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AMERICAN ZIONISTS DEMAND MORE DEFINITE RELATIONS BETWEEN

In a resolution adopted unanimously to-day the Administrative National Committee of the Zionist Organisation of America, meeting at Philadelphia, calls upon the Zionist World Organisation to enter into negotiations with Great Britain with a view to establishing a more definite relationship between the Mandatory Power and the Jewish people, in matters affecting immigration and land acquisition, and the full implementing of the Balfour Declaration and the Palestine Mandate, and the promises made in Mr. Ramsay MacDonald's authoritative letter of interpretation, which the Palestine Administration, the resolution says, is not fulfilling.

The resolution goes on to demand the working out of practical steps for co-operation between the Palestine Administration and the Jewish Agency for several years ahead, to provide openings for Jewish immigration and colonisation in the large and sparsely inhabited territories between the River Jordan and the eastern boundary of Palestine, as contemplated by Article 25 of the Palestine Mandate.

(In the territories lying between the Jordan and the eastern boundary of Palestine as ultimately determined, Article 25 of the Palestine Mandate reads, the Mandatory shall be entitled with the consent of the Council of the League of Nations, to postpone or withhold application of such provisions of this Mandate as he may consider inapplicable to the existing local conditions, and to make such provision for the administration of the territories as he may consider suitable to those conditions, provided no action shall be taken which is inconsistent with the provisions of Article 15, 16 and 18 - which provide for freedom of conscience and the free exercise of all forms of worship, the right of each Community to maintain its own schools in its own language, that there shall be no discrimination against religious or eleemosynary bodies of all faiths in Palestine,

and that there shall be no discrimination against the nationals of any State member of the League of Nations, or against goods originating in or destined for any of the said States).

The resolution was adopted after a speech by Rabbi Dr. Stephen S. Wise, who said that they were tired of dealing with underlings, and that it was necessary to deal direct with Great Britain.

ANTI-BRITISH FEELING AMONG PALESTINE ARABS: "TELL ENGLAND" FILM PROHIBITED AFTER ARAB PISSING OF BRITISH AND APPLAUDING TURKS IN SCENES DEPICTING GALLIPOOLI FIGHTING DURING WAR.

Jerusalem, Mar. 14th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

Strong anti-British feeling has been manifested by Palestine Arabs during the showing in Palestine of the British war film "Tell England", which deals with the fighting during the Great War at Gallipoli (where the Zion Mule Corps was in action). The Arabs who attended the two performances given on Saturday and Sunday nights, hissed the British soldiers and applauded the Turks. The Palestine Film Censor has ordered the film, in view of this display of anti-British feeling, to be withdrawn.

Similar anti-British feeling was shown by the Arabs who attended the performance of the film in Baghdad last week, and there, too, the film had to be withdrawn for this reason.

JEWISH AGENCY HEAD IN PALESTINE AND HIGH COMMISSIONER GO TO TRANSJORDAN: DR. ARLOSSOROFF HAS INTERVIEW ARRANGED WITH EMIR ABDULLAH.

Jerusalem, Mar. 14th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

Dr. Ch. Arlossoroff, member of the Palestine Zionist Executive, and Mr. Shertock, Secretary to the Palestine Jewish Agency Executive, have gone to Amman, the capital of Transjordan, where an interview with the Emir Abdullah has been arranged for them.

At the same time, the High Commissioner for Palestine and Transjordan, General Sir Arthur Wauchope, has flown to Transjordan, where he will remain for three days, making a tour of the Transjordan villages.

POLISH JEWS GOING TO PALESTINE IN HUNDREDS FOR LEVANT FAIR MAGGARAD AND PASSOVER PILGRIMAGE: MIDDLE-CLASS JEWS SEND DELEGATIONS TO ENQUIRE INTO POSSIBILITIES FOR MIDDLE-CLASS SETTLEMENT IN PALESTINE.

Warsaw, Mar. 14th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The coincidence of the Levant Fair, which will be opened in Palestine next month, the Jewish Olympiad, which will be held at the same time, and the Passover Festival, when many Jews go on pilgrimage to Palestine, is having the result of sending unusually large numbers of Polish Jews to Palestine this year.

A special train left to-day with 400 members of the Polish-Palestine Chamber of Commerce, including a delegation of 45 middle-class Jews, who are going out on the initiative of the Polish section of the Jewish Agency, to enquire into the possibilities for middle-class settlement in Palestine.

60 labour tourists also left here to-day for Palestine. The next party, which will leave on March 19th., will consist of 220 members of the Polish-Palestine Chamber of Commerce, including a delegation of industrialists and artisans, and soon after a third party of 500 members of the Jewish Sports Club Maccabee will leave, and further parties are in process of formation.

