Central Union Appeals To Non-Jews on Jewish Situation in Germany

**New Government Decree Grants Per-
mission to Officials to Join Ranks
of Nazis; Hitherto Prohibited**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, July 27—The Central Union of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith today issued an appeal to the non-Jews to aid the Jews in their present difficult situation.

The appeal points out the extent of the anti-Semitic incitement and states that the lowest kind of agitation is raging throughout the country against Jewish physicians, despite the fact that Jewish contributions to medical science are well known.

While the Nazi leader, Gregor Strasser, declares that the Nazis plan no pogroms, his followers incite the inhabitants in various sections of the land to riots against the Jews, says the Central Union.

"Because we love our Fatherland, we will not accept insults and the deprivation of our rights. We will fight to the last for our citizenship on German soil," the Central Union asserts.

London Roumanian Legation Says Bronstein Proved Head Of Revolutionary Committee

LONDON, July 27—The Roumanian Legation in London, in a statement to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency today, declares that Samson Bronstein, tortured Zionist leader of Yedinez, Besarabia, was identified as the president of the Committee which endeavored to form revolutionary organizations in the villages.

The statement addressed to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency is duplicated in communiques sent to other London papers, including the "Daily Herald" which featured the Bronstein torture.

The Roumanian Legation which has been silent on the Bronstein case for all this time, now states that as far back as May 7th, the District Inspec-

Los Angeles Jews Who Sought Settlement in Bira Bidjan Are Deserting

**Returning to U. S. or Seeking Settle-
ment in Moscow; "Emess" Scores
Icor for Choice of Settlers**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

MOSCOW, July 27—A group of Los Angeles Jews who migrated to Bira Bidjan in June with a view to permanent settlement there are either returning to the United States, disappointed, or coming to Moscow with the hope of settling in Moscow, the "Emess" reports.

The paper mentions the Jewish families named Filtzman, Heller, Konsev and Bomart, among those who are deserting Bira Bidjan. The first two are already enroute to the United States.

In this connection, the "Emess" severely criticizes the American organization "Icor" for sending as prospective settlers "traders and speculators who not only are unfit for Bira Bidjan, but spread counter-revolutionary sentiments there."

The paper quotes Mr. Filtzman as stating prior to his departure: "I would rather stand in line for Hoover's charity soup than enjoy the so called Soviet fortunes."

Rules Boycott Appeals Against Jews Do Not Constitute Breach of Peace

**House of Jewish Merchant Dynamited;
Four Non-Jewish Merchants
Arrested for Crime**

POSEN, July 27—A bomb was exploded under the house of a Jewish merchant in Kracziev, near Posen, today.

Four local non-Jewish merchants were arrested by the police and accused of dynamiting the house.

The merchants were charged with their attack as revenge for the Jewish merchant's action in building a new shop on his own premises.

The magistrate of Gnesen, near Posen, ruled that appeals for the boycott of Jewish shops do not constitute a breach of the peace. Everyone, the magistrate held, is entitled to warn prospective shoppers against Jewish shops.

The verdict was given in a test case submitted by the police who arrested two members of the anti-Semitic National Democratic party, who stood outside Jewish shops and prevented Christians from entering.

Wauchope Announces \$1,500 Gift at Fruit Show

JAFFA, July 27—The first Palestine fruit show opened here this afternoon. Four hundred varieties of fruit are on display.

The occasion was utilized by the High Commissioner, Sir Arthur Grenfell Wauchope, to announce his gift of £1,200 to establish a horticultural station at Farradyia, near Safad.

Sir Arthur also made an additional gift of £300 for the establishment of village school gardens.

Vienna Streets to Be Named After Two Jews

VIENNA, July 27—The Streets Commission of the Vienna Council has decided to name two streets after the late Dr. Leon Kellner, who was Professor of English Literature at Czernowitz University, and after the late Professor Leopold Oser of Vienna University.

Professor Kellner who lived for many years in Vienna, where he was at one time Lecturer at the University, was a Shakespearean authority. In his latter years he was political adviser on English and American affairs to Dr. Hainisch, when he was President of the Austrian Republic.

Professor Kellner was a close friend of the late Dr. Theodore Herzl, who appointed him one of his executors. He was the author of a Herzl biography.

