WARSAW RIOTING NOT ONLY ANTI-JEWISH BUT ANTI-GOVERNMENT SAYS  
MINISTER OF INTERIOR IN INSTRUCTIONS TO POLICE TO DEAL  
MORE DRASTICALLY WITH RIOTERS: 180 STUDENTS NOW UNDER  
ARREST INCLUDING PRESIDENT OF STUDENTS' FEDERATION:  
DEMAND BY NATIONAL DEMOCRATIC PARTY FOR THEIR RELEASE  
REJECTED: STUDENTS DEMONSTRATE AGAINST PRIME MINISTER:  
"GAZETA WARSZAWSKA" CONFISCATED: ANOTHER ATTEMPTED RAID  
ON JEWISH STUDENTS' HOME BEATEN BACK BY POLICE.

Warsaw, Nov. 8th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The National Democratic manifestations at the Warsaw University are directed not only against the Jews, but against the Government, the Minister of the Interior, M. Pieracki, states in a new order which he has issued to the police, instructing them to deal more drastically with the rioters.

180 National Democratic students are now under arrest, for participation in the disturbances, including their leader, M. Kurcusz, the President of the Students' Federation. A demand for their release made by the leaders of the National Democratic Party has been rejected.

The "Gazeta Warszawska", the chief organ of the National Democratic Party, has been confiscated for publishing inflammatory reports concerning the occurrences at the University.

While the Prime Minister, Colonel Prystor, was getting out of his motor-car outside the Prime Minister's office, a group of National Democratic students who had collected there, demonstrated against him, shouting "Down with the Government". They were immediately dispersed by the police, and a number of of them were arrested.

There were several attempts at fresh outbreaks made by National Democratic students during the course of the day, but each time the demonstrators were dispersed by the police before they got properly together, and many of the demonstrators were arrested.

Another attempt was made by National Democratic students to-day to raid the Jewish Student Home, but this, too, was beaten back by the police, and the demonstrators went off with anti-Government cries.

ANTISEMITIC AGITATORS GOING TO ART ACADEMY TO INCITE STUDENTS  
AGAINST JEWS GET THRASHED BY NON-JEWISH ARTISTS.

Warsaw, Nov. 8th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

A group of National Democratic students went this morning to the Academy of Art to try to persuade the art students to drive out their Jewish colleagues. Instead of this, the non-Jewish artists locked up the antisemitic agitators in one of the rooms, gave them a good thrashing, and then drove them out of the building.

OCCURRENCES AT WARSAW UNIVERSITY ARE DISGRACE TO CIVILISED NATION SAYS PROCLAMATION ISSUED BY UNIVERSITY SENATE.

Warsaw, Nov. 8th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The occurrences at Warsaw University are described as a disgrace to a civilised nation in an appeal issued to-day by the Senate of Warsaw University, calling upon the students to turn away from those of their number who have been guilty of committing acts of brutality. The Senate expresses the hope that the great body of students will go back quietly to their studies and restore the lost prestige and honour of the academic youth of the country.

GOVERNMENT CONTEMPLATING ABOLITION OF UNIVERSITY AUTONOMY AND APPOINTMENT OF GOVERNMENT COMMISSIONERS TO KEEP ORDER.

Warsaw, Nov. 8th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The Government intends to abolish the right of autonomy at present enjoyed by the Universities and to appoint a Government Commissioner to each University who will be responsible for the maintenance of order, according to a report current here to-day, if the Rectors are unable to put a stop to the student disturbances inside the University buildings.

More effective Government control over the Universities is felt to be essential, it is said, to counter the immense National Democratic influence among the students and in the University Senates.

POSEN UNIVERSITY STUDENTS DECIDE TO STAND SOLID WITH NATIONAL DEMOCRATIC STUDENTS AT OTHER UNIVERSITIES.

Warsaw, Nov. 8th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The students at the University of Posen have decided at a student meeting held to-day to stand solid with the National Democratic students at the other Polish Universities in the action which they have taken to enforce their demands for the exclusion of Jewish students from the Universities.

GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN AND NATIONAL DEMOCRATIC DEPUTY TO FIGHT DUEL: SEQUEL TO SPEECHES IN PARLIAMENT WHEN EX-MINISTER CALLED NATIONAL DEMOCRATS DEGENERATES AND SCUM.

Warsaw, Nov. 8th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

Deputy Stypulkowski, the National Democratic spokesman in yesterday's sitting of Parliament, who defended the action of the National Democratic students, has sent his seconds to ex-Minister Miedzinski, the Government Party spokesman who replied to his speech, to challenge him to a duel for having insulted him and his Party by describing them as wild and irresponsible degenerates, who stand for things done only by the scum of the people and in no way reflect the feeling of the Polish nation.

