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Einstein to Sail for Pasadena in December To Continue Work There

Will Continue Work at Mt. Wilson
Observatory Before Taking Up Duties
with Institute for Advanced Study

BERLIN, Oct. 13—Professor Albert Einstein will sail for Pasadena, California, to continue his work on the unified field theory, some time in December, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learns today.

Neither the date nor the name of the steamer he will take are definite as yet.

Professor Einstein will complete his work at Mount Wilson Observatory before assuming his new duties as head of the Mathematics School of the Institute for Advanced Study of which he has been appointed a life member.

Vienna Nazis Call for Anti-Jewish Boycott

VIENNA, Oct. 13—A mass demonstration in which 30,000 merchants and artisans participated to protest against the government for favoring agriculture was suddenly transformed into a hostile turning calling for a boycott against the Jews.

Incited by Nazi speakers who called for opposition to "Jewish control of trade and artisanship," the crowd took up the shout: "Do not buy from Jews!"

The fact that no protest against this agitation was heard from the merchants in the demonstration, is regarded here as another indication of the growing sympathy of the middle classes for the Nazis.

Arab Masonic Leader, Friendly to Jews, Dies

JERUSALEM, Oct. 13—Shoukry Houry, Grandmaster of the Palestine Mason Lodge, died suddenly yesterday at the age of fifty-five.

Houry was well known for his friendliness to the Jews and could converse with them in the Hebrew language.

Funeral services were held for him this afternoon. Sixty percent of the participants in the funeral services were Jews.

Premier Goemboes Again Makes Overtures to Jews as Students Are Attacked at University

Premier States His Party Favors De-
serving Jews; Anti-Semites Launch
Attacks at University

BUDAPEST, Oct. 13—Premier Julius Goemboes, erstwhile anti-Semitic leader, is going out of his way since his selection as Premier, to invite the co-operation of the Jewish elements in Hungary.

For the third time within a week, Premier Goemboes, speaking before Parliament today, has made overtures to the Jews. Premier Goemboes said: "My Agrarian Party is proud of the equality rights it has granted to deserving Jewish citizens."

At the same time he warned against the misuse of so-called Christian slogans for political campaigning.

This new friendliness toward Jews on the part of the Premier drew the wrath of a Nazi deputy, Mesco, at today's session, who criticized him for "his all too generous forgiveness of the Jews."

Court Acquits Jew Held Thirty Months Charged With Leading Pogrom Against Monarchists

Moses Sutch, Jewish Furrier, Will Be
Released Within Ten Days After Al-
most 3 Years Solitary Confinement

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

HARBIN, Oct. 13—Moses Sutch, a Jewish furrier kept in prison for thirty months on charges of having headed a pogrom against Russian Monarchists in 1929 was acquitted today by the High Court.

The charges against Sutch were that he headed the pogrom at Triochretche during the Bolshevik invasion of 1929, where 76 White Russians were killed.

During the entire period of his incarceration, Sutch was held in solitary confinement with his hands and feet manacled.

The accusation against the Jew was turned into an anti-Semitic issue by a priest named Makajeff and was taken up with vigor by the anti-Semitic press.

As a result of the disturbed situation which followed the campaign against

Grant of 4,500 Immigration Certificates Is Confirmed In Official Gazette

2,700 to Be Assigned to Men Between
Ages of Eighteen and Thirty-five;
1,500 for Unmarried Women

JERUSALEM, Oct. 13—A grant of 4,500 labor certificates to the Jewish Agency Executive for the six month period ending March 31st, as reported by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency is confirmed in the official gazette appearing today.

Of the 4,500 certificates available, 2,700 are to be assigned for men between the ages of 18 and 35; 1,500 for married women of the same age; 300 for men up to the age of forty-five.

The grant is the largest by the Palestine government in the last six years, although it represents 2,250 less than asked for by the Jewish Agency executive.

Declassed May Not Be Wardens in Synagogues

MOSCOW, Oct. 13—Members of the declassified groups in Soviet Russia may not be elected as wardens of synagogues, says the official bulletin on religious matters issued by the Central Committee of the Wzsk.

The bulletin states that every religious community must have three authorized juridical representatives. In the past since the wardens were considered servants of religion and ipso facto declassified, few desired to assume such office.

In some circles the new ruling is interpreted as meaning that those who accept the office of wardens will not lose their rights.

Neiman Gets Prison Sentence For Blowing Shofar

JERUSALEM, Oct. 13—Shlomo Neiman, a Zionist Revisionist from Poland was sentenced to twenty one days imprisonment yesterday for blowing the shofar at the Wailing Wall at the conclusion of Yom Kippur services.

The blowing of the shofar is contrary to the regulations obtaining at the Wailing Wall. Neiman who was arrested immediately following his act was released on bail following representations by Chief Rabbi A. I. Kook.