PROFESSOR EINSTEIN PLEADS FOR CONDUCTING ZIONIST POLITICS TO ENABLE JEW AND ARAB TO LIVE IN PEACE AND BROTHERHOOD IN PALESTINE: USSISCHKIN FIVE YEAR JEWISH NATIONAL FUND CAMPAIGN INAUGURATED AT EINSTEIN BANQUET BY HIS EXPRESS WISH: CERTIFICATE OF PLANTING OVER 2,000 TREES IN EINSTEIN FOREST PRESENTED TO HIM AT BANQUET.

Before leaving America to-day on his return to Germany, Professor Albert Einstein attended last night at Los Angeles, a banquet given in his honour by the Jewish National Fund, the only Jewish function which he has attended during his present visit to America. In his speech to the gathering Professor Einstein made a plea that Zionist politics should be so conducted as to enable Jew and Arab to live in Palestine in peace and brotherhood.

Over a thousand people were present, and the occasion also served to inaugurate the Ussischkin five-year plan for the sale of dunams of land in Palestine for the Jewish National Fund.

On Professor Einstein's express wish, the sale of land was started at the banquet. He felt, Professor Einstein explained, that his attendance at a Zionist banquet would be a useless gesture if nothing concrete was done.

A certificate was presented to Professor Einstein recording the planting of more than 2,000 trees in the Einstein Forest in Palestine, which was started three years ago to commemorate Professor Einstein's 50th. birthday. (Professor Einstein was 53 yesterday, March 14th.).

WHEREVER HITLERISTS HAVE RULED HINDENBURG OBTAINED ABSOLUTE MAJORITY: THAT FACT SPEAKS VOLUMES: GERMAN PRESS ON RESULT OF ELECTION: FATAL BLOW TO SWASTIKA SAYS "BERLINER TAGEBLATT": INSTEAD OF HALF POLL OF "HIGH HITLER BOASTED HE SECURED ONLY A QUARTER AND HIS VOTE WAS HIGH WATER MARK OF HITLERISM/ ONLY DECLINE POSSIBLE NOW.

The result of the presidential election is of historic importance in the unanimous view of the Berlin press. It means that Germany will have nothing to do with Hitler, the Social Democratic "Welt am Montag" writes. The victor of this election is the German people, it says. Now the fight goes on to liberate those sections of our people who have fallen under the spell of Hitlerism or Sovietism.

The Hitler phase is at an end, the "Montag Morgen" declares. Instead of half of the poll, or the 15 million votes of which Hitler boasted, this adventurer, whose appearance has momentarily disturbed the world, obtained not much more than a quarter of the poll. And this, it says, is the high-water mark of Hitlerism. It can expect no increase now. Only a decline is possible. What is more significant, the paper points out, is that practically everywhere the Nazis ruled Hindenburg obtained an absolute majority. That

happened in Hessen, where they were in power, that happened in Brunswick, where they are still in power. That fact speaks volumes. The eyes of those who still follow Hitler will be opened as the eyes of those who followed him previously have been opened.

Germany's decision has been made, the "Vossische Zeitung" writes. It is against Hitler, against Hugenberg. It is for Hindenburg, for the State.

Hindenburg's victory is a final and fatal blow to the Swastika, the "Berliner Tageblatt" writes.

LONDON "TIMES" ALSO SEES NAZI DECLINE AFTER REACHING HIGH-WATER MARK: ELECTORAL STRENGTH MUSTERED BY NAZIS IS LIMIT WHICH CAN BE REACHED IT SAYS: CENTRE-SOCIALIST COMBINATION COULD HOLD ITS OWN AGAINST NAZI-NATIONALIST ATTACK ALMOST INDEFINITELY.

London, Mar. 15th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

There are certain signs in yesterday's poll, the London "Times" writes, that at this level the Nazi wave has reached its high-water mark. These signs were the results in Hessen and Hamburg, both States in which elections have been held since 1930. In both places the Nazi vote decreased in spite of a heavier poll: in Hessen from the 291,000 (37.1 per cent.) of November last to 280,000 (33.7 per cent.), and in Hamburg from 202,500 (26.2 per cent.), in September to 200,500 (24.5 per cent.). There is much to support the view that the electoral strength yesterday musterred by the Nazis is the limit which can be reached simply by indefatigable house-to-house work in the countryside, superlative organization, and investive without substance.

