CALL TO POGROMS AGAINST JEWS ISSUED BY NAZI LEADER; JEWS ATTACKED IN BRESLAU

Nazis Demonstrating Against Execution Sentence Passed by Beuthen Court Assault Pedestrians, Smash Windows of Jewish Stores; Goebbels Calls on Nazis to Deliver Up Jews to Deserved Punishment; Central Union Says No Panic Among Jews of Beuthen; Bruening Reported in Stuttgart Negotiating for Nazi-Centre Coalition; Jewish Merchant Fined for Defending Self Against Nazis Who Are Acquitted

BRESLAU, Aug. 24 — Demanding work and bread and crying "Death to the Jews!" "Hound the Jewish band from the German Land!" "Down with Bloody Jewish Judges!" Nazi bands marched through the streets of Breslau today in a demonstration against the death sentence imposed upon five Nazi terrorists by the Beuthen special court.

Jewish pedestrians were assaulted and the windows of Jewish stores smashed. Two Jews were knocked down in the Goethestrasse and robbed.

Union of Poale Zion and Zeire Zion Approved by World Conference in Danzig

Program Calls for Intensification of
Zionist Activity; Recognition of
Hebrew and Yiddish

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

DANZIG, Aug. 24—The merger of the world organizations of the Poale Zion and the Zeire Zion was decided upon here today at a joint conference of delegates from both organizations.

A program to be carried out under the unification plan was adopted.

Ben Gurion, Palestine labor leader declared that the course of events in recent times has already effected a unification which the world conference here merely sanctioned.

The unification plan was presented by the head of the Zeire Zion, Tartakower and calls for an intensification of Zionist and Socialist activity.

The program calls for an intensified campaign for the Jewish autonomy and the recognition of Hebrew and Yiddish as the two languages of the Jewish people in all countries of the world where they reside. Hebrew, the program says, must be recognized as the

Jew Fined for Defense Against Nazis

BERLIN, Aug. 24—A Jewish merchant, Ger, residing in Schweidnitz, Silesia, who was seriously injured by the Nazis, was fined by the court today because he brought a knuckle duster into self defense.

The Nazi terrorists were acquitted. Ger had been repeatedly threatened by the Nazis, who finally carried out their threats with the result that Ger sustained a serious kidney injury.

The windows of a Jewish firm, named Bloch, in Saalfeld, East Prussia, were smashed today by unknown vandals.

At the same time it became known that a Yiddish daily called "Morgen Blaetter" will make its appearance in September under the direction of Zalman Schneuer and others.

Jews, Panic-Stricken, Begin to Evacuate Polish Town Following Riot

Riot Started When Stone Hit Banner
of Religious Procession; Jews
Charge Deliberate Provocation

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

WARSAW, Aug. 24 — A panic-stricken Jewish population sought to evacuate the town of Olszany following a riot which ensued when a stone hit a banner of a religious procession as it was passing through the Jewish quarter, it is revealed here today.

The Christian religious procession was held in the town with the participation of peasants from neighboring villages. When a stone hit a Sacred Heart banner, the cry was raised that it was thrown from the house of a Jew, Isaac Kopelovitch.

Hundreds of participants rushed upon the house, smashing doors and windows and creating such a panic among the Jewish community that they began to evacuate the town.

Tunisian Jewish Organ Appeals to Herriot to Protect Jews in Tunisia

Complains French Authorities, Particularly French Resident, Manceron,
Display No Haste in Prevention

TUNIS, Aug. 24—An open letter to Premier Eduard Herriot of France, as the head of the government in Tunisia, calling upon him to come to the defense of the Jewish people and prevent further excesses, is published by the "Reveil Juif," Tunisian Jewish paper.

The paper appeals to Premier Herriot, as a frequent sympathizer with the Jewish people, and refers to the disturbances recurrent recently in Tunisia, frequently assuming serious form.

The paper complains that the French authorities, particularly the French Resident, General Manceron, are displaying no haste in efforts to prevent outbreaks against the Jews by the Arabs.

