CRITICALLY ILL AT 91.

Warsaw, May 3rd. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

There is great concern in Polish Jewry over a report from Radin, that the venerable Gaon, the Baal Chofetz Chaim, Rabbi Israel Weir Hacohen of Radin, who is 91 years of age, is critically ill there and in view of his great age is not expected to recover.

The Baal Chofetz Chaim as he is popularly known to indicate his authorship of the great work on the Jewish way of life by which he made his reputation, is honoured by orthodox Jewry throughout the world as the supreme rabbinical

authority of the present age.

He has described himself as "a simple Jew, believing and following what the Torah says, and nothing more". He has made his home in the small out of the way town of Radin, not in any of the great centres, and has kept himself simple, meek and humble, and has refused all honours.

He has never held an official position as Rabbi, and has never taken any payment for his Rabbinical work. He used to travel over the country, visiting all the Jewish towns and villages, selling his books for whatever he was offered, in order to a read the knowledge of Judaism, but without disclosing his identity, and as if he were only an itinerant bookseller. All his life he has supported himself by selling things for his living. When he first settled in Radin he opened a herring shop, and afterwards a grocery shop, and all the Jews of the town became his customers. When he realised that the other shopkeepers were suffering as a result of that, he closed his shop, and again took to travelling the country with his books. The Jews of Radin then asked him to become their official Rabbi, but he refused to do that. He has since then repeatedly refused offers of important Rabbinical positions in big cities. When the Jews of Radin insisted that living among them he must be their Rabbi, he accepted the position on two conditions - the first, that he should not receive any salary from the Community, and the second that his decisions in religious matters must be obeyed by all of them. Once a Radin Jew refused to obey his judgment rendered according to Jewish law, and the Chofetz Chaim immediately sent back his contract as Rabbi to the Community, and from that time has held no official post as Rabbi. Of the Jewish organisations the only one with which

the Chofetz Chaim identified himself was the Agudath Israel, because of its strict adhesion to Jewish law, and he was a member of its Rabbinical Council. He was greatly attached at the same time, to Falestine, and had several times contem-plated settling there. He was a great peacemaker, and always end-severed to make peace between Rabbis and other Jaws, and be effected the reconciliation between the famous Hassidic Fabbis of Ger and Belz.

The persecution of the Jewish faith in Soviet Russia has been a great sources of sorrow to him, and he has repeatedly asked Jewish communities to recite special prayers of intercession in the synagogues on behalf of the Jews of Russia.

Dr. Stephen S. Wise, Honorary President American Jewish Congress, in addressing the gathering, said that there were two problems, the problem of Palestine, the problem of the Galuth, and it was the problem of the Galuth that the projected Jewish World Congress would have to deal.with.

The purpose of the Jewish World Congress, the resolution further says, is to cope on a world scale with the attempt now being made by antisemites in all countries organised in a world movement, to degrade us and to undermine our The Jewish World Congress, it proceeds, will mainexistence. tain an organised Jewish world movement to help to bring about political, economic and social changes, which will strengthen the position of the Jewish people in all the lands where they reside, and also the upbuilding of our national home in Pales-

The Conference has endorsed the plan for an International Convention to outlaw antisemitism put forward by Professor Tedeschi, of Rome (reported in the J.T.A. Bulletins

of February 3rd, and March 29th.).
... In 1927 a Jewish Forld Conference called on the intitative of the American Jewish Congress was held at Zurich, for the protection of minority rights, and Dr. Stephen S. Wise replied there to criticism of the Conference made by Chief Rabbi Israel Levi of France, the late Mr. Lucien "olf and others who had opposed the idea of Jewish international action. The nations and Governments of the world expect Jews frankly to act together in defence of their fellow-Jews who are oppressed, he said. When we fail to do so, Governments expect insincerity rather than fearfulness. With the fullest understanding of the seriousness of my word, I maintain in the hearing of the Jewish world that the statements of the heads of the Joint Foreign Committee of England, the American Jewish Committee and others are documents of the Galuth.

