Report Acute Hunger Prevails Among Jewish Settlers in Bira Bidian

Comzet Representative Corroborates Report; State Government Grain Trust Conducts Policy Against Newcomers (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

MOSCOW, July 13-Acute hunger prevails among the Jews in Bira Bidjan, according to a statement in the 'Emes."

The paper says the situation is particularly prevalent in the settlements of Bira, Icor, Birecan and Nikolayka.

In the same paper it is stated that the administration of the government grain trust in Bira Bidjan has definitely refused to settle Jewish newcomers, warning them it is best not to come. In Stalinfeld, the paper reports, Jews were driven from the office of the local

grain trust. Corroboration of this report is offered by the representative of the Comzet, governmental department for settling Jews on the land and in industry, who now wires that new Iewish setlers are simply ridiculed by the local authorities, and that many of them are forced to sleep in the open, because officials refuse them shelter. Emigration of Jews From United States Lowest Of All Nationalities

Period from July 1, 1931 to April 30, 1932

While the rigorous restriction of immigration coupled with the economic crisis led to a decrease of 92,204 in the immigrant population of the United States in the ten months from July 1st, 1931 to April 30, 1932, the number of Jews in this country was increased by 1,927 during the same period, according to statistics compiled by the Hias. This is due to the small departure of Iews from America, it is stated.

The figures published by the government show that all nationalities with the exception of Jews, Italians and Armenians have been affected and of these Iews have gained most although the number of Jewish immigrants was

The so-called "Nordics" furnished the highest percent of emigrants. The Scandinavians, that is, those coming from Norway, Denmark, and Sweden, furnished 414% of emigrants or more than four times as many as immi-grants; the Germans 166%; English-men 176%; French 127%, and Irish 123%. The Jewish emigrants consti-tuted only 16% of the Jewish immigration into the United States. The Polish percentage was 349% and the Russian 223%. The average percentage of all nationalities was 283

Toronto Kehillah

Vindicated by Judge (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

TORONTO, July 13-The Toronto Kehillah, charged with misappropriation of funds and misconduct, was completely vindicated and the charges dismissed in the report submitted to the City Council yesterday by Judge John Tyler.

Judge Tyler also vests in the Kehillah full authority for the regulation of the Kosher meat supply.

Judge Tyler's report says in part: "If there is a community formed, such as the Kehillah, there can be no shochet not appointed by it and no rabbis not in the Rabbinical council can in any way act or direct in that community the slaughtering and koshering of meat.

"The fixing of price for Kosher meat should be vested in the Kehillah and all butchers who sell meat either wholeasil or retail require to have a shochet appointed by the Kehillah and belong-ing to the Rabbinical Council. Any Rabbi outside of the Rabbinical Council or any shochet not appointed by such council, should not slaughter and kosher meat.

The decision of Judge Tyler puts an end to a controversy active for more than a year between the Vaad Ha'Eer, the City Council, and the Kehillah, the former claiming the same rights in the city abbatoir as the Kehillah.

Prof. Felix Frankfurter Declines Appointment to Massachusetts Supreme Court

Announcement Made by Governor Elv on Eve of Council Meeting; Believe Confirmation Was Assured

BOSTON, July 13-On the eve of the meeting of the Governor's Council to act upon his appointment of Pro-fessor Felix Frankfurter of Harvard

University to the Massachusetts Su-preme Court Bench, Governor Joseph B. Ely last night made public the announcement that Professor Frankfurter had declined to accept the post.

Professor Frankfurter, said Governor Ely, had declined the post from a sense of duty to his obligations at Harvard Univcersity.

The action of Professor Frankfurter brings to an unexpected close the controversy which has been aroused by his appointment. While leading judi-cial authorities such as former Supreme Court Justice Oliver Wendell Holmes and Supreme Court Justice Louis D. Brandeis, headed the list of those who urged the appointment of Professor Frankfurter, an opposition had been formed on the ground that Professor Frankfurter had radical leanings.

It was expected that at today's meeting of the Governor's Council, the appointment would be confirmed despite a measure of opposition, by a vote of 6 to 2.