Tunisia, says the paper pointedly, is a French protectorate and not a German one, and the protection of the lives of the Jews is therefore awaited.

Rumors Current Wulfin

**Sentence to Be Commuted;
Slight Penalty Imposed**

**Point to Postponement of Hearing
Until Date When New Penal Code
Lessening Sentences Is Effective**

WARSAW, Aug. 24—Rumors are current here today that Shmuel Wulfin, Vilna Jewish student sentenced to two years imprisonment on charges of having participated in the events leading to the death of a Christian student killed in the anti-Semitic riots last November, will have his sentence commuted and receive a minor penalty.

An appeal against the Wulfin verdict, scheduled to be heard on August 26th has been postponed until September 1st.

It is pointed out in this connection that the date of the new hearing coincides with the entry into force of a new penal code under which the maximum sentence for Wulfin's offense is six months imprisonment.

scene succeeded in quelling the riot and restoring a semblance of calm.

The Polish papers suggest the stone was thrown by a Communist atheist, but the Jews believe that the stone was deliberately thrown in order to provoke riots against them.

This viewpoint is supported by the revelation made in the pro-government paper, "Slovo," which in an article devoted to the situation in Olszan, states that persistent efforts were made to compel Kopelovitch to give up his house adjoining a church.

The ostensible reason for the efforts to expel him was that he disturbed the services.

The efforts to invoke the aid of the authorities in the expulsion of Kopelovitch failed, while efforts to raise a sum sufficient to purchase the house also fell short of success. This is at the bottom of the attack, asserts the "Slovo."

Nazis Succeed in Compelling Ouster of Professor Gumbel, Noted Jewish Pacifist

**Nazis Had Long Trained Battle Against
Gumbel for Exposure of Nazi
Terrorism and Militarism**

HEIDELBERG, Aug. 24 — Adolph Hitler's National Socialists brought to a successful close yesterday a long battle against Professor Emil J. Gumbel, prominent pacifist, against whom its anger was directed because he is a Jew.

Professor Gumbel, an authority on political economy, was named professor extraordinary at the University of Heidelberg by the Socialist Ministry of Baden in 1930. Through the period of his affiliation with the university he has been the target of attack by the Nazis and Nazi student demonstrations were frequent against him.

Professor Gumbel, in a number of books written after the war, compiled extensive data to show how the National Socialists abused and even murdered their political opponents, notably the republicans, and escaped punishment.

The order of ouster was issued by the Minister of Education of Baden, complying with the request of the Senate and Philosophical Faculty of Heidelberg, which conducted an investigation into his political utterances.

Professor Gumbel is also responsible for the exposing of the organizing of semi-secret National military organizations.

A Nazi deputy speaking at a meeting of the Nazi students at the Heidelberg Town Hall as recently as this summer, just before the July 31st Reichstag elections, exclaimed: "Let us see to it that on July 31, the foundation stone of a German state is laid in which Gumbel shall be no more. The Gumbel can be buried and not lilies but turnips shall be planted on his grave."

Professor Gumbel's views against war have a warm adherent in Professor Albert Einstein.

Arab Gets Death for Murder of Wife of Official

JERUSALEM, Aug. 24—The Arab fellah responsible for the murder of Mrs. Thomas Miller, wife of an engineer occupying an important post in the public works department, was sentenced to death.

An Arab accomplice received a sentence of five years imprisonment.

Mrs. Miller was killed and her husband wounded in the middle of the night of July 1st.

**Outward Calm in Sfax But Police and
Troops Still on Duty**

PARIS—Although calm prevails outwardly now in Sfax, in Tunisia, where serious anti-Jewish outbreaks took place recently, both police and troops are still kept in readiness to prevent renewed trouble, in view of the extreme tension which continues to exist in the attitude of the Arabs towards the Jewish population, and alarming rumors are spreading.

Clashes keep breaking out in the market place. The Grand Rabbi of Sfax has been insulted by an Arab, who went by shouting: "Jews are burning down the Moslem Mosques in Russia."

