Comsomol Seeks 440 Volunteers For Settlement in Bira Bidjan For Period of Two Years

Appeal for Volunteers Issued by Ukrainian Young Communist Body;
Delegate Sent from Bira Bidjan

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

MOSCOW, Sept. 21—A delegate has been despatched from Bira Bidjan to recruit 440 volunteers from the Comsomol, Communist youth organization, for settlement in Bira Bidjan, it was learned yesterday.

The delegate will work in co-operation with the Ukrainian Comsomol which has issued an appeal for the 440 volunteers, particularly for building activity.

Thus far, however, only seventy-two have registered. The 440 volunteers will be required to serve for a period of two years.

The Bira Bidjan delegate has been instructed by the Bidjan administration not to minimize the hardships involved and to accept only such volunteers as are willing to recruit themselves in the face of the frequent lack of food, the summer floods which have this year destroyed most of the crop and the lack

Arab Sports Group Declines To Merge With Hapoel

JERUSALEM, Sept. 21—An invitation to merge with it extended to the Arab Sports organization by the Hapoel, Labor sports organization, was turned down by the Arabs, it was learned today.

The Hapoel recently resigned from the Palestine Sports Federation because it is allegedly dominated by the Maccabim.

Catholic Clergymen Prohibited From Supporting Nazis by Order of Bishopric

New Archbishop of Vienna Known for Sympathetic Attitude Toward Jews

VIENNA, Sept. 21—Catholic clergymen were prohibited from supporting the National Socialists or their ceremonies in a letter sent out today by the Archbishop of upper Austria.

A similar prohibition, it is expected, will be issued by the Archbishop of Vienna.

The action, it is believed, is due to the fact that in the latest communal elections, an alarming reduction in the Christian Socialist vote was noted, in favor of the Nazis.

VIENNA, Sept. 21—The appointment of Professor Theodor Innitzer, former rector of the University of Vienna, as Archbishop is arousing satisfaction in Jewish circles where he is well known for his sympathetic stand toward the Jews.

During his tenure as dean of the University of Vienna, Professor Innitzer was energetic in his suppression of anti-Semitic disturbances. He was insistent upon the observance of the equality rights of the Jews when he served as Minister of Education.

The new Archbishop is a member of the Pro-Palestine Committee in Austria. He has delivered several lectures on Jewish rehabilitative work in Palestine before Catholic audiences.

Leon Blum to Interpellate Parliament on Tunis Excesses

PARIS, Sept. 21—Deputy Leon Blum, Jewish leader of the French Socialist Party, will submit an interpellation in Parliament calling upon the French government to take stringent measures to suppress the Arab attacks on the Jews of Tunisia, it is learned here today.

Anti-Jewish attacks on the part of Arabs have been recurrent throughout Tunisia in the past several months, and while Premier Herriot has promised measures to prevent their renewal, the attacks have not yet ceased.

Polish Zionists Ask Revisionists Be Prevented From Exercising Rights as Separate Union

Charge Resolution on Discipline a Breach of Zionist Rules; Want Changes Held Up

WARSAW, Sept. 21—The Central Committee of the Polish Zionist Organization today sent a memorandum to the Zionist Executive calling for action against the Revisionists to be brought before the Congress Court of honor.

The action, according to the memorandum, is to be brought in order to prevent the Revisionists from exercising their rights as a separate union within the Zionist Organization, as approved at the last meeting of the Actions Committee in July.

The resolution adopted by the Revisionist Congress in Vienna last month, stating that the Revisionist Union has the first right to discipline its members, is called an open breach of Zionist discipline in the memorandum.

The memorandum also asks that the reorganization of Zionist institutions and Palestine offices, as decided by the Actions Committee, be deferred until the Executive makes a pronouncement of its attitude toward the decisions of the Revisionist congress.

2 Jewish Communists Sentenced To Death; Plead Innocence

BERLIN, Sept. 21—Two Jewish Communists were sentenced to death today by a special court which tried them on charges of having participated in an attack in Charlottenburg on Hitler Storm Troop Number 33, where one Nazi was killed.

The two Jews sentenced were among four Communists tried on the same charges.

The Jews, Werner Caam, aged 23, a clerk in a store and Fritz Zweig, aged twenty, a painter, pleaded not guilty. They maintain they did not participate in the attack. The public prosecutor insisted upon his charges because, it is explained, the two Jews organized a household defense against Nazi attacks.

