## Severe Punishment for Polish Anti-Jewish Boycott Agitators Ordered in Official Communiqué

Organ of Anti-Semitic National Democratic Party Confiscated for Criticizing Decree; Six Agitators Arrested

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

WARSAW, Sept. 12—Severe punishment will be meted out to those who persist in agitating for a boycott against Jewish book-sellers, declares an official communiqué issued by the Polish government last night.

At the same time the authorities make known that they will adopt stringent measures to suppress the boycott propaganda.

The action of the government follows increased boycott propaganda undertaken in particular by the anti-Semitic National Democratic party in connection with the opening of the school term.

Last week the agitation against the Jews led to street clashes.

The "Gazeta Warszawska" was confiscated last night for criticizing the communiqué of the government. The paper is the organ of the National Democratic Party and has been virulent in its attacks upon the Jews.

Six boycott agitators have been arrested and face the possibility of serving two years in prison.

## Jewish Tobacco Merchants Dwindle from 800 to 2

WARSAW, Sept. 12—Only two large Jewish tobacco merchants are left in Poland today from a group which numbered 800, declared the "Hajnt" yesterday.

The paper says that there were 800 large Jewish tobacco merchants prior to the introduction of the state monopoly. This number was subsequently reduced to thirty and has now dwindled to two in the entire country.

## Arab Executive Declines to Invite Jews to Fair in 1933

JERUSALEM, Sept. 12—The Arab Executive yesterday declined to invite Jewish representatives to participate in the Palestine Arab Exhibit planned for 1933.

A suggestion that the Jews be invited to take part in the exhibit had been made by the Palestine government.

## Appeal to Diet for Abolition Of Prohibition of Schechita In Operation for Two Years

Union of Bavarian Butchers Says Prohibition Has Brought About a Catastrophic Situation

BERLIN, Sept. 12—An appeal for the abolition of the schechita prohibition in Bavaria was addressed yesterday to the Bavarian Diet by the Union of Bavarian Butchers.

The schechita prohibition, which has been in operation for two years, has placed Jewish butchers in a catastrophic position and has also heavily affected the farmers, says the appeal.

Formerly 60,000 cattle annually were required to satisfy the needs of the Jewish population. Today this number has been reduced to 270, according to the Union.

The Kehiloth of Bavaria purchase their meat outside of Bavaria and the Kosher Sausage industry developed chiefly for export purposes, has been transferred elsewhere, states the complaint memorandum.

## Former Jewish Labor Minister To Oppose Premier MacDonald

LONDON, Sept. 12—Emanuel Shinwell, Jewish Laborite, who served in the last Labor government, and a personal friend of Prime Minister MacDonald, will seek election to Parliament as the representative of the Seaham constituency, opposing Premier MacDonald.

Mr. Shinwell will represent the Labor Party in this district at the next general election.

In making known his candidacy, Mr. Shinwell stated that "only the highest sense of loyalty to the Labor movement has induced me to oppose Premier MacDonald. I was for many years among Prime Minister MacDonald's devoted followers. Now I oppose him because I am taking my stand upon the principles which he has always enunciated."

## Five Histadruth Members Arrested for Picketing

JERUSALEM, Sept. 12—Five members of the Histadruth, Palestine Labor Federation, were arrested today for picketing orange groves in the Bnai Brak colony where Arabs are employed.

## Industrialization of Colonies In Jewish Regions to Be Undertaken This Winter

Sixty Shops to Be Established in Colonies by Ort Under Comzet Supervision

MOSCOW, Sept. 12—The industrialization of the Jewish colonies in the Crimean, Kalinindorf, Odessa and Pervomaisk regions this winter will be undertaken in accordance with a decision adopted at the just concluded special conference held in Yevpatoria with the participation of representatives of the Comzet, Ort and Agrojoint.

Sixty different industrial shops will be opened in the Jewish colonies, according to the plan adopted.

Special delegates came from Moscow to represent the governmental department for settling Jews on the land and in industry as well as the two Jewish organizations.

The industrialization program is to be carried out by the Ort under the supervision of the Comzet.

The conference also heard reports on the situation in the colonies in connection with the crop.

## Constantin Brunner Felicitated On Seventieth Birthday

BERLIN, Sept. 12—Constantin Brunner, famous philosopher, known as the Sage of Potsdam, who celebrated his 70th birthday recently, is the recipient of tribute from the German press.

Brunner, whose real name is Leopold Wertheimer, is hailed as one of the most distinguished and powerful thinkers of the day.

He was born in 1862 in Altona and is a grandson of Chief Rabbi Akibah Wertheimer. He is a Spinozist and anti-Kantian. His most important works are "Spinoza Against Kant" and "Anti-Jewish Hatred and Anti-German Hatred."