A Jewish doctor has been accused of having poisoned an Arab patient who died, and the situation created by this allegation became so serious that the authorities were compelled to order an investigation, as a result of which it has been officially established that death was due to natural causes.

The Sfax Arab Tribunal has sentenced several Arabs who were caught red-handed taking part in the disturbances to the minimum terms of punishment allowed by the law, ranging from a few days to three months' imprisonment, while two Jews, Eli Amira and Salomon Berrihi, who took part in the self-defense, have been sentenced to one month's imprisonment and ordered to pay the cost of the damage done in the fighting, in which they were concerned. All sections of the Jewish population are united in protesting against these sentences.

"L'Oeuvre" states that it has learned that shortly before the outbreak, thirty Palestine Arabs arrived in Tunis, who, no doubt, were largely responsible for stirring up the trouble.

The J.T.A. here also learns that rumors of anti-Jewish outbreaks being prepared were in circulation in Sfax several days before the outbreak and that Arab workers who are employed by Jews showed extreme reluctance to come to work.

The "Reveil Juif," published in Tunisia, which has reached here, declares:

"Calm is gradually being re-established in Sfax, and the village is once more assuming its peaceful appearance. Nevertheless, the inhabitants remain uneasy, for, if it is true that there are no more serious clashes, it is nonetheless true that incidents have not ceased altogether. The people were first excited by the story of a poisoning, agitators, according to their wont, having accused a Jewish doctor of having poisoned one of his patients. The authorities ordered a post-mortem by French doctors, but, although the

French Ministry of Interior Upholds Deportation of Three Jewish Students

**Upholds Decision Against Three Jewish
Students Who Demonstrated Against
Anti-Semitic Polish Professor**

PARIS, Aug. 24—The Ministry of Interior today upheld the deportation of three Jewish students of Nancy University for demonstrating against a visiting Polish professor, Dr. Loth, notorious as an anti-Semite.

The deportation order was issued on June 16th but it was hoped that it would be cancelled when Premier Eduard Herriot assumed office.

Two of the deported students have gone to Belgium to continue their medical studies, while the third, Scharf, leader of the demonstration against Professor Loth, is now in Paris, seeking facilities to migrate to Palestine.

It is believed that the expulsion order was issued at the instance of the Polish Embassy.

New York Rabbis Mediators In Kashruth Controversy

TORONTO, Aug. 24—Rabbi Israel Rosenberg, Rabbi Joseph Kanowitz and Rabbi A. Peffer, all of New York, and affiliated with the Union of Orthodox Rabbis have been invited to come to Toronto to act as mediators in the Kashruth controversy between the Jewish Community and the Abattoirs.

The matter had reached such a stage that it was sent to the courts for settlement. Judge Tyler, who presided in the case, suggested that the matter be referred to the Union of Orthodox Rabbis for solution.

source that Dr. Heinrich Brüning, former German Chancellor and leader of the Centre Party has interrupted his vacation and has arrived in Stuttgart to confer with Nazi spokesmen regarding a possible Nazi-Centre coalition.

The negotiations, it is learned, are being carried on with the participation of the director of the Centre Party, Grasz and the Nazi leaders, Gregor Strasser and the Nazi President of the Prussian Parliament Kerl.

The negotiations apply to a coalition both in the leadership of the Reich and in Prussia.

Kerl, it is stated, sent a courier to Munich to obtain instructions from Adolph Hitler, Nazi chieftain.

BERLIN, Aug. 24.—Well-informed political circles state today that the negotiations are favorable to the appointment of Minister of Defense General Kurt von Schleicher as Chancellor with the Nazi leaders Gregor Strasser or Dr. Wilhelm Frick, former Thuringian Minister of Education, as Minister of Interior.

Whether Dr. Heinrich Brüning, former German Chancellor and at that time vigorous opponent of the Nazis, will accept the portfolio of Foreign Minister, is still uncertain.

The headquarters of the Centre party state that Nazi leaders will not insist upon the deprivation of the rights of the Jews, since constitutional changes would require the sanction of two thirds of the membership of the Reichstag.

