## Renewed Anti-Semitic Attacks Recur Through Tunisia; Believe Palestine Arabs Responsible

Rumor Agitators Are Sent to Tunisia  
by Grand Mufti, and Are Aided  
by Local Sheikh

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

TUNIS, Sept. 9.—Renewed attacks by Arabs against the Jews are recurring throughout Tunisia which has been in a disturbed state for the past two months.

While Premier Edouard Herriot in Paris yesterday offered assurances to the League to Combat Anti-Semitism that the authorities would take measures to prevent any recurrence of the anti-Jewish attacks, Arabs armed with knives attacked a cinema in the Jewish quarter in Tunis last night.

Native soldiers, who were stationed in the Jewish district, restored order.

Attacks upon Jews in Tunis are a daily occurrence, and the disturbances are spreading throughout the country.

Incitement against the Jews is spread through the accusation that Jews insulted the Moslem religion.

In Moknin, several Jews were wounded, severely.

The outbreak started following an altercation between a Jew, Pinchas Uzan and an Arab customer. An Arab mob assembled and demanded Uzan's

## Nazi Leader of East Prussia Arrested on Charges of Inspiring August Attempts

Actual Perpetrators of Attacks Upon  
Socialist Leaders and Jews Have  
Escaped to Danzig

BERLIN, Sept. 9.—Georg Ierbrant, a Nazi leader of East Prussia, was arrested today on charges of having inspired the attempt upon the lives of Socialist political leaders and Jews on August 1.

The Nazis actually responsible for the attempts have escaped to Danzig, however.

Among those against whom the Nazis directed their attempts on August 1st, was Kurt Sabatsky of Koenigsburg, representative of the Central Union of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith.

The Nazis attacked the home of Dr.

## Berlin Labor Court Rules Dismissal Not Justified Because Of Jewish Faith of Employee

Government Radio Station Ordered to  
Re-employ Jewish Manager of  
Broadcasting Department

BERLIN, Sept. 9.—The Labor Court today ordered the Government Radio station to re-employ the manager of its broadcasting department who had been dismissed because he is a Jew.

The dismissed employee is Dr. Kirschner, a naturalized Hungarian Jew.

The court ruled that the fact that Dr. Kirschner is a Jew is no cause for dismissal.

The head of the government radio station is the Nazi secretary of State, Scholtz.

## Jew Dismissed Despite Court Order

BERLIN, Sept. 9.—Challenging the decision of the Labor court today which ordered the reinstatement of the Jewish manager of the broadcasting department of the government radio station, Dr. Kirschner, the secretary of State, Dr. Scholtz, who is the head of the station today dismissed Alfred Kerr, popular Jewish broadcaster.

Kerr is a well known critic who commented daily on current events.

## Prof. Wreschner, Psychologist, Dies in Zurich at Age of 66

ZURICH, Sept. 9.—Professor Arthur Wreschner, noted Jewish psychologist, and a member of the faculty of the University of Zurich died here today at the age of sixty-six.

Professor Wreschner, who was born in Breslau made his home in Zurich since 1900.

He had been a Professor of Psychology at the University of Zurich since 1910.

## Chief Rabbi of Orthodox Community Dies in Brussels

BRUSSELS, Sept. 9.—Rabbi Isaac Mayer Horchstein, chief rabbi of the orthodox Jewish Community here died today.

The deceased was sixty-five years old and had served in office for a quarter of a century.

## Appeals for Authority for Yemenite Jews in Palestine To Practice Polygamy

Leaders of Yemenite Community in  
Palestine Make Plea Before Rab-  
binical Court of Appeals

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM, Sept. 9.—The right of Yemenite Jews residing in Palestine to practice polygamy was put forth by one of the most prominent leaders of the Yemenite Community who appeared before the Rabbinical Court of Appeals against his wife who refused to permit him to marry a second wife, and demanded a divorce on this ground.

By request of the Central Committee of the Jewish Women's Equal Rights Association, Dr. B. Joseph appeared before the court in behalf of the wife. The argument of the husband was that the Yemenites, being Eastern Jews, are permitted to have more than one wife.

