Police Apprehend Bombers of Kiel Synagogue and Karstadt Department Store; Ascertain Bombers Are Nazis; "Angriff" Incites Attack Against Professor Bernhard for Asking Curb of Nazi Terrorization

BERLIN, Aug. 9—New bombings and stonings of Jewish places of business occurred today in Neidenburg, Bishofsburg and Neukdeln.

In Neidenburg the business places of the Jewish firms of Wistenetsky, Marclovitz and Tilman were bombed.

In Bishofsburg, the windows of two Jewish firms were stoned.

In Neukdeln, the local branch of the prominent Jewish shoe firm of Julius Leiser was stoned and five large show windows broken.

5,000,000 Rouble Lottery Issued by Ozet for Bira Bidjan Work

**Will Attempt to Utilize Arrival of 60
From Palestine for Demonstration

MOSCOW, Aug. 9—A five million rouble lottery was announced today by the Ozet, Jewish colonization association, for the purpose of securing financial support to strengthen its work in Bira Bidjan.

The Ozet is also seeking to capitalize the arrival of a group of 60 from Palestine for settlement in Bira Bidjan for a demonstration against Palestine.

The Palestine group is expected to arrive this week and will be accorded a reception in Moscow. A mass meeting will be arranged which will be addressed by representatives of various organizations.

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WEIZMANN BREAKS SILENCE; ADDRESSES AGENCY MEETING; REVISIONIST UNION RECOGNIZED AS INDEPENDENT UNION

Actions Committee Concludes Sessions After All Night Deliberations; Votes for Recognition of Revisionist Body as Separate Union, by Vote of 22 to 21; Motion to Limit Separatist Political Activity Defeated After Heated Debates; Weizmann Calls on Zionist Section to Stimulate Spirit of Co-operation with Non-Zionists; Says Transjordanian Question Must Be Taken Up at This Juncture; Stresses Importance of Chalutzim to Palestine

LONDON, Aug. 9—The General Council of the World Zionist Organization concluded its sessions at seven o'clock this morning after an all night session devoted to a heated discussion on the Revisionist demand for recognition as an independent union within the Zionist Organization.

By a vote of twenty-two to twenty-one, recognition of the Revisionist Union was voted upon without the limitation that the Revisionists be prohibited from conducting separatist political work.

The vote of the Actions Committee averted a crisis which hung over its deliberations throughout the night. The Revisionists threatened to secede from the organization should their political activity be restricted.

MONTREAL, Aug. 9—The anti-Semitic weekly, "Le Miroir" again devotes the greater part of its latest issue to a series of new and malignant accusations against the Jews. Across the first page of this sheet is the headline "Jews are Dishonest" and in the following article the Jews are brand-marked as smugglers, white slavers, usurers, incendiaries and responsible for every other crime under the sun.

The article also lays claim that 88% of all the commissars and officials in Soviet Russia are Jews and states that "since the Jews have abandoned their Jehovah for the Golden Calf" it has become their second nature to be dishonest and corrupt and that is the reason why they are hated and despised and have been driven out from various

About the Zionist leader, the paper states: "From the London post office directory we gain the information that Dr. Chaim Weizmann has hidden his identity under the English name of Charles instead of the Hebrew Chaim (which should doubtless be Cain).

"This Weizmann is a Polish Jew, born in Motele, Poland. He is the direct successor of Asher Ginsberg (Achad Haam) the author of the 'Protocols', and is the most dangerous Jew alive today in the whole world. He is recognized as the uncrowned King of the Jews."

After this the paper refers to the Soviet delegation in Geneva and says: "The Jewish dictators of Soviet Russia are represented at the World Disarmament Conference by three of their own kin. We have already told about the devilry of the chief of the delegation, Litvinov-Lunacharsky, whose head is sought by the governments of various countries, but whose diplomatic rights make him inviolable. The second member of the Soviet delegation is Radek-Sobelson, whose first name implies thief. The mother of this Soviet emissary was the owner of a house of prostitution in Charlow and it is there where "the thief" saw the first light of day."

The "Le Miroir" also informs its readers that the first World Congress of anti-Semitic chiefs will be held this week in a city of central Europe. The patriotic order of the "Goglus" will be officially represented and important resolutions will be considered for a united front against international Jewry. The deputy speaker of the Canadian Parliament, Armand La Vergne, is again represented in this week's publication. He takes issue with an American Jew, S. H. Livingston of Lancaster, Pa., who wrote him in reference to his connection with the anti-Semitic campaign. In his reply to Mr. Livingston the Canadian deputy again states that he is not an anti-Semite but as far as the blood ritual accusation is concerned it has been proved by historic authentic facts and he bases his belief on those "facts."

