Public Prosecutor Brings Action Against Nazi Deputy As Immunity Lapses

One Nazi Freed; Two Get Money Fines
for Attacking Jewish Scouts
Enroute to Convention

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Sept. 17.—The public prosecutor of Cologne today brought action against the Nazi deputy Boerger on charges of inciting to violence.

The action comes eight months after Boerger addressed a Nazi meeting in Cologne and agitated for acts of violence against the Jews.

Boerger, it is stated, could not be persecuted previously because of Parliamentary immunity which he enjoyed. This status is no longer valid, in view of the dissolution of the Reichstag, it is pointed out.

Unusually small sentences were imposed today on two Nazis who attacked Jewish boy scouts enroute to Frankfurt to attend a scout convention, while a third was released. While the public prosecutor asked sentences of 6 months imprisonment be imposed and counsel for the Nazis pleaded for a money fine only, the court ordered the release of one of the accused and fined the remaining two defendants 25 marks each.

BERLIN, Sept. 17.—The Paderborn court today sentenced to 15 years imprisonment, Kurt Meyer, who was found guilty of the premeditated murder of a maid servant in the home of his family.

The Nazi press has made much of the case and has labelled it an instance of ritual murder.

It is learned that the Meyer family has not been connected with the Jewish community for years.

Order Library of Munkacz Rebbe Confiscated for Taxes

PRAGUE, Sept. 17.—The valuable library of Rebbe Shapiro, known as the Munkacz rebbe, was confiscated by the authorities today for alleged failure to pay his taxes.

The authorities claimed taxes in the amount of one million kronen, based on profits allegedly made on the sale of Pidyonoth, being burials paid by the chassidim when visiting the rebbe.

Says One Tenth of Austrian High Society Has Jewish Blood In Its Veins

Austrian Writer Says There Is No Racial Purity; Jewish Blood Flows in
Veins of Many Royal Families

VIENNA, Sept. 17.—Declaring that there is no racial purity, Otto Forst de Battaglia, well known Austrian writer, declares in a new book, "Secrets of the Blood," that many royal families have Jewish blood in their veins.

Esther Shapiro, he asserts, daughter of a vice-chancellor of Peter the Great of Russia, brought Jewish blood into twenty royal families. Among them he lists the Chigis, hereditary marshalls of the Roman Catholic Church, the Polish royal families of Lubomirski, Potocki and Lanckoronski; and the Dukes of Holstein.

One tenth of high Austrian society has Jewish blood in its veins, he declares, through marriages with Perelars, Arnstein, Henigstein and others.

Allegations Against Dr. Weiss Disputed at Opening of Libel Suit Against "Angriff" Editor

Only Defense Offered by "Angriff" Editor Is That He Has Already
Withdrawn Charges

BERLIN, Sept. 17.—The trial of Lippert Krause, editor of "Der Angriff," Berlin Hitler organ, who is being sued for libel by Dr. Bernhard Weiss, ousted Jewish vice-president of the Berlin police department, opened here yesterday.

Dr. Weiss entered suit against Krause when the latter charged that in Paris he had been connected with disreputable institutions.

Dr. Weiss on the witness stand yesterday was able to prove the complete falsity of the allegations against him.

The only defense the Nazi editor has thus far offered is that he has already withdrawn the allegations.

BULLETIN TAKES OVER PUBLICATION OF "JEWISH CURRENT EVENTS," YOUTH JOURNAL INITIATED FIVE YEARS AGO BY ASSOCIATED TALMUD TORAH

To Be Weekly; Is Only Publication Of Its Kind; Strict Impartiality and

Tenants of Sholom Aleichem Co-operative House May Bring Suit for Damages

A suit for damages will be entered if 26 tenants of the Sholom Aleichem co-operative apartments, occupied by 212 Jewish writers' and artists' families, are evicted in accordance with dispossess warrants issued by Justice William E. Morris of the Second District Court, it is learned.

Attorney for the tenants claimed that Justice Morris had refused to admit evidence and had made premature judgments.

The situation arose through the foreclosure on the house, which was built and occupied on a co-operative basis. The tenants claim that an agreement was reached with the landlord of the house to permit half of the rental to drift provided the co-operative association paid the other half. The association paid \$1,000, but the landlord did not live up to his half of the agreement, while the title guaranty company likewise failed to adhere to an agreement tentatively arranged by its representative. As a result, the majority of tenants have gone on strike, refusing to pay their rent.

The "World Telegram," commenting on this situation, declares: "The Sholom Aleichem centre was a courageous social experiment which succeeded in all but finances. The depression defeated it there. The 212 families are anxious to remain together and continue their community life. Some agreement should be reached permitting them to do this."