The Jewish students were beaten up and thrown out of the college buildings. The anti-Semites then proceeded to paint inscriptions on the walls attacking the Premier. "Down with Goemboes," were among the inscriptions seen.

At the same time anti-Semitic posters were plastered on the doors of Jewish homes in Polttauj Falu, a suburb of Budapest.

Minister of Education Homan ordered the University authorities to take rigorous measures to maintain order. The police of Budapest have taken steps to prosecute those responsible for posting the anti-Semitic bill boards.

The attacks upon the Jews are attributed in part to the anti-Semites rejoicing at the death of Count Kuno Klebelsberg, Minister of Education in

Lehman to Open Campaign Tour October 20th

Colonel Herbert H. Lehman will begin his state tour in behalf of his candidacy for Governor of New York on October 20th. His present plans call for ten days of active campaigning.

The Lieutenant-Governor will be officially notified of his nomination by the Democratic Party on Monday.

Colonel Lehman outlined the five major issues on which his election campaign is to be based in an address delivered at a dinner of the Columbian Order on Wednesday evening.

These are economy in government, control of public utilities, water power development, humane and welfare activities and prohibition.

To Lay Cornerstone of Palestine Foundation Fund Building

JERUSALEM, Oct. 13—The cornerstone of the building to house the administrative offices of the Palestine Foundation Fund will be laid on Monday with elaborate ceremonies.

Representatives of the Jewish Agency and Zionist Executives, the Jewish National Fund and the Palestine Jewish National Council will participate in the ceremonies. The building will adjoin that of the Jewish National Fund.

400 Orthodox Jews in Protest Against Sabbath Work

JERUSALEM, Oct. 13—Four hundred orthodox Jews marched from Jerusalem to the suburb of Romema as a protest against sixty Jews who are employed in public works there and work on the Sabbath because their government contract calls for it.

The police used clubs on the throng in an effort to disperse it.

Rabbi Abram Blau, leader of the Agudath Israel, was arrested for offering resistance to the police, but was later released on bail.

Following the demonstration a delegation representing the Palestine Jewish National Council visited the District Commissioner asking that the Jews be released from Sabbath labor.

The District Commissioner explained that this is difficult for technical reasons. Moreover, he said, if the Jews are unwilling to work on Saturday they will be released from their contracts and Egyptian labor will be substituted.

Count Klebelsberg, who died yesterday of typhoid fever, was responsible for the mitigation of the numerous clausus which limited the number of Jews in Hungarian Universities to 5% of the total student number. This act incurred the wrath of the anti-Semites and led to numerous acts of violence against the Jews.

Russian Court Rules Circumcision Not Crime

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

MOSCOW, Oct. 13—The High Court here has ruled that the performance of circumcision, prescribed by the Jewish religion is an act not punishable in itself, and is believed to set an important precedent.

The verdict was handed down in connection with the action brought by a Communist father against a Mohel who circumcized his son without his consent, although with the approval of the child's mother and grandmother.

The court found that the mother's consent was sufficient and also dismissed the charge brought against the Mohel that he had performed a surgical operation although medically untrained. The court ruled that every competent Mohel is entitled to perform circumcisions.

The Mohel was, however, held for trial for an unsanitary execution of his task as the child became ill after the operation had been performed.

MOSCOW, Oct. 13—Six Jews received the order of "Red Banner of Labor" in recognition of their services to the building of the Dnieprostroy dam, the largest hydro-electric plant in the world.

The Jews honored are the engineers Rubin, Kaufman, Silberstein, Frumkin, and Kazman and the secretary of the Party organization, Leiserson.

More than 12 percent of the workers skilled and unskilled, employed in the dam's construction, are Jews, according to assistant Chief Engineer Laubman.

"The work at Dnieprostroy was a great school for the greatest part of the Jewish workers employed there." More than 80 percent of the Jewish workers, he said, joined the shock brigades. Many started as unskilled laborers and now are among the best mechanics.

Funeral services were held for Dr. Max Girsdansky, who died on Monday evening at the age of sixty-eight.

Dr. Girsdansky, who came to the United States from Kovno at the age of fifteen, was one of the founders of the Socialist Party in the United States, and of the American Society of Russian Revolutionists.

Central Union Leaders Tell Of Growing Anti-Semitism Among Left Wing Parties

State Acuteness of Nazi Danger Diminishing, But No Ground for Excessive Optimism

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Oct. 13.—While the acuteness of the danger to the Jews from the Nazis is diminishing, a growing anti-Semitic tendency is noticeable among the Left parties, it was brought out yesterday at a press conference called by the Central Union of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith.

The Left Wing parties are agitating against the Jews because of the attitude of individual Jewish employers who favor the government of Chancellor Franz von Papen and also approve measures for the reduction of wages, it was pointed out by Dr. Alfred Weiner, counsel of the Central Union and Hans Reichmann.