Dr. Joseph pointed out that the applicant's influential position in the Yemenite Community made the case a very important one because of the example it set.

The verdict of the Rabbinical Court of Appeals has not yet been issued and the Jewish Women's Equal Rights Association in Palestine is looking forward to it with great interest.

## Grain and Hay on 2,700 Hectares Of Land in Bira Bidjan Destroyed by Heavy Rainfall

Rains Heaviest in 16 Years; 58% of  
Newcomers Desert Bidjan According  
to Official Statistics

MOSCOW, Sept. 9.—Grain and hay on 2,700 hectares of land in Bira Bidjan were destroyed by the heavy rains, according to telegraphic advices received here from Bira Bidjan.

The rainfall is the heaviest in sixteen years, it is stated.

At the same time it is made known that the desertions on the part of newcomers to Bira Bidjan has reached an average of 58 per cent, according to official statistics compiled by the Regional Soviet.

Fifty-six Jewish immigrants from Belgium, including eleven women and fifteen children, passed through Moscow today enroute to Bira Bidjan.

## "Frankfurter Zeitung" Scores Lack of Representativeness at Geneva Jewish Conference

**Says Conference Zionist; "Rundschau"  
States Union of Jews Will Not Be  
Deterred by Threats**

The "Frankfurter Zeitung" which has just reached this country publishes an article with regard to the Geneva Jewish conference in which it challenges the rights of the initiators of the conference to call it representative of world Jewry.

"The so-called Jewish 'world conference' regarding whose course our Geneva correspondent reports, was no official conference of the Jews of the world," the paper writes. "The larger Jewish organizations and almost all Jewish communities, with very few exceptions, remained apart from it or announced their opposition. The conference consisted chiefly of delegates sent by groups around the American Zionist leader, Dr. Stephen Wise, who also presided. Even the official Zionist organizations remained aloof, although most of the delegates were sent by groups in which Zionists have practically the deciding vote. Thus, for example, according to our knowledge, only the Jewish Volkspartei of Germany was represented, that is the Zionist faction of the Jewish communities and provincial unions (of communities). The Zionist character of the entire conference is distinctly reflected also in the resolutions, with the formulation of which wide Jewish circles can hardly be in agreement. So long as the efforts for an international unification of the Jews remains so one-sidedly in the hands of the Zionists the prospects of their success are very small.

"In this connection," it continues, "we should mention a polemic of the 'Voelkische Beobachter,' which publishes a report about the Geneva conference under the four-column wide

## Fifty Percent of Employees in Reservoir Works to Be Jews

JERUSALEM, Sept. 9.—Following several meetings at which Major Campbell, the District Commissioner; Mr. Jacobs, Administrative Officer; Dr. Arlosoroff, of the Jewish Agency Executive, and representatives of the Jerusalem Jewish Workers' Council and the Romema reservoir building contractors were present to determine the share of Jewish laborers in the construction of the reservoir, the contractors offered to employ Jewish laborers on the concrete-mixing and pouring and skilled works and to accept the return of Jewish workmen who had been on strike in protest against the paucity of their numbers. Both parties have signed a protocol, which Mr. Jacobs signed as a witness.

Over half of the laborers employed will be Jews.

The news that an agreement had been reached spread rapidly among the Jewish labor community and was received with great satisfaction. In an Arabic announcement to the Arab laborers on the work, the Jerusalem Workers' Council points out that it was demanding a just share for Jews in Municipal works in view of the fact that the Jewish taxpayers of Jerusalem constitute the major contributors to Municipal revenues, and that they did not wish to encroach upon the just rights of others. The General Jewish Labor Federation seeks co-operation between Arab and Jewish workmen and is interested in improving conditions among all sections of workers, the statement says.

headline, 'The Papen Government Has Written This Protection of the Jews on Its Banner!' In bold type the really singular threats against National Socialists and anti-Semitism are reproduced. This is incitement against Germany. The report quotes an utterance of the Berlin leader of the Jewish Volkspartei, Kareski, who mentioned with approval that the Papen government, as guardian of the constitution, also protects the legal rights of the Jews. Even though the utilization in this manner of this statement of the perfectly obvious constitutional protection of the German Jews is characteristic of the methods of the 'Voelkische Beobachter' in its war against Papen, it is, nevertheless, not astonishing that the stupid threats at the Geneva conference could find no other echo in these circles than that which has been cited. Such declamations are always a questionable matter—with such means no effective politics can be carried on."

