## Salonica Jews Move Dwellings To Tents; Fear Collapse of Houses Owing to Quakes

### Salonica Jew Gives One of Largest Individual Gifts to Fund for Victims

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

SALONICA, Oct. 15.—Salonica Jewry gave a realistic interpretation to the Feast of Tabernacles today by transferring its dwellings to tents, in view of the earthquakes which the city is experiencing.

The Jews are afraid to remain in their houses lest they collapse.

Thus far there have been no Jewish victims of the quakes which have affected the villages neighboring Salonica for the most part.

The suggestion that the Jews open a special subscription list for the victims has been abandoned and the Jews have decided to participate in the general fund being raised. The Jewish Community has contributed 10,000 drachma for this purpose. One of the largest individual contributions to the fund for the victims is in the amount of 400,000 drachma and comes from a Jewish tobacco merchant, Schnurr.

## Prosecutor Orders Release Of 3 Nazis Held for Attack On Synagogue Worshipers

### Reason Given Is That It Has Not Been Proven Nazis Entered Synagogue

VIENNA, Oct. 15.—General astonishment was caused here today when the prosecutor suddenly ordered the release of three Nazis held in connection with the attack upon worshippers in an improvised synagogue in the Sperlgasse Cafe on Rosh Hashanah.

The prosecutor not only ordered the release of the Nazis but the return of the equipment which they carried at the time of the attack.

The reason given is that the investigation allegedly proved that the Nazis neither entered the synagogue nor attacked the worshippers.

As a result the Nazi press now demands compensation for the unwarranted arrest of the three Nazis, disciplinary measures against the Jewish police inspector who conducted the first investigation and action against the Socialist press which scored the attack.

## Roumanian Finance Minister Orders Action Against Tax Collectors Who Tortured Jew

### Order Follows Interpellation Intro- duced in Parliament By Deputy Michael Landau

BUCHAREST, Oct. 15.—Minister of Finance Mironescu yesterday ordered action taken against tax officials accused of terrorizing in September a Jewish trader, Motti Pekl of Kishinev.

In Finance circles it is hoped that the Finance Minister's order may be an indication of official condemnation of terroristic acts employed by tax collectors in Bessarabia, whose victims, it is alleged, are for the most part Jews.

Pekl was beaten up when he informed the tax collectors that he had already paid his taxes and showed them that the summons they produced was not made out against him, and after he had begged for an extension of time to make the second payment.

Minister Mironescu's official action followed an interpellation introduced in Parliament by Deputy Michael Landau, who asked that an end be brought to the terrorization acts which he said are by now as notorious throughout Roumania as "the Bessarabian methods."

Minister Mironescu ordered the tax official implicated in the attack on Pekl submitted to a disciplinary trial, stating the investigation showed that the Jewish trader had been tortured. The tax administrator was transferred to another post by order of the Finance Minister.

Pekl will bring a civil action against the tax officials for assault.

## Acquit Two Jews of Cathedral Window Breaking

CRACOW, Oct. 15.—Two Jews were acquitted yesterday by the Court of Appeal of charges of breaking the windows of the Bernardin Cathedral here last November at the height of the anti-Semitic excesses.

The two Jews who previously had been sentenced to two months imprisonment, are Bernard Johannes, aged 18, and Eugen Windich, aged 17.

## Academy Gives Prof. Einstein Leave Provided He Returns For Several Months Annually

### Leave of Absence Annually Will Per- mit Einstein to Take Up Duties in America

BERLIN, Oct. 15.—The Prussian Academy of Science with which Professor Albert Einstein is associated, has agreed to grant him an annual leave of absence for several months to permit him to take up his duties as head of the Mathematical School of the Institute for Advanced Study at Princeton, N. J., it was announced today.

Professor Einstein will be enabled to take up his duties in the United States, in the institution of which he is a life member, providing he spends the remainder of the year in Germany annually.

According to present plans of the Institute for Advanced Study, the school year is to begin in October and conclude in April.

## Yiddish and Hebrew Recognized As Languages of Instruction In Latvian Jewish Schools

### Latvian School Controversy Ended with Approval of Languages by Parliamentary Commission

RIGA, Oct. 15.—The Education Commission of the Latvian Parliament yesterday decided to recognize Yiddish and Hebrew as the national Jewish languages and as the languages of compulsory instruction in Jewish schools.