Kashruth Controversy

Breaks Out Anew

In Paterson, N. J.

Charge Kashruth Laws Are Not Observed; Form Rival Organization to Vaad Ha-Kashruth

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

PATERSON, July 27—The Kashruth controversy that raged here for a considerable length of time and that was believed settled when a committee of prominent citizens intervened, has broken out anew with charges by Rabbi William Wittenstein that "fifty per cent of the meat sold in supposedly kosher butcher shops in this city, is not in accordance with Jewish dietary laws."

"I have in my possession much evidence and numerous data," said Rabbi Wittenstein further, "accumulated during the past three years of specific cases that were outrageous transgressions against kashruth. I am willing to reveal all I know before an open meeting."

Rabbi Wittenstein also charged the Vaad Ha-Kashruth, kosher meat supervisory body, with mismanagement of funds. He has asked for an accounting of funds, claiming that more than 6,000 chickens are slaughtered each week in this city, resulting in an income of about \$500 weekly for the Vaad Ha-Kashruth. He said that the Vaad owes

Herzl Memorial Exercises

Today at Astor Hotel

Tribute to the memory of Dr. Theodore Herzl, founder and leader of political Zionism, on the occasion of the 28th anniversary of his death will be paid today at a memorial meeting at the Hotel Astor. The memorial exercises are being held under the auspices of the Jewish National Fund of America and the New York Zionist Region. The anniversary occurred last Sunday but the entire week has been set aside by American Zionists for commemorating the anniversary and rededicating the adherence of the movement to the ideals advocated by the late leader.

Nelson Ruttenger, President of the Jewish National Fund of America, will preside at the meeting, at which hundreds of New York Zionists are expected to attend. Morris Rothenberg, President of the Zionist Organization of America; Hon. Carl Sherman, former Attorney General of the State of New York, President of the New York Zionist Region; Jacob De Haas, Abraham Goldberg and Max Rudensky, are among the speakers who will address the gathering.

The liturgical part of the program as well as a number of Palestinian folk songs will be rendered by Rev. Jacob Rapaport, President of the Cantors Association of America and by Cantor Moshe Nathanson of the Society for the Advancement of Judaism.

Ku Klux Klan Makes

Its Reappearance in Full

Regalia in Los Angeles

3,000 in Full Klan Attire Participate in Giant Demonstration in Los Angeles Temple

LOS ANGELES, July 27—While the Ku Klux Klan has been considered a dead organization throughout the country for the past few years, several incidents within the past six months in and around Los Angeles indicate that it is still flourishing to some extent in the Southwest. Some time ago the police of Compton, a few miles west of Los Angeles, were called upon to tear down Ku Klux Klan posters urging the recall of several officers for their alleged failure to enforce the prohibition laws.

On Monday more than three thousand members of this white hooded brigade in all of their traditional trappings met in the Angelus Temple, the institution made notorious in the headlines by Aimee Semple MacPherson, Ma Kennedy and David Hutton, the husband of the woman evangelist. According to a story in the "Los Angeles Times," these Kluxers came at the call of Jay Kellog, a cowboy evangelist. From the altar or stage of this huge auditorium gleamed the fiery cross and three large sections of white garbed men and women raised the roof with their applause as the cowboy evangelist shouted, "I am an all-American," and brandished two six-shooters.

"Never since the days of the night riders was such an exhibition of converted bed sheets witnessed in one spot in a metropolitan city," said the "Los Angeles Times."

Grand Dragon of the Realm of California, T. S. Moodie, stated in a talk after the sermon that the next convention of the Klan will be held in Long Beach in 1934. "We expect about 25,000 members to attend," he stated.

Says It Is Unwise and Unrighteous for Jews to Forsake Judaism for Theosophy

Rabbi Jung Takes Issue with Jewish Theosophists; Says Study of Teachings of Mme. Blavatsky Condemns Her

It is both unwise and unrighteous for Jews to become theosophists for the benefit of their faith, or as a medium through which their faith is to become clearer or dearer, according to Rabbi Leo Jung, of New York, in a communication published in "Israel's Messenger" of Shanghai.