Speakers expressed the opinion that the forthcoming elections will not result in victory for the Nazi aspirations to secure control of the government. The Nazis themselves, they stated, estimate a loss of fifty seats in the next Reichstag. On the other hand there is as yet no ground for excessive optimism, it was emphasized.

The Central Union representative in Koennigsberg, Matzdorf, stated that the panic among the Jews in the small towns shows no signs of abating, that the Jews continue to remain indoors, fearing attacks should they venture out.

Warsaw Kehillah Awards Prizes for Literary Work

WARSAW, Oct. 13.—First prize for the outstanding literary work in the past year was awarded by the Warsaw Jewish Community to Jacob Kahn for two volumes of poems.

Second prize was awarded to A. S. Hershberg for his work on Jewish culture during the Talmudic period.

Sperlgasse Cafe Sues Nazi Party for Damages

VIENNA, Oct. 13.—A suit in the amount of 15,000 schillings was entered against the Nazi party for damages by the Sperlgasse cafe.

The cafe was converted into a temporary synagogue for Holiday services and was attacked by Nazis on the second day of Rosh Hashanah.

Roumania's Oldest Jewess Dies at 116

CZERNOWITZ, Oct. 13.—Roumania's oldest Jewess, Miriam Schweitzer, died today at the age of one hundred and sixteen.

Despite her advanced years the centenarian retained possession of all her faculties until the last.

Jewish Press Scores Brown For Assertion Polish Jews Suffer No Special Misery

Polish and American Jewish Press Challenge Brown Assertions; Apology Demanded

Severe criticism is levelled against David A. Brown for his statement that no specific misery exists among the Polish Jewish masses in articles appearing in the Polish and American Jewish Press.

Issue with this declaration, which was made by Mr. Brown in an interview with a representative of the Polish Telegraphic Agency during a recent visit to Warsaw, is taken by such papers as the "Hajnt" of Warsaw, "Unser Express" of Warsaw and by the New York Jewish "Day".

The "Hajnt" wrote:

"The American 'delegate', Mr. Brown, stated in an interview with the Pat (Polish Telegraphic Agency) that while in Poland he saw not the slightest difference in the attitude toward Jew and non-Jew and also no specific Jewish misery."

"When Mr. Brown approached the wicket in the railway station to buy a first class ticket, no difficulties were imposed in his way and they sold a ticket to him as to all other non-Jewish passengers. A seat in the parlor car, with soft Polish cushions was assigned him just as to other non-Jewish passengers. In the diner car, the waiters bowed to him politely and served him with the best and finest."

"The same was true in the Hotel Bristol. He was assigned the handsomest room and the hotel staff was prepared to fulfill his every wish."

"Then Mr. Brown went out for a walk through the Jewish streets to see how Jews live."

"It was an ordinary Wednesday and on Nolevskis, he saw Jews parading with canes in a semi-holiday spirit. In Krashinski's Garden the benches were crowded with elderly Jews and youths discussing politics, the legendary Red Jews — and the stratosphere."

"Ah... the Jews here live not so badly," said Mr. Brown to himself, — 'the non-Jews labor, sweat, drive the trolleys, toil whole days in stifling, crowded offices in government posts; ruin their eyes and acquire hunched backs — while the Jews parade with canes and carry on political discussions in the parks.'

"Mr. Brown proceeds, he sees non-Jewish mail carriers loaded with heavy packs of mail, executives with heavy portfolios, everyone is rushing, perspiring, pursuing — and the Jews reposing themselves in Krashinski's gardens."

"Ha, Ha, — Mr. Brown smiles to the children — it's pretty good to be out in the open, isn't it? And to himself he says: 'Not a bad idea on the part of the Jews to take a 'week-end' in the

Palestine Schools to Reopen As Controversy Over Control Is Settled After Six Months

Compromise Agreement Is Reached; Committee of Five, Representing All Groups to Supervise

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM, Oct. 13.—The dispute over the control of the Jewish school system which has delayed the opening of the school semester was settled last night at a special session called by the Palestine Jewish National Council.

A compromise agreement was reached which may bring about the opening of the schools within a fortnight.

According to the agreement, the schools are to be under the supervision of the Palestine Jewish National Council. The actual supervisory work, however, is to be carried out by a special committee of five, including two representatives of the Palestine Jewish National Council, one of the Jewish Agency Executive, one of the municipality of Tel Aviv, one of the Jewish Farmers and Parents Association.

The settlement ends a dispute which has endured for the past six months since the Jewish Agency Executive turned over the schools to the Vaad Leumi undertaking, however, to furnish a portion of the budget.

The dispute arose through the opposition of the Tel Aviv Municipality and the Farmers Association to granting the control to the Vaad Leumi.