The Centre headquarters insist that its leaders are determined not to permit religious discrimination.

In the face of the assurances given by President Paul von Hindenburg to the Central Union of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith that he would not permit any infringement upon the rights of the Jews and this statement by the Centre party that it would oppose discrimination, the Nazis are reiterating their insistent demands that Jews be dismissed from official posts and that they be displaced from their economic fields as well.

BERLIN, Aug. 24.—While Beuthen, where sentence of death was passed on five Nazi terrorists, is quiet and Adolph Hitler is heaping invective and defiance upon the von Papen regime, the government yesterday issued a manifesto making it clear that it will use armed forces against any party resisting its decrees.

The manifesto asserts that the death decree, issued to curb the terrorists, will be applied impartially and that its application will not be deterred by threats against the government.

"The government will, if necessary,

employ all the resources of the state in order to carry out the measures of the law on a non-partisan basis, and will not permit any party to flaunt its decrees," says the manifesto.

"The passionate reproaches which have been publicly raised against these sentences should be directed against the authors of the bloody deeds and not against the state authorities which must take sharp measures in the interests of the common welfare. The government will know how to meet any attempt to falsify the principles of the state law and to incite political passions to renewed excesses."

This is the government's reply to the challenge of the Nazis and their threats that "there will be no quiet in Germany until the Beuthen judgment has been annulled. May those who are responsible for the conduct of the government realize the seriousness of the hour before it is too late."

The government's manifesto is met by Adolph Hitler with a second proclamation in which he justified his refusal to enter the cabinet and threatened the end of the present regime.

The Hitler declaration says: "My German comrades, those of you who have a flair for battle for honor and liberty of the nation will understand how and why I have refused to enter this bourgeois government. Justice Herr von Papen will condemn thousands of National Socialists to death. Did they think to cover this provocative procedure with my name? The gentlemen deceived themselves.

"Herr von Papen, your bloody objective I now perceive. I desire victory for national Germany and the extermination of its Marxist destroyers, but I will never be the executioner of fighters for the national liberty of the German people. With this deed, our attitude toward this 'national cabinet' is defined. Heaven may send us torture after torture, but our movement in the end will finish this government of hangmen."

Jews of Beuthen Not Panic-Stricken

BERLIN, Aug. 24.—The Jews of Beuthen are not panic-stricken, despite the Nazi agitation and the Nazi attacks which followed the death sentence imposed upon five Nazis for the murder of a workman, the Central Union of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith, informed the Jewish Telegraphic Agency today.

The Central Union states that while one Jewish trader was beaten up, a number of Jewish pedestrians were abused and the windows of the Jewish firm of Salow Wolfsohn smashed, the Nazi ire is directed chiefly against the Left wing press.

power to ease the situation. In addition a band of well-known Jews and Arabs, who will undertake some piece of common work, has been formed.

"On Wednesday the Driba Tribunal considered the Sfax disturbances. The rioters were sentenced from anything from 10 to 16 days imprisonment, and 13 were acquitted. As a typical example, one of the aggressors of the aged Rabbi Yossef Cohen, was sentenced to 10 days imprisonment. The Jews, on the other hand, seem to have been well attended to. Elie Amira, a young hairdresser, was condemned to one month's imprisonment for having defended himself when attacked, in spite of a fine defense put up on his behalf by Mathieu Ganem. A second Jew, Mouni Berrebi, also arrested for having defended himself, denied the facts altogether. A third, Elie Ankri, who was accused of having defended his life and goods with a revolver, is having his case considered further.

"The decision of the court has profoundly moved the Jews of Sfax. It is, in short, the condemnation of any legitimate defense. It is to be hoped that the young Amira will appeal to Tunis."

Maurice Bernstein, who came to America as a small boy from Russia, sold newspapers, and finally became known as the "fish grocer" of San Francisco, died after a brief illness at the age of 46 years.

He served dinners to thousands. He was prominent in the B'nai B'rith.

Samuel Stone of Yonkers, N. Y., former president of Temple Emanu-El, is dead of a heart attack at the age of 55.