The Jewish Alderman Berl Schwartz, whom the anti-Semitic publication nicknames "Matzohbld" Schwartz, is again under fire for demanding in the City Council police action against the distribution of the anti-Semitic stickers which, according to an announcement in the very same issue are being printed in the plant of the Goglu publications and are being sold for the

LONDON, Aug. 9—Something of a sensation was caused at yesterday's meeting of the Administrative Committee of the Jewish Agency by the decision of Dr. Chaim Weizmann, former president of the world Zionist organization and the Jewish Agency for Palestine, to make an address, while he has maintained complete silence at the sessions of the Actions Committee which he has attended.

Dr. Weizmann received prolonged ovations during his address which was devoted to a discussion of Palestine problems. His address revolved around the Chalutzim movement, the question of Transjordan as a possibility for further Jewish settlement and the work of the Jewish Agency for Palestine.

The Chalutzim, he emphasized, form the backbone of Zionism because every Chalutz creates greater possibilities for further immigration.

Comparing Palestine with Rhodesia, Dr. Weizmann pointed out that in contrast to Palestine settlers the 50,000 Europeans who migrated to Rhodesia in the last fifty years, barred the door to further immigration since they did no work themselves.

Private investments are of major importance in Palestine upbuilding work, he said. Discussing the allegations that the Jewish youth is being weaned from Zionism by Communism, Dr. Weizmann compared Palestine colonization to a Temple and Russia to the tower of Babel.

Dr. Weizmann approved the plan of Dr. Arthur Ruppin for the settlement of 5,000 families and expressed no doubt that between £200 and £250 would suffice to settle each family as estimated by Dr. Ruppin.

He urged the need for opening the question of utilizing Transjordan for colonization at the present juncture. He also urged the Zionist Organization to bring non-Zionists closer to Palestine work and expressed the view that the inactivity of the non-Zionists is due to the fact that they are insufficiently drawn into a spirit of co-operation which the Zionist section should have created.

1,200 Immigration Cases Abroad Handled by Council Of Jewish Women in 2 Months

American Relatives Have Turned to
Council's International Bureau
for Aid

The Bureau of International Service of the National Council of Jewish Women has been receiving increasing numbers of cases from agencies abroad requesting service for alien families in their communities despite the fact that immigration to the United States has practically ceased, according to information made public by the Council of Jewish Women.

Similarly, relatives in the United States have turned to the International Bureau for aid in solving some of their difficulties with respect to their families abroad, the statement says.

The necessity of preserving the unity and integrity of the family was stressed at the International Conference on Social Work held at Frankfurt am Main, in July, as one of the fundamental needs of civilized living at this time.

During the month of July of this year, as well as during the month of June, over 1200 international cases were handled by the National Council of Jewish Women, 400 of them requiring major service for disinherited families. Of the 175 new cases received during the month of June alone, 99 were referred to the Bureau by agencies and Council Sections in the United States, 51 cases came from Poland, nine were referred from China, five from Russia, six from Lithuania, and the balance from Germany, Austria, and England. Among other services, these cases involved the collection of funds from residents of this country to send to their relatives abroad, as well as action in five legacy cases for heirs living in other countries.

Legacies to Jewish Institutions in May Will

Legacies in the amount of \$4800 go to nine institutions in the will of the late Mrs. Pauline May who left an estate valued at \$500,000.

The institutions benefiting are: The Brooklyn Hebrew Orphan Asylum, and its women's auxiliary and the women's auxiliary of the Jewish Hospital of Brooklyn, which receive \$1000 each; the Ladies Hebrew Benevolent Society, United Jewish Aid Societies and Sisterhood of Congregation Shaaray Tefila, \$500 each; the Ladies Aid Society of the Sanitarium for Hebrew Children, Ladies Auxiliary Society of the Home for Aged and Infirm, The Child Welfare, Inc. \$100 each.

Seventeen employes receive \$250 each for every year of their service in the will of Joseph Schanz.

Dr. Brodetsky Says Two Distinct Lines
of Policy Are Possible, That of the
Present—and That of the Revisionists

LONDON—The statement of Zionist policy in relation to the Mandatory and toward the Arabs as enunciated by Dr. Seig Brodetsky, member of the World Zionist Executive in London, in charge of political affairs, aroused considerable discussion at the sessions of the Actions Committee, which will shortly conclude its deliberations here.

In my opinion, Dr. Brodetsky said, there are two possible and distinct lines of policy—the present policy of the Organization as adopted by the last Congress, and the policy enunciated with remarkable clarity by the leader of the Revisionists. At the Permanenz-Ausschuss last year I was asked whether there isn't a third line of policy in between. My answer then was: No! And it is my answer still.

