LEHMAN NOMINATED FOR NEW YORK GOVERNOR: WOULD BE FIRST JEW TO HOLD THIS OFFICE

Is First Jew to Be Chosen for This Office by Democratic Party in New York; Has Distinguished Career in Philanthropic, Civic and Jewish Communal Jewish Circles Ask Leader of Centre Endeavor; Record in Office of Lieutenant-Governor, First Political Post, Highly Praised; Nominated After Two Day Battle When Delegation of Opposition Party Threaten to Swing Toward Him

ALBANY, Oct. 5-Lieutenant Governor Herbert H. Lehman, noted Jewish philanthropist, civic and communal leader, last night became the first Jew ever to be nominated for the post of governor of New York State by the Demo-cratic party and, if elected, will be the first Jew to hold this high office in New

Colonel Lehman was nominated by acclamation after a stormy two day battle concerning his candidacy, based not on his personal fitness for the office, but on the score which Tammany Hall has against Governor Franklin D. Roosevelt, Democratic presidential no-minee, whose choice Colonel Lehman is.

Nazi Headquarters Expel Saalfeldt; Order Inquiry Into Racial Origin of All Leaders

Origin; Investigation to Be on Same Basis (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Oct. 5-Nazi headquarters in Berlin have ordered the expulsion from the party of Dr. Wolfgang Saal-

feldt, Nazi leader at Eutin in Holstein, because he is of Jewish origin. The case of Dr. Saalfeldt has re-cently occupied a leading position in the press. Dr. Saalfeldt brought a libel action against the local leader of the Tannenberg League because the latter charged he was of Jewish origin. A leader of the Nazi party in Luebeck, Dr. Brendel, testified in court at the time, that Saalfeldt would be permitted to remain in the Party because is a Jew.

BERLIN, Oct. 5-Two editors of "Der Angriff," organ of the Nazi party in Berlin, Krause and Lippert, received sentences of five and three months imprisonment today having been found guilty of libel against Dr. Bernhard Weiss, former vice-president of the Berlin police department.

Two police officers who were witnesses for "Der Angriff" editors and who supplied the Hitler paper with calumnious material were held for trial

Dr. Weiss was the target of calumnious attack by the Nazi press because he is a Jew. His own declaration on the witness stand made a deep im-

Sir Rudolph Slatin Pasha Dies; Converted Jew: Won Renown For Great Britain and Austria

Adventures in Egypt and Africa Won Him Wide Popularity; Was Born an Austrian Jew

(Tewish Telegraphic Agency)

VIENNA, Oct. 5-Sir Rudolph Slatin Pasha, an Austrian Jew who adopted the Christian faith and attained high honors in the services of his own country and that of Great Britain, died here yesterday at the age of seventyfive.

Sir Rudolph succumbed to a stomach ailment for which he underwent an

operation a month ago.

Sir Rudolph was born Rudolph Carl Slatin and although he never renounced his Austrian citizenship, he achieved renown for his services to Great Britain as Governor General of Darfur and Inspector General of the Sudan. In recognition of his contributions to the history of Great Britain in Egypt and Africa, King Edward VII knighted the man who by this time had attained the rank of Major General in the British Army.

This did not deter the Austrian government from making him a Baron in

1906.

Sir Rudolph was visiting Austria when the World War broke out. He thereupon renounced all his British titles, but refused to fight against the Allies. Instead he took a post with the Red Cross, later becoming European head of the Red Cross work aid to prisoners of war.

Sir Rudolph started on his career of adventure as a boy of sixteen when he went to Egypt where he made the acquaintance of the explorers Schwein-furth, Rohlfs and Heuglin and Emin mittee. Pasha who in turn introduced and

A Jew, it is stated, according to the Forward, was among the principals supporting Tammany's stand against Mr. Lehman. In this connection Max D. Steuer of New York is mentioned by the paper. Mr. Steuer's stand with Tammany Hall, it is alleged, was due to jealousy, having himself coveted the nomination and again was the price he was willing to pay in order to secure the endorsement of Tammany for the candidacy of his son, Aaron for Su-preme Court Justice. The paper also mentions that Aaron Steuer is married to a Catholic.

