Einstein's stay in the United States for a period of five months only, leaving him free to spend the rest of the year Professor Einstein, despite his em-

"There is no question that I am a pacifist. The war made me that. And I am decidedly an anti-Fascist. I am the welfare of the working class. I consider the republic is in danger from Fascism. If Hitler ever comes into power, there will be a terrible slaugh-ter," Professor Gumbel predicted.