The question is whether, in the face of the still unsatisfactory political position, we shall adopt the line of hard, steady and daily labor, or the line of political adventure. You may ask: What is political adventure? If Revisionists in China go to Lord Lytton and present him with a petition that Great Britain should leave Palestine, it is political adventure. If young Jews are led to believe that the salvation of their people will be secured by their living in camps with offensive and defensive arms, including gas-masks, it is a wild adventure. If so-called leaders go around the Jewish towns declaring that the salvation of Jewry is to be awaited from the approaching World War, and that we must be ready to take the side against Great Britain, in this world struggle, it is criminal adventure. If the leader of a Zionist Party announces that since Great Britain's financial stability has been shaken, she is no longer a useful ally of the Jewish people, and we must look for more useful and more powerful allies, it is political adventure. If from a villa at Geneva a leader of a Zionist Party announces in a mock-solemn fashion that Great Britain must go out of Palestine, it is political adventure.

We need not be concerned about the honor or political interests of Great Britain, who can look after herself. One of the most interesting phenomena of recent years has been the way that Englishmen have understood that Jews can and must fight for their rights, even against the British Government. What matters is the honor of Jewry and our national future. This care for the future of our people leads me to the conviction that political adventure is the worst possible road for our national salvation.

B'nai Brith Reiterates All Districts Opposed to Conference, In Reply to Jewish Congress

Dr. Rubinow Asserts British B'nai
Brith Did Not Accept
Invitation

The Order B'nai Brith, through its Secretary, Dr. I. M. Rubinow, replying to the statement of the American Jewish Congress that 50% of the foreign B'nai Brith Districts are in favor of the world Jewish conference which opens in Geneva on August 14th, reiterates its assertion that the "foreign districts are unanimously unfavorable to B'nai Brith's participation in a world Jewish conference at the present time."

Dr. Rubinow writes:

"May I point out that when President Cohen wrote to Mr. Deutsch: 'The answers received from the foreign districts are unanimously unfavorable to B'nai Brith's participation in a world Jewish conference at or near the present time' this statement was in full accord with the answers received, regardless of communications you may have had from Europe.

"As far as England is concerned, President Liverman of District Grand Lodge No. 15, in reply to our inquiry concerning a cable message in the 'Jewish Daily Bulletin' announcing their acceptance of your invitation, wired: 'Report absolutely incorrect. We have not accepted invitation.'

"Mr. Liverman's letter, dated July 15th, informed us that while "this district Grand Lodge decided to participate in the conference to take place this summer, we propose to take no further action pending a definite decision from you as to what action and

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strengthen our position in the world on international politics, at Geneva as well as in all the important centres of political influence. We are continually working at this. But it is one thing to work calmly and deliberately, and to exert every ounce of strength in order to fortify our position; and it is another thing to run round offering Palestine to any bidder, in the expectation that Great Britain will take fright and run away.

Much has been said recently about various lines of action proposed in order to influence Great Britain, either to implement the Mandate or to vacate Palestine. The idea of a petition is not a new one. It has taken various forms. One is a petition to Great Britain direct. Another is a petition to the League of Nations, asking the League to ensure that our justified expectations are realized, and in particular, it is suggested that the Jewish youth should approach the League and explain their tragic position in the ocean of anti-Semitism which has covered Europe and other parts of the world. A third is a petition from the

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policy the B'nai Brith is taking in the matter, as it is, of course, understood that no District of our movement can act sectionally in this important matter. Pending your decision we are withholding our reply to the invitation of the American Jewish Congress.

"While, unfortunately, we have not heard directly from Palestine, Roumania and Turkey, a message in the Yiddish papers of July 23rd, from Bucharest reads as follows: 'The B'nai Brith of Roumania has decided not to participate in the Jewish world conference. The invitation to send delegates was yesterday rejected for important reasons.'

"It appears from your letter that you have been in communication not only with District Grand Lodges, but even sections of the Districts as your quotation from the head of the Transylvanian section of the Roumanian B'nai Brith would indicate. This we deeply regret as obviously a decision on a matter of vital importance to the entire Order could not be arrived at by an outside body communicating with individual sections and sub-sections of the Organization," the B'nai Brith communication concludes.

No comment on this communication was forthcoming from the offices of the American Jewish Congress since the heads of the organization are all abroad in connection with the conference sessions.

