The two Jews involved, David Mess-ner and M. Guttman, were arrested five days apart, the former on July 10th and the latter on July 15th, and accused of signaling to Soviet guards across the frontier, using lights for

Two other partners were also arrested, but were released at the end of July, while Messner and Gutman, were ordered returned to their native town of Balti but did not reach their

Coty Organ Now Charges Schwartzbard Killed on Soviet Instruction, "La Liberte" Subsidized to Aid Defense

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) PARIS, Aug. 22-French justice is proceeding against Francois Coty, anti-Semitic leader, for participating in frauds infringing the company laws, the conservative journal, "La Liberte," reports.

"L'Ami du Peuple," Coty's organ, re-torts today by accusing "La Liberte" of receiving subsidies from Moscow tal of the Bolshevist murderer, Schwartzbard."

The Schwartzbard referred to by the anti-Semitic organ, is Sholom Schwartzbard, who killed General Semion Petlura, responsible for the bloody pogroms in the Ukraine.

Schwartzbard, a Jewish watchmaker, who had lived through the horror of the Petlura pogroms in the Ukraine, shot and killed Petlura on May 25, 1925, when the latter was leaving a Paris restaurant.

At Schwartzbard's trial, which opened in October of 1927, Alexander Shul-gin, former Minister of Foreign Af-fairs in Petlura's cabinet, sought to prove and failed that Schwartzbard was instructions from the Soviet government in Moscow.
