PALESTINE MOSLEM WORLD CONGRESS: SHAUKAT ALI ARRIVES IN
JERUSALEM: SAYS I AM RESPONSIBLE FOR CONVENING CONGRESS
ASSERTING ITS DECISIONS BE BINDING ON ALL MOSLEMS AS

Jerusalem, Dec. 4th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Shauket Ali, the Indian Moslem leader, accompanied by his son and by Sheik Taftzzni, arrived in Jerusalem this morning from Cairo, to attend the Palestine Moslem Congress, which is opening here on Sunday evening.

The Grand Mufti met Shaukat Ali, and Fakhri Nashashibi, one of the members of the opposition to the Grand Mufti,

received Sheik Taftazni.

The Grand Mufti kept away from the arrivels all newspapermen, except those who are Moslems and his own supporters. Even Mr. Drazny, a well-known Egyptian Moslem publicist, who was representing a Turkish newspaper, was not allowed to see them.

A few British new spaper correspondents have been invited to attend the formal opening of the Congress on Sunday evening, but only Moslems will be permitted to be present at the actual deliberations, which will take place in the Mosque of Omer area.

The decisions adopted by the Islamic Congress which is opening in Jerusalem on Sunday evening, will be binding on all Moslems in the same way as a decision of the College of Cardinals is binding on all Roman Catholics, Maulana Shaukat & All declared in an interview published to-day in the "Bourse Egyptienne", which he gave to a correspondent of the paper while he was in Cairo on his way to Palestine.

I am responsible for convening this Congress,

Shaukat Ali claimed, and its chief aim is to protect the Moslem World against the danger of European culture, which is

poisoning our youth.

The Congress will also deal with the question of the Moslem Holy Places in Palestine, he said, and will determine the place of Jerusalem as a Holy Centre for Moslems. The projected Moslem University in Jerusalem is a need of the hour, he said, because we must provide opportunities for the Moslem fouth to study, in addition to Moslem literature and culture, all other subjects taught at a modern University, in order to train good and faithful Moslems, who will be capable of carrying on the fight for Moslem existence.

Turning to the question of Zionism, Shaukat Ali said "the Balfour Declaration means nothing to us. We have never

accepted it and we never shall accept it".

Jewish immigration to Palestine must be stopped in order to prevent unemployment in the country, he went on, and if in spite of our demands Jewish immigration continues, we shall find the necessary ways and means of organising a Moselem immigration to Palestine, and we shall see who will win.

I sm taking an active interest in Palestine, Shaukat Ali explained to the interviewer, because Palestine is sacred to Moslems in the same way as Mecca, and there is no power in this world that can prevent us Moslems from giving our atten-

tion to this question.

I do not oppose an understanding between Arabs and Jews, Shaukat Ali concluded, although I sm against a Jewish National Home, and I have nothing at all against an understanding being reached with those Zionists who are already in Palestine, so that they may remein there, but only on condition that the Jews give up their demand for special rights and privileges in Palestine.

"It will be recalled that in a Fecent interview with a representatibe of the 'Egyptian Gazette', Al Haj Amin el Husseini, Mufti of Jerusalem, and one of the prime movers in the proposed Islamic Congress, asked if it was true that there was strong opposition to it on the part of Falestine Moslems, replied that those who oppose him did not amount to more than one per cent.", the "Egyptian Gazette" writes, drawing attention to the large number of important signatories to the manifesto issued by the Opposition, including members of the Falestine Areb Executive, the Supreme Koslem Council, the Sharia Courts, sha mayors and members of Falestine municipalities.

The attitude of the Wahabi Government to the Congress is made clear in a statement by the Hedjaz Minister for "ar, Jamal el Gazzi Pasha, who is now in Beirut, published in the

Beirut paper "Al Ahrer".

