## EXECUTIVE ANNOUNCES IMMEDIATE PREPARATIONS FOR WORLD CONGRESS

**Geneva Conference Attacked in "London Jewish Chronicle"; Says Conference Did Not Afford Satisfaction Even to Its Callers; Lord Melchett Says Jews of England Welcome Decision to Establish World Jewish Congress; Baptists Applaud Endeavors**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

GENEVA, Aug. 18—Today on the morrow of the closing of the world Jewish conference which voted for the summoning of a world Jewish congress in the summer of 1934, the newly elected executive of twenty announced that a program to popularize the congress would be launched immediately.

The propaganda will seek to find adherents of the congress idea both in Jewish and non-Jewish circles, it was stated.

Actual preparations for general elections for deputies to the congress will be inaugurated in October, it is said.

The Executive, which will direct the work, will seek to establish a Congress Committee in every country where Jews live.

LONDON, Aug. 18—The "London Jewish Chronicle" in its issue of tomorrow will publish an editorial bitterly castigating the world Jewish conference concluded yesterday in Geneva.

The paper calls it "an unfortunate gathering dignified by its promoters with a grandiose title ill corresponding to its unimportant and unrepresentative character."

## Dickstein Calls for Revision Of Medical Methods of United States Consulates

**Congressman Believes Chicanery of  
Medical Officials in Poland  
Now Checked**

WARSAW, Aug. 18—Congressman Samuel Dickstein, chairman of the Immigration Committee of the United States House of Representatives, now in Warsaw investigating the alleged unjustified non-issuance of U. S. visas to Jewish immigrants, yesterday informed the Jewish Telegraphic Agency he is convinced that he has brought about the prevention of further chicanery in medical examinations by physicians attached to the United States consulates in Poland.

Congressman Dickstein had previ-

## 25 Palestinians Arrive in Russia; Enroute to Bidjan

## Nazi Organ Publishes Forged Document by Non-Existent Body Alleging Jews Pro-Soviet

**Remuneration Will Be in the Form of  
a Little Journey Eastward  
Says "Beobachter"**

BERLIN, Aug. 18—A forged document, allegedly revealing the sympathy of the Jews toward the Union of Socialist Soviet Republics, is published today by the "Voelkischer Beobachter," Nazi organ.

"In remuneration for this sympathy, we will soon give the Jews a little journey eastward," states the Nazi organ.

The forged document, allegedly a secret document, carries the Soviet emblem and is signed by a non-existent Jewish organization called "Judische Glaubensgemeinschaft Deutschlands." At the same time the paper attempts to create the impression that a number of Soviet Commissars are Jews and that the Jews rule Russia.

The forged document allegedly is an appeal by the non-existent organization to German Jews to support the Communists, and the paper quotes it as declaring: "The Jewish sympathies are

Congratulatory messages were read from Baron de Rothschild, and Lord Melchett among others, while ad-

### Mark Fiftieth Anniversary Of Establishment of First Jewish Farms in United States

Colonies of Alliance Established in  
New Jersey Half a Cen-  
tury Ago

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 18—A unique event rich in historic significance is to take place tomorrow and Sunday, in the quiet country spot known as Rainbow Lake on the outskirts of Norma, N. J., thirty-five miles from this city.

Fifty years ago almost to the day, forty-three families recruited from various parts of Russia, dreamers of the European ghettos, bent on convincing a skeptical world that the Jew can adapt himself to the land and can become a valuable asset to the farming population of the country, landed here and immediately applied themselves to the establishment of the very first Jewish farms in this country. The spirit animating these men and women closely resembled that of the early pioneers in Palestine.

Envisioning America as the great land of opportunity these erstwhile residents of Odessa and Kiev, victims of discrimination, oppression, out and out persecution, could see no reason why in this land they could not establish themselves as tillers of the soil. Not satisfied with being mere dreamers, they applied themselves to the translation of their dreams into reality. The result of their effort was the founding fifty years ago of the Colonies of Alliance, Norma and Brotmanville, in New Jersey. And now after a lapse of fifty years, these early pioneers, at least those who survive and their children, will assemble tomorrow

## U. S. Minister Lauds

### Election of Rothenberg

Praise for the action of American Zionists in electing Morris Rothenberg as their President at their recent annual convention is contained in a message sent from the American legation at Tirana by Herman Bernstein, United States Minister to Albania, and a leading figure in the American Zionist movement before his assumption of diplomatic office.

Mr. Bernstein's statement, voicing satisfaction with Mr. Rothenberg for his command of "the necessary qualities at this difficult juncture," expresses optimism with regard to the upbuilding of the Jewish National Home despite "universal pessimism" and emphasizes that success for the Jewish people is dependent on "hard work and peaceful endeavors."

