## NAZI ORGAN MARKS SELECTION OF NOTORIOUS ANTI-SEMITIC TO REICHSTAG PRESIDENCY BY NEW POGROM INCITEMENT

**Captain Herman Goering, One of Hitler's Principal Aides, Gets Reichstag Presidency; Is First Nazi Ever to Hold This Post; Known for the Virulence of His Attitude Toward Jews; Jewish Leaders Indignant That Organ Is Permitted to Replace Suspended "Angriff"; Charge von Papen Government With Timidity**

BERLIN, Aug. 31—The "National Post" which replaced the suspended Nazi organ "Der Angriff" today celebrates yesterday's election of the Nazi leader and notorious anti-Semite, Captain Herman Goering, to the presidency of the Reichstag, by issuing a new appeal to the Nazis to make a quick end of the Jews.

"Der Angriff" was suspended last week because of its attack on Chancellor Franz von Papen. The fact that the same issue carried a call to Nazis to conduct a pogrom against the Jews was ignored in the suspension order.

The "National Post" today alleges that a Jewish Communist, Siegfried Caro, participated in the events leading to the death of a Nazi, Schroeder, and that he instigated attacks upon other Hitler Storm Troopers. This, the paper charges, "demonstrates the brutality of the Jewish race and the righteousness of our fight against these alien scamps whose hours, we hope, are numbered."

Contributors to the "Berliner Tageblatt" and the "Vossische Zeitung," as well as to the Jewish press are characterized as swine who condescend to their synagogues.

A Jewish writer, Alexander Gergely, who took his own life, because he was starving, committed suicide, according to the Nazi organ, because he was dis-

gusted with his own swinishness, and offers a good example to the remainder of the Jews.

Jewish leaders are indignant that the police department is permitting the "National Post" to continue the pogrom incitement inaugurated by the "Angriff".

They declare that the "National Post" has adopted its present attitude because "Der Angriff" suspension order related not to its pogrom agitation but only to the insults heaped upon the German Chancellor.

Jewish leaders deplore the timidity of the von Papen government and believe that it is hesitant about adopting a more militant attitude lest it be accused by the Nazis of protecting the Jews.

## Break Up Revisionist Session At Three in Morning When Tumult Arouses Neighborhood

**Excitement Precipitated by Lichtheim  
Letter Asking Rejection of  
Calais Agreement**

VIENNA, Aug. 31—The police department broke up the session of the congress of the World Union of Zionist Revisionists at three o'clock this morning upon the complaint of residents in the district of the convention hall.

The intervention of the police followed tumultuous scenes lasting one hour precipitated in the course of the general debate, particularly on the question of the ratification of the Calais agreement.

The excitement started when Meier Grossman, vice-president of the Revisionist Union, read a communication from Robert Lichtheim, Berlin Revisionist, calling upon the conference to set aside the Calais agreement which leaves to the discretion of individual Revisionists whether or not to pay the

## Roumanian Premier Promises Far Reaching Measures to Meet Demands of Jewish Deputies

**Pledges Relief in Matter of Staatenlose; Compulsory Sunday Closing Law; Kehiloth Law; Subsidies**

BUCHAREST, Aug. 31 — Premier Alexander Vaida Voedov today promised a delegation representing the Jewish Party in the Roumanian Parliament that his government would in the fall undertake far-reaching measures to meet the Jewish demands regarding the status of the Jewish "Staatenlose," the organization of the Jewish Communities; subsidies for the Kehiloth; and alleviation of the distress caused by the Sunday Closing law.

The pledge was given by the Roumanian Premier following representations of the group which included Deputies Meyer Ebner, Josef Fischer, Michael Landau and Marton.

An amendment to the citizenship law will be enacted in the fall in order to end the abnormal position of the Jewish "Staatenlose," Premier Vaida Voedov promised.

An amendment to the present Jewish Communities law, against which Roumanian Jewry is united in opposition, will also be adopted, he said. The amendment will permit the organization of autonomous Jewish communities.

Told of the failure of the government to make payment of the subsidies promised to the Kehiloth, the Premier stated that regular monthly payments would be made of the 1932 subsidies.

He agreed also to alleviate the Sunday closing law in favor of Jewish artisans who really observe the Sabbath.