He considers that it is not in the interest of Moslems to hold the Congress in Jerusalem as Pelestine is under a Mandate, "Al Ahrer" says. It would be best under the circumstances, he thinks, for the Congress to be in the Hediaz, which is an independent Moslem country. King Ibn Saud, his "ar Minister declared, would like a Congress in Aecce, but he does not intend to eall it soon.

The Hedjaz-Nejd Legation in Cairo has intimated that the Government of the Hedjaz has not appointed any dele-

gates to the Jerusalem meeting.

Turkey has also received an invitation to the Congress, the Minister said, but, considering that the Congress is contrary to the interests of progress and civilisation, it is clear that Turkey cannot participate. It is obvious, he concluded, that the Congress will have a purely local and limited character.

"Originally the purpose of the Congress was said to be to launch a movement for the restoration of the Caliphate, the Turkish ex-Sultan Abdel Kejid being mentioned as the Caliph, with Jeruselem as his seat. The Turkish ambassador in London was reported in October to have made representations against any restoration of the ex-Caliph after the Turkish people had deposed him, and owing to these representations, it is believed, the Aga Khan and Shaukat Ali both issued statements in London at the time repudiating the movement, so far as the Indian Moslems are concerned, and describing any attempt to restore the Caliphate as "desurd".

London, Dec. 4th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The intervention of the Turkish Government with the Pritish Government with regard to the Moslem Congress was confirmed to-day to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency in official Government circles. The reply given by the British Government, it is understood, was satisfactory to the Turkish Government.

The British Covernment adopts an attitude of detachment as regards the Moslem Congress. The Government understands that no contentious political questions will be discussed at that Congress, which will be confined to religious matters only. In these the Government is not inclined to intervene, insofar as there will be no danger of disturbing public peace in Palestine, which is a matter over which the Palestine Administration will, of course, watch.

## ROUNDING UP PALESTINE BRIGANDS: TWO ARRESTS MADE.

Jerusalem, Dec. 3rd. (Jewish Telegrephic Agency).
Two brigands were captured to day, one of them believed to be connected with the hold-up at Ramallah on Satunday, in which Dr. Strathearn, Director of the Jerusalem Opthalmic Hospital, Miss Coates, Principal of the Jerusalem Girls' College, Miss McInnes, the daughter of the Anglican Bishop in Jerusalem, and other prominent British residents were robbed, and the other with a hold-up which was carried out on November 24th.

Reports of hold-ups in Palestine since September 17th. show that eight have been committed in the Nablus District, four near Tulkarem, three in the neighbourhood of Ramloh, two near Safod, the same number sutside Haifa, and one each in the Aare, Jeriche, and Beersheba districts, making a total of 22. In only one case do any arrests appear to have been made previous to the present two.

REVISIONIST CENSUS BOYCOTTERS GO TO PRISON SINGING "HATIKVAH".

Jerusalem, Dec. 4th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The District Court at Jaffa has to-day ordered nine

youths to pay £5 or go to prison for a month for sabotaging the census. All of them elected to go to prison rather than pay the fine, and went off to prison singing the "Hatikvah". The authorities are putting them to light work in prison.

The Executive has requested Mr. H. Farbstein to come to London for a few weeks prior to his departure for Palestine. While in London, Mr. Farbstein will give his attention to financial and economic matters connected with his future duties in Palestine.

JORGA WITH CUZAY: ROUMANTAN PREMIER CONGRATULATES ANTISEMITIC

IEADER WHEN HE TELLS PARLIAMENT ONLY DIFFERENCE OF METHODS

Professor Cuza, the Roumanian antisemitic leader,
speaking in the Chamber to-day said that he welcomed the present crisis in the country, because it is smashing the banks
through which the Jews exercise their domination over the
Roumanian people.

BE DISSOLVED AND CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY APPOINTED.