This decision is in line with the demands of Jewish leaders and ends a controversy which has endured for several months in this connection.

The decision of the Commission follows an incident involving J. Landau, director of the Jewish Education Department of the school system and the Minister of Education. Mr. Landau, replying to the Minister of Education, declared that among the languages used by the Jews are Russian and German. Since the law provides that the government supply schools for each nationality where the language of instruction is that of their respective nation, and since the Jewish language is disputable, perhaps the use of Latvian in Jewish schools is preferable, Mr. Landau suggested.

# WRITERS AND LEADERS HONOR DR. ERNST BENEDIKT AT RECEPTION ARRANGED BY J. T. A.

Publisher of "Neue Freie Presse" Will Be Received by President Hoover Today; States Jewish Question of Paramount Importance to Austria's Recovery

A reception and tea in honor of Dr. Ernst Benedikt, publisher of the "Neue Freie Presse" of Vienna, liberal and literary tradition, was held Thursday afternoon at the Hotel Plaza by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency and attended by a number of outstanding journalists in the Jewish and non-Jewish press as well as leaders in various fields.

Following the reception, Dr. Benedikt left for Albany where he was received by Governor Franklin D. Roosevelt. The distinguished Viennese visitor is in the United States on his first visit to this country, having arrived on the S. S. Rex.

Dr. Benedikt will be received by President Hoover this morning at eleven o'clock.

Introduced by Jacob Landau, managing director of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, Dr. Benedikt made a brief address in which he described conditions in Austria.

He expressed the belief that Austria will recover from its present critical state, but that the process will be slow and will be based upon the confidence it is able to inspire from its own citizens and from public opinion abroad.

No recovery is possible, however, without the application of justice and equality to the minorities, he emphasized. The Jewish question is in fact a question of minorities and so is also the problem of Austria as a whole.

The credo of liberalism, Dr. Benedikt stated, had been handed down to him by his father, the late Moritz Benedikt, for forty years the editor of the "Neue Freie Presse," who died in 1920, and under whose guidance the paper attained its wide repute for liberalism and journalistic and literary excellence.

Mr. Landau, in introducing the guest of honor, referred to the wide reputation which the "Neue Freie Presse" enjoys throughout Europe and in this country as well. He recalled the fact that one of the most distinguished contributors to the paper was Theodore Herzl, founder of political Zionism.

## Alarming Number of Kidnappings of Jews Reported in Harbin

**Jews Kidnapped and Held for Ransom; Tortured If Funds Demanded Are Not Forthcoming**

HARBIN, Oct. 15.—An alarming number of kidnappings of Jews has recently taken place here causing much perturbation among the Jewish population.

Among those kidnapped is the three year old child of a Jew, Subotowski, manager of an American motor car firm. The kidnappers demand twenty thousand dollars ransom which the father is unable to raise.

A pathetic case is that of a Jewish butcher named Greenberg who was kidnapped and tortured when he was unable to produce \$5,000 as ransom. Finally, Greenberg's wife offered herself as hostage for her husband to enable him to raise the ransom sum. When Greenberg finally brought the money, the bandits refused to release his wife and demanded additional sums.

Greenberg is completely wrecked by the experience and by the knowledge that his wife is being subjected to inhuman torture.

A Jewish physician, Eliason, was also kidnapped but managed to make good his escape.

## Jewish Organizations Disavow Responsibility For Utterances of Brown

**"Exponent" States Allegations Not Unusual for Man of Mr. Brown's Characteristics**

The allegations made by David A. Brown that no specific misery exists among Polish Jewry are termed "not unusual for one possessing Mr. Brown's characteristics" in an editorial which appears in the current issue of the Philadelphia Jewish Exponent.

Mr. Brown's allegations concerning the situation of Polish Jewry and his charges that the Jewish press and the Jewish Telegraphic Agency in America misrepresented the situation, continue to arouse comment.

The Executive Committee of the Federation of Polish Jews yesterday announced that it has unanimously resolved to take such additional appropriate action against Mr. Brown as the circumstances require.

At the same time, the Federation through its Executive Director, Z. Tygel, issued a statement charging that the "American Hebrew" is attempting to beloud the issue.