The "Juedische Rundschau," organ of the Zionist Federation of Germany, in its issue which has reached New York, carries an editorial replying to the attack of the Nazi organ, "Voelkischer Beobachter," on Georg Kareski, former President of the Berlin

## Itzig Saafieldt's Grandson Nazi Leader in Holstein

BERLIN, Sept. 9.—The Republicans searching for Jewish blood among the Nazi leaders to confound their Germanic pure-race dogmas have scored another success, by revealing the Jewish origin of Dr. Wolfgang Saafieldt, the Nazi district leader at Eutin, in Holstein.

Dr. Saafieldt brought a libel action against the local leader of the Tannenbergs League, but was unable to dispute the proofs brought forward of his Jewish origin, which were accepted by the court, in dismissing his action.

The Germanic leader in Eutin is the illegitimate son of the Jewess, Cecilia Saafieldt, the "Montag Morgen" satirically comments, and she was the daughter of Itzig Saafieldt, a Jew of Posen. Itzig Saafieldt's grandson just wandered across from Germany's Polish frontier to her Danish frontier. What becomes now of the pure-blood theory of the Holstein Nazis?

## Z.O.A. Arranging Schatz Remains Transferal

Morris Rothenberg, President of the Zionist Organization of America announced today that arrangements are being completed for the conveyance of the body of the late Professor Boris Schatz, noted pioneer Palestine artist, from Denver, Colorado, where he died some months ago, to Palestine where his historic work of organizing the creative arts was launched, and where his remains will be interred.

Mr. Rothenberg stated that the Zionist Organization of America in conjunction with affiliated Zionist national bodies in the United States are providing the necessary funds to defray the expense involved and that there is no need for action by others in the situation.

The details of the shipment of Prof. Schatz's remains will be announced after a conference with the son of the late Professor Schatz who is now on his way to New York from California.

CHICAGO, Sept. 9.—At a meeting of the Executive Committee of the Zionist organization here last night, several hundred dollars were raised to defray the expenses of the removal to Palestine of the body of Professor Boris Schatz, Jewish sculptor and founder of the Bezalel School of Arts and Crafts which has been kept embalmed in a Denver mortuary since his demise in March.

John Rissman was named chairman of a Committee and was scheduled to depart for New York today to consult with officers of the Zionist Organization of America regarding this matter.

The annual Chicago Zionist conference will be held on November 13th. Morris Rothenberg, president of the Zionist Organization of America has been invited to be the guest speaker at the conference.

# **Louis Marshall Memorial Scientific Building to Be Dedicated in November**

**Building on Campus of New York State College of Forestry Will Be Available for Students in Two Weeks**

SYRACUSE, Sept. 9.—The dedication of the new Louis Marshall Memorial Scientific Building, which is being erected on the campus of the New York State College of Forestry, Syracuse University, and which, outside of a few details, is nearly completed, will take place early in November, according to the committee in charge of the ceremonies.

Alfred E. Smith, former governor of New York State, and chairman of the board of trustees, is scheduled to be one of the participants in the dedication program.

The edifice will be ready for occupancy within the next two weeks, in time to receive the students when they will return for the fall opening of the college late this month. Already a graveled driveway is being laid from the end of Irving Avenue around the Stadium to the western entrance of the long red brick structure, and in front of it, the ground is being terraced for the grass and trees.

The first floor of the building is occupied largely by the auditorium, which will be the largest on the campus and will seat the entire student body of the college. The second and third floors will contain laboratories with the latest improvements, which will be used for scientific experiments, research and discoveries, while the top floor will have specially constructed refrigerator store-rooms.

## **State Rights of Hebrew Language Infringed Upon**

JERUSALEM, Sept. 9.—Two cases have been brought to the attention of the Government by the Vaad Leumi, showing how the rights of Hebrew as one of the three official languages of the country have not been observed.