Between Professor Jorga , the Prime Minister, and myself, he said, there is only a difference of methods, but in essentials we are at one, and by the spring there will be a

Professor Jorga thereupon rose and amid much applause from the Government benches congratulated Professor Cuza. Deputy Samuel Singer, one of the members of the

fessor Cuza's antisemitic speech.

of the antisementic terrorist youth organisation, the leader of the antisementic terrorist youth organisation, the Iron Guard, who in 1925 assassinated the Prefect of Jassy, M. Manciu, because he had taken measures to prevent an anti-Jowish outbreak, and who was recently elected to Parliament in a bye-election. This was his first speech in the Chamber, and he devoted it to a passionate demand for the expulsion of all Jows from Roumenia. If our aims are not given effect by this Parliament, Codreanu warned the Chamber, it will have to be dissolved, and we shall appoint a National Constituent Assembly which will carry out the will of the people.

The relations between Professor Jorga and Professor Cuza have been the subject of frequent speculation in the Roumenian press since Professor Jorga's accession to power. There was a good deal of pointed talk when last summer, in the depate on the King's speech Professor Cuza was cheered loudly by the Government Deputies when he recalled the collaboration which had existed years ago between Professor Jorga and himself, when they had been joint leaders of the antisemitto party of the time.

Professor Ouza was moved to the recollection of these old days, when Deputy Theodore Fischor, the leader of the Jewish Farty, rose in protect against his allegations that the Jews were a disloyal element, and his demand that they should therefore be excluded from the army. He hurl insults of a personal character against the Jewish Deputies and invoked Professor Jorga's past to argue that the Prime Minister's views on the Jewish question are not dissimilar

The democratic general press expressed alarm at the time at the close friendship which it said was being displayed in Government quarters towards Professor Guza.
The "Adeverul", for instance, asked why Communists were not failowed to sit in Ferliament, their seats being invalidated,

while the Cuzists, who are just as much impossibilists and wreckers, have been allowed to retain their seven (with Codreanu's bye-election seat eight) seats in Farliament. The Government has announced that it would take drastic measures against all extremist movements, it said, but these measures are confined only to the extremists of the Left, while the Cuzists who are just as much out for the viclent disruption of the State, are being honoured and their leader is given a high order and is applauded by the Government benches. When the qlections took place for the President of the Chamber, the Adevenul added, there were many Deputies who judged from Professor Jorga's attitud towards Cuza that he would like Cuza to be elected, and consequently Cuza obtained no less than 40 votes, with the Government candidate, Deputy Pompei, who has been elected, securing 120 votes.

In April, soon after Professor Jorga became Prime kinister, a Cuzist paper, the "Gazeta Maramuresului", appearing in Marmorosz, in the Province of Transylvania, under the editorship of a priest named Barlea, reprinted an article which Professor Jorga had published in 1908 when he was associated with Professor Cuza in the leadership of the League of Christian National Defence, with the intention of showing that the Premier is in agreement with Cuza on the action to be taken against the Jows.

Since the war, Professor Jorga has repeatedly and emphatically declared that he is opposed to antisemitism, and when he took office as Prime Minister he reiterated this in his statement to the representatives of the press. Dr. Filderman, the President of the Union of Roumanian Jews, said in discussing the new Government with the J.T.A.

The Jewish National Party, as well as the leaders of the Union of Roumanian Jews have expressed satisfaction with Professor Jorga's present views on the place of the Jewish citizens in the Roumanian State, and when Parliament celebrated his 60th, birthday last Juhe, the Jewish Party spokesman lauded him as a scholar and a wise statesman.

In September, however, there was a storm in the Roumanian press over an alleged utterance by Professor Jorga to a deputation of peasants in which he complained that it was against his wish that the minister of Finance had got the National Bank to help those "Jides" of the Berkovitch Bank, and told the peasants that if they had no money to pay their bills they should protest them. We can't run the National Bank as we would like, he added, because the foreign expert in charge will not allow it, and if we act against his wishes he has threatened that he will leave the country and declare Roumania bankrupt.