JEWISH STUDENTS LEFT UNIVERSITIES TO FIGHT FOR FATHERLAND WHEN ENEMY INVADED COUNTRY SAYS PROTEST ADOPTED BY FEDERATION OF JEWISH FIGHTERS FOR POLISH INDEPENDENCE: DEMAND FOR EXCLUDING JEWS FROM UNIVERSITIES UNJUST AND UNWORTHY.

Warsaw, Nov. 8th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The Federation of Jewish Fighters for Polish Independence, whose membership is restricted to people who during the Great War fought in the Polish Legions for the liberation of Poland, and afterwards fought in the Polish army which beat back the Russian Bolshevik invasion, has held a protest demonstration here against the antisemitic disturbances at the universities of Cracow, Lemberg and Warsaw.

When the call went out to the Polish youth in November 1918, and again at the time of the Bolshevik invasion in 1921, to fight for the fatherland, says the resolution adopted at the meeting, the Jewish students left the Universities and went to the front to fight for Polish independence and liberty. The roll of honour in Warsaw University contains very many Jewish names. The demand of the National Democratic students that Jews should be excluded from the Universities, the resolution declares, is therefore unjust and unworthy.

#### WARSAW BUNDIST SHOT DEAD BY COMMUNIST IN TRADE UNION CLASH.

Warsaw, Nov. 8th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

A Jewish bake-house worker named Abraham Neuman, 31 years of age, who belonged to the Jewish Socialist Party Bund, was shot dead to-day by a Jewish Communist in the course of a fight between Bundists and Communists over a question concerning the conduct of the professional interests of the Jewish bake-house workers.

∴ Fighting between Bundist and Communist workers is frequent in Poland, the Bundists resenting the attempts of the Communists to obtain control of the Jewish trade unions. Last year and also in 1929, there were several such clashes, in which revolvers were used and people were killed and injured. There was trouble of this kind in the Jewish bakery industry in Warsaw in November 1929, when the Communist bakers' union called a strike, which the Bundist bakers' union repudiated. Groups of Communists went about attacking bakeries where Bundist workers were at work, and there were many serious injuries and arrests on both sides.

#### WHOLE AFFAIR OF ROSH HASHANAH ATTACK ON BERLIN JEWS MAY BE REOPENED IN APPEAL LODGED BY PUBLIC PROSECUTOR AGAINST SENTENCES IN BOTH TRIALS.

Berlin, Nov. 8th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The Public Prosecutor has lodged an appeal against the sentences passed by the court on Count Helldorf and his associates in the anti-Jewish excesses here on Rosh Hashanah, on the ground that they are totally inadequate. He has also appealed against the heavier sentences passed at the end of September on the participants in the excesses, claiming that these, too, are not sufficiently severe, so that it is possible that the whole affair may be reopened.

#### PREPARATIONS FOR PALESTINE GENERAL STRIKE CALLED OFF AND MOTOR STRIKE MAY END SOON: ACTION TAKEN BY STRIKE LEADERS FOLLOWING GOVERNMENT ANNOUNCEMENT OF WILLINGNESS TO POSTPONE COLLECTION OF LICENCE FEES FOR ANOTHER MONTH.

Jerusalem, Nov. 8th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The Palestine motor strike will probably end tomorrow, without extending, as was feared, to a general strike of shopkeepers and others throughout the country, as a protest against the rise in prices of food and other articles owing to transport difficulties.

This evening a Government announcement was received by the "Palestine Bulletin" stating that the Government was postponing the collection of licence fees for another month. The "Palestine Bulletin" communicated this announcement to the strike-leaders, who immediately held a conference in the editor's office, and decided to call off the general strike, and adjourned to consider what action to take with regard to the motor traffic strike.

Before this, the Motor Drivers' and Owners' Union issued a statement declaring that they are not opposed to licence fees on principle, but that they are not able to pay the fees, as has been recognised by the Board of Inquiry. The Union places on the Government the responsibility for the severe losses suffered by the motor industry in Palestine.

The hope of a speedy settlement is also seen in the action of the Acting High Commissioner, Mr. Young, the Chief Secretary to the Palestine Government, in having an interview this morning with three of the members of the Enquiry Board, Mr. Shelley, President of the Jerusalem Chamber of Commerce, Mr. Rokach, former Mayor of Tel Aviv, and Mr. Ya'eli, the leader of the motor drivers in Haifa.