The result of that Conference was the establishment of the Council on Jewish amority Rights by a fusion of the activities of the Committee of Jewish Delegations, the American Jewish Committee and several other bodies, representing the Folkists.

About the time of the last Zionist Congress at Basle in July, the American Jewish Congress also took the initiative in holding a preliminary Conference there to make preparations for the projected Jewish World Congress, and it was decided to hold a Jewish World Conference next summer (the plan now endorsed by the New York Conference) when official representatives of Jewish institutions in all parts of the world will be invited to attend in order to draw up a programme for the Jewish World Congress.

GERMAN PRO-PALESTINE COMMITTEE MESTS AND REAFFIRMS SUPPORT OF PALESTINE ORK.

Berlin, May 2nd. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

The German-Pro-Pelestine Committee held its sixth annual meeting here to-day. Herr von Kardorff was in the chair, in the absence of Count Bernstorff, former ambassador to America, who is ill, and sent-a-message. Among those present were kinisterial Director Dr. Diechkoff, Privy Councillor Prueffer and Legation Councillor Professor Dr. Sobernheim, all of the Foreign Office, and Dr. Ruppel, the German member of the Permanent Mandates Commission of the League of Nations. A message was also received from Dr. Puender, State-Secretary to the Prime Minister's Office.

Unfortunately, I am ill, and cannot undertake the journey to Berlin to attend our annual meeting, the first I have ever missed, Count Bernstorff wrote. I have often taken the opportunity to declare myself in public in support of the great social idea of the reconstruction of pelacetine, and for that reason I will now only repeat my avowal briefly, and add that my interest end participation in the cause have not in any way diminished. As soon as my health permits, I hope to continue to save the cause in the coming years with the same devotion as previously.

JE APPOINTED MEMBER OF ROUMANIAN COVERNMENT ECONOMIC COUNCIL: MR. LAZAR MARGULIS PROMINENT ZIONIST AND MEMBER OF JETISH AGSNOT COUNCIL.

Bucharest, May 2nd. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

May Inzar Margults, one of the Zionist leaders in Roumania and a member of the Council of the Jewish Agency, has been appointed by the Government as a member of the newly-constituted Roumanian Government Economic Council.

The appointment has given immense satisfaction to homanian Jewry, not only because of the honour paid to a Jew, but because the presence of a Jewish representative is regarded as an important safeguard against antisemitic tendancies in the work of the Council, which will be responsible for all future legislation relating to economic life. No law can now be adopted by Parliament or by Government decree, relating to economic life without having been first submitted for consideration to the new Council. The Council consists of 25 members, and in effect is the Cabinet on Economic life. The other members-of-the Council include the Minister of Finance, M. Argetoianu; the Minister of Trade-and Industry, M. Vasilescu-Karpen; the Minister of Argetoiature, M. Valorscu Slesti, and the Kinister of Labour, M. Walorscu Slesti, and the Karlinister of Agriculture, M. Walorscu Slesti, Madgearu; the ex-Minister of Inde and Industry, M. Madgearu; the ex-Minister of Inde and Industry, M. Madgearu;

M. Margulis has also been appointed as one of the two Rapporteurs to the Council dealing with industry.

ROUM: NIAN NAZI PARTY FORMALLY CONSTITUTED.

Bucharest, May End. (Jewish Telegraphic Agency).

A Roumanian Nazi Party has been formally constituted this week, Senator Stafan Tatarescu, a brother of M. Tatarescu, former Under-Secretar to the Ministry of the Interior, who was in charge of the inves igations into the Oradeo-Mare pogrom in 1927, and was at the time accused of having helped to organise it, presided at the inaugural meeting. The new Party will issue an official organ, which will start publication on the 15th. inst.

Nothing emerged at the meeting to indicate whether the new Party is of a definitely antisemitic character, and whether it will, as has been reported, serve in fact as a new channel for the activities of the suppressed Iron Guard Organisation.