The Federation also made public replies it has received to its communication asking action against Mr. Brown for his utterances, from Joseph C. Hyman, Secretary of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee and Morris D. Waldman, Secretary of the American Jewish Committee.

Both replies disavow any responsibility for the utterances of Mr. Brown on the ground that his membership in these organizations does not give him authority to speak in their behalf.

Mr. Hyman declared: "I acknowledge receipt of your communication of October 5th with reference to an interview of Mr. David A. Brown with the Polish Telegraphic Agency.

"We have received no report or communication from Mr. Brown directly, and we have no information concerning any statements that he is said to have issued. We need hardly add that Mr. Brown has not anywhere stated that he is studying conditions abroad in behalf of the Joint Distribution Committee or that he speaks for this organization. As apparently Mr. Brown is speaking as an individual, under the circumstances we do not feel that the Joint Distribution Committee should officially enter into the situation.

"We have from time to time, especially within the last year, issued the official reports of our European Director and of our colleagues abroad, which point to the acute conditions of need of the Jewish population in Poland and in other Eastern European countries, and from which you may have seen that these reports of ours fully coincide with the situation such as you describe. ## Hitler Attacks Jews at First Election Meeting Held in Bavaria

**Renews Charge That von Papen Is Influenced by Jacob Goldschmidt, Jewish Banker**

BERLIN, Oct. 15.—The propaganda line to be pursued by Adolph Hitler was indicated by the Nazi chieftain at the first election mass meeting held in Bavaria.

Sixty similar meetings will be organized by the Nazis. Hitler declared in his address that Chancellor Franz von Papen carried out the wish "of his Jewish superior, Jacob Goldschmidt," the banker, when he offered Hitler only a post in the government, with the intention of destroying the Nazi movement and helping to realize the aims of Bolshevism.

A second speaker, Volver, Prime Minister of Oldenburg, openly adopted a pogrom tone, declaring that the wandering Jew incites the distress of the German race and creates the programs of all parties including those of the Nationalists and Communists in order to govern them. Therefore, he asserted, it is necessary for Germany once and for all time to free itself from the Jewish yoke.

## "Opinion" to Become Monthly Magazine

Beginning October 25th, "Opinion," formerly a weekly publication, will make its appearance as a national monthly magazine under the editorial direction of James Waterman Wise.

The editorial board of the new monthly magazine has been augmented and will consist of Erwin Edman, John Haynes Holmes, Mordecai M. Kaplan, George Alexander Kohut, Ludwig Lewisohn, Maurice Samuel, Johan J. Smertenko, and Stephen S. Wise.

Funeral services were held for Rabbi David Frankel, who died at the age of sixty-seven. Rabbi Frankel had served as spiritual leader of the Dukler Mogen Abraham synagogue for twenty years.

ments on his address delivered at the reception arranged in his honor.

The paper emphasizes the long liberal tradition of the "Neue Freie Presse" and the wide influence it exercised in moulding public opinion.

The editorial commends the statement made by Dr. Ernst Benedikt that "the position of the Jews in a country is the barometer of the cultural level of the people among whom Jews live."

The economic plight of the Jews of Eastern Europe is so desperate and the general outlook so bleak, that American Jewry must come to their aid both to relieve the acute material situation and as an expression of moral solidarity, stated Dr. Ernst Benedikt, publisher of the "Neue Freie Presse" of Vienna, in an interview with a representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

The economic situation is severest where the Jews of Poland are concerned, while the political situation affecting the Jews is most difficult in Germany, declared the publisher of the "Neue Freie Presse," an organ renowned for decades for its liberal and literary traditions. Among one of its most distinguished contributors was Theodore Herzl, founder of political Zionism.

Dr. Benedikt will spend a short period in this country.

The misery of the Jewish population defies description, Dr. Benedikt stated he was informed by a special correspondent of his paper who was sent to Poland to make a study of the situation as it affects the Jews. The living standards of the Jews have sunk to such a level in Poland as cannot be comprehended by the western world, he said. The older generation has resigned itself to its fate and the rising generation faces the future with hopelessness. It is the situation of the youth in particular which is most disturbing and should receive serious thought, he said.