Yesterday's vote, if translated into terms of parties, the "Times" adds, suggests that the Centre-Socialist combination could, at a pinch, hold its own against the Nazi-Nationalist attack almost indefinitely at home; the real trouble begins when Germany has to go to the international Conference table. But however German affairs may develop in coming months, President von Hindenburg will continue at the head of them.

The Liberal "News Chronicle", on the other hand, heads its report "Hitler's day is Coming", and its Foreign Affairs Correspondent concludes his note by saying: Hitler's party is easily the largest and most homogeneous in Germany and cannot be debarred from participation in power much longer.

50 YEARS OF JEWISH CULTURAL EFFORT IN AMERICA TO BE CELEBRATED: COMMEMORATION OF MASS JEWISH IMMIGRATION AFTER 1881 POGROMS.

New York, Mar. 14th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

A public celebration will be held at the Hotel Astor on Sunday, April 10th., to commemorate the 50th. anniversary of Jewish cultural and literary activity in America.

Since the beginning of the westward exodus of great masses of European Jewry, the 50th. anniversary of which occurred this year, Dr. A. Coralnik, the President of the Jewish Writers' Club of America, under whose auspices the celebration is being arranged, says in a statement which has been issued for the occasion, the Jewish press and literature have played a role of significance in American Jewish life. In the adjustment that followed the Jewish mass migration which began in 1882, they were instrumental not only in fostering among vast masses the feeling of high civic pride, but also in the creation of new literary values which have been specific contributions to America.

Mr. Ab. Cahan, the editor of the "Jewish Daily Forwards", Dr. Coralnik, Mr. Peter "Iernik, editor of the "Jewish Morning Journal", Dr. Chaim Zhitlovsky, and Mr. George Z. Medalie, United States District Attorney, are honorary chairmen of the Committee, Dr. A. J. Rongy is chairman, Mr. Jacob Fishman, managing editor of the "Jewish Morning Journal", Mr. Louis Lipsky, and Mr. David A. Brown, are Vice-Chairmen, Mr. B. C. Vladek, the manager of the "Jewish Daily Forward", is acting as treasurer, and Mr. Z. Spiegelman as secretary.

90 YEARS OF JEWISH ARTISANSHIP AND AGRICULTURAL ACTIVITY
IN HUNGARY: FIRST DECADE AND LAST MOST DIFFICULT REPORT
SAYS: ENTIRE ENDOWMENT FUND WENT DURING INFLATION.

Budapest, Mar. 14th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The Jewish Artisans' and Agriculturists' Organisation in Hungary, known as the Mikefe, completes this week 90 years of its existence next week, the 20th. inst. In these nine decades, the Organisation has looked after 8,000 Jewish orphan boys, of whom 6,000 were given a training in artisanship, gardening, or agriculture, the report says. Some of them have become factory owners and there are among them several distinguished artists, including two well-known sculptors, Eduard Kallos and Eduard Ligets.

The most difficult periods of the organisation were the first decade and the ninth decade, the report states. When the Organisation was first established antisemitic elements tried to put difficulties in its way, arguing that the introduction of Jews into agriculture and handicraft would be harmful to the Hungarian nation. In spite of that, some of the greatest men in official Hungary came to the help of the Organisation, among them the great Hungarian liberator, Ludwig Kossuth, Count Ludwig Batthyany and the Palatine Josef.

On its 50th. anniversary the Organisation established an apprentices' home, and on its 70th. anniversary it opened a Gardeners' Training Institute.

During the inflation period the entire endowment fund of the Organisation went, but it was enabled to continue its activities by generous contributions from a number of Jewish philanthropists. Some of the principal donors to the Organisation were Deputy Dr. Armin Neumann, Baron Adolf Kohner, Chief Rabbi Dr. Simon Hevesi and Dr. Emil Stein, now President of the Organisation. Madame Veszi, the wife of Senator Dr. Josef Veszi, the editor-in-chief of the great Budapest daily, the "Pester Lloyd", is the President of the Ladies Committee of the Organisation.

AMERICAN JEWS SENDING MATZOTH TO SOVIET RUSSIA.

New York, Mar. 4th. (J.T.A. Mail Service).

The last day for placing mail orders in America for forwarding matzoth and kosher food supplies for Passover to Soviet Russia is Thursday, March 17th., says an announcement issued here by the Hebrew Immigrant Aid Society (Hias). Radio orders may be sent until Tuesday, March 22nd., and cable orders until Friday, March 25th.

Mr. Aaron Benjamin, the Hias Commissioner in Europe, is in Riga, personally superintending the packing and forwarding of the matzoth and food parcels, the Hias states, and he has made all arrangements for their delivery not later than April 1st.

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
