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TROUBLE IN WARSAW BECOMES MORE SERIOUS: STUDENTS NOW DEMAND
 NUMERUS NULLUS AGAINST JEWS: ANTISEMITIC FIGHTING AND
 DEMONSTRATIONS IN STREETS: JEWISH PACK-CARRIERS GIVE
 GOOD ACCOUNT OF THEIR PHYSICAL PROWESS MAKING ANTISEMI-
 TIC STUDENTS RUN HOWLING WITH BATTERED HEADS WHEN THEY
 START SMASHING WINDOWS IN JEWISH QUARTER: MOUNTED POLICE
 DISPERSE CROWD OF HOOLIGANS KNOCKING OVER PERAMBULATORS
 WITH BABIES WHILE MARCHING THROUGH WARSAW'S PRINCIPAL
 PARK: GOVERNMENT DECLARES DETERMINED TO PUT STOP TO DIS-
 TURBANCES.

Warsaw, Nov. 5th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The antisemitic disturbances at Warsaw University became more serious to-day, the fighting spreading to the streets of the city, the students making an excursion against the Jewish quarter, where they started smashing windows and would have done more serious damage, but for the Jewish pack-carriers, a body of physically strong men, who are known for their fighting abilities, and soon made the students run off very much battered, although the Jews, too, suffered a number of casualties.

The Jewish students coming to the University to-day found the entrances held by strong bodies of National Democratic students, who set upon the Jewish students, both men and girls, and forced them to give up their attempt to enter the University building.

A crowd of National Democratic students then held a street meeting just outside the University, but the police immediately broke up the meeting, and twenty National Democratic students were arrested, and will be put on trial. Groups of National Democratic students then went marching about in the vicinity of the University shouting "Smash the Jews! "We want a numerus nullus!" "No Jews at the University!"

They then made their way in groups to the Jewish quarter in the neighbourhood of the Eisendorplatz and started smashing windows. The Jewish pack-carriers then came on the scene and the students scattered before the fury of their attack. Some of them carried away ugly injuries, although there were a number of casualties also on the Jewish side.

On their way to the Jewish quarter, the student groups passed through the Saxon Park, the principal park in Warsaw, and some of them started knocking over perambulators with the infants inside, heedless of the cries of the mothers and nursemaids. Police on foot and mounted soon came up, and drove the hooligans out of the park and arrested twelve of them.

This evening the National Democratic students held a meeting, at which a resolution was adopted to continue the offensive against the Jews until there are no Jewish students left at the University.

Antisemitic Students Break Into Jewish Seminary And Hit
Students Attending Professor Balaban's Lecture: Minister
Of Education Holds Conference To Consider Government
Action.

While Professor Meyer Balaban, the Jewish historian, was lecturing to-day at the Seminary of Judaica in the University, a body of National Democratic students broke into the lecture hall, and hit the Jewish students.

Several professors, attracted by their cries, rushed in and took the Jewish students into the University Library and Archive, where they let them out by the back door, so that they escaped their assailants.

The J.T.A. is informed in official quarters that the Minister of Education, M. Jedrzejewicz, has to-day had a conference with the University authorities at which it was decided to adopt drastic methods, which it is believed will be effective in putting a stop to the outbreaks.

It is stated that twenty National Democratic students are under arrest for their part in the disturbances and that the Government intends to make an example of them. The Government is determined, it is said, to stop at nothing in order to put an end to the hooliganism which has broken out at the University, and the police have been instructed not to shrink from taking any measures of force which they may find necessary to deal with the disturbances.

WARSAW UNIVERSITY CLOSED DOWN BECAUSE OF CONTINUING DISTURBANCES: HEATED SCENE IN SENATE: GOVERNMENT SENATORS ACCUSE NATIONAL DEMOCRATIC SENATORS OF RESPONSIBILITY FOR TROUBLE: 15 JEWISH CORPSES WERE DELIVERED BY JEWS FOR DISSECTION LAST YEAR WHEN JEWISH PROPORTION REQUIRED ONLY TWELVE SAYS GOVERNMENT PARTY ORGAN SHOWING COMPLAINT JEWS NOT DELIVERING JEWISH CORPSES UNJUSTIFIED PRETEXT.

Warsaw, Nov. 6th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

Warsaw University was closed today on account of the continuing anti-Jewish student excesses, the Rector explaining in an official announcement that the situation has got out of hand and the authorities therefore see no other way of coping with it, except to suspend the work of the University. For the present the University is closed for one day, in the hope that the students will seerason and will not renew the disturbances when the University is reopened. But if the troubles continue the authorities will not hesitate to close the University until it is possible to carry on its work without the accompaniment of fighting and violence.

Heated scenes took place to-day in the Senate, where during the discussion on the Education Budget, Senators belonging to the Government Party angrily accused the Senators of the National Democratic Party of responsibility for the student excesses in the University and the surrounding streets.

The "Express Poranny", one of the papers of the Government Party, states to-day that since the New Year the Jews delivered up 15 Jewish corpses for dissection purposes, although on the percentage basis the Jews were required to provide only 12 corpses, so that the agitation worked up by the antisemitic students that the Jews are not supplying Jewish corpses for the work of the Jewish medical students is only a pretext.

THE UNEMPLOYED RIOTS IN PALESTINE: FOUR JEWISH LABOURERS
ARRESTED IN HEDERAH DEMONSTRATION SENT TO PRISON:
MAGISTRATE CENSURES POLICE FOR UNNECESSARY BRUTALITY

The four Jewish labourers who were arrested in the unemployed riots which took place yesterday in the Jewish colony Hederah, have been sent to prison for seven days.

