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FEAR NEW SERIOUS ATTACKS IN GERMANY WITH JEWS AS PRINCIPAL VICTIMS IF DEATH SENTENCE OF FIVE NAZIS IS CARRIED OUT

**Hitler Openly Defies Von Papen Government Should It Refuse Commutation of
Death Sentence Imposed on Five Nazis for Killing Workman, in Accordance
With Anti-Terrorist Decree; Jewish Stores Attacked Following Decree;
Jew Dragged to Street, Stripped and Beaten Up**

BERLIN, Aug. 23 — With attacks upon Jews already resultant and Adolph Hitler himself breathing defiance against the government of Chancellor Franz von Papen, renewed and serious disturbances with the Jews among the principal victims are expected as a result of the execution sentence passed upon five Nazis yesterday by the special court of Buethen in Silesia for the murder of a Communist on August 9th.

The verdict was announced by a special court operating under the anti-terrorist decrees issued by President Paul von Hindenburg. There is no appeal against the verdict of the court, although, it is understood the government may stay a sentence.

When the verdict was pronounced last night at seven o'clock, Edmund Heines, Nazi Reichstag deputy and leader of the local Storm Troops, who had attended the trial in Nazi uniform, arose and shouted: "The German people in the future will pronounce different verdicts. This judgment will be a beacon of German liberty!"

This defiance was taken up by a number of spectators and echoed by thousands of aroused Nazis who surrounded the courtroom. An attempt was made to rush the court house building and when repulsed by the police, the Nazis proceeded to adjoin-

Ask Ouster of All Jews From Clergy and Church Offices

VIENNA, Aug. 23—A demand for the ouster of all clergy and church officials of Jewish descent is made of the Archbishop by the Nazi press.

The papers declare that a Jew even though he becomes a priest through the baptismal font, cannot become a son of the German people.

They charge that the Christian clergymen of Jewish descent are opposed to the German nationalist movement and that they impose difficulties in the way of the Nazis, even in church ceremonies.

ing streets, breaking the windows of a number of Jewish stores.

A Jewish fruit dealer was dragged to the street, stripped and flogged.

The Nazis also smashed the windows of the Socialist "Volksblatt" and of the Catholic Center Party paper.

Adolph Hitler today sent a personal petition to Chancellor Franz von Papen asking commutation of the sentence. In a statement issued, Hitler threatened to make an end to what he termed "this guillotine government."

Rabbi Silver Resigns Education Post; Brickner Succeeds

CLEVELAND, Aug. 23—Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, one of the founders of the Bureau of Education and its president since its inception in 1924 has resigned his post and will be succeeded by Rabbi Barnett R. Brickner.

Rabbi Silver will leave Cleveland on a year's sabbatical leave, beginning in October. This is the reason given for Rabbi Silver's resignation.

The Bureau has under its supervision eight branches of the Cleveland Hebrew Schools, including the Hebrew Teachers Institute for the training of Hebrew teachers; six branches of the Council Religious Schools; and the Jewish Teachers Institute for the training of expert teachers in the Sabbath Schools. In addition to these schools the Bureau carries on extension education.

The Bureau is a subsidiary of the Jewish Welfare Fund.

Agudath Israel Group Sails For Palestine August 31st

JERUSALEM, Aug. 23—An excursion to Palestine of members of the Agudath Israel has been arranged by the Executive of the organization in Palestine.

A group of affiliates will sail for Palestine from Trieste on August 31st, on the steamship "Adria".

Possibility Havana May Annul Decree Raising License Fee From \$6 to \$129

**If Not Annulled Will Be Reduced to
\$20 or \$25 It Is Believed; Jews
Make Representations**

HAVANA, Aug. 23—The possibility that the municipality of Havana will change its decree raising the fee of peddlers licenses from \$6 to \$12 a person, to the sum of either \$20 or \$25, was indicated here yesterday.