"Let me say that I have spent time on reading Mme. Blavatsky in the original and that I have read with attention the pamphlets of some of her disciples," wrote Rabbi Jung. "It is because of such knowledge as I have been able to glean from these writings, independent of the devastating criticism of authorities, that I consider it unwise and unrighteous for Jews to become theosophists 'for the benefit of their faith,' or as a medium through which their faith is to become clearer or dearer or what not to them. It is because I have spent many hours on a fair endeavor to let Mme. Blavatsky speak for herself in her own words, as well as in such persuasive garb as Mrs. Besant and others dress her 'revelations' that I consider it a crime against humanity, which needs the unalloyed moral strength of Jewish teaching to forsake Judaism for Mme. Blavatsky, or to substitute for it, the new guidance of theosophy.

"The Jewish theosophists have made of theosophy not only a new religion, but a cause, which (if the contributions to "Israel's Messenger" are typical) they serve unwisely and unrighteously by perverting, distorting and explaining away whatever an opponent may say," Rabbi Jung states.

\$50,000 Legacy at

Stake in School Issue

PATERSON, N. J., July 27—A discussion as to Jewish educational methods has arisen here, which involves the use or forfeit of a \$50,000 bequest.

Recently, a movement was started to unite the Clinton Street Talmud Torah, conducted under Orthodox auspices, with the Barnert Memorial Hebrew Free School, conducted under Reform auspices. Essentially this involves a uniform curriculum. The Talmud Torah has utilized the 'Ivrit B'Ivrit' or Hebrew into Hebrew method of translation, while the Barnert school employs the method of Hebrew translated into English.

Now, discovery has been made that there is a stipulation both in the charter of the Hebrew Free School and in the will of its original donor whose name it bears, the late Nathan Barnert, former Mayor and outstanding civic and communal leader, making specific com-

Nothing Can Stop Jewish Progress in Palestine Says Jerusalem Ass't Governor

Captain Miller, Here on Visit; Discusses Jewish Achievements; Terms Them Miraculous

DETROIT, July 27—"Nothing can stop Jewish effort in Palestine." With these words Captain William J. Miller, assistant governor of Jerusalem, here on a vacation, summed up an interview he granted last night to a representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, describing his experiences in Palestine and presenting his views on conditions there.

Captain Miller came to Palestine with the first troops who captured the land from the Turks in December of 1917. He was a member of the staff of General Allenby when the capture of Jerusalem ushered in the present era in Palestine, and has remained in Palestine since that time.

He first acquired prominence when he broke up a notorious band of robbers at Ramleh where he was stationed for a number of years as governor. To this day he is best known in Palestine as "Miller of Ramleh." Later he was stationed at Jaffa. During the 1929 disturbances he was in charge of British affairs at Nabulus, and as a result of a firm stand taken by him there was not a single death in his region, except for a few who were wounded when he ordered his soldiers to fire upon a disturbing and unruly mob.

For years assistant to Major Campbell, now governor of Jerusalem, Captain Miller became his assistant when Major Campbell was elevated to his present position.

"Miraculous" is the term he used to describe the growth and achievements since 1918, and in similarly enthusiastic terms he spoke of the settlers in Palestine and their ideals.

Describing Palestine's problem as being three-fold—political, religious and economic—Jerusalem's assistant governor at the outset emphasized that events of the type that took place in 1921 and 1929 will not again be repeated.

"Careerists," or those in the British service to whom their positions meant their pay checks, were described by him as a group who did not care one way or another for either Jews or Arabs. Very few in Palestine are seriously concerned over the progress of Jewish endeavor, he stated. He did, however, emphasize that there is in Palestine a group of officials who are anxious to be fair and impartial.

Sir Arthur Grenfell Wauchope, the present head of the Palestine government, he stated, like the late Lord Plumer, who followed Sir Herbert Samuel as second High Commissioner of Palestine, is a fair and impartial

Nephew of Theodore Roosevelt Attacks Bishop On Closing of Clinic

Reiterates Charges That Racial Prejudice Brought About Closing of Clinic in St. Mark's

An attack on Bishop William T. Manning, which reiterates the charge that racial prejudice is responsible for the closing of the Body and Soul Clinic of St. Mark's-in-the-Bouwerie, is made by Monroe Douglas Robinson, nephew of the late Theodore Roosevelt.