A Constantin Brunner Society was founded in 1924 to spread his teaching.

## "Nation" Lauds Jewish Congress as Courageous Idea

The "Nation" in its current issue carries an editorial on the Jewish conference in Geneva where it declares that obscurantism and defeatism will not solve the Jewish problems.

"The world Jewish conference which met recently in Geneva, voted to call a world congress during the summer of 1934. This congress will discuss such questions as anti-Semitism, Zionism, minority rights and the economic status of Jewish life. To our mind this represents not only a courageous but an extremely important step. There were many influential members of the race who opposed the idea of holding a world congress. Some were apparently afraid of their Jewishness. . . . Some believed an international congress of Jews would simply serve to antagonize still further the anti-Semitic forces. . . . A few of the opponents were merely defeatists. That all these objections were overcome at the Geneva conference shows with what good sense the majority of the leaders are facing the problems of their race. . . . Only by discussing them in open and democratic fashion can the tasks before the Jewish race successfully be met."

Leadership in the constitution of the world Jewish congress which is to be convened in the summer of 1934 must come from America inasmuch as the representatives from various lands at the Geneva conference "failed to show that they have possibilities at the present time to help us in organizing the coming world congress," declares Z. Tygel, secretary of the Executive Committee to organize the congress, in a statement issued.

Because of this fact, "it is readily understood that most of the future work is to fall to the lot of American Jewry," according to Mr. Tygel, and

## Says Artists Deny They Are Jews; Join Nazis in Order to Escape Persecution

Hurok, Back from Europe, Says Situation in Germany Recalls Days of Czarist Russia

The deplorable situation in Germany has caused a number of Jewish artists to deny their Jewish affiliation and even to join the Nazi movement in an effort to escape the lash of the Nazi whip. This statement was made by S. Hurok, noted Jewish musical entrepreneur, in an interview with a representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency upon his return from Europe.

As an example, Mr. Hurok gave the case of Eric Kleiber, noted German conductor, who has appeared in the United States with the Philharmonic Orchestra. Herr Kleiber is a Jew, but he denies this and has joined the Hitlerite movement in order to maintain his position in the German musical world, alleged Mr. Hurok.

The present situation of the German Jews recalls Czaristic Russia when Jews pretended they were Christians, some even going through the conversion forms, in order to secure permission to reside in Moscow and St. Petersburg, which were barred to Jews, Mr. Hurok said.

He asserted that the von Papen government is not very energetic in its measures to counteract the anti-Semitic propaganda of Adolph Hitler's cohorts.

## Elizabeth to Have Community Chest; Congregation Campaigns

ELIZABETH, N. J., Sept. 12—Primarily through the efforts of Harry Lebau, executive director of the Local Y.M.-Y.W.H.A., a Community Chest, which has been talked of here for a number of years, has now become a reality. An organization committee, with Mr. Lebau acting as secretary, has completed its work and a decision was reached today to have the first Chest campaign early in November for an estimated quota of \$175,000. What the budgetary requirements will be for the Jewish charity and welfare organizations is now being determined by the latter group, who have already pledged their support to the Chest.

Four prominent Jews: Dr. Emil Stein, Samuel Koestler, Henry Piper and Nathan R. Leavitt, are among the citizens already named to the Chest board of trustees. Mr. Lebau, who has been at the helm of "Y" activities for the past several years, was formerly identified with the field staff of the Joint Distribution Committee.

## Jews Demand Individual and Collective Equality Rights Says Head of German Zionists

Ussishkin Says Palestine Matter of Settlement Between Arabs of Near East and Jews the World Over

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

FRANKFURT-AM-MAIN, Sept. 12—The annual convention of the Federation of Zionists of Germany opened here yesterday with the participation of 150 delegates and a large number of guests.

Kurt Blumenfeld, president of the Federation, who opened the sessions, described the spread of Nationalism in Germany and its effect on the position of the Jews in the country.

"We do not demand national autonomy," Dr. Blumenfeld declared, "but individual and collective equality rights, particularly the right of Jews to conduct their own schools."

## Services for Mrs. Grabelsky, Patron of Hebrew Culture

Funeral services were held on Sunday for Mrs. Bath Sheba Grabelsky, wife of the Zionist worker, B. Grabelsky, who was known as a pioneer patron of Hebrew culture in this country.

The body of Mrs. Grabelsky, which will ultimately be taken to Palestine for burial, was temporarily interred in Mount Carmel Cemetery.

Her husband and three children survive. Mr. Grabelsky formerly served as treasurer of the Zionist organization of America.

Both have been prominently identified with Zionist activity in this country, particularly with the propagation of Hebrew culture.

Mrs. Grabelsky financed the publication of a children's magazine in Hebrew.