The storm troop, allegedly attacked, is notorious for its part in the attack on the Jews on the Jewish New Year, last year. The Nazi killed is named Batschke.

Leaders Meet Tonight to Discuss Federation Drive

Leaders in the \$3,923,000 campaign of the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies will meet tonight at the Savoy Plaza Hotel to discuss the critical situation of privately supported philanthropies, and to formulate plans for the 1932 drive of the Federation, which will open on October 16, it was announced by former Supreme Court Judge Joseph M. Proskauer, president of the Federation.

Speakers at the meeting will include Judge Proskauer, who will outline the crisis which philanthropy faces this winter; Dr. Solomon Lowenstein, executive director of the Federation, who attended the conference with President Hoover on relief work and will discuss the national aspects of the problem; Waldemar Kops, chairman of the campaign executive committee; and Samuel D. Leidesdorf, chairman of the Business Men's Council, which is the money-raising unit of the Federation.

Professional and business leaders, more than seventy-five of whom are expected to attend the meeting, represent the various divisions within the Federation which operate in their own fields to solicit contributions during the campaign. Last year more than 100 business, professional and trade groups were represented in the organization of the drive.

Among those who are expected to attend the meeting are the steering committee of five comprised of Felix M. Warburg, Percy S. Straus, Sol M. Stroeck, George Blumenthal and Arthur Lehman.

PARAMOUNT COMPANY SCORED FOR PLACING ADVERTISEMENTS IN NAZI FILM PAPER

Press Points to Fact That Jewish Money Is Thus Indirectly Supporting Incitement Against Their Own Brethren; Company Official Here Says It Is Investigating Matter

The disclosures by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency in a cable from Berlin dated September 8th that the Paramount Film Company is patronizing a Nazi film publication through large advertisements, is arousing widespread comment in the Jewish press in this country and abroad.

It is pointed out that even such companies as the "Ufa," controlled by Dr. Alfred Hugenberg, head of the Nationalist Party of Germany which has not been friendly to the Jews, have not advertised in the film organ. The Paramount company's patronage of the organ has moreover enabled it to enlarge its activities and to appear as a weekly, instead of twice monthly as hitherto.

The Jewish Telegraphic Agency addressed an inquiry to the Paramount officials in this country. It has received a reply signed by J. H. Seidelman, manager of the foreign department of the company, written in behalf of Adolph Zukor, president of the company, which states that an inquiry has been despatched to Berlin with regard to this matter and that the company prefers to make no statement until the facts are known to it.

Among the papers which comment upon the matter are the C-V Zeitung of Berlin, "Opinion" of New York, the "Hebrew Journal" of Toronto and the "Israelite Press" of Winnipeg.

The C-V Zeitung, organ of the Central Union of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith carries in its issue of September 9, 1932, which has just reached this country, a correspondence which it says comes from film circles in Germany, scoring the action of the German branch of the American film production company, Paramount, in placing advertising in the Nazi film organ "Der Deutsche Film".

The C-V Zeitung correspondence declares as follows: "It is well known that the principal activity of the 'Kultur-politik' of the National Socialist Party centers around the radio and film industries. It is equally well known that the entire Nazi 'Kultur-politik' is comprised of nothing more than unexampled agitation against Jewish collaborators in both these industries regardless of their value, from a purely objective standpoint, and regardless of how much they are part and parcel of Germany.

"For some months now there has been appearing a paper called 'Der Deutsche Film', published by the National Socialist Party, Department of Films, and openly labelled as the National Socialist Film Paper.

"Thus far it has not been possible to find in this paper any new ideas worthy of discussion or any new constructive

proposals. Were German films like 'Der Deutsche Film,' they would never have attained their position of cultural importance or the prestige they enjoy today throughout the world.

"The paper is devoted exclusively to scandalous articles anti-Semitic in character. It is overwhelmed with hatred for the Jews.

"Certainly there are things and people in the film industry calling for justified criticism. But the Nazi organ assails every Jew in the film industry in sullied terms without any differentiation. The attempt is made to destroy the reputation of every Jew in the most justified manner.

"The film industry itself, regardless of the political or religious adherences of its affiliates, without exception spurned this publication. Not a single producer, beginning with 'Ufa' down to the smallest film rentier, took notice of the paper's appearance or placed any advertisements with it.

"The last issue of 'Der Deutsche Film', September 3, however, brought the first exception to the consolidated indifference to the Nazi film publication. Responsible for this is not a German producing firm, but a daughter organization of the American Paramount Company, the German Paramount Company, A-G. This organization can claim for itself the sad distinction of giving decisive support to the existence of this anti-Semitic film paper by placing (two) 2 full page advertisements with it.