President George E. Gordon of Congregation Beth-El of Chelsea, Mass., announces that Rabbi Jacob Freedman of Springfield, Mass., who formerly occupied pulpits at Ahtsferdan, N. Y. and Long Beach, Cal., has been elected as the officiating rabbi of Congregation Beth-El in Chelsea.

Nathan Straus, Jr. Gives \$5,000 For Immediate Palestine Aid

Responding to the warning of Louis Lipsky, national chairman of the American Palestine Campaign, that the activities of the Jewish Agency for Palestine face a collapse unless American Jewry immediately provides funds, Nathan Straus, Jr. has given a check for \$5,000 for immediate transmission to Palestine, paying a pledge months in advance before it was expected, according to an announcement made by the American Palestine Campaign headquarters.

Commenting upon Mr. Lipsky's frankness in revealing the serious financial stringency of the Jewish Agency, Mr. Straus declared that "Jews here are entitled to know the facts as to Palestine. Much of our distress in America today has been made sharper because of the tendency to gloss over and distort the basic facts. The American people were sufficiently mature to have been told the truth. We Jews must learn from that experience."

BALTIMORE, Sept. 17—Louis Lipsky, chairman of the American Palestine Campaign, who addressed a meeting of Baltimore Zionists here, called upon them to tie up all their activities directly with Palestine endeavor.

Mr. Lipsky was also the guest of honor at a luncheon tendered by the Baltimore Zionist region, where a campaign for Palestine funds in the near future, was decided upon.

BALTIMORE, Sept. 17—A visit by the delegates to the Hechalutz Farm at Parkville, outside of Baltimore, marked yesterday's proceedings of the convention of the Poale Zion-Zeire Zion, the United Jewish Socialist Labor Party.

Six Chalutzim now live at the place during a period of training and preparation prior to their departure for Palestine. They are undergoing a practical course under the guidance of the well-known Palestine agronomist, Joseph Ettlinger.

A report, which aroused a lively discussion afterwards, was made today by Pinchus Gindgold, of New York, on the Jewish public schools and teachers' seminary.

There are today, he said, under auspices of the party and the Jewish National Workers' Alliance, close to sixty schools in various parts of the country and a seminary in New York.

Mr. Gindgold was followed by Joel Entin, president of the seminary, who read a paper on the cultural activities of the movement.

Baruch Zuckerman, member of the executive committee, reported today on the deliberations of the World Conference at Danzig last month and the Jewish Agency.

Prices of Food Packages To Russia Reduced

Food packages sent by American Jews to friends and relatives in Russia through the Hebrew Sheltering and Immigrant Aid Society will now cost from twenty-five to thirty percent less according to announcement made yesterday by John L. Bernstein, chairman of the Society's Committee on Work in Foreign Countries.

This reduction in the prices is the result of negotiations between Hias and the Soviet government. It was pointed out that elderly and pious Jews could not possibly make use of orders on the Torgsin stores in Russia, first because of the matter of "kashruth," and secondly because the Torgsin stores, owing to the food scarcity in Russia, cannot supply all the desired articles.

General food packages are not limited either as to quantity or as to the number of times they may be forwarded. The only limitations made are in the quantity of sugar, coffee, cocoa and soap—three kilos of sugar and two kilos of either coffee, cocoa or soap may be sent to the same person in each month.

Synagogues Not to Admit Worshippers Without Tickets

CHICAGO, Sept. 17—The Federation of Chicago Jewish Congregations, representing twenty-two reform and conservative congregations, has decided to abolish free service periods for adults during the high holidays and will not permit anyone to enter the synagogues for services unless tickets are shown.

The resolutions were not adopted, Gustav D. Golding, president of the Federation explained, "to deny any poor person the right to worship, but because of the common practice of a great many people who could afford to pay for the luxuries, but who demanded admission to our religious institutions during the high holidays and expect such institutions to be maintained throughout the year by their regular members."

Persons who are unable to purchase tickets will be given free tickets as long as they are available at various temples, it was explained, upon application.

To Hold Memorial Meeting For Dr. Goldflam

WARSAW, Sept. 17—A memorial meeting will be held here on September 27, to honor the late Dr. Samuel Goldflam, it was decided yesterday by the Executive Committee of the Warsaw Jewish Community.

The town of Otwozsk will name a street after Dr. Goldflam.

Dr. Goldflam was a leading Jewish member of the medical profession and a member of the Jewish Agency for Palestine. He died in Warsaw on August 27 at the age of eighty.