## New York Chapters of Alliance Elect Executive

The New York chapters of the Jewish National Workers Alliance concluded its two day sessions with the election of a new executive committee.

The Committee which will be empowered to elect its officers is comprised of: A. Sosnow, J. Tiplerowsky, A. Shudrow, J. Chafkin, L. Boxnbom, M. Yskowitz and M. Kaufman.

The board of directors of the Hebrew Orphans Sheltering Institution in Newark, N. J., has retained J. Emanuel Wiseman, formerly of Brooklyn and Providence, as its new superintendent. Mr. Wiseman himself was raised in the Brooklyn Hebrew Orphan Asylum, on whose supervisory staff he later served for six years. A graduate of Brown University, he also held positions with the Jewish Orphanage of Rhode Island and more recently with the Hebrew National Orphans Home at Yonkers, N. Y.

Funeral services were held in Jersey City for Jacob Heyman, prominent in Hudson County, N. J. The deceased was a member of Temple Beth El and active in Jewish charitable endeavor, notably the Hebrew Orphans Home of Hudson County.

## Samaritan High Priest Is Opposed to Balfour Declaration Says "Falastin"

**Alleged Interview Causing Surprise at Religious Sect Aided by Jewish Bodies Since Balfour Declaration Issued**

JERUSALEM, Sept. 12.—Some surprise is occasioned here today by the publication in the "Falastin," Arab nationalist publication, of an alleged interview with the High Priest of the Samaritans wherein the latter is quoted as stating he does not recognize the Balfour Declaration and does not agree that Palestine be rehabilitated as the Jewish national homeland under a Jewish government.

The Samaritans are a small Jewish religious sect, dating their existence as a separate community from 722 before the common era, who live strictly according to the Torah and who have permitted no modern adaptations to enter the habit and customs of their existence.

The viewpoint of this religious sect is not considered of any vital importance, because of the smallness of the group, but it is causing some astonishment in view of the fact that many Jewish bodies have helped the Samaritans both materially and spiritually since the issuance of the Balfour Declaration.

## Colby Calls for Nomination Of Colonel Lehman

Bainbridge Colby, Secretary of State in the cabinet of President Woodrow Wilson, in a signed article which appeared in yesterday's "American," calls upon the Democratic Party to unite behind the candidacy of Lieutenant Governor Herbert H. Lehman for governor of New York State.

"For the Democratic Party to nominate any other candidate than Lieutenant Governor Lehman to succeed Governor Roosevelt is to repudiate the Roosevelt policies that have won popular confidence for the Democratic party," he declares.

## High Commissioner Promises Contribution to Bahimah Fund

JERUSALEM, Sept. 12.—The Palestine High Commissioner, Sir Arthur Grenfell Wauchope, yesterday promised a Bahimah delegation a contribution of £50 to its construction fund.

The fund is to be utilized for the purpose of erecting a playhouse for the Bahimah company in Tel Aviv.

An innovation for Jewish religious schools has been introduced at Temple Ohabai Shalom in San Francisco.

I. Adriel Fried, principal of the school, has evolved a plan whereby the intermediate groups of the school have begun conducting weekly class sessions by reading a specially prepared children's service during which a different Biblical story and brief sermon are delivered by selected pupils.

**Roumanian Prime Minister Promises  
Important Concessions Following Repre-  
sentations of Jewish Deputies**

BUCHAREST.—The Prime Minister, M. Vayda-Voyvod, has promised a number of important concessions to the Jewish population in the course of an interview with a delegation of the members of the Jewish Party, Deputies Dr. Ebner, Dr. Josef Fischer, Advocate M. Landau, and E. Marton, accompanied by Dr. Stern, the General Secretary of the Jewish Party.

The Jewish Deputies began by raising the question of the Nationality Law. They pointed out that under the existing law tens of thousands of inhabitants, Jews and also non-Jews, are denied Roumanian citizenship and are consequently Stateless, people without a country. They reminded the Prime Minister that he himself had in 1919 signed the Minorities Treaty, under which these people should have been given Roumanian citizenship.

The Prime Minister promised that the Minister of Justice would appoint a special commission to go into this matter and that during this autumn the Nationality Law would be amended, to put an end to the Stateless position of these tens of thousands of inhabitants of the country.

The Jewish Deputies then brought up the question of the Communities Law. They pointed out that the Communities Law enacted by the former Minister of Education and Public Worship, M. Vlad, in the Maniu Government of which M. Vayda-Voyvod was a member, had created chaos in Jewish life. The Jewish Communities had no official existence; they had no taxation rights and they were generally handicapped in their work. They reminded the Premier that the entire Jewish population of Roumania, belonging to all movements and parties, had united in protest against the Vlad Law and demanded its abolition.