"This act, — unfortunately — deserves to be nailed.

"The same issue of the paper publishes on its front page a characteristic article entitled: 'Who Are the American Film Producers?' A number of well known American producers are listed and at the end the following comment is appended: 'Of these eight magnates of the film industry, seven are Jews. Of these film powers, who exercise the largest influence in the film industry in the United States five are immigrated of 'Ostjudenstammlinge'.

"Strangely enough the one name missing from this list is that of one of the largest American film firms — that of the Paramount Company, founded by the Hungarian Jew, Adolph Zukor, its president, and Jesse L. Lasky. In executive positions are Sam Katz and Emanuel Cohen. The European interests of the Company and the German Paramount A-G, are under the direction of Ike Blumenthal, the company's general representative.

"Through the insertion of two pages of advertising, it would appear, the German Paramount Company has freed itself from inclusion in this list. If

Jews of Germany Adequately Handling Own Situation Says Jewish Women's Council Head

Mrs. Arthur Brin Finds Jewish Youth in Germany Have Not Lost Their Courage

The Jews in Germany are adequately handling their own situation, stated Mrs. Arthur Brin, President of the Council of Jewish Women. "Though while the tenseness in Berlin is very apparent, I was interested to notice that the young people have not lost their courage," Mrs. Brin told a representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency yesterday. She has just returned from a three month stay abroad.

In discussing the work of the National Council of Jewish Women, which has more than two hundred sections throughout the United States with a membership of about 40,000 women, Mrs. Brin said that the service maintained at the various ports of entry into the country, to give Jewish immigrant aid, had decreased.

The restricting immigration laws while lessening our Port and Dock Service, has overwhelmed us with a large influx of international work, she pointed out.

We are extending immigrant service of another type. We maintain contact between those families who have been separated because of the immigration laws and for the four month period from May to September, 520 new international cases were received at headquarters. On September 1, there were 1,190 international cases active in our files.

Because of the fact that the Boards of Education in several communities have contemplated the elimination of English classes for the adult foreign born for the coming year, the National Council of Jewish Women has advised its various sections throughout the country to "use their influence jointly with other organizations to see that appropriations for this work continue."

"This year," said Mrs. Brin, "we are planning to strengthen our organization procedure so as to be better able to meet the needs of our community sections."

Strahl Named Head of Zeirei Agudath Israel

Isaac Strahl was elected president of the Zeirei Agudath Israel of America at the fifth annual convention of the organization held at the Institutional Synagogue here.

Other officers are: Israel Widdiker, vice-president; Moses Bauman, secretary, and H. Weiner, treasurer. The convention approved a resolution calling for the raising of a fund to send 25 Chaltzim to Palestine. Reports delivered indicated that the activities of the organization have shown a

B'nai Brith's 90th Anniversary **October 13th; Nationwide Observance Is Planned**

Is Oldest and Largest Jewish Fraternal Order with Six Hundred Lodges

CINCINNATI, Sept. 21.—Four hundred B'nai Brith Lodges throughout the United States and Canada will hold special meetings, cultural gatherings, and membership drives, and will sponsor special events during the coming year in honor of the Order's entry into the 90th year of its existence, which begins October 13.

On that date, in 1843, twelve men, headed by Henry Jones, met at Simpson's Cafe in Essex Street, New York City, and resolved to found a fraternity patterned after the many friendly societies of that time. In the 89 years which have elapsed since that humble beginning was made, B'nai Brith has grown to be the oldest and largest Jewish fraternal order in the world. It has 400 lodges in the United States and Canada, and 200 more in 25 other countries encircling the globe.

The Central Administrative Board of B'nai Brith has officially authorized this nation-wide observance by American and Canadian lodges of the Order's completion of its ninth decade.

Special meetings, featuring programs of Jewish music, written or oratorical accounts of the Order's rich history and achievements, and reviews of American Jewish history generally since 1843, will be held, and in all cases will be community events, open to the public in approximately 400 cities, towns and villages.

Special membership drives will be held to induct "Ninetieth Anniversary Classes" into the Order, and the total membership of B'nai Brith is expected to be appreciably swelled in this manner.

