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Protest Numerus Clausus in Latvian Medical School; One Jew Admitted of 39 Applicants

Ten Jewish Applicants Have Medical Diplomas from Foreign Universities

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

RIGA, Sept. 6.—Of thirty-nine Jewish students who applied for matriculation in the medical school of the University of Latvia, only one was admitted, it is learned today.

In contrast, 53 non-Jewish students were enrolled in the medical school. Among the 38 Jewish students rejected are ten Jews who received medical diplomas in universities abroad and who were willing to take the full medical course again in order to be able to practice medicine in their native lands.

New regulations have recently been advanced restricting the practice of medicine to those who are graduates of Latvian medical institutions.

The mass rejection of Jews by medical and other professional institutions is arousing great indignation in Jewish circles which protest against the virtual numerus clausus.

The stringencies applied to admissions to the medical schools are less harsh in other faculties where a larger number of Jewish applicants have been admitted.

Vilna Court of Appeal Reduces Sentences of Five Jewish Youths to Forty-five Days

Were Sentenced to Prison Terms of From 18 Months to 3 Years for Al- leged Part in Anti-Jewish Events

VILNA, Sept. 6.—Five Jewish youths who had been sentenced to prison terms ranging from eighteen months to three years for alleged participation in the anti-Semitic disturbances in Vilna last November, had their sentences reduced to 45 days in prison yesterday by the Court of Appeal.

The Jewish youths affected by this new decision are named Girwicz, Sawicz, Galperin, Rubin and Dworkin.

The action of the Court of Appeal is in line with its verdict in the case of Shmuel Wulfkin, Jewish student sentenced originally to two years imprisonment for allegedly taking part in the events which led to the death of a Christian student killed during the riots, and whose sentence it changed last week, to two months imprisonment.

Housing Agreement Between Ort, Soviet Not to Operate Until Next Year Owing to Housing Shortage

Soviet Unable to Supply Building Materials Even for Dollars; Ort Offices Receive Numerous Inquiries

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

MOSCOW, Sept. 6.—The agreement concluded between the Soviet government and the Ort in July providing for the building of co-operative dwellings for Jews who have relatives in America willing to defray part of the expense in dollars will not become effective this year, owing to the shortage of building materials, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency was informed yesterday.

According to the terms of the agreement made public by the Berlin headquarters of the Ort on July 25th, 40% of the building cost was to be secured by the Ort in dollars from American relatives.

The remaining sixty percent of the cost was to be borne by the prospective builders who were to secure the funds in the form of long term loans extending over a period of twenty years to be granted jointly by the Soviet government and the Ort.

The Soviet government moreover undertook to supply part of the material and the labor required for the building of the houses.

The Soviet authorities, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency was informed, are unable to supply building materials even for dollars and the agreement will not become effective until after the winter season.

The Ort offices in Moscow have received numerous inquiries from American relatives of Russian Jews who are displaying great interest in the project which, it is expected, will aid many

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Police Reserves to Guard Against Uprooting of Trees in Natania

JERUSALEM, Sept. 6.—Police reserves have been despatched to the Arab villages surrounding Natania, in view of the recurrent uprooting of trees in the colony and the inciting propaganda against the Jews disseminated in these villages.

Two arrests were made by the police. The reserves were sent to the Arab villages following a visit to the High Commissioner by representatives of Natania.

Duesterberg, Stahlhelm Leader, Candidate for President, Says He Is of Jewish Origin

Acknowledges Jewish Derivation as Nazi and Ludendorff Organs De- nounce Him for It

BERLIN, Sept. 6.—Lieutenant Colonel Theodor Duesterberg, a leader of the monarchist Steel Helmet Society of German war veterans, and defeated candidate of Dr. Alfred Hugenberg's Nationalist Party for the presidency of Germany, today acknowledged that he comes from Jewish stock at a meeting of the presidium of the "Stahlhelm" where he resigned his office in the leadership of the organization.

The Nationalist leader stated: "I actually originate from Jews, but I have only now learned that fact myself."

The statement by Duesterberg comes after an attack upon him in yesterday's edition of the Nazi organ, "Der Angriff," and the organ of General Eric von Ludendorff, "Volksware," where

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Ludendorff Scores Hindenburg For Assuring Jews Rights Will Not Be Infringed Upon

President Attacked Because of Alleged Ignoring of Patriotic Organizations While Jewish Representations Heard

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Sept. 6.—President Paul von Hindenburg is scored by General Eric von Ludendorff, famous German war commander, who since the conclusion of the war has achieved notoriety as an anti-Semite, in a signed article in his organ, "Volksware," yesterday for expressing opposition to any limitation of the political and religious rights of the Jews in Germany.