The Prime Minister said that he was willing to consider measures to extend the autonomy of the Jewish Communities, and to enable them to organize as speedily as possible. The Premier's attention was drawn to efforts that had been made by outside people to interfere in the internal affairs of the Jewish Community, and he assured the Deputies that such things would not be allowed to recur.

On the question of Sabbath observance, the Prime Minister said that he would take measures to enable Jewish artisans to work on Sundays if they really observe the Sabbath. The Government would provide facilities in this respect, in the same way as in the question of Sabbath observance by Jew-

## "Unser Zeit" Complaints of Maltreatment of Jews at Hands of Revenue Officials

**Says Small Jewish Traders in the  
Provinces in Particular Are  
Victimized**

KISHINEV, Sept. 12.—The maltreatment of Jews by revenue officials, particularly small Jewish traders in the villages, is disclosed by "Unser Zeit."

It reports that on August 29th, a tax collector, accompanied by a police sergeant entered the shop of a small Jewish trader in Kishinev, Motti Pekl, and demanded the payment of certain taxes. In support of his demand, he produced a summons which carried a different name.

Pekl drew the attention of the officials to this and insisted that he had already paid his taxes. The officers were adamant however. They insisted upon additional payment threatening to confiscate Pekl's scales, without which it was impossible for him to continue in business.

The Jewish merchant begged the officers to give him some extension of time to make the payment. The answer of the officials was to fall upon Pekl with sticks. The Jew was saved from their fury by the intervention of neighbors.

## Work on Mosul Oil Pipe Line to Begin Thursday

Next Thursday will see the beginning of work on the oil pipe line which is to extend 1,200 miles across Iraq, Palestine and Syria and which will be laid at a cost of \$54,000,000, "World Petroleum" states in its current issue.

Engineers from Great Britain, France and the United States will begin to connect Iraq by a great Y-shaped tube with two ports on the Mediterranean.

## "Jewish Mystic" Returns from Cross Country Tour Half Starved

Sabin O. ish children attending Government schools.

The Minister of Education, M. Dimitri Gusti, was called in to take part in the discussions on the Jewish schools question. The Premier and the Minister of Education both declared that the Government is anxious to find a satisfactory method of solving the difficulty with regard to providing Jewish teachers for the Jewish schools. Unfortunately, the present financial situation of the country did not allow the Government at the moment to establish a Jewish Teachers' Seminary as the Jewish Deputies demanded. An agreement was reached, however, between the Government spokesmen and the Jewish Deputies that the rights of the existing Jewish teachers should not be affected, and in order to enable additional teachers to qualify, short term courses will be arranged for Jewish teachers who have matriculated, and who will on passing the examinations receive diplomas entitling them to the same rights as all other teachers who hold the teachers' certificate. The Prime Minister also promised to speak with the Minister of Finance about the subsidies for the Jewish schools.

The Prime Minister also promised to go into the question of the subsidies for the Jewish Communities, and the salaries of the Jewish teachers when the Government draws up its next budget, and said that the subsidies for 1932 will be paid regularly each month.

The Jewish Deputies drew the attention of the Premier to the difficult economic position of the Jewish population, and the heavy burden of taxation borne by the town population to which the Jews mainly belong, in comparison with the villages. The position of the Jewish co-operatives was also discussed.

The Prime Minister has arranged to discuss the economic questions again with the Jewish Deputies at greater length in the presence of the Ministers in charge of the economic departments.

The attention of the Prime Minister was drawn to the brutal methods employed by the local administrations against the Zionist youth organizations, and he promised the Jewish Deputies to see that this matter should be regulated in accordance with the wishes expressed by the Zionist Organization.

The Prime Minister, in conclusion, expressed his readiness at all times to consider the problems of interest to the Jewish population and to endeavor to satisfy their demands.

Pekl was hurried to the Finance Administrator, where he complained against the treatment accorded him. The administrator however merely expressed disgust that a Jew should appear before him covered with blood.

"You take every opportunity to demonstrate the red colors in public," the administrator asserted.

A physician who was asked for a medical certificate attesting to Pekl's condition replied: "I don't understand the alarm. After all, he didn't kill you."

## Exhibition to Aid Indigent Jewish Artists

An Emergency Aid for Jewish Artists has been formed upon the initiative of members of the Women's Organization of Central Synagogue, and is sponsoring an exhibition of paintings to aid indigent Jewish artists. The exhibition is to be held at the Central Synagogue Community House, from November 1st to 20th.

The pictures are to be purchased from needy Jewish artists, and are to be selected by outstanding art critics. For each work of art, whether wood-cut, painting, or etching, the artist is to receive \$25, and in order to raise the necessary funds for the purpose, books of 25 subscriptions at \$1 each, have been issued. Every book, when filled, will entitle the individual or organization to one picture, which will be awarded after the exhibit, to be disposed of as the group see fit.
