French Report Affords No Basis for Discussion Actions Committee Decides

Committee Will Instruct Executive to Explain Its Attitude and Prepare Complete Development Plans

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) LONDON, Aug. 8-The French Report affords no basis for discussion, was the decision of the Actions Committee of the Zionist Organization now in session here, it became definitely known today. Previous unofficial reports had indicated that the Political Commission of the Actions Committee favored outright rejection of the French recommendations as being contrary to the terms of the Mandate and the spirit of the MacDonald

The Actions Committee is instructing the Zionist Executive to submit detailed observations regarding its attitude and a full plan for the further development of Palestine. The transfer of responsibility for

educational work in Palestine from the provinces. Jewish Agency Executive to the Vaad Leumi was unanimously agreed upon at the plenary session of the Actions Committee today. The Agency will, however, contribute annually the sum of £40,000 towards the educational work. It had been generally believed that the Revisionists would oppose the transfer but no opposition developed.

In connection with the future educational work in Palestine the Actions Committee resolved to instruct the Executive to press the Government for an adequate subsidy. It was pointed (Continued on Page 4)

that the bombings are part of an organized attempt to damage Tewish property and to hurt Jewish merchants in the smaller towns of the various

Leaders Report at Jewish Agency Sessions in London (Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, Aug. 8 - Yesterday's session of the Administrative Committee of the Jewish Agency was chiefly devoted to political reports delivered by Dr. Nahum Sokolow, President of the Agency, Dr. Selig Brodetsky and Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff.

Oscar Wasserman delivered the opening address and then handed over the presiding chair to Dr. Leo Motzkin declaring that he hardly felt justified in conducting the proceedings since he had not been able to devote as much time to the work of the Agency as he would have liked.

Following the political reports various commissions were appointed and these went into session immediately. of the commissions are meeting jointly with commissions of the Actions Committee of the Zionist Organization. American representatives at the Agen-

cy meeting include Rabbi Samuel Shulman, Louis Lipsky, Joseph C. Hyman, Dr. B. Hexter, and Sam Lamport. Thereare indications that the Agency will conclude its sessions today.

Tunis Authorities Still Fear Possible Renewal Of Arab-Jewish Clash

Condition States Report From Paris

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) PARIS, Aug. 8 - Military attachments are still assisting the local police at Fax, a seaport community in Tunis, maintaining order and guarding against the possible renewal of threatened anti-Iewish disturbances. A tense situation has developed there as a result of a report which Arabs have been spreading that Jews are responsible for the destruction of all Mosques in

The charge has also been made there that a Tewish doctor was responsible for the death of an Arab patient whom he had been treating. In order to prevent the spread of this rumor the authorities ordered an investigation and established that the Arab had died from natural causes.

A local Arab tribunal condemned several Arabs who participated in the recent disturbances, sentencing those found guilty to imprisonment ranging from a few days to three months. The same court, however, also sentenced two Jews to thirty days imprisonment because of their efforts at self-defense.

A local publication makes the assertion that shortly before the outbreaks against the Jews, thirty Palestine Arabs arrived in Tunis and it is believed that they prepared the ground for the disturbances.

Crowd Seeks to Prevent Arrest Of Arab by Jewish Officer (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM, Aug. 8-An excited Arab crowd today surrounded the Tewish police officer Goldman while he was arresting a Hebronite Arab for having wounded two Arabs. The injuries were inflicted by the use of a revolver and the crowd maintained that the police officer himself was the one who injured the Arabs

British police finally dispersed the crowd and an official police communique later gave the facts as they actually oc-

(Tewish Daily Bulletin) DETROIT, Aug. 8 — The Hebrew Free Loan Association, at its quarterly meeting, elected Judge Harry B. Keidan, Nathan Simons and Assistant District Attorney George M. Stutz members of the board of directors. In spite of the increasing difficulty

of obtaining endorsers, the Hebrew Free Loan has loaned out over \$70,-000 during the first six months of this year, the report to the board showed. While this is \$5,000 less than the corresponding time last year, the number of loans made is approximately the

Many people this year have looked to the Hebrew Free Loan to preserve their homes by borrowing money for taxes, during the past month, while quite a number of unemployed tradesmen have borrowed varying amounts to set themselves up in small businesses.

Abram Katkisky Fund of \$8,500 has been very active, having loaned out \$6,000 of that amount. This of its donor, Abram Katkisky, and loaning sums up to \$500. Through this fund, responsible parties are enabled to start business ventures of a much more substantial nature than would be possible by borrowing from the association proper. Central Union Refutes Nazi Allegations Against German Jews

sations Against Jews; Points to Jewish War Record

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BERLIN, Aug. 8-The Central Union of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith has issued a booklet, entitled "We German Jews" aimed to refute the anti-Semitic arguments of the Nazis.

German Jews are Germans, the Central Union declares. We have lived in Germany for over 1,600 years, we have developed under German culture, we speak German and we love Germany.

Yiddish, which is spoken by the Jews of Eastern Europe, it points out, is actually Middle High German, as spoken 600 years ago in Swabia and Frankia, so that German is actually the lewish mother-tongue.

During the war, it says, at least 12,000 Jews gave their lives in battle fighting at the front for the German fatherland, according to official records.

German Jews have contributed to the creation of German culture and science in every field of endeavor, the booklet points out, drawing attention to the large number of Jews and those of Jewish origin among the 44 German Nobel Prize winners. The Jews of Germany have contributed, it says, to German law, medicine, physics, chemist-ry, astronomy, art, music and sport.

The Central Union emphatically denies the allegations that Jews are organized in a Jewish International, that lews have invaded the Government offices or that the German Press is con-

It cites facts and figures showing that out of over 200 Ministers in nineteen post-war German Cabinets, there were only five of Jewish birth, of whom three had left the Jewish Community. And there is not a single Jewish daily in Germany, it says.

Jews have no political party of their own, it points out, and Jews are to be found in practically all political parties. It is a libellous assertion to say that Marxism is a Jewish theory. Many Jews are opponents of Marxism, and Marx, although he was born a Jew, was