The rise in the price of licenses fees, announced on July 25, has jeopardized the economic position of 500 Jewish peddlers who are unable to pay the fee. It is estimated that 60 percent of the Jewish peddlers would be without means of livelihood should this new regulation be carried into effect.

The announcement of the new measure aroused sharp protests in Jewish circles and brought about representations to the authorities on the part of the Jewish Centre.

These representations will bring about either the complete nullification of the decree or a reduction of the fee to either \$20 or \$25, it is stated.

Reveal Bira Bidjan Committee in Palestine

TEL AVIV, Aug. 23—Police seized documents here today revealing the existence of a Palestine Committee which is mobilizing immigrants for Bira Bidjan, the Far Eastern District of Soviet Russia where an autonomous Jewish region is to be established in 1933.

The documents, it is stated, reveal that the names of 300 prospective candidates for Bira Bidjan settlement were submitted of which 140 were approved.

Mark 3rd Anniversary Of Hulda Attack

JERUSALEM, Aug. 23—Commemoration of the third anniversary of the attack upon Hulda was marked here yesterday by the unveiling of a memorial by the Efrayim Chizik colonists in the presence of many visitors from all parts of Palestine.

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Conference on Labor

Colony This Week

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

DETROIT, Aug. 23—A two day conference will be held at "Unser Camp" beginning August 27th, under the auspices of the "Harueth Beth", an organization organizing a labor colony in Palestine upon land of the Jewish National Fund in Wadi-Hawareth.

The Yakhin delegation, representing the co-operative agricultural organization for orange plantations, will participate in the sessions.

Sixty-five Jewish families are affiliated with the Harueth Beth organization which will grant 20 dunams of land to each member of the organization. Of this area 10 dunams are to be planted with orange groves. Settlers are to pay for this area at the rate of \$2,500 annually for a period of five years. Settlement is to be made after the groves bear fruit and the settlers are able to earn a livelihood from the products.

An additional sum of \$1,500 will be required for housing facilities and development of the remaining 10 dunam area, it is estimated.

All the members of the organization have contracted with the "Yakhin", an affiliate of the Histadruth, Palestine labor Federation for the cultivation of the area.

The new labor colony is one of nine for 1,000 families in the progress of establishment on Wadi Hawareth land.

Story of "American Chalutzim" Told at 50th Anniversary Celebration

Over 600 Descendants of Settlers Return for Events Marking Jubilee

NORMA, Aug. 23—The story of the "American Chalutzim," the Jewish pioneers who settled at Alliance, N. J., in 1882, was retold at the Golden Jubilee celebration, marking the 50th anniversary of Alliance, Norma and Brothmanville, at Rainbow Lake, Norma, over the week-end. From all parts of the United States over 600 descendants of the original settlers and former residents gathered to renew acquaintance, see their old home and pay tribute to the remaining few pioneers and to the memory of those who had passed on.

In a number of addresses, delivered at the final banquet Sunday afternoon, the hardships and struggles of the first settlers were vividly recalled; how the Alliance Israelite Universelle had purchased the tract of land in the South Jersey wilderness; how the settlers starved and scrimped and finally cleared the land after the Baron De Hirsch Fund had come to their rescue, and the bitter struggle to eke a living out of the sandy, rocky soil, were all pictured. The joys of building and the humble pleasures of these Russian Jewish immigrants were not forgotten in the recital of the history of the colonies.

Dr. Jacob Billikopf, director of the Federation of Jewish Charities, Philadelphia, declared that the South Jersey colonies had given the impetus to the great Jewish migration from Russia.

Warsaw Jew Presents Plan to Minister to Solve Financial And Unemployment Problems

Would Have Each Polish Citizen, Man and Woman, Donate Gold Wedding Bands to Government Bank

WARSAW — A Warsaw Jew, Herman Rotenberg, has presented to Finance Minister Jan Pilsudski a novel plan for solving Poland's financial and unemployment problems, according to the "Hajnt."