While the government's financial position prevents the opening of a Jewish Teachers' Seminary, Premier Vaida Voedov stated that the rights of Jew-

## Typhoid Fever Takes Toll Among Jewish Poor in Warsaw

WARSAW, Aug. 31—Typhoid fever is making alarming inroads among the poor sections of the Jewish community, here, it was learned today.

Several deaths from typhoid fever are reported daily and the alarming spread of the disease is laid to the door of the mounting poverty and the general hunger from which the poorer section of the Jewish population suffers.

## Livelihood of Jewish Artisans In Poland Imperilled

WARSAW, Aug. 31—The livelihood of Jewish artisans who own their work-shops and of those who desire to open work places of their own is threatened by the approaching expiration of the prolongation granted artisans who do not possess guild diplomas, it was indicated here today.

The prolongation period expires on December 15, 1932. As a result hundreds of Jewish artisans face the closing of their shops while Jewish artisans will not be permitted to open new shops unless they are able to show a guild diploma.

Herschorn First Jew Named To  
Swimming Federation Executive

He is prominently identified with Jewish activity in Montreal.

shelke to the World Zionist Organization.

Robert Lichtheim has been the target of attack on the part of the Palestine delegation, who have persistently demanded his resignation from the Executive of the Revisionist Union as well as from the Actions Committee as a Revisionist representative.

Jewish War Veterans  
Convention in Atlantic City

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., Aug. 31—Jewish war veterans from all parts of the nation will convene here from September 2nd to the 5th for the eleventh annual encampment of the Jewish War Veterans of the United States.

About 1,500 delegates are expected and addresses will be delivered by a number of leading public officials. A George Washington Bicentennial military ball also will be a feature of the occasion. J. George Fredman, of Jersey City, heads the convention committee and Louis Weiss, of Newark, clerk of the N. J. House of Assembly, is secretary. It is announced that Col. Isaac De Costa, 89, of this city, will be the oldest member of the organization, attending the sessions. He is a Civil War veteran.

Jew Gets State Legion  
Post As Chaplain

HOT SPRINGS, Aug. 31—Rabbi David B. Alpert of Texarkana, Arkansas—Texas, was elected by acclamation to the state chaplaincy of the Arkansas American Legion, the first Jew to hold that office in Arkansas, at the annual convention held at Hot Springs.

Building Activity in  
Palestine in 1931 Showed  
11 Per Cent Increase Over 1930

Building activity in the municipal areas of Palestine during 1931 showed an increase of more than 11% over the previous year, according to a report just received from Rehabiah Lewin-Epstein, director of the Tel-Aviv Bureau of the American Economic Committee for Palestine. A total of 5,002 permits were issued during 1931 for buildings of an approximate value of £2,720,678 as compared with 5,052 permits in 1930 valued at £2,448,670.

The principal sources of the increase were Tel-Aviv, Jerusalem and Haifa. Tel-Aviv erected 1,095 buildings valued at £310,000 in 1931 as compared with 705 buildings valued at £175,000 in 1930. In Jerusalem 849 buildings valued at £1,948,170 were constructed in 1931. In Haifa the sum of £213,000 was invested in buildings in 1931, an increase of £20,500 over the previous year. Among the more important buildings which were completed in Haifa last year are that of the Law Courts. Large apartment houses of 3 and 4 stories are now under construction in Haifa.

While figures for 1932 construction in Jerusalem and Haifa are not yet available, Mr. Lewin-Epstein reports that during the first six months of this year a total of 476 permits were issued in Tel-Aviv for buildings of an estimated valuation of £190,000, or at a rate of £380,000 per annum, which is far in excess of 1931, the previous record year. Tel-Aviv is the only all-Jewish city in the world. Although it was founded less than twenty-five years ago on what was then regarded as sandy waste land, it now has a population of over 50,000 and is growing very rapidly.

The increase in building activity in Palestine becomes especially notable when compared with the investments in buildings erected in other years, to wit: £1,741,687 in 1929, £692,462 in 1928, and £770,064 in 1927.

Emma Wolf, Jewish  
Authoress Dies At 67

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 31—Emma Wolf, widely known California Jewish authoress died here today at the age of sixty-seven.