The first was that the person appointed by the District Officer at Nablus to collect fees at the entrance to the Sebastich excavations issued tickets in English and Arabic only. The second that post office signboards in different parts of the country have switched the order of precedence in which the languages had been inscribed.

The Government has replied that, in the first case, the lack of Hebrew on the admission tickets will be remedied when the present stock is exhausted.

As regards the second case, this arose through a mistake and only a limited number of signboards were affected. The accepted order of precedence is English, Arabic and Hebrew.

## **J. D. B. NEWS LETTER**

**Hebrew University Receives Additions to Its Library from Various Lands**

JERUSALEM.—The Hebrew University has received a number of additions to its library from various countries.

Mrs. S. Preciado of Bucharest who established recently a fund for the purchase of books on architecture as a memorial to her late son, Jonah Joel Preciado, has lately donated the library of the deceased. The collection is composed of a well-chosen collection of more than 200 books and many periodicals on architecture and art and will contribute much to fill the gaps in the departments concerned.

Another architectural collection was received from E. J. Levy of Cairo. Mr. Levy sent about 100 books in French, English and German. Most of the books are well-known standard works.

The "Deutscher Verband Zur Foerderung der Universitat Jerusalem" in Berlin (Prof. Citron) shipped recently five cases of books to the Hebrew National and University Library. The chief contributors to this shipment were Dr. Julius Misch and Dr. July Zadek, both of Berlin. Dr. Misch further sent two boxes of important medical periodicals, papers, reprints, etc., which he is collecting and has been sending regularly to the Library.

The Warsaw Committee of the Library which continues its activities in collecting books has again sent close to 1,000 volumes. Thanks to the efforts of this committee it is possible for the Library to include in "Kiryath Sepher" (the bibliographical quarterly issued by the Library) an almost complete list of the Hebrew and Yiddish prints which appeared in Poland during the last year. Besides books of Jewish interest the shipment contains an important collection of modern medical works (from the library of Dr. Bernard Joz, Warsaw) and a great number of general works in German, French and Polish.

The Copenhagen Committee of the Library has forwarded two cases containing many papers, dissertations and reprints on natural science, especially biology, and also the valuable periodicals which the Library receives regularly through the endeavours of the Committee.

## **General Zionists to Establish Bilu Colony in Palestine**

JERUSALEM, Sept. 9.—A colony named Bilu is to be established in Palestine by the General Zionists here, it was learned here yesterday.

The colony is to be established in celebration of the fiftieth anniversary of the first Bilu settlers.

## **Specialists in Electro- Surgery Named to Office In American Therapy Congress**

**Dr. Kolischer of Chicago Heads Organization for Year; Other Jewish Specialists Named**

The American Congress of Physical Therapy which has been in session here for the past week and whose deliberations have disclosed the important strides made in the application of electro-surgery closed on Friday evening with the election of Dr. Gustav Kolischer, of Chicago, noted Jewish urologist, as president of the Congress for a period of one year. Dr. Kolischer was honored at the opening of the sessions of the Congress with an award in recognition of his outstanding contributions to electro-surgery and its application to urology.

Dr. Disraeli Kobak, Jewish radiologist of Chicago, retains the post of editor of the official publication of the congress, "Archives of Physical Therapy."

Other Jewish specialists named to office are Dr. N. H. Palmer of New Orleans, third vice-president and Dr. William Bierman of New York, fourth vice-president.

Jewish specialists took a prominent part in the deliberations of the congress and in its demonstrations.

A new method of treating chronic lung and bronchial infections was presented by Dr. M. Joseph Mandelbaum of New York. The use of specially devised delicate rubber tubes to permit the flushing out of accumulated toxic products within the bronchial and pulmonary organs "has been found effective."

## **Rothenberg to Address Philadelphia Conference**

PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 9.—Morris Rothenberg, President of the Zionist Organization of America, will be the principal speaker at a rally of Zionist workers Monday evening, September 12th, at the Commodore Hotel.

arrest for alleged insults to the Moslem religion.

