PAUL WARBURG CREMATED.

New York, Jan. 26th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The remains of the late Paul M. Warburg were cremated to-day.

The funeral service was strictly private, only immediate members of the family attending, in accordance with his wish expressed before his death.

The entire American press is publishing editorials and long appreciative notices of Mr. Paul Warburg's important work for American currency and economic stability.

GERMAN PRESS FULL OF LAUDATORY TRIBUTES TO PAUL WARBURG: WAS AT 33 A HAMBURG CITY COUNCILLOR AND ADMAYS REEKEBERED BIS NATIVE LAUD WITH AFFECTION: CRIEF AT GROWING CONDOID DISTRESS IN GERMANY HELPED TO WEAKEN HIM IND HASTENED FIS

Berlin, Jan. 28th. (Jewish Telegraphic Kgency).
The German press As printing to-day long obituaries and approintions of the late Paul M. Warburg, adding some bio-

graphical notes recalling the long association of the Warburg family with Hamburg, where Mr. Peull M. Warburg, too, was born.
The City of Famburg amnounces general mourning in memory of its illustrious son. The Hamburg papers point out that this illustrious american always remained a good Hamburger,

and wherever it did not conflict with his American lovalties would try to help his German homeland. "hen he was 33 years of age, &r. Paul Warburg was a member of the Hamburg City Council, and Namburg citizens looked to him as one of their coming big men. The "Yossisohe Zeitung" emphasises that hr. Warburg" always stood for "kmerican-Gorman co-operation, and in his last

years followed with intense anxiety the growing economic distress in Germany, and this was one of the causes of his break-down and his weakened condition, helping to hasten his death.

"TIMES" RECALLS MR. WARBURG'S "ARNING WHEN UNITED STATES WAS AT HEIGHT OF ITS PROSPERITY THAT IT WAS RUSHING TO CATASTROPHS

London, Jan. 26th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

Mr. Warburg's death at this time of exceptional business depression, the "Times" says, recalls that in warch 1929, when the United States was at the peak of its exuberant "pros-perity", he warned the country in striking terms that it was rushing straight toward catastrophe, Afterwards, analysing the causes of the depacte, he declared that it had been made inevitable by an attempt to maintain high prices by tariffs and other artificial messures in face of a constantly accelerated mass production. No great harm would have resulted from mass production, he asserted, if it had occurred in a world of free trade and well-managed production. He was a consistent advo-cate of a downward revision of Reparations and "ar debts and a strong supporter of the Poover foratorium.

The "Times" also recalls that when hr. Warburg's term as Vice-Governor of the Federal Reserve Board expired in 1918, when the United States was at wer with Germany, although he had been an American citizen since 1911 he declined reappointment. which President Wilson pressed upon him, giving as his reason the agitation at that time against holding by persons of "enemy origin" of high positions of trust in the United States.

LORD READING'S CONDITION MORE SATISFACTORY: THOSE WHO KNOW CONDITIONS NOT ALARMED.

Cairo. Jan. 25th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

Lord Reading's condition has improved a little this evening, it is reported here from Luxor. Lady Reading states

that his condition remains satisfactory.

Those who know Eastern conditions of life are not seriously alarmed by the illness of Lord Reading, a writer in the "Yorkshire Post" says. An Englishman in the East is very une yorkshire rost says. An Englishman in the East is very susceptible to bronchial trouble, sudden rises of temperature and a general feverish condition due to a "slight touch of the sun". A temperature high enought to kill you in England peases there unnoticed. For the moment Lord Reading is suffering from no complications, and the changes are that he will recover speedity. Now the less atgiver has to be watched rather carefully. Complications, once they set in, work far more swiftly in the East than in England, and when Lady Reading

summoned a doctor to travel from Cairo to Luxor by air she was merely taking a reasonable precaution. It was most unlikely that Luxor could provide the right medical attention.

Lord Erleigh, the writer continues, thinks that the

dust of Egypt is the cause of his father's illness. Dust is a notorious germ-carrier. It is responsible for nearly half the bronchial trouble and system by India. Just how the dust of Egypt will be so bad as the dust of India, with which Lord Reading is only too well acquainted. A car travelling along the high road cannot approach within two hundred yards of the car in front of it, unless the occupants are prepared for the fine brittle dust that will clog eyes, mouth, nostrils and ears and may set up an unpleasant couch.