President von Hindenburg's condemnation of any attempt to limit Jewish rights was made through Secretary of State Meissner, in reply to representations made on August 15th, by the Central Union of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith. On that day the Central Union presented to the president a White Book offering documentary evidence of the extent of the Nazi terrorization of the Jews.

General von Ludendorff criticizes the President for offering such assurances to the Jews while complaints addressed to him by patriotic German organizations, he alleges, have been ignored.

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Fredman Chosen Head**Of Jewish War Veterans**

ATLANTIC CITY, Sept. 6.—More than eight hundred delegates and visitors today concluded the eleventh annual encampment of the Jewish War Veterans of the United States.

J. George Fredman, Jersey City lawyer, was unanimously chosen Commander-in-Chief, succeeding Harold Seidberg of Cambridge, Mass. The latter was presented with a medal by Julius S. Berg, New York State Senator.

Col. R. Mendelsohn of Brooklyn, former Commander, installed the new officers which besides Mr. Fredman included: Wm. Berman of Boston, Senior Vice-Commander and Harry R. Raymond of New York, Junior Vice-Commander. Rabbi Abraham Nowak of Cleveland Heights, Ohio, was again chosen Chaplain-in-Chief and Rabbi Edward Lissman of New York, honorary Chaplain-in-Chief.

Ethel Cohen of Providence, R. I., was elected head of the ladies' auxiliary which held its meeting at the same time.

The principal speaker at the convention banquet was Congressman Sol Bloom of New York, head of the Washington Bi-Centennial, who pledged continued support for veteran legislation in Congress. A Bi-Centennial military ball was one of the features of the convention.

Resolutions adopted were primarily of a secular character, such as favoring repeal of the 18th amendment. A resolution urging immediate payment of the government bonus was adopted. A resolution disapproving the activities of the National Administration toward the B.E.F. was tabled.

Mr. Fredman was head of the Convention committee, Herman W. Brams of Newark, treasurer, and Louis Weiss, clerk of the New Jersey House of Assembly, was secretary.

Dr. Gustave Kolischer of Chicago, president-elect of the American Congress of Physical Therapy now in session here at the Hotel New Yorker, was one of the eight recipients of awards in recognition of outstanding contributions to physical therapy.

The honor was conferred upon Dr. Kolischer for outstanding contributions in electro-surgery and its application to urology.

Dr. Kolischer, who was born in Austria in 1863 is a graduate of the University of Vienna. He came to this country in 1899. He is senior Urologist at the Michael Reese and Mount Sinai Hospitals of Chicago.

**Attempt to Inject Racial
Issue in Horner Campaign**

CHICAGO, Sept. 6.—An attempt to inject the racial issue into the gubernatorial campaign because Judge Henry Horner, the Democratic nominee, is a leading Jew, is being made by campaigners for his Republican rival for the post, former Governor Len Small.

The Republican forces are spreading throughout the State the slogan: "The United States went to England for its president and Chicago went to Czechoslovakia for its mayor. Does Illinois want to go to Jerusalem for its governor?"

Judge Horner himself has remained aloof from this action, but many adherents have jumped to his defense.

James Webber Linn, professor of English at the University of Chicago, who conducts a daily column in the "Chicago Times," discussing this racial attack on Judge Horner says:

"The life of Judge Horner as a public servant is an open book. There are only two pages in the book. One is headed 'Ability,' and the other is headed 'Humanity'.

"If I were the managers of the Democratic campaign, I would publish that book of two pages and I would see that every good woman in the state of Illinois was handed a copy of it by a friend, personally. I would utterly ignore the false 'issues' raised by the Small faction; I would let the Judge himself do all the discussing, in public or private, of what he with his wide experience and economic training regards as the real political issues of the state campaign; and I would tell the women of Illinois the straight, clear, warm truth about the power of goodness of this great Jew and keep on telling it to them, until they became aware that it was the truth. Once they know the truth, I trust the women. You can fool them and you can blind them to the truth for a while; but once they know it, they vote right."