The letter from the United States Minister is addressed to Mr. Rothenberg and reads as follows:

"I congratulate you heartily on your election to the Presidency of the Zionist Organization of America. The opportunity for still greater service to the cause of Jewish idealism is now yours. In these days of universal pessimism, of moral and spiritual as well as economic ebb, it is well to remember that, despite the heartbreaking hardships of recent years, the *Hatikvah* is sure to be fulfilled if the Jewish people intensifies its efforts to redeem Zion through hard work and peaceful endeavors.

"Now more than ever, the upbuilding of Palestine requires increased enthusiasm and service. The rebuilders of Zion in Palestine should be helped and encouraged to maintain and strengthen the position of the constructive undertakings of Eretz Israel. To link Israel's historic past with the hope, achievements and future of the Holy Land, this generation of Jewry must 'act in the living present,' with the vision and courage of practical idealism. American Zionists are to be congratulated on having chosen you as the leader at this difficult juncture, for you combine the necessary qualities with a talent to avoid extremism."

### "Seeress" Says Peace Depends on Fulfillment of Biblical Prophecies

LOS ANGELES, Aug. 18—Mrs. Eileen Garrett, an Irish "seeress" who came to Los Angeles recently as a guest of the American Society of Psychological Research, in an interview in the Los Angeles Times states definitely that the peace of the world depends upon the Biblical prophecies' fulfillment relating to the Jews, and that these prophecies will be fulfilled.

"One of the striking events of the future will be the fulfillment of the prophecies in regard to the Jews. It will be demonstrated that they are indeed the Lord's chosen people," she said. "In every Jew, even the ignorant

## Rabbis Ask Hindenburg to

### Continue Protection for Jews

A cablegram was sent yesterday to President Paul von Hindenburg of Germany expressing appreciation of his sympathetic stand toward the Jews and expressing the hope that his support will be continued to protect the Jews from further attack by the Nazis, in accordance with a decision adopted at the close of the two day sessions of the 15th annual convention of the Assembly of Hebrew Orthodox Rabbis of America and Canada.

The convention also adopted a resolution deploring the persecution of Jews in Roumania and Germany.

The five day week for workers was endorsed.

Rabbi G. Wolf Margolies, dean of American orthodox Rabbis was re-elected president and the other officers named as follows: Vice presidents, Rabbi Jacob Mendelson of Newark, S. T. Golubowsky, New York, Dr. Gratsky; treasurer, Rabbi M. Margolies of New York; J. T. Levy, Dr. B. Birstein, New York, secretaries.

### Outstanding Jewish Players At Chess Congress

PASADENA, Calif., Aug. 18—A number of outstanding Jewish chess players are participating in the two week Chess Congress which opened here this week.

Among those prominent in the congress will be Dr. Alexander Alekhine of Paris, world champion, who will play what is among the first chess games to be played in the air. His opponent will be Isaac L. Kashtan of New York, regarded as one of America's outstanding chess players. The game will be played in the cabin of the Goodyear blimp "Volunteer."

Among the master chess players listed and entered in the various games are: Jacob Bernstein, four times New York state champion; Harry Borchow of Los Angeles, California champion for the past two years; Samuel D. Factor of Chicago, Western Chess Association champion; Fred Reinfeld, intercollegiate and New York state champion; Samuel Reshevsky, University of Chicago, the one time "Polish wonder," Herman Steiner, thrice member of the American Olympic team in chess and Dr. Moses Sholtz of Los Angeles.

## Funeral Services

### For Nachman Heller

Funeral services were held for Nachman Heller, former rabbi, translator and author. Interment took place at the Beth David Cemetery, Elmont, L.I. He was 58 years old.

He retired from the rabbinate ten years ago. He was the author of "The Coming of Shiloh" and the translator of "Daniel and Ezra" from the original Aramaic into Hebrew and then into English.

## Departures From U.S. Three Fold as Large as Immigrant Entries in Fiscal Year

A Total of 35,576 Aliens Admitted to Country While 103,295 Persons Departed During Same Period

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

WASHINGTON, Aug. 18.—Alien departures from the United States numbered a total three times as large as the number of new immigrants admitted as permanent residents during the past fiscal year, according to a statement issued yesterday by Secretary of Labor Doak.

"During the fiscal year ended June 30, 1932," the statement said, "only 35,576 permanent immigrants were admitted, and 103,295 alien residents left the United States with the expressed intention of making their homes in other countries. In other words, alien emigration exceeded immigration by 67,719."

"A comparison with corresponding figures for the preceding fiscal year is exceedingly interesting. In that year 97,139 immigrants were admitted, as against 61,882 who departed permanently from the United States. Thus for the fiscal year just ended we show an increase of departures over admissions of 67,719 as compared with an increase of 35,257 admissions over departures for the preceding year.