Hans Goslar, Jewish Press Chief for Thirteen Years, Is Definitely Dismissed from Post

Had Previously Been Sent on Leave of
Absence Owing to Nazi Pressure
Against Him Because He Is a Jew

BERLIN, Sept. 17—Ministerial Director Hans Goslar, who for 13 years had been head of the Press Department of the Prussian Government, which was originally founded by him, will not resume his duties after October 1st, when his leave of absence expires, it is learned here.

In accordance with the decision adopted by the Commissar of Prussia, he is now to be definitely dismissed from his post.

Herr Hans Goslar took the opportunity before vacating his position to hold a conference of representatives of the foreign and local press. He laid stress on the fact that his future work will not be connected with politics. He had always desired to establish cordial relations between the Prussian Government and the press, he said, although occasional conflicts could not be avoided. He wished the press to appreciate the fact that his position had not always been an easy one, but he had tried to carry out his duties honestly and with the best intentions of serving the German Fatherland.

Herr Goslar's leave of absence, and his consequent dismissal, is due to Nazi pressure, it is stated, because he is a Jew.

Jewish Socialist Party Formed in France

PARIS, Sept. 17—For the first time in the history of the Jews in France, a Jewish Socialist Party has been created and already has several hundred members.

The new party bears the name of "The Jewish Socialist Union in France," and according to its constitution has the "same aims and program as the French section of the Workers International."

The Jewish Union, it is pointed out, has in addition, a distinct field of work and that is to conduct Socialist propaganda among the Jewish immigrant workers; to watch over their economic, cultural and political interests. Among the members of the new party is the well-known Yiddish poet, David Einhorn. The Union has a weekly organ.

Jews Seek to Organize Community Federation

TUNIS, Sept. 17—A movement for the organization of a federation of Jewish communities in Tunisia has been launched.

The recurrent outbreaks have helped to demonstrate to the Jews of Tunisia the need for an organized body.

Jewish Question Playing Part in Dis- cussion of Plans for New Party

BERLIN—The Jewish question is playing a certain part in the present considerations for the formation of a new party to support the von Papen Government.

The question is whether Jews should or should not be accepted as members of this new party. The Stahlhelm organization of German ex-soldiers, which is to form the backbone of this party, has had several Jews among its founders. Later the policy conducted by the Stahlhelm forced these Jews to resign from the organization and Jewish members have not since been admitted.

A direct anti-Semitic policy is, however, not carried on by the Stahlhelm, and friendly relations are maintained with the Union of Jewish Ex-Soldiers in Germany.

In spite of the revelation that Colonel Duestenberg, the present leader of the Stahlhelm, is of Jewish descent, the Stahlhelm leaders do not desire Jews to be admitted to the new party, wishing to avoid the risk of being denounced by the National Socialists as a "Jewish Party."

At the same time, it is not desired that racial purity as preached by the National Socialists should become the principle also of this new party. Endeavors are being made, therefore, to keep this delicate question of Jewish participation in the background. This may not, however, be possible, since the new party, when actually formed, will have to face the question of the enrolment of Jews in the organization. A number of Conservative Jews, and particularly the Union of National German Jews, are already taking a lively interest in the proposed new organization.

The von Papen Government has so far not expressed itself in any way on the Jewish question, apart from the statement on behalf of President von Hindenburg to the Central Union of German Citizens of Jewish Faith, which was issued after the von Papen Government was formed.

It is thought, nevertheless, that the majority of the Jews in Germany would prefer the von Papen Government to remain in power rather than see a coalition Government materialize between Herr Hitler and Dr. Brüning.

Herr von Papen has never shown himself to be an anti-Semite. Several years ago, when he was President of the League for the Protection of German Culture Against Bolshevism, he invited a representative of the Jewish religion to participate in a mass meeting held in the Berlin Sports Palace to protest against the persecution of religion in Russia.

Warburg Appeals for Aid To Jewish Federation in Present Emergency Situation

Is Member of Steering Committee of
Five in Campaign for \$3,923,000 to
Open on October 16th

Facing the most critical relief emergency in the history of organized philanthropy, the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies has drafted a group of outstanding leaders of former years to direct its 1932 appeal to complete a budget of \$3,923,000 for the support of ninety-one affiliated philanthropies, it was announced yesterday by former Supreme Court Justice Joseph M. Proskauer, president of Federation.

The group will be in effect a steering committee and will include Felix M. Warburg, one of the founders of Federation and its first president; Percy S. Straus, who was first chairman of the Business Men's Council, the fundraising division of Federation; Arthur Lehman and Sol M. Strock, former presidents; and George Blumenthal, head of Mount Sinai Hospital, the largest of the affiliated institutions.