Although an invalid for the past fifteen years, Miss Wolf did not relinquish her literary labors.

She was a native of this city having been born here on June 15, 1865. She was the author of "Other Things Being Equal" and other books.

Samuel Freedman, president of The Sons of Israel Synagogue of Albany, announced that the congregation had unanimously extended a call to Rabbi Abraham Simon to its pulpit and that he had accepted.

Rabbi Simon, an honor graduate of the Jewish Theological Seminary of this year's class, will begin his term of office next week. He is the first graduate of the Seminary to be elected to a post in the capital city of the Empire State.

# **Cardinal Van Rossum, Catholic Prelate Sympathetic To Zionist Aims Dies in Rome**

**Declared Catholic Church Opposed to  
Anti-Semitism; Apprehensions Re-  
garding Holy Places Allayed**

ROME, Aug. 31.—Cardinal Van Rossum, influential Catholic prelate, sympathetic to the work of rebuilding of the Jewish National Home, died here today.

In an interview with a representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency in 1926, Cardinal Van Rossum made it known that the Catholic Church has no apprehensions regarding the status of the Holy Places in Palestine as a result of Zionism and that it regards the rebuilding of the Jewish National Homeland "as the fulfillment of God's promises to His Chosen People."

"The Church," he asserted, "condemns anti-Semitism most severely and with the whole force of its authority. Especially does the Church desire that its voice of love to all peoples should be made heard now after the war, when so many prejudices and seeds of hatred and persecution are spread against the Jews."

"I want to emphasize," he stated, "that any attempt to disturb the peace, the dignity and security of existence of the Jewish people, will never be supported by the Church, because it is contrary to its spirit and mission."

The Catholic religion, he said, has three principles in common with the Jewish religion and cited them as "belief in one God; in the immortality of the soul and in purification by punishment for sin."

"Christians," the Cardinal stated, "have to thank the Jews for their greatest spirits, for their apostles, for St. Paul, St. Peter and Christ himself. This alone is sufficient reason why Christians should respect and appreciate the people of Israel for what they have done and deserved."

Discussing the rehabilitation of Palestine, the Cardinal stated: "The efforts of the Jewish people to revive its land which has been neglected for generations are being watched by the Church with benevolence as the fulfillment of God's promises to His Chosen People."

"Naturally, other religions, and especially the Catholic religion which has in Palestine its Holy Places and traditions must be properly respected. Many of the apprehensions which were felt of late years in this respect have now disappeared and the Catholic Church looks with full sureness upon the development of common relations for the future," was the viewpoint expressed by Cardinal Van Rossum.

Max Rubin, president of the Jacksonville Jewish Center, has announced that Rabbi Morris Margolis of Detroit, Mich., had accepted the pulpit of that congregation and will start his term of service on September 1st. Rabbi Margolis is a graduate of the Jewish Theological Seminary, class of 1932.

## **J. D. B. NEWS LETTER**

**Two Noted German Jews, Professor  
Willstaetter and Professor Sobernheim  
Mark 60th Anniversary**

BERLIN.—Two noted German Jews, specialists in unrelated fields recently celebrated their 60th birthdays. They are Privy Councillor, Professor Richard Willstaetter, famous chemist and Nobel Prize winner and Legation Councillor, Professor Moritz Sobernheim, famous Orientalist and Rapporteur on Jewish political affairs in the Ministry for Foreign Affairs.

Professor Willstaetter, who was born on August 13th, 1872 at Karlsruhe, in Baden, received the Nobel Prize in 1915 for his researches in the chemistry of chlorophyll. "It is no exaggeration to say," an authority has written, "that with the possible exception of Fischer's work on the chemistry of proteins, Willstaetter's chlorophyll researches belong to the very best work in the whole domain of organic chemistry. Today he is easily the foremost organic chemist in Germany. Willstaetter has done much pioneering work on the chemistry of the plant alkaloids, on the blood pigment, and on the plant pigments. His work is an excellent example of the application of chemistry to the elucidation of botanical and physiological problems."