**Income and Membership of

Revisionist Congress Upholds Calais Agreement; Gives Union Priority in Discipline of Members

Says Revisionist Shekel Payers Not Bound by Actions Committee Resolutions Regarding Activities

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

VIENNA, Sept. 6.—The congress of the World Union of Zionist Revisionists concluded its six day sessions with the adoption of a number of resolutions relative to internal policy and relationship to the World Zionist Organization.

By a vote of 82 to 24, the congress endorsed the decision reached at the Revisionist conference in Calais, which relegates to the individual Revisionist the right to decide whether or not to pay the shekel to the Zionist organization.

At the same time, in the light of the decision of the Actions Committee that members of all Zionist groups within the organization are subject to the discipline of the World Zionist Organization, the congress went on record as giving the Revisionist Union priority in the disciplining of its members.

An official declaration was also entered in the minutes of the congress taking the stand that the resolution adopted by the Actions Committee, in connection with the admission of the Revisionists as a separate union, that existing regulations preclude individual Zionists and Zionist groups from negotiating with governments or the League of Nations and from conducting political work without the consent of the Executive, are not binding upon Revisionist shekel payers. This stand was taken on the ground that the Actions Committee's resolution is contrary to the Zionist organization's constitution and Zionist statutes.

A motion by Vladimir Jabotinsky was adopted which empowers the incoming Executive to decide whether or not a petition embodying the Revisionist demands with regard to Palestine is to be drawn up and whether it is to be addressed to the governments of various lands and to the League of Nations.

Goes Into Bankruptcy

BERLIN, Sept. 6.—The Industrie und Privatbank, representing the banking business of the firm of Jakob Michael, one of Germany's largest firms, went into bankruptcy yesterday.

The firm had liabilities in the amount of 38,000,000 marks, about \$9,036,400, as against assets of 1,000,000 marks, or about \$237,800.

The firm went into bankruptcy when creditors meeting in an effort to arrive at a settlement were unable to agree.

Jew Suggests Jews Join Nazi Party; Central Union Directors Say This Is Impossible

By Our Berlin Correspondent

BERLIN.—Of public interest in the public prints in recent weeks has been a discussion pro and con on the suggestion made by Dr. Max Naumann, leader of a small group of so-called National German Jews, an ultra-patriotic body, that Jews join the Nazi movement.

This suggestion has been taken up by some Nazis, whose viewpoint has been published in the "Deutsche Allgemeine Zeitung," regarded as the organ of Chancellor Franz von Papen.

Notice is also taken of this suggestion by Dr. Ludwig Hollaender, Director of the Central Union of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith, who writes in the organ of the Union, the "C.-V. Zeitung," that Jews cannot join the Nazi movement, even though a proportion of its members are not anti-Semitic so long as its authoritative leaders advocate an anti-Semitic policy.

Among the letters published by the "Deutsche Allgemeine Zeitung" is one signed by a member of the Nazi party, Clemens Marx, who writes as follows in support of Dr. Naumann's suggestion:

"It must be made clear that a large section of the National Socialists are not anti-Semites. The great achievements of the Jews are fully recognized. I can confirm my own experience that many National Socialists count Jews among their best friends.

"There is another thing, however, which must also be made clear—that much of the harm done to Germany and the German cause is due to the actions of people who are Semitic. At the same time, Mr. Naumann's suggestion may open a new road. It would put a stop to the internecine warfare among us Germans, and if he succeeds, and those other Jews, who, thank God, are in a minority, realize also that they live in Germany, earn German money and are protected by Germans, and they act in a way that is in accordance with the interests and the welfare of Germany, then anti-Semitism will surely be restricted to only a small number of fanatics."

There is a second letter, however, by another Nazi named Ernest Weipert, repudiating any idea of Jews being allowed to join the Nazi Party.

The first essential, he writes, is that a Jew cannot be a German citizen. He must be placed under alien laws. If Germany is not able to provide for her own people, then the aliens must go out. The Jews in Germany should, therefore, be warned to pack up and clear out.

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Urge Opening of Buildings and Community Centers to the Unemployed During Emergency

Suggestion Made at 17th Annual Convention of State Federation of Y.M., Y.W.H.A.'s and Kindred Associations

GLENS FALLS, N. Y., Sept. 6.—The New York State Federation of Young Men's and Young Women's Hebrew and Kindred Associations, affiliated with the National Jewish Welfare Board, at its 17th annual convention, concluded here last night, dealt primarily with the role the community center can assume during the present economic emergency.