The Arabs produced witnesses who testified that Uzan had insulted the Moslem religion, with the result that the Jew was arrested. He was released by the police later.

Subsequently Uzan travelled to an outlying Arab village where he was attacked and left lying unconscious on the roadside. A passing motorist found him and brought him to a hospital.

Three Arabs responsible for the attack were apprehended. Their arrest aroused their co-religionists and thousands of Moslems took part in a demonstration demanding their release.

When this was refused, the Arabs stormed the Jewish quarter to which the Jews had fled panic-stricken. The quarter was barricaded and an attempt at self-defense was undertaken. But the efforts of the Jews proved unavailing as they were hopelessly outnumbered.

Police from a neighboring village were summoned to the assistance of the local police. They dispersed the throng, and arrested several.

Arab attempts against the Jews were also reported in other localities.

Several anti-Jewish agitators who arrived in Bengardane, Southern Tunisia, from Sfax, where anti-Jewish riots occurred in July, were expelled by the military authorities, when they called for "A war upon the Jews."

Rumor has it that Palestine Arabs, sent by the Grand Mufti of Jerusalem and supported by the local Sheikh Taalbi are the principal agitators. Anti-Jewish meetings are held in mosques; inflammatory speeches are delivered against the Jews and such Palestine Arab newspapers as the "Falastin" and "Al Jamiel Arabiyah" are read before the worshippers while the charge is made that Jews are planning to seize the mosques and oppress Palestine Arabs.

Jewish circles have entered a complaint against the local authorities who, they charge, are not suppressing the vicious propaganda against the Jewish population.

To the anxious situation of the Jews in the country has been added new excitement by the refusal of the judicial authorities to release on bail, a Jewish baker, Elie Ankri, who was arrested on July 26th, on charges of having blinded a local Arab during the riots in Sfax.

Ankri is being held despite the fact that the French authorities have recommended his release and despite the fact that both the Police and government Commissioners recommended his release on bail.

The facts in the case are that Ankri protected himself when the anti-Jewish riots occurred in Sfax at the end of July and that he fired once in the air in order to frighten the attackers and

fective in promoting better health and has proven practically innocuous in thousands of instances in which this method has been used in human subjects," Dr. Mandelbaum declared.

Between symposiums, Dr. Kobak attended a patient from whose cheek he removed a cancer by the electro-surgical method. The entire operation took less than fifteen minutes; did not require the use of an anesthetic and caused no discomfort to the patient.

Immediately after the operation, the patient, who is a well known authoress residing in New York, whose name was withheld, returned to the conference with Dr. Kobak to demonstrate the effectiveness of this method.

The efficacy of electro-surgery in cancer cases had previously been upheld by Dr. Gustav Kolischer.

A paper on "Therapeutic Fever Induced by Radiotherapy" was read to the conference by Dr. William Bierman, who is the director of the Department of Physical Therapy at the Beth Israel Hospital.

Jewish Community on the basis of his address describing the position of German Jewry at the Geneva Jewish world conference.

Herr Kareski, the "Rundschau" says, described the conditions in Germany soberly, and warned against exaggerations and the one-sided consideration of certain internal German developments.

In speaking of the position of the Jews under the present Government, he said, as was natural with the Government powers reposing today, largely in the hands of the President of the Republic himself, that it is against any formal deprivation of the rights of the Jews, and certainly against anti-Jewish violence.

The present Government of Germany knows how Germany's position in the civilized world would be prejudiced by a return to medieval barbarism in the treatment of the Jews. The Papen Government will therefore protect the rights of the Jews.

It is, however, going too far, and merely a rhetorical flourish to say that it has inscribed the protection of the Jews on its banner. The Government has inscribed on its banner the "Christian National Regime," and the Jewish question does not take first place with it.

So far as we Jews are concerned, the "Rundschau" concludes, the threats and the misrepresentations of the "Voelkischer Beobachter" will not deter us from collecting our forces and fighting for our existence and our rights wherever they are menaced. The roads which we shall take in doing so will be influenced by political and Jewish considerations, and not by anti-Semitic attacks.