Economic discrimination against the Jews is still operating in Poland, Dr. Benedikt declared, "although it cannot be said that the present government is anti-Semitic—indeed many regard it as the best government under the circumstances and far better than a National Democratic government would be. This discrimination is aggravating a situation already made sufficiently acute by the general economic distress apparent in Poland."

Dr. Benedikt holds that the crisis is international in scope and can therefore be solved only in an international way.

Discussing the situation in western Europe as it affects the Jews, especially in Germany and Austria, Dr. Benedikt said:

"The Hitlerite movement in Germany is of course unpleasant for the Jews, but I do not think it spells

great danger for German Jewry." Hitlerite leaders recently have evinced a tendency to mitigate their anti-Semitic agitation he said. He expressed doubt that Hitler would ever come into power in Germany but even in that eventuality, the conscience of the world would prevent the Hitlerites from depriving the Jews of their rights."

The political status of the Jews in Austria is not as bad as in Germany, although their economic position is far from good, the Vienna publisher stated.

Dr. Benedikt acknowledged that there is an anti-Semitic movement of proportion in Austria, but said that it has not attained the strength of the Nazi movement in Germany. Moreover, he said, public opinion is strongly opposed to the excesses as demonstrated by the criticism of the recent student excesses at the University of Vienna.

The middle class Jewish elements and the professional classes suffer greatly from the crisis. The situation is rendered more acute by the fact that unemployment deriving from professional classes are joining the ranks of the proletariat and there is not sufficient work to enable all to earn even a meagre livelihood.

The Viennese publisher gave the interviewer an impression of Theodore Herzl, who was not only one of the most distinguished contributors to the "Neue Freie Presse" but also a dear friend of the family.

Dr. Benedikt stated that Theodore Herzl was the most distinguished personality he has ever known. "His personality stands before me so vividly as if I had seen him but yesterday. He was like a High Priest with the spirit of God in his heart. He was so handsome and distinguished of appearance, that it alone would have rendered him unique, had he contributed nothing to the spirit and ideology of his people. He radiated warmth and power and confidence."

Discussing Herzl's writing, Dr. Benedikt declared: "His feuilletons were gems of charm and temperament. He was master of every subject with which he dealt. His writing combined humor with melancholy. To each sentence he lent a personal character, almost as a rare flower giving out memorable perfume. Moreover, all his work was instinct with humanitarianism. He chose martyrdom to glamor and success. He will remain an eternal memory of self-sacrifice to Zionists and non-Zionists alike," Dr. Benedikt stated.

bers unless they have authority to speak as representatives of the Committee? Mr. Brown did not speak with such authority nor did he claim that he was doing so; most probably he spoke as the publisher of a weekly periodical in New York City.

"The authoritative views of our Committee on the Polish situation are those given in the official publications of the Committee."

"In this connection may I remind you that during the sessions of the Institute of Politics at Williamstown, Mass., last summer, Mr. Max J. Kohler, who is also a member of the Committee and of its Executive Committee, represented the situation of the Polish Jews in a manner which undoubtedly agrees with the point of view of your Federation? He too did this in his personal capacity and not as a representative of our Committee."

The "Jewish Exponent" in its editorial said:

"The Federation of Polish Jews was entirely within its rights when it protested against the utterances of Mr. David A. Brown, while on a short visit in Warsaw, though there is evidently nothing the American Jewish Committee or the Joint Distribution Committee can do in this matter."

It proceeds to quote a quotation from the annual review of the year by Harry Schneiderman, editor of the American Jewish Year Book and assistant Secretary of the American Jewish Committee in which the acute misery is described. It comments:

"It is evident that Mr. Brown did not realize this; and not having realized it, had come to the conclusion that it did not exist. This is not unusual for one possessing Mr. Brown's characteristics. Had Mr. Brown been a little more cautious, had he applied a little forethought, he would have perceived that a statement such as he made to the Polish Telegraphic Agency, might do harm. As the matter stands, he has done a grave injustice to Polish Jewry."

The Jewish Daily Bulletin is in receipt of a communication from Louis Rittenberg, managing editor of the American Hebrew in which he says that the statements attributed to Mr. Brown in the Polish Telegraphic Agency interview are at variance with the articles which he has been writing in the American Hebrew.