At the end of September or the beginning of October the eight B'nai Brith Hill Foundations will re-open in as many universities. The one at the University of Illinois will be starting its ninth year of existence, while

Paramount Company Scored For Placing Advertisements In Nazi Film Paper

there is appreciation of the lack of dignity involved in the action of a company whose executives are Jews which places advertising in an anti-Semitic and inciting sheet; if they are insensitive to the fact that no German film company has placed any advertisements with this sheet; at least collegial solidarity with other American firms and producers who refused to have anything to do with such a paper, might have been expected from the Paramount Company.

"The question ought to be asked in earnest: 'What makes the German Paramount Company, in particular, submissive to pressure from the Nazi film paper?' It would certainly be far more advisable for Mr. Zukor and Mr. Ike Blumenthal of Berlin to thoroughly look into the situation. Or do the responsible heads of the organization find it an honor to be the promoters of hatred of the Jews in the German film industry?"

"The first fruits are already ripe: It is certainly not a mere coincidence that 'Der Deutsche Film' in the very same issue in which the Paramount advertisement is published, carries an announcement that henceforth it will appear as a weekly. That means that henceforth its activity of promoting anti-Jewish hatred will be doubled."

"Opinion" writes: "A despatch from Berlin reports that the Paramount Motion Picture Corporation has entered into an advertising contract with a Nazi film publication—a publication which in line with Nazi policy demands the exclusion of Jews from the German motion picture industry. The despatch further states that the advertising provided by the Paramount Company makes it possible for this Nazi paper to increase its number of appearances from a bi-weekly to a weekly edition."

"A nice point in paradox might be made as to the comparative inappropriateness of this advertising contract having been given by the Paramount Company and its having been accepted by the paper in question. For the fact that the Paramount Company is owned and headed by Jews is so well known as to make it hardly necessary to call attention to the fact that Jewish money is thus being used to support an organ which is the avowed enemy of Jews and Jewish life. But the incident calls attention to a more serious question, namely, to what extent should Jews use whatever economic power they may possess in order to safeguard themselves and their co-racialists."

"Obviously it is impossible to inquire at every turn as to the attitude of corporations and industries to the Jewish problem. Nor can the executives of great companies be asked to answer a questionnaire concerning the degree of their anti- or philo-Semitism. But while economic self-defense cannot be carried ad absurdum it may and,

in all decency, it must be used in certain instances. Thus for Jewish firms to patronize such outspoken anti-Semites as Coty of France or the Nazi publications of Germany is the last word in mercenary self-contempt. The possible excuse that the American officials of the Paramount Company were not cognizant of the nature of the publication which they used in Germany as an advertising medium can serve no longer. The Jews of the world will expect and will demand that they forthwith cease to make use of it and publicly state their reason for so doing.

"We do not rest under the delusion that Hollywood can counteract Hitler, nor that Coty will be cured by a female boycott of his products. But such action, whatever its economic effect and we believe it may be great, will give earnest that Jews the world over are one and stand as one in defense of Jewish rights and honor."

The "Hebrew Journal" of Toronto comments editorially on the Paramount advertisements under the caption: "Why do they remain silent?"

"Jews are great patrons of the movies," says the editorial. "Thus indirectly Jewish money is devoted to helping a Nazi publication which does not cease to agitate that Jewish films be boycotted and they are not even ashamed to call upon Germany to rid itself of the Jews through expulsion."

"The Paramount Company has not even found it essential to explain its stand, or to state, even if it is not the truth, that the representatives of the company in Germany did this on their own responsibility without consulting the heads of the organization."

"If the Jewish leaders of the Paramount Company have not found it necessary to answer to the terrible charge against them, then Jewish public opinion in America must demand an answer."

"The paper also wants to know why the Canadian representatives of the company are maintaining the same silence."

The "Israeli Press" of Winnipeg scores the Paramount Company for placing its advertisements in the Nazi film organ, not because it means any profits, but simply "to curry favor with the bitter enemies of the Jews."

"Lackeys is a better name for them. The Jewish lackeys of old were compelled to demean themselves, but this self-demeaning had no effect upon the community as a whole."

"The lackeys with whom we are concerned are not compelled to demean themselves, but jumped to the fore of their own accord, in the hope of having their checks padded. And thus they help the greatest enemies of the Jews in their work against the Jews."

"It is our misfortune that there is no organized public opinion which will teach these people a lesson, or at least, hit their pocket books, which is their most vulnerable spot."

MOSCOW, Sept. 21—The All Soviet Central Council of Trade Unions yesterday ordered the Ukrainian, White Russian, Crimean and Far Eastern Unions to support the anti-religious campaign inaugurated by the "Emess."
