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ANTI-JEWISH STUDENT TROUBLES IN POLAND SPREAD: CRACOW UNIVERSITY STILL CLOSED: JEWISH STUDENTS ATTACKED AT WARSAW UNIVERSITY: MOUNTED POLICE DISPERSE STUDENT MOB OUTSIDE JEWISH STUDENT HOME: NON-JEWISH UNIVERSITY LECTURER TRYING TO GET STUDENTS TO STOP ANTI-JEWISH AGITATION SET UPON AND INJURED: NEWSPAPERS ALLEGE JEWS PROVOKED DISTURBANCES: UNIVERSITY RECTOR APPEALS TO STUDENTS' PATRIOTISM NOT TO CONTINUE DISTURBANCES.

Warsaw, Oct. 30th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The anti-Jewish student disturbances which broke out at Cracow University yesterday are spreading to the other universities in the country, and attacks on Jewish students have already occurred at Warsaw University.

The situation at Cracow continues to be very alarming, and the authorities have decided to keep the University closed for the present. Some rioting took place to-day. The antisemitic students belonging to the National Democratic Party held a meeting in the morning, and proceeded to march on the Jewish Students' Home, where they smashed windows, and injured two Jewish students. The police soon arrived on the scene, however, and dispersed the demonstrators, who went off singing antisemitic and patriotic songs.

The Jewish students afterwards started to hold a protest meeting in the vicinity of the University, but the police ordered them to disperse.

In the afternoon a big crowd of National Democratic students again tried to break through to the Jewish Students' Home, but they were dispersed by a force of mounted police.

The antisemitic students are in a state of wild fury, and one of the lecturers at the University, Dr. Kruszynski, a non-Jew, who spoke to them protesting against the anti-Jewish disorders as unfitting for a University, was set upon by the students and injured.

The Rector of Cracow University has issued an appeal to the patriotic feelings of the students, pointing out that disorders are harmful to the interests of the country, and calling on them to accept the guidance of the University authorities and return to their peaceful studies.

The entire Cracow press, with the exception of the Polish Socialist Party's organ "Naprzod", puts the blame for the disturbances on the Jewish students, alleging that they provoked the anger of the National Democratic students by their arrogance.

WARSAW UNIVERSITY RECTOR ASSURES JEWISH STUDENTS HE WILL NOT PERMIT ANY DISTURBANCES.

Warsaw, Oct. 31st. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

Jewish students doing their first year course at the Faculty of Law were to-day set upon by antisemitic students and thrown out of the lecture rooms. The National Democratic students in the more advanced courses are believed to have instigated the younger students to start the trouble.

A delegation of Jewish students visited the Rector of Warsaw University to-day in order to make representations to him against the renewed anti-Jewish agitation. The National Democratic students are delivering speeches to the other students, they said, telling them what is happening at Cracow, and urging them to follow the example of the Cracow students, and kick the Jews out of the University. They are also distributing inflammatory leaflets among the students inciting them to violence against the Jews.

The Rector assured the Jewish students that he would not permit any anti-Jewish agitation at Warsaw University.

The Jewish students are discussing joint action with the students belonging to the Government Party and with the democratic student bodies in order to establish a united front against the anti-Jewish agitation.

How strong the National Democratic students are at the University was demonstrated to-day in the supplementary elections to the Committee of the law students, when, despite the united opposition of the Jewish and the Government Party students, the candidate put up by the National Democrats was nevertheless elected.

Cracow University is still closed to-day.

COUNT HELLDORF LED ATTACK ON JEWS NAZI STORM-TROOPER TELLS
BERLIN COURT.

Berlin, Oct. 31st. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

Count Helldorf was in command of the anti-Jewish excesses which occurred in Berlin on Rosh Hashanah, a man named Mill, who is employed as a waiter in the Hitlerist Club, declared to-day in giving evidence in the trial against Count Helldorf, and the other Hitlerists accused of having directed the anti-Jewish outbreak. The day after the excesses, he said, a Nazi official named Tiecke had boasted to him, "We did a good job of work in the Kurfuerstendamm, because Helldorf led us so ably."

The Presiding Judge thereupon turned to Tiecke and asked him whether it was true that Helldorf had led them, and Tiecke replied: Some Nazi comrades told me that Helldorf had led them, but I refuse to give the names of my comrades.

PALESTINE ARAB EXECUTIVE HAD NO RIGHT TO CALL OFF BALFOUR
DECLARATION DAY STRIKE GRAND MUFTI'S ORGAN COMPLAINS.

Jerusalem, Oct. 31st. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The Palestine Arab Executive had no right to announce that the annual general strike against the Balfour Declaration would not take place this year, the "Jamea el Arabia", the organ of the Moslem Supreme Council and the Grand Mufti, complains to-day. If it did not wish to organise the strike itself, it should have left it to individuals to decide how they should act.