At the age of 24, Professor Willstaetter was appointed Lecturer at Munich University, where he afterwards, in 1915 — the same year that he was awarded the Nobel Prize, became Ordinary Professor in Chemistry in succession to his teacher, Adolph von Bayer, a position that had previously been held by the great Liebig. In between he had been—in 1905—Ordinary Professor at the Technical High School in Zurich and—in 1912—Professor at Berlin University and Director of the newly-created Kaiser Wilhelm Chemical Institute in Dahlem-Berlin.

In 1925, the anti-Semitic students at Munich University started disturbances, demanding Professor Willstaetter's removal because they refused to sit at the feet of a Jew. Professor Willstaetter promptly resigned, in spite of the unanimous insistence of the Munich University authorities that he should remain.

We have been proud, the Rector of Munich University wrote to him at the time in his official capacity on behalf of the Senate, to number so internationally famous a figure among us, and we shall never forget how you have always devoted your genius to serving your fatherland, and during the war by your discovery of methods of utilizing chemistry for the protection of our troops and for the extension of the sources of food supply for our people at home you won for German science

# **204 of 231 Jewish Migrants Desert Bidjan; 764 New Arrivals in August**

**Unfriendliness of Local Administration  
and Lack of Food Blamed;  
"Emess" Asks Measures**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

MOSCOW, Aug. 31.—Of 231 Jews who arrived in Bira Bidjan for the purpose of finding places in the Tu-guisk Timber Factory, only twenty-seven have remained. The others left the region owing to the unfriendliness of the local administration and the lack of food, the "Emess," Yiddish Communist daily here reports today.

The paper demands measures be taken to cope with these developments.

Simultaneously it became known that the Comzet, governmental department for settling Jews on the land and in industry, has received a telegraphic communication from Bira-Bidjan stating that 764 new Jewish settlers, including 11 from abroad, arrived, during the month of August, in Bira-Bidjan where an autonomous Jewish region is to be established.

The situation in the Far Eastern Region, says this communication, remains unsatisfactory as far as food and shelter are concerned, and the approaching rainy season make the prospectives even more difficult.

Professor Willstaetter is the holder of many foreign honors, including an honorary doctorate of Oxford University.

He takes an active interest in Jewish affairs and belongs to the Liberal Jewish movement. He was one of the speakers at the 1930 Conference of the World Union for Progressive Judaism, which was held in London, when he took as his subject "Jews in the Modern World."

Mankind, he said, has a deep longing for something higher, nobler, for eternal values. I look to Judaism to oppose the exaggeration of material interests and of sport, and to work for ethical values. We need better bridges and connections than technical knowledge can construct if we are to overcome divergencies and boundaries of countries and oceans; let us seek them in the works of art and science, in ethics and religion.

## **Professor Sobernheim**

Professor Sobernheim, who was born in Berlin on August 13th, 1872, holds high office in the Ministry for Foreign Affairs, where he is Rapporteur on Jewish political affairs. He is also a famous Orientalist, being secretary of the Near Asia Egyptian Society and an outstanding authority on Semitic Epigraphy. He was a member of the Baalbek Expedition of the Prussian Government, and has made many visits to Palestine and Syria on behalf of the

## Nazi Organ Marks Selection of Goering As Reichstag President By New Pogrom Incitement

Goering, one of Adolph Hitler's principal aides, notorious for the virulence of his anti-Semitic preachments, was chosen president of the Reichstag, at its opening session yesterday afternoon receiving 367 votes of the 582 votes cast.

Captain Goering's name was placed before the Reichstag for the post of president by a member of the Centre Party. This is regarded as significant of the agreement between the Nazis and the Centrists for a working coalition.

Captain Goering set forth his views regarding the attitude of the Nazis toward the Jews in an interview given to a representative of the "Gazetta del Popolo" of Turin as recently as the end of last May.

At that time he made it clear that the Nazis would tolerate no equality rights for the Jews whom he charged with being a "disruptive and poisonous element which has brought harm to the German people."

Although he denied that the Nazis plan to murder the Jews, when they come into power, he emphasized that the Jews would be suffered to remain in the country as aliens only.

"The Jewish question is not fundamentally for us a theoretical question," he stated at the time. "Nazism defends itself against the Jews. It does not persecute them. We defend ourselves against Jewry, not against the Jewish religion. In the Third Regime, religious liberty will be complete for all confessions which do not conflict with the customs and moral feelings of the Germanic race."