The letter which appears in the New York Times, repeats the charges against Bishop Manning made by Dr. Edward S. Cowles, founder and director of the ousted clinic. The letter says in part:

"I have read in the New York Times your insinuating statement with respect to my intimate friend and physician, Dr. Edward Spencer Cowles. Why do you, as my Bishop, deal in personalities when great humanitarian principles are involved: I blush with shame that my Bishop should stoop to personalities.

"You have put a ban on the clinic at St. Mark's Church and there can be no adequate reason to justify this action because you have never seen the work of the clinic. There are thousands to testify to the saving of life and the restoration of health by Dr. Cowles. Why do you side with the vestry?

"I have been a vestryman of St. Mark's Church and have been an Episcopalian all my life. My whole tradition is Episcopalian. I am horrified that my Bishop should be so lacking in sympathy as to sacrifice human welfare for prejudice at any time, but especially at this time of medical, mental, spiritual and worldly need."

Dr. Cowles has made public a letter from Dr. William N. Guthrie, rector of the Church wherein the rector admitted the "moral obligations if not the strictly legal rights" of the clinic to demand a continuance after ten years of operation free of charge.

Four Jews Beaten; Expelled from Transjordan

mand that the method of teaching shall always be Hebrew into English.

The will stipulates that unless the Hebrew School complies strictly with all the provisions set forth, then Barnert's bequest of \$50,000 and certain other sums left in trust for maintenance expenses of the school, shall revert to his estate.

Benjamin Horwich, head of the Barnert school, has asserted that it would be inadvisable for his institution to adopt another means of teaching in view of the financial loss it would incur in not adhering to the stipulation. However, both schools are anxious to reach an agreement and they have designated representative committees to confer.

The late Mrs. Ida Roth Cohen, who was a member of a prominent family of Newark, N. J., has willed \$1,000 for a newsboys' fund sponsored by the "Newark Evening News." It directs the "News" to use the bequest "for such charitable purposes as it shall deem proper." This newsboys' fund was originally established by Mrs. Roth's brother and is known as the Isaac Roth Memorial Fund.

man who is sympathetic to Zionism.

"How about the charge that English officials in Palestine are definitely anti-Jewish?" was the interviewer's next question.

Captain Miller admitted that the charge is based on truth. He explained the reason for it. When an Arab comes to a British official, his attitude is one of subservience. He bows down to every command—whether he follows it or not—with the words of "At your service." The Jew, however, will not assume such a servile attitude. He comes to the British with head erect. If an illegal decision is made against him, he questions the authority of the officer. Naturally, Captain Miller said, the official resents the attitude of the man who questions his authority and would rather have the subservience of the other element of the population.

Captain Miller was particularly emphatic in declaring that there is no room in Palestine for extremists, whether Arab or Jewish.

His answer to the question: "What is the attitude of the Christian groups in Palestine to the Jews?" he summed up in one word: "Jealousy." Jealousy of Jewish achievement and of Jewish determination to carry the Palestine ideal to reality.

Captain Miller expressed the view that the creation of a harmonious union between Jews and Arabs is possible and pointed in proof of his contention to the numerous examples of Arab-Jewish co-operation. But he advised that Jews ought to resort to a "silencer" when spreading the Zionist gospel and in their reconstruction efforts. He advised against the danger of exaggeration which causes Arabs to look with suspicion upon Jewish progress.

Comparing the positions of the Jews and the Arabs, Captain Miller stated that while the latter had the figures of population in their favor, the Jews have brains, energy, an ideal and demonstration of the remarkable achievements of the past decade. That is why, he said, Arabs look with fear upon Jewish effort. To "fear" he ascribed most of the existing difficulties.

When told that the "Palastin" anti-Zionist Arab daily, had subscribed to the service of the Palestine Telegraphic Agency, which is associated with the Jewish Telegraphic Agency and is the sole distributor of Reuter news, Captain Miller expressed the view that this is a fine step in the direction of progress and better understanding. He said that to him it meant the beginning of a desire on the part of an Arab newspaper to publish news instead of filthy gossip.

Reminded of the difficulties that face Jewish endeavor, Captain Miller replied:

Dr. Ludwig Hollaender, director of the Central Union, stated his belief that the police will act in consonance with the dictates of the government which is determined to maintain order and prevent outbreaks regardless of the party from which they originate.
