NAZI ORGAN MARKS SELECTION OF NOTORIOUS ANTI-SEMITE TO REICHSTAG PRESIDENCY BY NEW POGROM INCITEMENT

Captain Herman Goering, One of Hitler's Principal Aides, Gets Reichstag Presidency; Is First Nazi Ever to Hold This Post; Known for the Virulence of His Attitude Toward Jews; Jewish Leaders Indignant That Organ Is Permitted to Replace Suspended "Angriff"; Charge von Papen Government With Timidity

Nazi organ "Der Angriff" today celebrates yesterday's election of the Nazi leader and notorious anti-Semite, Captain Herman Goering, to the presidency of the Reichstag, by issuing a new appeal to the Nazis to make a quick end of the Jews.

"Der Angriff" was suspended last week because of its attack on Chancellor Franz von Papen. The fact that the same issue carried a call to Nazis to conduct a pogrom against the Jews was

ignored in the suspension order.

The "National Post" today alleges that a Jewish Communist, Siegbert Caro, participated in the events leading that he instigated attacks opon other Hitler Storm Troopers. This, the paper charges, "demonstrates the brutality of the Jewish race and the righteousness of our fight against these alien scamps whose hours, we hope, are numbered."

Building Activity in Palestine in 1931 Showed

11 Per Cent Increase Over 1930 Building activity in the municipal areas of Palestine during 1931 showed an increase of more than 11% over the previous year, according to a report just received from Rehabiah Lewin-Epstein, director of the Tel-Aviv Bureau of the American Economic Committee for Palestine. A total of 5,002 permits were issued during 1931 for buildings of an approximate value of £2,720,678 as compared with 5,052 permits in 1930 valued at £2,448,670.

The principal sources of the increase were Tel-Aviv, Jerusalem and Haifa. Tel-Aviv erected 1,095 buildings valued at £310,000 in 1931 as compared with In Jerusalem 849 buildings valued at £1.948,170 were constructed in 1931. Tel-Aviv is the only all-Jewish city in the world. Although it was founded less than twenty-five years ago on what was then regarded as sandy waste land, it now has a population of over 50,000 and is growing very ra-