At the service, it proceeds, the Nev. A. D. Belden will make a statement and will read the 13th, chapter of the

first Epistle of St. Paul to the Corinthians - the famous passage on Faith, Hope and Charity.

Jerusalem, Jan. 25th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The ceremony of conferring the first Master of Arts degrees of the Faculty of Humanities at the Hebrew University

degrees of the Faculty of Humanities at the Hebrew University took-place at the University top-day. The degree was conferred on thirteen graduates, two of them women. The ceremony was attended by the High Commissioner for Falestine, General Sir Arthur Wauchope, the Chief Justice, Sir Michael MacDonnell, and the entire Faculty of the University, the members of the Commadar Corps in Felestine, and representatives of the various academic bodies, learned societies, and the churches.

Mr. Ragheb Bey Nashashibi, the Mayor of Jerusalem, did not come to the function, so the threatened demonstration

against him did not take place.

Professor Klein, the head of the Faculty of Humanities, introduced the graduates, and Dr. J. L. Magnes, the Channellor of the University, conferred the degrees.

of learning, Dr. Magnes concluded his address to the graduates.

May your lips be touched by the burning coal off this earthen altar.

Dr. Magnes referred in the course of his speech to the plight of the Jewish students who are suffering indignities and persecution in the Universities of many lands, reminding us again, he said, how man can torture man.

The High Commissioner, Sir Arthur Wauchope, in addressing the gathering, said that the students should be proud that they were the first to be honoured by one of the youngest universities in the world, established by a people whose culture goes back to the remotest times.

Recalling the tree-planting in which he had taken part this week on the occasion of the Jewish New Year of the Trees, he likened the graduation ceremony to it, saying that the graduates, too, are the saplings planted by the University which grow into great trees.

Deputy Lewin, who is now on his way to Palestine with the Gerer Rebbe, who is his father-in-law, is one of the leaders of the Agudath Israel World Organisation.

The agudist block in the Warsaw Jewish Community is also credited by the press with the intention of appointing ten new Rabbis in the various districts of the city of Warsaw, as

well as 25 assistant Rabbis. Negotiations in this connection with the Government

are in progress, it is stated, and the matter is expected to be settled as soon as the Gerer Rebbe and Deputy Lewin return from Palestine.

JABOTINSKY EXPLAINS HIS DYNAMITE SPEECH: LETTER TO "TIMES": PERCLAID NOT THES WHOM I ACCUSED OF PLATING WITH DYNAMITE: I ESPECTALLY RESENT WORDING OF YOUR CABLE BECAUSE IT SOUNDS AS THOUGH I SUGGESTED JEWS WISHED OR MIGHT WISH HARM TO AS THOUGH IN CHOUSE IN THE STATE OF THE STAT RUEL REALITIE

Mr. Vladimir Jabotinsky has a long letter in to-day's issue of the "Times" explaining what he meant by his speech to the Revisionist Conference in Warsaw, the report of which in the "Times" contained a passage attributing to him the statement that "Jews might become the dynamite which would blow up the British

This is most inaccurate, Mr. Jabotinsky declares, for it was not to Jews but to another (and much more formidable) community that I referred as to a potential reservoir of human "dynamite". (kr. Jabotinsky in his ordains a state of the s (Mr. Jabotinsky, in his original letter indicated Islam as being the other community, but the "Times" made the change in printing the \text).

But I especially resent the wording of your cable, hr. Jabotinsky goes on, because it sounds as though I suggested that Jows" wished or might wish harm to the British Empire. I have heard of no Jew who does. It is one of our racial weaknesses (too often taken advantage of) that with us resentmed does not necessarily imply the desire for revenge; and "the too often taken advantage of) that with us resentment Empire" really bears no responsibility for Emgland's action as

mandatory in Palestine.

On the other hand, he says, the object of my present mise au point is by no means apologetic. On the contrary, your mase au point-1 oy no means appropriate. On the contrary, you cable's spitome of my Warsaw speech was in some ways rather an under-statement. It was England, not the Jews, whom I accused of playing with "dynamite" - with a store of potential high explorations and the comme likely was the comme likely w sive consisting of some 300,000,000 units; and what seems likely to be "blown up" as a result of such practice is, I said, something much bigger and more important even than the British Empire namely, the world's stability.