The campaign, which will open on October 16, will be under the supervision of this group of what might be termed the elder statesmen of Federation, which is now the largest Jewish organization of its kind in the world.

Speaking for the committee, Mr. Warburg said, "Everyone is well aware of the conditions which men and women will have to face this year. Those in-

Want Jew as Czech Consul General in Cuba

HAVANA, Sept. 17—Foreign Minister Benes of Czechoslovakia has instructed the Czechoslovakian Ambassador in Washington, Dr. F. Veverka, to offer appointment as Czechoslovakian Consul General in Cuba to Mayer Lishovitz, a Czechoslovakian Jew residing in Havana, it is learned here today.

Mr. Lishovitz sailed for the United States today in connection with this matter.

Dr. Lishovitz has been resident in Havana for ten years. He also has the title of rabbi. He is active in Jewish communal life here and is president of the Congregation Adath Israel and of the newly formed Federation of Jewish Communities.

Mayor Indorses Detroit's Five Cent Kosher Kitchen

Formulating Plans for Re-Opening of Bezalel School

JERUSALEM, Sept. 17.—The Bezalel School of Arts and Crafts, founded by the late Professor Boris Schatz, owing to lack of funds, will be reopened as a public institution according to plans now in the process of formulation.

This information is divulged in a letter received from Henrietta Szold by Mrs. Eli Daiches, Director of the Friends of Bezalel in Chicago.

After the death of Professor Schatz, several meetings were held in Palestine of the founders, the members, and the contributors to Bezalel, as well as the representatives of several public institutions, Mrs. Szold wrote. The purpose was to find a way of continuing the activities, with the result that a Committee of the Bezalel Society was formed, headed by Dr. Lurie, the Acting Director of the Jewish public schools of Palestine. Dr. Sapier was temporarily appointed manager of Bezalel.

A second committee was formed, consisting of the teachers of the former Bezalel School, also under the chairmanship of Dr. Lurie, for the purpose of elaborating a plan for the re-opening of the school. The Committee entered into negotiations with the various groups of "Friends of Bezalel" which have been formed in various countries, especially in the United States, in order to influence them to renew their activities for the good of the institution. Another step was taken by the Chairman, who applied to the Education Department of the government to grant an annual subsidy for the maintenance of the school.

The activities of the Society, the library, the museum, the picture gallery and the workshops, are housed in buildings registered in the name of the Keren Kayemeth.

Under the arrangements contemplated the revived school will be a public institution under the management of the Committee. The Jewish National Fund has promised a certain sum of money for the repair of its buildings as soon as the Committee shall be confirmed officially.

The Chicago branch of the Hebrew Immigrant Aid Society of America is sponsoring an inter-collegiate oratorical contest on the work of Hias, which will be held in Chicago on January 22, 1933. The purpose of the contest is to awaken the interest of Jewish college students in the work and activities of the Hias. Hirsch E. Sobel, director of the contest, announced that all Jewish students enrolled regularly at a college or university within a 500-mile radius of Chicago are eligible to participate. Registration should be made before October 31. Entrants will have the choice of any subject dealing with Hias history, activity, function, or necessity of Hias, widening of Hias work, Jewish immigration policy, Jewish aliens, etc.

Jew Is All University Speaker for First Time

IOWA CITY, Sept. 17.—Dr. Moses Jung, Professor of Religion at the State University of Iowa, was invited to be the All University Speaker at the opening Vesper Service. He is the first Jewish professor so honored.

Last year he had the honor of being invited to deliver the coveted Baconian lecture before the University faculty. The Iowa School of Religion is the only University School of its kind in the world. "Cooperation without compromise" is the principle which guides the activities of its Catholic, Jewish, Protestant and non-denominational professors and which has been described as the most encouraging aspect of campus life.

Czech Health Resort Prohibits Schechita

PRAGUE, Sept. 17.—Schechita was prohibited today by the municipality of Eger, a health resort in Czechoslovakia, by order of the municipality.

All animals must be stunned before slaughtering, the municipality ruled, adding that it understands that this is not contrary to Jewish tradition.

David Graubart, rabbi of Beth Israel synagogue, Rock Island, Ill., will become rabbi of Tifereth Israel Community Synagogue of Des Moines, Iowa, on October 1st. He will succeed Rabbi Lewis Grossman.

Rabbi Samuel Segal, a graduate of the Jewish Institute of Religion, Class of 1932, has been appointed Social Director of Congregation B'nai Jehshurun, New York, and Leader of its Junior Congregation.
