely favourable attitude to the minorities in general and the problems of Jewish life in Poland in particular. When he was in the Polish Socialist Party he fought bravely for the rights of the national minorities, and demanded just treatment for them to the extent of complete autonomy, even. He always had an open heart and an open eye towards the Jews when many Polish party leaders, including leaders of the Polish Socialist Party, had not the slightest understanding for the Jewish demands. Even lately, when he became leader of the Government camp, he did not betray his past, and to the end he was as always the friend of the national minorities, and especially of the Polish Jews.

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