The July 29th issue of the "London Jewish Chronicle" which has just reached this country carries a letter from M. Gordon Liverman, head of the British B'nai Brith, in which he explains that the British Lodge favored participation in the world Jewish conference, but has declined the American Jewish Congress invitation to participate because of the opposition of the central headquarters of the Order. Mr. Liverman's communication says:

"Some confusion appears to exist in regard to the attitude of the B'nai Brith in this country to the World Jewish Congress and I would be grateful if you would permit me to explain the position.

"At the meeting of the District Grand Lodge in London, whose proceedings were reported in your issue of July 15th, a decision was taken in favor of participation, and the headquarters of our Movement were advised accordingly.

"It is obvious, however, that an international organization such as ours, on such a subject as a World Jewish Conference, one district cannot act alone.

"Having regard of the fact that our colleagues in America and on the Continent do not favor participation, our Order cannot be represented on this occasion and in these circumstances, we, in England, are unable to accept the invitation sent to us."

Jews of each land to their own Government, asking this Government to use its influence at Geneva in order to support our demands. A fourth is a petition to each Government asking it to use its influence at Geneva in order to make Great Britain give up the Mandate.

I need not go into a detailed discussion of the advisability of any petition at all, and if a petition is advisable, which form to choose. I would merely say two things. The first is that any such action undertaken by anybody but the officially accredited representatives of the Jewish Agency is unthinkable and cannot be tolerated. Any section of the Organization doing this is placing itself outside the pale of the Zionist Organization.

I have never been inclined to get very excited over what the Revisionists call their "separate political work"; I know that it is more talk about work than actual work. Yet I must say that such interference with our difficult political task as would be represented by a Petition organized by the Revisionists must be prevented. Secondly, I would say that we must beware of the fallacy of believing that Great Britain may consent to be pushed by violent methods.

We have been attacked for not doing anything positive in connection with the problem of the Palestine Arabs. No doubt Dr. Arlosoroff will have something to say about this matter; but I must say for myself that many Zionists have no very clear notions of what they conceive to be the task of the Executive in this respect. Are we to make peace with the Arabs by talking to them diplomatically. If so, what are we to offer? I can understand the attitude of some members of the Brith Shalom. They say frankly: If we want to establish an understanding with the Arabs, then we must offer them something tangible in return for their recognition of our right of entry into Palestine, and, say they, the only thing we can offer Arabs is their political liberty, namely, parliamentary Government. I say that I can understand this point of view although I do not share it.

The way to an understanding with the Arabs of Palestine is not a very obvious one, but certain important avenues do exist and some progress has been made along them during the past year. The first is that Jews and Arabs should co-operate on public bodies, Government committees, etc. I think there is more of this going on than people are aware of, and the policy of the Palestine Government seems to be to develop this process. The second avenue is that of Government firmness in its policy. Any facilitation on the part of the Mandatory Power is interpreted by the Arabs as weakness and an encouragement to their extremists. Conditions in this respect are not always satisfactory, and it is part of the task of the Executive

to urge upon the Government at all times a steady firmness in its policy. Thirdly there is the undoubted fact that our work in Palestine is bringing great benefit to the Arabs; that our national interest is indeed also the interest of the Arabs.

I object to such talk as that we are going to Palestine for the benefit of everybody. Nobody believes it, and in any case, we refuse to allow the Arab or anybody else the right to decide whether we may or may not come to Palestine. But we must use facts and figures to prove that our benefit is compatible with that of the Arabs, and must desist from any talk or act that may lead to misunderstanding.

What has made the problem of the Palestine Arabs so difficult, Dr. Brodetsky said, is the smoke screen that has been thrown up around the whole question, consisting of allegation based upon anti-Jewish prejudice: the allegation that while the Jewish National Home may be an excellent objective considered theoretically, it simply can not be carried into effect; that the very existence of the Arabs of Palestine is threatened by our work. The Shaw Commission was led astray by this allegation. The representatives of the Mandatory Power, the then Colonial Secretary, Lord Passfield, and the then High Commissioner, Sir John Chancellor, were predisposed to this view, put up an appearance of scientific neutrality, and said that this must be carefully investigated. The result was the Hope Simpson Report and the accompanying White Paper which foreshadowed severe restrictions upon Jewish land acquisition and Jewish immigration.

A careful study of the Prime Minister's letter will show that in principle the restrictions adumbrated in the White Paper were largely annulled as the result of the discussion with the Cabinet Sub-Committee.

Observance of Tisha B'ab Begins Tonight

Traditional Jews the world over will begin observance tonight of Tisha B'ab, the ninth day of the Hebrew month of Ab.

The day is associated with the final destruction of the kingdom of Judah, twenty-five centuries ago, and with the destruction of the Temple by the Romans under Titus more than 600 years later.

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
