## Industrialization of Colonies In Jewish Regions to Be Undertaken This Winter

#### Sixty Shops to Be Established in Colonies by Ort Under Comzet Supervision

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) MOSCOW, Sept. 12-The industriali-

zation of the Jewish colonies in the Crimean, Kalinindorf, Odessa and Pervomaisk regions this winter will be undertaken in accordance with a decision adopted at the just concluded special conference held in Yevpatoria with the participation of representatives of the Comzet, Ort and Agrojoint. Sixty different industrial shops will

be opened in the Jewish colonies, according to the plan adopted. Special delegates came from Moscow

to represent the governmental department for settling Jews on the land and in industry as well as the two Jewish organizations.

The industrialization program is to be carried out by the Ort under the supervision of the Comzet.

The conference also heard reports on the situation in the colonies in connection with the crop.

## Constantin Brunner Felicitated On Seventieth Birthday (Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

BUCHAREST .- The Prime Minister, M. Vayda-Voyvod, has promised a number of important concessions to the Iewish population in the course of an interview with a delegation of the members of the Jewish Party, Deputies Dr-Ebner, Dr. Josef Fischer, Advocate M. Landau, and E. Marton, accompanied by Dr. Stern, the General Secretary of

The Jewish Deputies began by raising the question of the Nationality Law. ing law tens of thousands of inhabitants. KISHINEV, Sept. 12-The maltreat-ment of Jews by revenue officials, particularly small Jewish traders in the villages, is disclosed by "Unser Zeit." It reports that on August 29th, a tax collector, accompanied by a police ser-geant entered the shop of a small Jewish trader in Kishinev, Motti Pekl, and

demanded the payment of certain taxes. In support of his demand, he produced a summons which carried a different name.

Pekl drew the attention of the offi-

cials to this and insisted that he had already paid his taxes. The officers were adamant however. They insisted

The Prime Minister, in conclusion, expressed his readiness at all times to consider the problems of interest to the Jewish population and to endeavor to satisfy their demands.