The selection of Colonel Lehman has met with unusually wide acclaim in the press, where editorials praising the qualities he is able to bring to high

office are published.

Colonel Lehman who is fifty-four years old and a native of New York City where he was born on March 28, 1878, comes from a distinguished Iewish family. A brother, Judge Irving Leh-man has served on the bench of New York State courts since 1908. fourteen years Judge Irving Lehman sat on the Supreme Court Bench, being elected for a four year term in 1923 by nomination of both parties and again by nomination of both parties, he was elected an Associate Judge of the New York Court of Appeals to serve until

Colonel Lehman came to his first political office in 1928 after achieving a wide reputation which reached across the Atlantic as philanthropist and a Jew to whom nothing affecting the welfare of the Jewish people was alien.

In the four years since he first assumed office, he has achieved through his public acts, a reputation for progress and humane leadership. The complex character of his duties which have frequently called upon him to act as Governor of the State have not caused Colonel Lehman to give up his affiliations with local, national and international endeavor.

In 1930, Colonel Lehman was awarded the Zeta Beta Thau medal as the Jew who has done most for Jewry and

One of the most important functions of his public activity since 1924 has been the role of mediator he has played in the garment industry. Colonel Lehman, who consents to act as mediator only if requested to do so by both parties to a dispute, has been successful in averting serious strikes in the labor industry, the last strike which he settled at the end of this summer would have affected 27,000 workers of the ladies garment industry in New York.

Mr. Lehman resigned his business affiliations when he came to public office, including that of his active partnership in the banking firm of Lehman Brothers, considered the third largest banking firm in the United States.

Since the age of twenty-one, when he founded the Boys Club at the Henry Street Settlement, Mr. Lehman has taken an active interest in welfare work. He finances a camp for poor boys and with Aaron Rabinowitz financed a \$500,000 model housing project for 400 poor families on the East

Mr. Lehman's parents were Maver and Babette Lehman. His father came to the United States as a penniless immigrant from Germany and settled in the South. There he became a friend of Jefferson Davis and served as a sol-

Abbas Hilmi Admits Some Truth in Rumors He Has Pretensions to Throne of Syria

By Our Alexandria Correspondent ALEXANDRIA.-Light was thrown by the Egyptian ex-Khedive Abbas Hilmi himself on the various speculations which were recently rife regarding his plans in the Near East.

In an interview which he gave to the Egyptian daily "Al Ahram", the ex-Khedive is supposed to have admitted that there is some truth in the rumors as to his pretensions to the kingdom of Svria. A certain State, it says, which is interested to maintain friendly relations with its neighbor Syria, has suggested to him that he should put forward his candidature to the Kingdom of Syria, and this state has promised him

Since, however, the ex-Khedive explains, he has never given this possibility a thought, although he has always taken an interest in matters in the Near East, he has decided to express his opinion only after he has considered the problem on the spot, and for this reason he went to Constantinopole last December, where he consulted Mustapha Kemal Pasha and Tewfik Ruchdi Ismet Pasha. He subsequently visited French Commissioner in Syria, M. Ponsot, and from there proceeded to Palestine, where he received a very cordial welcome from the High Commissioner and the Emir Abdullah.

Referring to the "Islamic Bureau" which he has established in Geneva, the ex-Khedive said that the aim of this bureau is to work in the interests of Islam all over the world. Many Europeans, including Englishmen, Frenchmen and Germans who have been converted to Islam, have assisted him in the establishment of the Bureau, which should serve as a connecting link between Moslems the world over. The actual plans, however, will only be decided upon after the various conferences in Near Eastern countries which are taking place now.

The ex-Khedive denied having given the Emir Abdullah £15,000, in order that he should assist him with his plans. Relations of a most friendly nature, he said, had existed between them for some