Mr. Harcavy, the Haifa magistrate who tried them, took occasion at the same time to censure the police for using unnecessary brutality in dispersing the demonstrators.

Dr. Werner Senator, the Treasurer of the Jewish Agency Executive, and Mr. Remez, one of the leaders of the Palestine Jewish Labour Federation, have gone to Hederah to look into the situation.

PALESTINE GOVERNMENT UNYIELDING ON DEMAND OF MOTOR INDUSTRY:
WILL CONSIDER RECOMMENDATIONS OF INQUIRY COMMISSION IT
SAYS BUT MAKES NO PROMISE OF ANY CHANGE: NOT INFLUENCED
BY STRIKE.

Jerusalem, Nov. 5th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)...

A Government communique issued here to-day on the motor traffic general strike suggests that the Government has no intention of giving way to the demands of the strikers. The Government promises to consider the recommendations of its Board of Enquiry, in the matter of the taxation imposed on the motor industry, but makes no promise of any changes, being entirely uninfluenced in this regard by the pressure brought to bear on it by the strike.

The Haifa Municipality has adopted a resolution calling upon the Government to settle the strike immediately, and a group of merchants in Jerusalem have threatened to close down their shops unless a settlement is effected.

ALBERT HALL DEMONSTRATION ORIGINALLY ARRANGED AS PROTEST
AGAINST BALFOUR DECLARATION NOW CHANGED "TO EXTEND
BRITAIN'S HAND OF FRIENDSHIP TO MOSLEM WORLD."

London, Nov. 6th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The demonstration which was arranged some time ago at the Albert Hall by the National League for November 2nd., the anniversary of the Balfour Declaration, in order to protest against the Balfour Declaration policy in Palestine, and which was postponed a few days ago until next Friday, November 13th., will now have also a different character to that at first announced. The demonstration, it is stated to-day, is being held "to extend Great Britain's hand of friendship to the Moslem World".

The Moslem delegation to the India Round Table Conference will be present, as well as many Indian princes and members of the House of Lords and the House of Commons. Speeches will be delivered by the Aga Khan, Sir Muhammad Iqbal, Maulaana Shaukaat Ali, the Nawab of Chittari, the Begum Shah Nawaz, and British leaders of the movement.

NEW BRITISH GOVERNMENT: LORD READING RETIRES AND IS REPLACED BY SIR JOHN SIMON AS FOREIGN MINISTER: SIR HERBERT SAMUEL REMAINS HOME SECRETARY: SIR PHILIP CUNLIFFE-LISTER BECOMES NEW COLONIAL SECRETARY: MR. ORMSBY-GORE AND SIR HENRY BETTERTON MEMBER OF SHAW COMMISSION BOTH IN CABINET.

London, Nov. 6th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

Lord Reading is not in the new Government, which has been reconstructed by the Prime Minister, Mr. Ramsay MacDonald, after the elections, having retired from his position as Foreign Secretary (on account of his age - he is 71 -), Sir John Simon, who joined with Lord Hailsham, former Lord Chancellor, who is also included in the new Government as Minister of War, in the famous letter to the "Times" on November 4th., 1930, challenging the Passfield White Paper, as a departure from the terms of the Palestine Mandate, and demanding that "unless and until the matter is taken to the Hague Court and the Court has pronounced in their favour, the British Government should not enforce those paragraphs which are challenged", has been appointed Foreign Secretary in place of Lord Reading. It will thus devolve upon him to explain British policy in Palestine at the meetings of the League of Nations Council, as Mr. Henderson did at the time of the Palestine disturbances of August 1929, the issue of the Passfield White Paper, the question of the Wailing Wall, and other matters affecting Palestine policy.

Sir Herbert Samuel, the leader of the Liberal Party, who has his birthday to-day, attaining the age of 61, retains his position as Home Secretary.

Mr. J. H. Thomas, who has been Secretary for the Dominions and the Colonies, returns now to the Ministry for the Dominions, and Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, who was President of the Board of Trade in the last Conservative Government and also in the first National Government, becomes Secretary of State for the Colonies.

Sir Philip, who was formerly known as Sir Philip Lloyd-Greame, assuming the name Cunliffe-Lister in 1924, was a member of the Lloyd George Coalition Government and then of the Bonar Law Government which was formed on the collapse of the Lloyd George Coalition in 1922. He is not known to have taken any stand on the Palestine question, and even during the violent "bag and baggage" campaign which was conducted by a large section of the press during the 1922 election, demanding that the British Government should "clear out of Palestine", he made no statement either way, although all the candidates in the election were besieged with demands for statements for or against the Palestine policy, which were being published in big batches daily. In Palestine debates in Parliament, he did not vote.

Mr. Baldwin, the Conservative leader, who with Sir Austen Chamberlain and Mr. Amery sent a letter to the "Times" in October, also protesting against the Passfield White Paper, is Lord President of the Council in the new Government, and it is understood that he will be leader of the House of Commons.

Mr. Ormsby-Gore, former Under-Secretary of State for the Colonies and well-known for his favourable stand on Palestine policy, who held a minor position in the first National Government, is now in the Cabinet, as First Commissioner of Works, and Sir Henry Betterton, the Conservative member of the Palestine Enquiry Commission set up after the Palestine outbreak of August 1929, who was Minister of Labour in the first National Government, retains the post in the new Government, but has been promoted to the Cabinet.