The conference went on record as supporting the stand of Newton D. Baker, Chairman of the National Citizens Committee for Welfare and Relief, recently formed in Washington, in his emphasis on character-building agencies.

Supreme Court Justice Samuel J. Harris of Buffalo, who led a discussion on "What the Jewish Center Can Do for the Unemployed," urged the conference to open buildings and community centers where the unemployed could spend their leisure time, and to inaugurate vocational courses for trade education of the unemployed.

Former Congressman Isaac M. Siegel of New York City, who addressed the Convention on behalf of the National Jewish Welfare Board, declared "the time must never come when a man eminently fitted for public office is to be refused a nomination on account of his religious faith." "If that day ever comes," he added, "our thinking American citizenship will rise from its temporary stupor and rebuke the party responsible for such bigotry in such an emphatic manner that the so-called leaders will never forget." He specifically alluded to the candidacy of Lieut. Gov. Lehman for the Governorship.

J. Meyer Schime of Gloversville presided at a conference on dramatics. Miss Louise Meyerovitz, director of dramatic activities at Albany, and Philip Gross, director of dramatics of the Bronx Y.M.H.A., led the discussions.

Rabbi Julian L. Greifer, executive director of the Binghamton Community Center, led a symposium on mass cultural activities. He urged that programs deal with social problems and stated that the aim of the Center is to broaden the horizons of its membership.

Ask Amendment to Permit Jews to Register

CHICAGO, Sept. 6.—With a special session of the Illinois State Assembly assured for next month to consider various revenue and relief problems, a number of Chicago Jews are seeking to prevail upon Gov. Louis L. Emmerson to include in the call for the special session a change in the registration dates for this Fall.

It is pointed out that the first registration date, October 1, falls on the first day of Rosh Hashonah and that the orthodox citizens of Chicago will not register. That leaves only one other registration day for them, October 11. Jewish leaders declare that it is not fair to the Jewish voter to deprive him of the chance to have two days in which to register, therefore it is asked that the state assembly provide another registration day in place of the original date of October 1. It is called to Gov. Emmerson's attention that when a similar situation arose in Maryland four years ago, Gov. Albert C. Ritchie appreciated the importance of the matter and the election laws were amended.

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who repudiate the anti-Jewish part of its program and practice, Dr. Ludwig Hollaender, the Director of the Central Union of German Citizens of Jewish Faith, writes.

So long, however, Dr. Hollaender proceeds, as its authoritative leaders maintain their basic conception with regard to the Jews, we cannot see anything in the Nazi movement that will lead to the rebirth of Germany.

Dr. Naumann complains, he says, that German Jews see only one thing in Nazism—that when the Nazis will take over the Government, all Jews will be killed and that they are blind to everything else in the Nazi movement.

Dr. Naumann knows well enough the program of the Nazis, and its anti-Jewish demands, Dr. Hollaender continues. He has had opportunity enough day after day to see that these anti-Jewish demands are not merely on paper, but that the Nazis actually try to carry them into effect. Dr. Naumann knows the statements made on the subject by the most authoritative people in the Nazi movement, their unrestrained attacks and open incitement against the Jews. He knows, or he should know, that Herr Hitler has on no single occasion attempted to repudiate the most authoritative speakers in his party on the attitude on the Jewish question. Dr. Naumann knows also of the acts of terrorism that have been committed in the last few weeks against Jews. We do not see that this will lead to German regeneration. And we shall not allow ourselves out of fear to subscribe to something that may for the time being seem a way of escaping brutal violence. That would only demonstrate that we are lacking in firmness of character.

We are National German, Dr. Hollaender says, because we wish to see Germany's greatness restored, but we know also that to place Jews under aliens rights, to incite against Jews, and to commit acts of violence against them, is not the road to Germany's revival.

Those are acting in Germany's best interests who fight against this fanaticism.

Dr. Hollaender then refers to an article in the Zionist organ, the "Juedische Rundschau," concerning Dr. Naumann's suggestion, in which it said that Hitler's victory meant the complete collapse of the Jewish assimilationist idea.

This conception, he writes, is to my mind just as wrong as Naumann's. The Jewish assimilationist idea, properly understood, has taught us to be loyal Germans and loyal Jews. Its champions made it clear to us that the movement which liberated us from the ghetto must also expect to meet rebuffs. We must not be afraid of Hitler's victory. What the coming weeks and months will bring us, we do not know, but whatever they will bring