The Executive of the Palestine Arab Women's Organisation issued to-day its usual protest against the policy of the Balfour Declaration.

GRAND MUFTI ALLEGES JEWS INVENTED STORY ABOUT RESTORATION OF
CALIPHATE AT FORTHCOMING JERUSALEM ISLAMIC CONGRESS.

Jerusalem, Oct. 31st. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

All that has been said about the Caliphate and the restoration of the Turkish ex-Sultan is without foundation and an invention of the Jewish press, the Grand Mufti of Jerusalem alleges in a statement published by the Cairo paper "Al Ahram".

The sole object of the Pan-Islamic Congress which is to be held in Jerusalem in December, he said, is to consider measures necessary to guard the sacred Moslem places, to consider certain religious questions and to cement a spiritual union of Moslems.

Many Moslem societies in Egypt, including the "El Rabita el Sharquia" (Eastern Union) youth associations, and individuals who have filled important religious posts, have been invited, the Mufti said, as have similar bodies and persons in Syria, Tripoli, Tunis, Morocco, Algiers, Persia, Yemen, Hedjaz-Nejd, Iraq, Afghanistan, India, Java, Jugoslavia, Albania, Poland, Turkey, and other places.

The creation of an association to foster Islamic culture, with the establishment of a Moslem University in Palestine as one of its aims will be among the questions before the Congress, he said, and the staff of the University will be apportioned among the various Moslem countries, which will be expected to make contributions and to give pledges to ensure the propagation of Moslem religious thought.

300 PALESTINE GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS TO BE "AXED".

Jerusalem, Oct. 31st. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

Fifty senior and 250 junior Government officials will be dismissed in accordance with the recommendations of the O'Donnell Economy Commission, it is reported here to-day, but no confirmation of the report can be obtained.

JEWISH AGENCY FINANCES: ASSETS GREATER THAN OBLIGATIONS.

Jerusalem, Oct. 31st. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The total obligations of the Jewish Agency amount to £P.700,000 against assets of over £P.800,000, even after deducting £P.500,000 for depreciation in the value of investments, Mr. Werner Senator, the Treasurer of the Jewish Agency Executive, declared at a press meeting held at the offices of the Jewish Agency here.

The £P.700,000 which were not all debts, he continued, included a number of budgetary obligations and several investments such as some £P.184,000 advanced in winding up the affairs of the American Zion Commonwealth, to which an additional sum of about £P.114,000 must be added. The Palestine Foundation Fund, the financial arm of the Jewish Agency, received land as security against this investment, the value of which will ultimately be recovered from the Jewish National Fund, to which the land passed.

The Executive of the Jewish Agency, he said, had never exceeded the limit of its ordinary credits and its actual obligations at the present time do not exceed £P.150,000, which amount includes overdue salaries of teachers and officials, and a further sum of £P.55,000 due to various banking institutions.

Recent developments (such as the fall in the pound and the economic depression in Central and Eastern Europe, and the heavy decline in income from the United States), he explained, have necessitated a curtailment of even the comparatively small sums budgetted at the last Zionist Congress in Basle.

It is cold comfort to us, Dr. Senator concluded, but great Governments, too, are faced with serious problems in balancing their budgets. I am confident, however, that the Zionist Organisation and the Jewish people know how to react to the situation and will enable us to surmount this trying period, both by strengthening the Jewish Agency and enlisting new forces for the upbuilding of the land.

FINANCIAL DIFFICULTIES IN ANGLO-JEWISH ASSOCIATION: HEAVY FALL
IN MARKET VALUE OF INVESTMENTS AND CONSIDERABLE DECLINE
IN REVENUE EXPECTED: NO FRESH OBLIGATIONS CAN THEREFORE
BE TAKEN ON PRESIDENT SAYS: NO MONEY FOR SIDE-SHOWS: HOPES
ASSOCIATION WILL BE ABLE TO MAINTAIN EXISTING COMMITMENTS.

London, Nov. 1st., (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

In view of the financial situation prevailing, it was necessary for him to point out that their first charge was the support of educational institutions, and that they had not the money for side-shows, so to speak, Mr. Leonard G. Montefiore, the President of the Anglo-Jewish Association, said at to-day's meeting of the Association. He was referring to a suggestion by Rabbi Dr. Daiches that Mr. Paul Goodman, who has recently returned from a mission to the Marranos in Portugal, should be invited to make a detailed report to the Association, in order to ascertain what the Anglo-Jewish Association could do to assist the Marranos. As far as the Association was concerned they were indebted to an amount of £50 in respect of the Marranos, Mr. Montefiore added. All the same, he would be glad for the Association to hear Mr. Goodman.