Rotenberg, says the paper, in a communication sent to Minister Pilsudski, suggests that every Polish citizen, man and woman, submit to the government bank his or her golden wedding bands. Those who do not wish to part with their rings, should be called upon to pay money in exchange.

Rotenberg estimates that the gold thus garnered would have a gold value of 250,000,000 zlotys and would enable the government bank to issue 750,000,000 zlotys in bank notes. This money, he proposes, be applied to building houses and credits for agriculture, industry and commerce, and will thus help to solve the unemployment problem in Poland.

New York Rabbis Contribute To New Publication

CINCINNATI, Aug. 23—Rabbis H. G. Enlow and Louis I. Newman, New York, are two of thirteen rabbis whose sermons were chosen this year to make up the Book of Sermons which is published annually by the Tract Commission of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations.

Rabbi Enlow's contribution is entitled "On Yom Kippur Eve," and is intended for the holiday of the Day of Atonement. The title of Rabbi Newman's sermon is "Fear Not the Sentence of Death," and it was intended for the same holiday.

The publication is used throughout the country in small towns where there are no rabbis; in institutions, and among university groups of Jewish students. Services are generally conducted by laymen, and the sermon read from the Sermon Pamphlet.

Hebrew Congregation Convention in Chicago

CINCINNATI, Aug. 23—The Union of American Hebrew Congregations will hold its next Biennial Convention in Chicago in June of 1933, it was announced here today.

The convention will take place at the time of the Century of Progress affair in that city.

The Savannah reform groups who had previously extended an invitation to the Union were consulted and yielded to Chicago.

Systematic Jewish Migration From Cuba; Fear End of Jewish Life There if Tempo Continues

Economic Conditions Preventing Livelihood Responsible for Migration; Strict Regulations Halt Immigration

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

HAVANA, Aug. 23.—Emigration of Jews from Cuba is assuming a systematic form, owing to the difficulties of earning a livelihood as a result of the general economic depression.

At the same time, immigration of Jews to Cuba has shown a marked decrease for the same reason and also because of the stricter regulations applied to the admission of immigrants.

Under the present law, an immigrant must be able to show a capital of \$500 before his entry is assured.

Last week a group of 60 Jews left to return to Europe, the majority of them being Polish Jews. Members of the group had lived in Cuba for about five years.

Fear is expressed lest the present rate of emigration continue which, it is believed, would in a year's period reduce the Jewish population here to such small numbers that no Jewish life would be possible.

Revisionists Here Call for Resistance to British Policy

At a conference of American Zionist Revisionists, held in connection with the forthcoming world congress of the Revisionist Union which opens on August 28th in Vienna, the stand of American Revisionists on a number of questions with which the world conference will deal, was formulated.

Reiterating the Revisionist belief that Britain is not fulfilling the terms of the mandate, the conference went on record as favoring both active and passive resistance to Britain's Palestine policy.

Efforts to increase the membership of the Revisionist body here and the strength of the Revisionist youth movement will be made.

A second conference will be held within a month.

Temple Faces Closing of Its Doors Owing to Money Lack

ELIZABETH, Aug. 23.—Because of the financial difficulties faced by Temple Bnai Israel here, a campaign will be launched under the leadership of Judge Henry S. Waldman to enroll a large number of Jews in the community as seat holders and to register in the Temple's school, hundreds of Jewish children who are receiving no Jewish education whatsoever.

Should the campaign fail of success, the Temple will be compelled to close its doors, it is stated.

The drive is to begin on September 11 and continue until September 18th.

Monsignore Seipel, Though Leader of Professedly Anti-Semitic Party, Maintained Good Relations With the Jews

VIENNA.—The death of Monsignore Seipel, leader of the Christian Socialist Party and former Austrian Premier, serves as the occasion here to recall his attitude toward the Jews.