"This is the first year in the history of the country when the number of aliens permanently departing from the United States exceeded the arrivals. During this period 19,426 were formally deported, 2,637 aliens who had become destitute within three years after arrival were returned to their native countries by the department, and 10,750 aliens who were apprehended and found to be subject to deportation were permitted to depart at their own expense without formal deportation.

"Therefore, it will be seen that the department directly caused 32,813 aliens, who were here lawfully or who had fallen into distress, to depart from the country. In addition, it has been variously estimated that thousands of other aliens left the country on their own initiative in preference to apprehension and subsequent deportation."

## Cincinnati Jewish Communal Worker Succumbs

CINCINNATI, Aug. 18.—Mrs. Louis H. Pollak, prominent Jewish civic and educational worker died here yesterday at the age of 45.

Mrs. Pollak, wife of City Councillman Julian A. Pollak, was identified with the Council of Jewish Women; was secretary of the Parent Teacher Association of the Hillsdale School, a member of the board of trustees of the public library and one of the organizers of the League of Women voters here of which she was formerly president.

## Mosely Party Member Arrested And Fined for Distributing Anti-Jewish Billboards

Party Spokesman Says Party is Not Anti-Semitic; That Youth Advocated Personal Views Only

LONDON, Aug. 18.—Jack Maddocks, a young man who gave his address as the offices of the Socialist Party, headed by Sir Oswald Mosely, was arrested and fined 40 shillings today for posting billboards throughout London, agitating against the Jews.

The billboards called for the nationalization of all banks owned by Jews and the expulsion of the Jews from the country.

The magistrate, in fining Maddocks, stated that such posters are offensive to numerous people and might lead to a breach of the peace.

Maddocks replied that it is his conviction that the influence of the Jews is detrimental to England.

LONDON, Aug. 18.—Dr. Forgan, Labor M. P., co-founder of the new Socialist Party with Sir Oswald Mosely, denied that the party shares the anti-Semitic views of Maddocks, in response to an inquiry by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency today.

Dr. Forgan stated that Maddocks is one of a number of unemployed, connected with the party, who were permitted to live in the basement of the party's offices. Apparently Maddocks has become infected with anti-Semitism, but his views are that of a private individual and are in no wise shared by the party which is not anti-Semitic, Dr. Forgan asserted.

## New York Gewerkschaften Conference in Syracuse

SYRACUSE, Aug. 18.—Isaac Hamlin, national secretary of the National Labor Committee for the Jewish Workers in Palestine, announced yesterday that a special conference of the New York State District Gewerkschaften Campaign will be held in Syracuse, September 4th, at Farband Hall. Delegates from Syracuse, Albany, Rochester, Buffalo, Schenectady, Troy, Auburn, Binghamton, and leaders of New York city will constitute the membership of the meeting.

Goldie Myerson, who will be in Syracuse at that time as an honor guest of the 11th Young Poale Zion Alliance Convention, and who will arrive from Palestine at the end of this month, will give a report and greetings of the work done by the Gewerkschaften Campaign in Eretz Israel.

The conference is called so that the members of New York State may know the results of the Campaign, and what it has accomplished during the past year for the workers in Palestine, and at the same time lay the plans, including the quota for each city, for the coming year.

## Executive Council Confirms Lewis Goldberg as Justice Of Superior Court

Sworn Into Office by Governor Ely; Will Assume Duties Monday; Prominent in Jewish and Civic Affairs

BOSTON, Aug. 18.—The Executive Council of the State of Massachusetts yesterday unanimously confirmed the appointment of Lewis Goldberg as Justice of the Superior Court of Massachusetts.

Mr. Goldberg, a former member of the Massachusetts Department of Public Utilities and prominent in Jewish affairs, was nominated for the post by Governor Joseph B. Ely on August 1st.

Justice Goldberg was sworn into office by Governor Ely yesterday and will formally assume the duties of his post on Monday.

Justice Goldberg succeeds Judge Henry P. Lummus, elevated to fill the vacancy on the bench of the Supreme Judicial Court declined by Professor Felix Frankfurter of the Law School of Harvard University.

Justice Goldberg, who was born in Russia, received his education at Harvard College and at Harvard Law School.

He is prominently identified with Jewish and civic activities.

From 1915 to 1921 he was assistant United States attorney for Massachusetts, and from 1921 to 1926 Assistant Attorney General of Massachusetts. For a period he served as Commissioner of the Department of Public Utilities.

Justice Goldberg is associated with the Zionist Organization of America, the American Jewish Committee, the Menorah Society and the Big Brother movement.