Not merely had there been a heavy fall in the market value of many of the Association's investments, Mr. Montefiore stated, but they had to be prepared in 1932 for a considerable decline in revenue. I do not think that I am unduly pessimistic, he said, in forecasting for 1932 a decline in revenue of some £14,000. Under the circumstances, I hope that we shall be able to maintain our existing commitments. It is our first and foremost duty to do so, and we must, in my opinion, be extremely chary of taking on fresh obligations.

By the end of 1931, he explained, they would have spent some £12,500 on the Evelina de Rothschild School in Jerusalem in connection with its removal and renovations and the need to provide this relatively large sum of money had come in an inopportune moment.

Mr. A. G. Brotman, the educational officer of the Anglo-Jewish Association in Baghdad, who is now in London, said that six Moslem boys had asked for admittance to the Shamash School and been accepted. The Government had not viewed the School "with any marked favour, he added, on account of the Chauvinistic spirit which animates the Arabs, requiring that all schools should be carried on in the Arabic language.

It was decided by the meeting to send a letter to the Chief Rabbi congratulating him for his work in connection with Calendar Reform. Dr. Daiches who raised the matter said that he thought the Association ought to associate itself with an expression of thanks to the Chief Rabbi, who had done great work indeed.

SIR HERBERT SAMUEL AS POSSIBLE PRIME MINISTER.

London, Oct. 30th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

From the point of view of his personal ambitions, Sir Herbert Samuel has all the cards in his hand, the "Evening Standard" writes to-night. He is, too, in the happy position of being able to cloak his objective with the mantle of high principle. As a convinced Free Trader in a Tariff Government he has only to resign in order to become the leader of the Opposition. For, faced with the prospect of being in the wilderness for five years, all Liberals, with the exception of the handful who may obtain office, will follow him.

Great things might come from such a step, the paper proceeds. The Liberals have every chance of being able to restore their fortunes quicker than Labour. Both parties are in the same state, and it may be years before the Socialists can recover from the hammering they have received. In this event Sir Herbert Samuel would be the natural heir to the throne. When the turn of the Opposition comes he would be the obvious Prime Minister - a possibility which hitherto has not entered even into his dreams.

All this, too, with the added satisfaction that here the path of duty is the path to glory.

With reference to Sir Herbert Samuel's opportunity, the writer proceeds, I once heard him say in Mr. Lloyd George's presence: "In the Bible Samuel anointed David. Now, however, David has anointed Samuel". Sir Herbert was referring to his appointment as High Commissioner for Palestine. Now it seems to me, he concludes, that by his attitude during the election David has anointed Samuel a second time. On this occasion, however, there has been no unction in the performance of the rite.

The "Manchester Guardian", the chief Liberal organ, also discusses Sir Herbert Samuel's position, pointing out that one of the first decisions that the official Liberals will have to take will be on the leadership. Mr. Lloyd George, it says, has not resigned the leadership, but it is highly improbable that he will continue to hold it. There is only one possible successor to Mr. Lloyd George, of course, it declares, Sir Herbert Samuel.

(Sir Herbert, who is at present Home Secretary in the National Government and the leader of the National Liberal Party, will celebrate his 61st. birthday next Friday, the 6th. inst.

NEW TREATMENT FOR CANCER: DISCOVERY BY DR. WILLIAM SUSMAN OF
MANCHESTER JEWISH HOSPITAL.

London, Nov. 1st. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

A new treatment for cancer based on the action of the pituitary gland is the subject of a prominent article in the "British Medical Journal" which was receiving widespread attention yesterday, the "Observer" writes in a column-long article to-day, drawing attention to the description contained in this article of a new treatment of cancer by Dr. William Susman, lecturer on pathology in the University of Manchester, and pathologist at Victoria Memorial Jewish Hospital.

In order to appreciate the significance of the discovery a leading physiological authority, who was consulted by a representative of the "Observer", it writes, pointed out that one must first recall previous experimental work on the pituitary gland and bear in mind the general relation of the glands to the problem of growth.

It is too early, was our authority's comment, it says, to assess fully the significance of this work, which must obviously be extended and applied to a large number of cases of all kinds. But the treatment described is simple, it was stated, it is comparatively free from danger, and it is not very expensive. And there seems no reason why it should not be tested thoroughly, at first in cases of inoperable disease, in order to see what degree of improvement, if any, can be obtained by other workers. Should the results be at all similar to those obtained by Dr. Susman, it will be clear that it is a discovery of very considerable importance, and it might be justifiable to apply the treatment in early stages of the disease.

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
