Berlin, Apl. 10th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). German Jewry is breathing freely again with the reelection of President Hindenburg, with an absolute majority of nearly 21 million votes over the combined vote of Hitler and the Communist candidate, Thaelmann. President Hindenburg polled 19,367,000 wotes out of the total vote of 36,483,490, out of which 13,417,000 were cast for Hitler.

The Hitlerists called up all their reserves for this struggle, it is felt, and used every ounce of support they could possibly obtain, so that no further increase in their polling strength is to be expected, and in all likelihood, a falling-off from the present peak-figure.

This is the principal lesson drawn from the presidential election, imagfar as it affects the forthcoming elections to the Parliaments of Prussia and the other German States, which take place on April 24th. The increase of two million votes in Hitler's poll is regarded as having come from the Nationalist and the Steelhelm camps, whose candidate in the first ballot, Colonel Duesterberg, who did not stand in the second round, had polled only 22 million votes. This bodily transfer of the Nationalist and Steelhelm vote to Hitler, it is pointed out, means that the present Mitherist vote represents the maximum of support that Hitler can obtain from any of the other parties, and this is insufficient to enable them to place in power a Hitlerist Coalition Government, even with their participation. There is also a belief in Jewish quarters that now

the election is over, with its test of strength between Hitler and the forces of stability decisively settled in favour of the forces of stability, both the Federal and the State Government will adopt a much more drastic attitude against the fitlerists, and that the Hitlerist Storm Troops will probably be suppressed. Responsible Jewish leaders are determined to demand

now more vigorously than ever that the German Governments . should effectively protect Jewish honour and make incitement to

anti-Jewish boycott a punishable offence.

NOT THE PRUSSIAN ELECTIONS: CALL ISSUED BY UNION OF GERLAN JETS:
IN 1930 ELECTIONS CALL WAS NO THURINGIARISING OF GEPLANY
AND FITTLERIST TEURINGIA WAS NIPED OUT: NOW IT IS NO HITLERIST GERMANY BY WAY OF PRUSSIA.

In the Parliamentary elections in 1930 our call was "No Thuringianising of Germany", and Fitlerist Thuringia was wiped out, the "C. V. Zeitung", the organ of the Central Union of German Citizens of Jewish Fatth, says in a call to its readers for the forthcoming elections to the Prussian Parliament. The result was that Thuringia became an enisode, and Germany did not become Hitlerist.

The present Nazi slogan is a "Hitlerist Germany by way of Prussia". That, too, must not be, the "C. V. Zeitung' savs.

The anti-Jewish agitation will, we fear, be pushed very much into the foreground in the coming election campaign, the "C. V. Zeitung" warns its readers. We German Jews, it says, have never hesitated to give our sacrifices in the service and for the benefit of the Fatherland and the German people. But we shall hat give our honour, our lives, and our economic existence as hostages to the Hitlerist Third Regime. Our Jewish honour and our German loyalty call us to action.

Defend Jewish Emancipation: Things Can Be Worse Even Than They
Are: Without Rights And Deprived Of Honour Life Will Be More Bitter Than Under Desperate Economic Conditions.

We cannot, and we will not believe, the call goes on, that German Jews have grown cold to the need of defending Jewish emancipation, that they no longer think it is worth everything they can give, in effort, in time, and in sacrifice, to defend their emancipation. Many are forgetting that things can become worse even than they are now, and that to live without rights, and deprived of all honour is much more bitter than to live under desperate economic conditions. To prevent any diminution of our rights, every German Jew must stand firm on April 24th. and translate his wishes into deeds.

JEW AND NAZIS ON SAME ELECTION LIST: JEWISH MANUF.CTURER HEADS ANTI-MARXIST LIST IN AUSTRIAN ELECTION INCLUDING FIVE

Vienna, Apl. 10th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). The strange spectacle of a Jew heading a list of candidates which includes members of the antisemitic Nazi Party is afforded in the municipal elections in the province of Carinthia, where Dr. Gustav Brauh, a local Jewish manufacturer, is heading the anti-Marxist list in the town of Weissenstein. The list includes five Nazis am five Christian Socialists, and several candidates of the Agrarian Party.

JEWISH NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR LATVIA: "LECTIONS FIXED FOR SEPTEMBER.

Riga, april 11th. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency). Elections to the Provisional National Council of the Jews of Latvia will be held on September 11th. and 12th., the ministry of the Interior having given its approval, and the Provisional Jewish National Council will hold its meeting on September 18th. and 19th.

Reports will be presented to the session on the position of the Jews in Latvia, the position of the Jewish social ordit institutions and their further expansion, social aid, guiltural work smong Latvian Jewry, the position of the existing Jewish communities, the formation of new communities, election of the Central Council, and the work

which it is to carry out.