Although the leader of a professedly anti-Semitic Party, Monsignore Seipel maintained good relations with the Jewish population, and when he was in office as Premier, declared that he regarded himself there as the representative of all citizens irrespective of their religion or race. He also expressed himself several times very sympathetically towards the orthodox Jews organized in the Agudath Israel, especially in regard to the question of Shechita, and when an Agudist delegation visited him on one occasion, headed by the President, Rabbi Dr. Pinchas Kohn, to express anxiety about the anti-Shechita agitation in the country, he assured them that he would never allow the prohibition of what was a religious commandment binding upon observant Jews.

He was well acquainted with the situation in Palestine, and declared his sympathy on several occasions for Zionism. When the Revisionist World Conference was held in Vienna in 1928, he was Prime Minister, and received on that occasion Vladimir Jabotinsky, and in his conversation, showed wide acquaintance with Zionist problems.

In an interview with the Jewish Telegraphic Agency in New York during his American visit, he said:

We are sympathetic towards the Zionist movement and its attempt to restore the Jewish state in Palestine. We hope that as the Zionists succeed and, as soon as a Jewish state will actually come into being, the Jewish question will find that solution and clarification which is in the interest of everybody. This does not mean that we should like all Jews to go to Palestine, but, just as many Germans and Austrians live in the United States and other countries as citizens of those countries, so will the Jews, after the Jewish State is established in Palestine be able to live as citizens of other states.

When Dr. Seipel was Premier in 1927, his Party, the Christian Socialists, published a statement outlining their program for the new year, declaring that the Christian Socialist Party "fights against the domination of the destructive Jewish influence in spiritual and economic life in Austria".

When approached by the J.T.A. representative in Vienna on this subject, Dr. Seipel said: It would be surprising if the Jews of the world were really alarmed because of the issue of this

Says Reception to Prospective Bidjan Settlers Turned Into Anti-Palestine Demonstration

Arab and Jewish Speakers Attack British Policy; Jew Refers to "Fourteen Years of Balfour Swindle"

LONDON, Aug. 23.—The reception accorded Palestine arrivals for settlement in Bira Bidjan was converted into a strong anti-Palestine demonstration, according to the Moscow "Emess" which has just reached London.

The reception was addressed by representatives of the Comzet, the governmental department for settling Jews on the land and in industry and of the Ozet, Jewish colonization society.

A leading speaker was the Arab Communist Aliamarov, says the paper, who stated that Great Britain and the Zionists are torturing the Arabs in Palestine. Aliamarov called for the strengthening of the Communist movement in Palestine.

One of the Palestine settlers group, Herzik, described the situation in Palestine as "fourteen years of the Balfour swindle." He stated that the Arab movement against the Jews and Great Britain is growing.

"We were the first to liberate ourselves from the Zionist swindle and numerous other groups are following us to Soviet Russia," Herzik is quoted as having declared.

and Poland to the United States following 1882. In the course of his address he said that the farmer, deep rooted in the soil, had fared better in the economic struggle, in many instances, than his brethren in the large cities.

Hon. Joseph Perski, city solicitor of Atlantic City, son of one of the 43 original settlers in the colonies, in recounting the early struggles, referred to the fact that "the worst piece of land in New Jersey" had been chosen to start the Jew on an agricultural career in the United States. Only the idealism that actuated the pioneers, could have carried them through, he declared.

Philip R. Strisk and Dr. Goward, of the Jewish Agriculture Society; Jacob H. Perskie, Harry D. Steinberg, Herman Eisenberg and Sigmund Steunberg, of Philadelphia, members of the arrangements committee; Prof. S. Louis Mounier, Vineland, educational director of the colonies for many years; Joseph Greenblatt, Vineland, and Joseph Zager, one of the first settlers, were other speakers at the jubilee banquet. A memorial service for the pioneers who had passed away was held earlier in the day at the Alliance Cemetery.

