Berlin, Feb. 24th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The Hitlerists were given a trouncing in the Reichstag to-day by General Groener, the Minister of Defence and the Interior, when he rose to deliver a sharp rebuke to Deputy Goobbels for his abuse of Fresident Hindenburg yesterday, because he is being supported by Jews in his presidential campaign.

These Goebbels lads who know of the Great War only by hearsay, the General said acidly, dare to get up here and class Field-Marshal von Findenburg, the supreme soldier

of the war, with deserters.
General Groener dealt on the course of his speech with the objections raised in democratic quarters to his recent action in removing the ban that had existed against members of the Nazi Party being enrolled in the Reichswehr. The first condition, he explained, before any Nazi is allowed to enter the Reichswehr, is that he must break off all association with the Nazi Perty.

The Hitlerist Deputies tried to shout down General Groener, keeping up a cry of "Jew traitors" "Jew profiteers", until the President of the Reichstag, Herr Losbe, had to suspend the sitting for a time. Several Hitlerist Deputies were named, and excluded from the remainder of to-day's sit ting.

Fr. Carl Melohior, the Jewish banker, partner in the Famburg banking house of Max Warburg and Company, who the Famburg defixing house of max "aroung and company, who has acted as Germany's representative on the Reparations Commission, on the Friancial Commission of the League of Nations, on the Basie Bank of International Payments, and other international bodies, was vigorously defended to-day in the Retchistag by the Frime Minister, Dr. Bruening, against an attack made on him by a Hitlerist, Deputy Rosenberg.

Dr. Welchior represented Germany masterfully at the various international conferences, in which he acted as our representative, Dr. Bruening said, and Germany owes a debt of spreciation to this brave and camable man who has

a record of great services to our country.

(The Hitleriat chief organ, "Voclkischer Beobachter", launched a vicious attack on Ir. Mcloinor while he was acting in December as the Garman representative on the Special advisory Committee meeting in Basle, where he defended Germany's case that she is unable, owing to the economic situation, to continue to meet her reparations obligations. The German people seems incapable of appointing a tribute negotiator, it said, without selecting an international Jewish banker, whose business interests pervent him representing the interests of the German people.

("hen the Advisory Committee of Financial Experts presented its report, finding unanimously that Germany is unable to pay reparations, Dr. Bruening sent a message to the German delegation, giving first place to Dr. kelchior as the head of the delegation, and paying high tribute to him for the clarity and conviction with which he had presented Germany's case, so that it had been unanimously adopted by the international experts, and expressed to him the gratitude of the German dovernment and nation).

The Prime Minister also followed up to-day the statement made by General Groener, the Minister of Defence and the Interior, explaining the removal of the ban which had existed against Fitlerists joining the Reichawehr.

Nazis, he said, are allowed to join the Reichswehr only on condition that members of the Nazi Party respect the oath taken by Hiller, to respect and observe the principle of legality, and to do nothing that is outside the law. If members of the Nazi Party continue their wild polloy of incidement and agitation, no Nazis will come into the Reichswehr, he declared.

HITLTRIST SLOGAN "PERISH JUDEA" PAINTED ON PORTALS OF ESSEN SYNAGOGUE.

The Education Commission of the Seym passed to-day at the third reading the Government bill for the reorganisation of the private school system, rejecting all the motions introduced by the Jewish Deputies and the other opposition groups for removing the dangers which they see in it to the

unhampered existence of the schools of the minorities. Deputy Sommerstein, speaking in the name of the Club of Jewish Deputies, read out a declaration, in which he repeated the arguments which he used against the bill, during the consideration of the bill by the Commission (given in the J.T.A. Bulletin of the 24th. inst.), contending that the Government bill as adopted by the Commission constitutes a violation of the rights of the minerities guaranteed in

The question of the crushing burden of old arrears of taxation which is lying heavy on the Jewish merchant and shopkeeping classes of Poland, without any possibility of their ever being able to pay it off, was raised by Deputy Rothenstreich, as the spokesman of the Club of Jewich Depu-ties at the meeting of the Finance Commission of the Saym, during the consideration of the Government bill empowering the Ministry of Finance to five certain relief to taxpayers in respect of old arrears of taxation.

As far back as December 1930, shortly after the elec-tion of the present Seym, the Club of Jewish Deputies introdued a motion to give relief to tax-payers in arrears, Deputy Tothens treich said, and only now, 17 months after, had the Government found it advisable to jut this question on the agenda

of the Finance Commission.

The Club of Jewish Deputies, as the representative of the Jewish population, he went on, had long ago demonstrated that it is impossible for the taxpayer to pay off all the accumulated arrears of taxation because of the severe economic orisis in the country, which is threatening to deprive him of all opportunity of earning his bare livelihood, let alone pay these huge sums in arrears to the State.

The present Government bill, he complained, is formulated every vagualy and it is difficult to tell what it is aiming at. We do not know from the bill, he said, what relief will be given to the taxpayer and how it will. benefit him. We are simply asked to give certain powers to the ministry of Finance. How these powers will be used we . are not told.

The Vice-President of Finance, M. Zawodski, said that the Government bill was intended only to give the Ministry power to prolong the period for the payment og tax arrears, but it must not be interpreted as ar amnesty.

The Rapporteur on the bill, Deputy Ulrich, of the Government Party, also said that the proposal of the Club of Jewish Deputies, to wipe out the old arrears of taxation, could not be entertained by the Government.

On being put to the vote, Deputy Rothenstreich's resolution was lost, and the Government bill was accepted by

the Commission.

MR. FELIX M. "ARBURG RELINGUISHES CHAIRKANSHIP OF JOINT DISTRIBUTION COMMITTEE "FICH HE FELD SINCE IT WAS FORM IN 1914: BEGOMES RONGRAFY CHAIRMAN AND IS SUCCEEDED BY MR. BAERWALD FORMER TREASURER.

New York, Feb. 24th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Mr. Felix M. Warburg, who has been Chairman of the Joint Distribution Committee since it was formed in November 1914, for the relief and rehabilitation of the war-stricken Joys of Eastern Europe, Palestine and elsewhere, has relin-quished the position after helding it for over 17 years, and he has been succeeded as Chairman by hr. Paul Baerwald, who has been Treasurer of the Joint Distribution Committee also since its formation in 1914.

Mr. Warburg continues to be actively associated with the Joint Distribution Committee and has been elected onorary Chairman at the last meeting of the Executive Committee.

The annual meeting of the National Council of the Joint Listribution Committee will be held in New York on March 26th., and 27th.

PALESTINE CITRUS FRUIT LEVY DROPPED.

Jerusalem, Feb. 16th. (J.T.A. Mail Service).
The High Commissioner, General Sir Arthur "auchope, has after a long discussion with a deputation of the Citrus Fruit Committee announced that the proposed levy on citrus fruit will not be proceeded with, and that the present arrangement whereby owners of infected groves pay the cost of the necessary fumigation will be continued for the present. Representatives of the Department of Agriculture will confer with representatives of the industry to decide on future procedure.

PRITISH FORCES IN PALESTIME: QUESTION OF POLICY CANNOT BE DIS "