I beg leave to quote the essence of those two passages in my "arsaw speech to which your cable evidently referred, Mr. Jabotinsky continues, one dealing with "Jawa" and the other will "dynamite". The first: "Our experience with England as kandatory for Palestine has resulted in making 15,000,000 people lose faith in a nation whose name, to every Jew, has always stood for straightforward moral earnestness. The Mandatory has become an unmitigated hindrence to any progress of Zioniam. The realisa-tion threatens to drive the Jewish messes, especially our youth, along a-very damage ous road. The youth of a people faced with The realisasuch plight as ours cannot live without some kind of faith; faith either in a great restoration or in a great destruction. Ingland acts as though she wished to see ablaze 15,000,000 toches of dospair scattered in every corner of the world.

The second passage is: "But this is not the only game of world incendiarism in which some English agencies now seem to engage. There is an even bigger one going on just now: I mean the systematic galvanisation of pan9Islamic fanaticism in its Jerusalem is being convertmost medieval and reactionary form. ed into a centre of incitement vying with the worst efforts of the Muscovite Comintern, a centre from which innumerable sticks of dynamite are to be showered all round, threatening not only our Jewish settlers in Palestine but also the whole of Zurope's colonial system. It is not to us Jews, it is to some of the mightiest nations of Europe that England may soon have to render accounts for this shortsighted and dangerous gamble with the world's security conducted under her aegis".

Mr. Jabotinsky's letter, however, "Contained the following additional two paragraphs: This is what I actually said, and here I repeat and Let me warn all concerned against attempts to shout down the feelings here expressed as those of one single faction or one single person. It would be blindness not be realise that the natural reaction to all this must inevitably be the rise of

the hatural reaction to all this must insulately de the rise of a strong anti-singlish feeling among all sections of Jewry not living under the British crown. In this term, anti-English feeling, I imply no hint of a futile threat; no Jew dreams of trying, "reprisals", nor would it says us if we tried. But the feeling itself is a fact; it grows and sgreads and deepens day

by day, and it can no longer be stemmed. .

It is with the profoundest regret that I state this There are even in England, some who know how undeniable truth. stubbornly my friends and I have stuck to the last trench in trying to keep up our people's waning faith in England. It was we who have for years, and even as late as the 1931 Zionist Congress, endeavoured to persuade our masses that the main defaulters were the Palestine bureaucracy and the Zionist leadership; but that there still remained England's collective conscience as our Court of Appeal, and if we only could reach it it would redress all our wrongs. I wish we could still go on preaching the same doctrine for it can do our people no good, in its present unparalleled dis tress, to have to admit that appledge meant to endorse a national hope of such universally revered sacredness can be turned into a mockery. But a moment comes when even the most desirable illusion can no longer be maintained in the face of cruel realiti

PASSOVER FOOD FOR JEWS IN RUSSIA. London, Jan. 25th. (J.T.A.). A Sub-Committee appointed to deal with this matter had studied the question thoroughly, and found that the forwarding of matzoth from this country to Russia would be very costly, as the duties to be paid on every 1b. of matzoth were exorbitant, Mr. A. M. Kaizer, the General Secretary, reported to the last meeting of the Executive Council of the Federation of Jewish Relief Organisations, held here with Mr. M. Grossman in the chair.

The Sub-Committee, therefore, came to the conclusion, that the best method would be to purchase flour and other he said, commodities from the Government stores in Russia, thus obviating the cost of postage and duties, and ensuring that the Passover relief would be in the possession of the beneficiaries in good time. The representative of the Federation in Russia had, therefore, concluded an arrangement with the authorities whereby they will provide parcels of flour, sugar, tea, oil and other necessities for Passover to individuals in Russia on instructions from London. The flour would be of the best witte variety, which is not obtain-able in the open market. The representative recommended that flour to the value of £2,000 should be purchased immediately, so that he could proceed at once to plan out its distribution.

The meeting resolved that this scheme be adopted, and that

the flour and other Passever necessities be purchased immediately from the Government stores. It was also resolved that orders be accepted from individuals in this and other countries for the issuing of these Passover parcels to their relatives in Russia.