The Jewish National Council will be elected for a period of three years. It has not yet been decided whether it is to consist of 50 or 75 members. The elections will be secret, equal, direct, and proportional by the Jewish population of Latvia. For the purpose of the elections, Latvia will be divided into three electoral areas. Riga and Livonia will return 34 or 25 members, according to whether the total number to be elected will be 50 or 75; Latgale 24 or 16, and Courland and Zemgale 17 or 11. All Jewish men and women who are Latvian citizens and have stained the age of 21 on the day of the polling will be eligible to vote.

In reply to Colonel Josian "edgecod, who had asked the Foreign kinister whether he could state what representations had been made to the League of Nations as to the treatment of the Jewish minority in Roumania at Jassy, and whether any steps were to be taken to improve matters of this sort in Roumania, Captain Eden, the Under-Secretary for Foreign affairs, said in the House of Commons to-day that Colonel Wedgwood presumably referred to the incidents which occurred in Jassy on the 22nd and 23rd March last, when there was a collision between a number of students. I am not aware that any complaint has been addressed to the League of Nations, he added, and according to recent information, the conflict in question was not due to any antisemitic feeling, but to other causes.

NO SOIL FOR HIPLERISK IN STITZERLAND SAYS PRESIDENT OF ZURICH

The severe economic orisis and growth of antisemitism in Germany has sent out rays into Switzerland Ferr Sally Brumachweig, the President of the Jewish Community of Zurich, said in his address to the annual meeting of the Lurich Jewish Community this week. There have been expressions of surprise, he went on, that the authorities have not stood out against this agitation, but the commonsense of the Swiss people is sufficient guarantee that the Hitlerist movement will find no soil in Switzerland. In any case, it is not for individuals to intervene with the authorities, but they should submit whateven facts or material they possess to the Community. completed 70 years of its existence, the President said.
It had been founded by ten men. The tolerant ideas of the
time had led to the emancipation of the Jews of Switzerland,
and the Community had grown rapidly in numbers, and was to-day

the largest Jewish community in Switzerland.

"e are all bound to Switzerland by ties of affection, the President said, and we are slways ready to do our duty to our country with joy. Switzerland is the synthesis of a true community of peoples. In this country, we Jows cen carry out all our duties as citizens without any reflection upon our ties with Judaism, even outside the boundaries of this country.

JEWISH EXPLORER SAMOILOVITCH TO DISCOVER SHORT AIR ROUTS FROM EUROPE TO AMERICA OVER NORTH POLE: INTERVIEW TITH J.T.A.

Professor Samollovitch, the famous Jewish Arctic explorer, who distinguished himself by his rescue on the Soviet Lobreaker "Krassin" of the crew of the Nobile Arctic expedition, who pessed to-day through Berlin, has given an interview to the J.T.A. here, in which, speaking of his plans for the future, he said that for six months he had on the icomessor "Russanow" repeated the voyage which Faron Nordenskjoeld had made in 1879 from Northern Asia along the Siberian Cosst, through the Behring Straits to Vladivsstock.

We is now taking command, he said, of enother expedition to the North Pole on the "Krassin", with the aid of asymplanes, in order to discover the shortest air route between Europe and America. Professor Samoilovitch said that he hoped that next year the first Russian airship built on Commander Nobile's system will reach Alaska.

EXPULSION ORDER AGAINST JETISH PEDLARS IN GUATEMALA "ITHDRAWN.

Washington, Apl. 1st. (J.T.A. Mail Service).

The Guatemalan Government has withdrawn the order of expulsion which it issued recently affecting a large number

of Jewish pedlars.

This information is conveyed in a letter addressed

This information is conveyed in a letter addressed. by the Guatemalan Minister to the United States, Mr. Adrian Recinos, to Mr. Isidore Hershfield, the Washington representative of the Hias.

Previously M. Recinos had refused to receive in personal audience either Mr. Hershfield or Mr. M. D. Rosenberg ,

representative of the B'nai B'rith, and Mr. Hershfield,

therefore, made his representations in writing.
The expulsion order was issued in the form of a law, signed by the President of the Republic and effective as of February 1st., 1932. As soon as the expulsion order was made known here through the J.T.A. steps were taken on behalf of the Jews of Guatemala by the American Jewish Committee and the American Jewish Congress as well as the Hias and the Binai B'rith.

The text of the Guatemalan Minister's letter is as follows

Referring to our previous correspondence relative to conditions in Guatemala, concerning pedlars whose expulsion had been ordered in a law recently passed, \bar{I} beg to say that I have just received a communication from my Government informing me that the expulsion of pedlars will not be carried into effect, as the Government reserves this right to be exercised only in special cases against pernicious elements. From how on, pedlars will be obliged to dedicate themselves to legitimate business and to establish themselves in legal form in the country.

Mr. Hershfield has replied to the letter expressing confidence "that our Government will find that your Jewish residents are an element of your population which has contributed and will contribute in substantial measure to the growth, prosperity and general welfare of Guaremala.