He was the first president of the Jewish Big Brother Association of Boston, serving three terms and is a trustee of the Boston Federated Jewish Charities. He is a director of the Boston Y.M.H.A.-Y.W.H.A. and of the Big Brother and Big Sister Federation, Inc.

## Detroit J.N.F. Plans Drive For Detroit Wood

DETROIT, Aug. 18.—Plans are being formulated here for a drive to plant 1,000 trees in a Detroit Wood in the Washington Forest in Palestine. The campaign, under the direction of the Jewish National Fund Council of which Leon Kay is president, has the support and co-operation of fifteen organizations.

Tentative plans call for a preliminary conference of all organizations in the city to arrange for the drive, which is to be conducted during October. The campaign is to culminate with a banquet or mass meeting on Sunday evening, Oct. 30, on which day the Michigan State Zionist Conference is to be held here.

Alliance was named in honor of the Alliance Israelite Universelle, from whom the colony received financial assistance. Similar assistance was also received from the Baron de Hirsch funds.

Tomorrow, Saturday morning will be given over to registration and for the purpose of a general get-together. This feature is announced to take place "rain or shine." At three thirty there will be a baseball game between the old-timers and the more recent arrivals. Sunday morning will be given over to a reunion in honor of the surviving pioneers of whom there are between twelve and fifteen of the original forty-three. The Golden Jubilee Banquet will take place at one P. M. at Rainbow Lake. At this banquet addresses will be delivered by former United States Congressman Benj. M. Golder, whose parents were among the pioneers; Judge Wm. M. Lewis of Philadelphia; Joseph B. Perskie of Atlantic City, another of the pioneers, and Rev. Hirsh Masliansky of New York City.

The exercises will be brought to a close with a memorial service.

ously charged that the medical officials of the consulates were taking unfair advantage of a number of immigrants who had been promised visas.

Congressman Dickstein yesterday attended a special examination conducted with the participation of the Chief United States Physician for Europe, Dr. MacMiller, where twenty-five immigrants who have been waiting for many years for visas and who have repeatedly been rejected by consulate physicians, were examined.

Fifteen of the twenty-five will in all probability receive visas, Congressman Dickstein stated.

The total number of Jewish candidates in Poland waiting for visas is approximately 600, while the total number of Jews throughout Europe waiting for visas is approximately 5,000, he said.

As a means of preventing possible chicanery, Congressman Dickstein proposes a medical triumvirate at American consulates, to consist of the consulate physician, a local physician and a special physician delegated from the United States.

Congressman Dickstein will introduce a bill to this effect at the next session of Congress.

Under present regulations, the consular physicians are the sole arbiters.

Congressman Dickstein who has been collecting material on the Polish Jewish situation in general, will proceed to Roumania tomorrow.

unlettered, unbatched emigrant from the cruel ghettos of the steppes, there is a sacred fire of spirituality and artistry. The most successful of all people in a material way, they are one of the least material at heart. They have brains, imagination and concentrated industry. Their sway will grow every year. As their influence extends, the narrow savage hatreds of nationalism will shudder down to a feeble flicker. The Jew is international in spirit. As he rises to power the vast brotherhood of man will grow. The world will be knit together as never before. Boundaries between countries will be for geographies; not for sentries with loaded guns.

"As the Jew spreads his influence over the world, the international jag of feminism will fade away. The whole structure of Jewish faith and Jewish custom is built upon family relation; and in this family relation the woman does not make speeches from the top of cracker boxes. Of all men in the world, the Jew knows best how to treat his wife and to have a happy home."

Mrs. Garrett is not a spiritualist nor does she know how she arrives at her prophecies. She does not claim any supernatural powers.

LONDON, Aug. 18.—Lord Melchett, son and heir of the late Sir Alfred Mond, Jewish industrialist and Zionist leader, in an interview appearing in the "Daily Herald," today states the Jews of England welcome the decision of the Geneva world Jewish conference to establish a world Jewish congress in the summer of 1934.

Lord Melchett declared he will do everything within his power to contribute to the success of the congress which aims at the protection of the Jewish people.

The English nation stands alone among the nations of the world in its attitude toward the Jews. If the world wants peace and prosperity it must turn from oppression of the Jews and follow the example of the English who heard the cry of Jewry for a national home and answered it through the great leader, Lord Balfour, Lord Melchett stated.

Today's issue of the "Baptist Times" reveals editorially that its editor, speaking in behalf of British Baptists, sent a telegram to the Geneva conference, applauding its purposes.

The message declared: "British Baptists pray for the blessing of your work for the freedom of the Jews." It stated further that the Baptists are pledged to equality of all religions and the abolishing of the disabilities to civil and religious freedom. The Jews, it declared, have enriched every department of human thought. Much of the enmity toward the Jews arises from envy of the greatness of the Jewish race, the Baptist spokesman asserted.