Despite the dislocation of traffic on account of the strike, Baron Henri de Rothschild, the well-known French dramatist and founder of the Pigalle Theatre in Paris, who is a nephew of Baron Edmond de Rothschild, the "father" of Jewish colonisation in Palestine, arrived in Jerusalem this morning.

AMERICAN ZIONIST CONVENTION OPENED: STILL UNCERTAINTY OVER NEXT ZIONIST LEADERSHIP: SENATOR BORAH SENDS MESSAGE TO CONVENTION EXPRESSING SYMPATHY FOR IDEA OF FORMING PRO-PALESTINE COMMITTEE IN AMERICA: BACKBONE OF PASSFIELD POLICY BROKEN SAYS MR. EMANUEL NEUMAN BUT PLANS CONVENTION AGAINST UNDUE OPTIMISM: HAD CONFERENCE IN WASHINGTON WITH JUDGE BRANDEIS ON EVE OF CONVENTION.

New York, Nov. 8th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The 34th. annual Convention of the Zionist Organisation of America was opened at Atlantic City to-day, and will remain in session until Tuesday night. Judge Julian W. Mack opened the Convention, which is attended by 500 delegates from all parts of the country.

Great uncertainty still exists with regard to the future leadership of American Zionism, despite the peace pact which was concluded between the Mack-Szold and the Lipsky group last month under which a committee was appointed, consisting of Mr. Robert Szold, Mr. Louis Lipsky, Mr. Israel Brodie, Mr. Abraham Tulin, Mr. Morris Rothenberg and Judge William M. Lewis, empowered to recommend to the Convention the selection of a national Zionist Administration, which will disregard partisan differences and will aim at securing the co-operation of all Zionist forces in America, without regard to majorities or factions.

A letter from Senator Borah, Chairman of the Foreign Relations Committee of the United States Senate, strongly favouring the idea of establishing a Pro-Palestine Committee in America, was read out to the Convention by Mr. Emanuel Neuman, member of the Zionist World Executive, who has just returned from Washington where he held a number of conferences with important individuals high in Government and academic circles in America, with a view to the formation of a Pro-Palestine Committee in the United States on similar lines to the existing Pro-Palestine Committees in Germany, France and other European countries.

Such a Committee, Senator Borah writes in the letter, will be helpful in the dissemination of accurate and reliable information from Palestine and for giving encouragement to the movement. I am in sympathy with the work and shall always be glad to help.

Mr. Neuman, who in the course of his stay in Washington also had a conference with Judge Brandeis, the former head of the American Zionist Organisation, who is celebrating his 75th. birthday next week, warned the Convention in his address against undue optimism, even though, he said, the backbone of the Passfield policy is broken.

Mr. Neuman announced that they were beginning to establish a Palestine Economic Bureau as a clearing house for their various problems, and to give opportunities and information to people interested in Palestine. He appealed to American Zionists to send settlers to Palestine, urging an American emigration to Palestine of a thousand American Jewish families in possession of means who would be able to help in the development of the country.

#### HEYERMANS' STATUE IN AMSTERDAM SMEARED WITH PAINT.

Amsterdam, Nov. 8th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The statue to the famous Jewish dramatist, Herman Heyermans, which was recently erected in the Vandel Park in Amsterdam, was smeared during the night with red paint. The police have opened an investigation. It is suggested that antisemites are responsible for the outrage, particularly as Heyermans was also an active Socialist, and the Hitlerist movement, which is beginning to invade Holland from Germany is also violently anti-Socialist.

Herman Heyermans, who was famous both as playwright and novelist, was the author of "The Ghetto", "Sabbath", "Diamond Town", and other works dealing largely with the life of the Jews in Holland. He was born in Rotterdam in 1864 and died in Amsterdam in 1924. At the end of September this year, the Amsterdam City Council adopted a resolution to name one of the new streets in Amsterdam the Heyermans Street.

#### NO STOPPAGE OF IMMIGRATION TO URUGUAY: STATEMENT BY HICEM.

Paris, Nov. 8th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

In view of reports which appeared last week in certain papers to the effect that the Government of Uruguay had decided to suspend immigration to Uruguay, the Management of the Hias-Ica-Emigdirekt (Hicem) though very doubtful about the correctness of the report, cabled to its office in Montevideo for the facts. A telegram has just been received in reply which states that the report is completely untrue and that there have been no restrictions and no changes whatever in regard to immigration to Uruguay. The country remains accessible to all emigrants who comply with the formalities required - presenting a valid passport, medical certificate of health, certificate of moral conduct and a certificate of qualification in their trade or profession.

On account, however, of the economic crisis which is affecting Uruguay as it is affecting all countries, it is possible at present only for artisans or skilled workers to find employment there.