Gilbert Seldes, author, who was also born at Alliance, where his father was postmaster, sent a letter of greeting to the celebration committee.

A feature of the observance was the issuance of "Yoval," a book commemorating the 50th anniversary. Chief interest centered in an article by Sidney Bailey, Sr., one of the surviving pioneers, on the history of the settlement. Others who are still living include Mrs. Bailey, Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Zager, Mr. and Mrs. William Cohen, Mr. and Mrs. S. Spiegel, Meyer Solunsky and Israel Opachinsky.

Harry D. Steinberg, Philadelphia, was the general Jubilee Committee chairman, and there were representatives in nine cities. Jacob D. Spiegel, president of the New Jersey State Association of Township Committeemen, and Jacob Crystal were the co-chairmen of the reception committee.

program. The Christian Socialist Party, which has existed for decades, and has not changed its program in any material point, is known as an anti-Semitic party. There can, therefore, be no surprise at the fact that its program published now has an anti-Semitic tendency.

But, Dr. Seipel continued, attention must be paid to the manner in which the anti-Semitism of the Christian Socialist Party is expressed in the program. The Party, it declares, is fighting not against the Jews in spiritual and economic life, but only against the domination of destructive Jewish influence. It is felt by the nations of the East of Europe, who are close neighbors of Austria, that in many parts of the world there does exist a dominating destructive Jewish influence, which, although it is not based upon the character of Jewish nationality or of Jewish religion, is probably based on the history of the Jews. The fact that the leaders and propagandists of Russian Bolshevism, as well as of the allied Communism of Germany and Austria and of Austrian Socialism which stands upon the basis of the materialist conception of history and from the point of view of the conservative Christian population is opposed to civilization, are to a large extent Jews, explains sufficiently the anti-Semitic feeling which exists in the minds of the people.

Going on then to speak of his position not as leader of the Party but as the Prime Minister of Austria, Dr. Seipel added that, of course, as Premier and head of the Government, he had nothing to do with the Constitution or the program of the Christian Socialist Party. But since we have a Parliamentary Government, he continued, whose members are selected by Parliament from among the representatives of the political parties, the Premier has not ceased to be a member of his Party. Naturally, he said, he is trying to introduce the principles of the Party, as far as possible, into public life.

But, he concluded, his membership of the Party has never hindered him in his work of maintaining order in the State and assuring equal rights to all the citizens of Austria, without distinction of religious belief. This fact is well known to the Austrian Jews and is respected by them. They have not made any sign that the fact that the head of the Government belongs to the Christian Socialist Party is causing them any anxiety.

In his New York interview with the J.T.A., Monsignore Seipel also referred to this question, saying: Our anti-Semitism is directed against the Jew who does not wish to be known as such rather than the Jew who admits he is a Jew. In fact, we were glad when the Jews elected their own representative, Engineer Stricker, to the Austrian Parliament. In the last election, however, many of the Jewish votes were cast for Jews who sit as Socialist Deputies. See-

understand why I refused to enter a vote upon Papen government. Herr von Papen, your bloody objectivity does not exist for me.

"I am not suited to become the executioner of patriotic fighters for freedom. The verdict was a stupid provocation."

"If they think I will vouch for this they are badly mistaken. Heaven may send us torture upon torture, but our movement will be able to finish this guillotine government."

"Herr von Papen has entered his name into German history with the blood of patriotic fighters. Penalties will not be able to cope with the crop of this deed."

The Nazi chieftain also addressed a personal message to the condemned Nazis declaring:

"My comrades: In view of the monstrous and gory sentence that has been passed upon you, I feel that I am linked to you in unbounded loyalty. From this moment on your freedom is a question of our honor, and a struggle against the government under which this has come to pass is our duty."

The decree which imposed death sentences upon the Nazis became effective just two hours before the five Nazis murdered a Communist workman, Konrad Pietrzuch, in bed at Pottempa, near Buethen.