Governor Ely in making public Professor Frankfurter's declination made public in part a letter which he had received from him. The letter declared .

Frankfurter Letter

"Your Excellency's nomination of me for the supreme judicial court has presented the most difficult decision of my professional life. The choice my professional life. The choice could not be easy. You offered me an opportunity which comes to very few lawyers. To join the bench which can draw upon the spirit of Shaw and Holmes for the creative tasks of judicial administration in our day is a call of high honor and profound import-ance to the well-being of the Commonwealth.

"But I have other responsibilities to the law which, after much anguish of mind, I feel I ought not to sever now. As against the opportunities for immediate achievement on the bench, the long term effects of legal education make their claim. The grave problems already upon us and those looming on the horizon require as never before a courageous and learned bar. The future direction of bar and bench will be determined by the quality of our law schools. This work must go for-ward and I cannot bring myself to believe that I should prematurely aban-don my share in it, however great and honorable the opportunity you offer terest here.

I should have less confidence in Dr. Matthews has not commented on the rightness of this position had not the announcement of his daughter's

Jewish National Fund Collects Sum of £98,000 In Seven Month Period

Shows Decrease of £18.963 Over Similar Period During Last Year

(Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM, July 13-The receipts for the first seven months of the Tew-

ish year, from October to April, amounted to £98.063, which is a decline on last year's receipts, amounting in the same period to £117,026, the Jewish National Fund headquarters here state.

The decline is partly due to the inability of a number of European countries to export their contributions, resulting in an amount of some £6,000 being thus held up, it is stated. In addition there has been a serious drop of receipts from the United States, from £29,000 to £22,000. Last year's figure included an ad-

vance from South Africa of £5.750. There has been an increase in re-ceipts in Belgium, Holland, and Switzerland, while there has been a decline in Germany, Great Britain, all parts of Roumania and in Palestine, where \$4,621 were received in the seven-month

neriod.

The second half of the year usually brings in a larger sum than the first half, the statement concludes, expressing the belief that as a result of a number of efforts in various countries the total receipts for the year will not fall short of those of last year.

Minister's Daughter Marries Noted Critic of Jewish Descent

M. Sachs, the grandson of Georges Bizet, Catholic composer of the opera Bizet, Catholic composer of the opera "Carmen", is the great grandson of Jacques Francois Halevy, famous Jew-ish composer. Maurice, Sachs, the father of the groom, is also a Jew. The marriage of the son of a Jew

National B'nai Brith Headquarters Institute Inquiry Into Situation

SEATTLE, July 13-Aroused at reports of discrimination against Tewish students at the University of Washington, the national executive offices of B'nai B'rith today launched an investi-gation into recent University incidents. Dr. I. M. Rubinow, executive secretary of the B'nai B'rith, called the investiga-

tion, which will be made through the Seattle lodge of the B'nai B'rith order. How the Jewish Daily Bulletin, carrying the report of the recent Shevuoth incident at the University, caused launching of the probe into anti-Jewish-

practices was revealed in Dr. Rubinow's telegram here. In his message to President Leo

Meltzer of the Seattle B'nai Brith lodge, Dr. Rubinow declared that he had noticed an account in the Iewish Daily Bulletin of five Jewish University students taking "incompletes" in their work because they chose to go to the synagogue instead of taking final examinations on Shevnoth The Shevuoth incident came on the

heels of a University ruling that, beneeds of a University runing that, be-ginning in October, Jewish law students at the University will be compelled to attend classes on Saturday. The law school rule provoked nation-wide comment in Jewish circles

As the first step in the B'nai B'rith investigation, Mr. Meltzer sought an audience with President M. Lyle Spencer of the University and after delay, heard Dr. Spencer's explanation of the

University authorities contend that Jewish students must make their choice between going to school on Saturday in the law school or observing the Tewish Sabbath and not attending law school. In the Shevuoth incident, the same argument was put forth.

Dr. Rubinow's telegram indicated that attention of the B'nai B'rith has been brought to the situation at the University and that immedite action will be forthcoming to effect any remedies possible and to forestall any further discrimination against Jewish students,