The controversy reached such a stage that the Palestine government intervened and threatened to withdraw its subsidy unless the schools were reopened at the end of this month.

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Jewish Press Scores Brown For Assertion Polish Jews Suffer No Special Misery

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Brown, sojourned in Warsaw. He lived in style befitting a moneyed Jew in the Hotel Europejski. He was travelling to China to 'investigate' the situation of the Jews there, although no one delegated him to this task. On the same journey, he also 'investigated' the situation of the Jews of Poland, although no one requested him to do that either.

"This Mr. Brown is a man without any specific profession. His chief work in America is to hold speeches at meetings where money is collected. It makes no difference to him for what purpose the money is to be assigned, whether to aid the impoverished Polish Jews, or to build a temple in Chicago, or an institution, for example which is occupied with propaganda for a new soap project. He must speak. He has a series of prepared speeches for meetings, and he must utilize them.

"Who cares?

"But when such a Jew comes to Warsaw, 'investigates' the situation of the Jews, and then gives out an interview that he sees no signs of misery among Polish Jews, he must be told:

"Dear Uncle, Stop

"Our Jewish Pat colleagues look for such people as David Brown and lick their fingers after such interviews. The Pat was so greatly pleased with Mr. Brown that it took up the cudgels for him and was wroth at the 'jargon' press because it received Mr. Brown so ill and did not even publish any interviews with him.

"We are constrained to inform Mr. Brown that if he desires to view Jewish misery, he should, on his return trip, take a stroll through the Jewish streets—and not as before through Nizka, Chamutscha and Stowski streets—where misery is today too weak a description—Let him walk through Golevka, Genscha and Franchiskaner streets, there where signs are still hanging and stores are still open. Let him enter the large six-room houses; let him interest himself even in those who still wear a pair of whole shoes, remnants of better days—and he will see a terrible picture of Jewish misery.

"He will not find Jewish misery in the Hotel Europejski or in the Hotel Bristol or even in the office of the director of the Pat."

The "New York Day" declared:

"David A. Brown, editor of the

'American Hebrew,' Executive member of the American Jewish Committee, Joint Distribution Committee, the Union of American Hebrew Congregations and active in a host of various reform Jewish organizations, owes an apology to the Jewish world at large.

"He, Brown, being in Warsaw recently, ostensibly to 'study the situation'—it is not certain whether upon his own responsibility or as representative of the organizations with which he is identified—informed the Poles that Jewish papers in America 'create a false picture of the Jews in Poland' and that they blacken, without rhyme or reason, the face of Poland in the eyes of the world. In other words that the Jewish press in America disseminates libels against the poor, innocent Polish government.

"This report David A. Brown presented not to the Jewish public opinion in America, not even through the columns of his own newspaper, but rather to Polish public opinion and the public at large, through the Polish Press Agency, 'Pat,' which as every one is aware, is the official press organ of the Polish government.

"In order to justify his charges against the Jewish press in America in the eyes of the Polish government, this Brown offers as a motive the 'fact' that 'he did not see any specific misery among the Jews of Poland, because such misery does not exist.'

"These are words and charges on which Jewish public opinion in America must pause.

"One or the other is possible.

"If no specific Jewish misery exists in Poland and if the Jewish press in America really creates a false picture of the position of the Jews in the Polish republic, something must be done at once.

"We must all fall on our knees in obeisance before the sanctified innocence—called Poland—and pray for forgiveness for the error of our ways; and counsel for the defense of all of us, whom we must raise on high and whose praises we must sing, must be none other than David A. Brown.

"But if it should be proved that all that has been written not alone by the Jewish Press in America, but also by the Jewish press in Poland in recent years and especially during the last few months, concerning the Jewish situation in Poland, is the truth and nothing but the truth, then

"Something must be done at once also and done in such fashion as to render it impossible for the genus Brown to take journeys ostensibly in the interests of the Jews, to speak in the name of the Jews, and in general to have the front of a Jewish leader.

"Let him repeat here in America for Jewish public opinion to hear that Jews in Poland suffer no special misery; that everything is good and well; that the Polish government treats them as it should; that those who paint a false picture concerning the Jewish position in Poland and libel the Polish govern-

Sutch, the Harbin Court which first tried him and found insufficient grounds for conviction, was afraid to order his release. Instead it had Sutch transferred for trial to Mukden, where after nine months the Mukden court ordered him retried to Harbin for another trial.

Although in the interim a change in government resulted in the application of the widest amnesty, the Monarchists were successful in their efforts to keep Sutch imprisoned.

The charges suffered complete collapse, however, at the latest trial before the High Court, where several Mongolian princes, volunteer witnesses, testified that Sutch was five hundred miles away from Trichretche when the disturbances occurred and that he was pursuing his legitimate trade of furrier at the time.

The High Court ordered Sutch's release within ten days, unless the Monarchists lodge a new appeal against the verdict.