"It would be ridiculous to allege that we seek to persecute the Mosaic religion, which leaves us quite indifferent," he asserted. "We are defending ourselves against an element that is alien to our race, against a disruptive and poisonous element which has brought harm to the German people."

Continuing his tirade against the Jews, Captain Goering said: "For a very long time, but especially since the end of the war, during the post war period, Berlin has become the centre of attraction for all Galician and Russian Jews. They have come here in hordes, with their lice and their cafans, possessed of nothing save an insatiable desire for acquisition. Berlin has become the filter of this mob. After a few months here they learn how to dress in European fashion, to speak German and even to take baths. Most of them have done well here and some have even become rich. They have left the East Side and gone to live in the West, and more than one who arrived at the Schlesische Railway Station in Berlin wearing his cafan left after a few months via the Zoo Railway Station for London, Paris, or America, transformed into a European, shaved and scented. But for every one who leaves,

ish teachers already in the profession will not be infringed upon and that matriculated Jews will be enabled to acquire teachers' diplomas upon the completion of extension courses.

An end will be put to the persecution of Zionist youth by local administrations, the Premier also promised.

The Jewish delegation pointed to the discrepancy between the burden of taxation placed upon the towns and that imposed upon the villages and submitted a memorandum outlining the difficulty of the economic position of the Jews, mostly town inhabitants, as a result of this discrepancy.

The Premier stated that he would arrange for further discussion of the economic question in the presence of the Ministers responsible for the situation.

The Jewish Deputies stated that the reception accorded them by the Premier was cordial.

ten remain behind, and most of those who remain are the dregs who have not passed through the filter.

"The Third Regime," he promised, "will enact legislation to prevent all further immigration into Germany from Poland, Russia or any other country in the world. Those Jews who have immigrated into Germany since August 2nd, 1914, will be expelled. All the Jews who have in any way insulted the German nation will be taken to the frontier or they will be punished here according to the law for the crimes of which they are convicted."

"All those Jews who have not immigrated into Germany from abroad will be left here, but they will be removed from all public positions, in the press, the theatre, the film, the school and the Universities. We shall also dismiss them from all public offices, cancel all their honors, and remove them from every position in which they may be able to exert their disruptive anti-national, international or at best bi-national influence to the hurt of the German people."

"It has been said that we shall kill the Jews. That is untrue. The decent Israelite merchant who wants to remain in Germany as an alien, under the protection of the alien laws, will be able to continue to pursue his business unhindered and will come to no harm."

Deprivation of citizenship for all those who marry Jews or Jewesses was promised by Goering.

"The aim of the Hitlerist movement," he asserted, "is to revive German national life. The Nazi regime will allow no alliance between Germans and people belonging to the black and yellow races, nor between Germans and Jews. German citizens, men or women, who marry Jews or Jewesses, will automatically forfeit their citizenship rights in the German State."

Institut Francais d'Archeologie Orientale. He has published a number of books on the people of Tripoli, Baalbek, Palmyria and Samaria.

Professor Sobernheim has held his office as a Councillor of Legation in the German Foreign Office, and Rapporteur on Jewish political matters since 1918.

He is a grandson of City Councillor Magnus, who was for many years a leading member of the Board of the Jewish Community of Berlin, and a stepson of Consul-General Dr. Eugen Landau, the famous industrialist, who is Vice-President of the Hilfsverein der deutschen Juden, and who recently celebrated his 80th birthday. Dr. Walter Sobernheim, the big industrialist, and Dr. Kurt Sobernheim, the financier, are brothers.

Since 1924, Professor Sobernheim has been President of the German Federation of Israelite Communities, which was organized in 1872. Under his leadership the Federation's principal aim is to bring about the formation of the projected All-German Federation of Jewish Communities, which is now on the verge of formation.

As President of the Society for Promoting the Science of Judaism, he has rendered many important achievements in the field of Jewish science and of Jewish scientific publications.

He is a member of the Board of the Jewish Colonization Association Ezra, and he is a member of the Presidium of the Pro-Palestine Committee in Germany.

He is also one of the founders and the Chairman of the Religious Centre Party in the Jewish Community.

## Singer, Prominent Polish Jewish Writer Arrives in United States
