## Hitler Campaign Against Jews Becoming More Vigorous As Elections Approach

Seek to Attract Masses to Movement  
Through Boycott Agitation  
Against Jews

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Oct. 18.—With the approach of the Reichstag elections, next month, the Hitler campaign against the Jews is daily assuming a more vigorous form both in theory and practice.

Efforts are being made to attract the masses to the Nazis through their campaign of boycott against the Jews. Thus a register of all customers who buy in Jewish shops is to be compiled at the expense of the Nazis.

In addition the Premier of Oldenburg, Roever, has succeeded in pushing through the Diet a bill prohibiting Schechita, despite the appeal of the local rabbis that more careful consideration be given to the consequences of the act.

A similar resolution has been introduced by the Nazis in the Mecklenburg

## Special Court Releases Four Nazis When They Apologize To Jew for Attack

Read Into Record Letter from Woman  
Who Says She is Mother-in-Law  
of Goebbels

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Oct. 18.—The special court today released four Nazis who appeared in court in full uniform of the Storm Troops, after they had publicly apologized to a Jewish cafe proprietor, Loewy, for attacking his cafe and insulting him and his wife.

The trial revealed that the attack had been instigated by a Christian cafe owner, a competitor of Loewy's, who had first intoxicated the Nazis.

Another curious development at the trial was the reading into the record of a letter received by Loewy from a steady patron, Mrs. Friedlander, who apologized for being unable any longer to patronize his Jewish cafe "since it is unbecoming the mother-in-law of Goebbels."

Paul Joseph Goebbels is the editor of "Der Angriff," Nazi organ, and head of the Hitler party in Berlin.

## Cuban President Orders Havana To Revoke Order Raising Peddlers License Fees to \$120

Five Hundred Jewish Peddlers Affected  
by Decree; Representations Made  
by Jewish Bodies

HAVANA, Oct. 18.—The president of Cuba, General Gerardo Machado, has ordered the head of the municipality of Havana to rescind its order raising the price of peddlers' licenses from \$6 to \$120, it was learned here yesterday.

This information was imparted in a telegram received by Mrs. Elena Goldstein, president of the Jewish Women's Federation, which had made representations to the president concerning the matter as 500 Jewish peddlers would have been unfavorably affected by the ruling.

The matter of peddlers' licenses has been pending for some months. When the announcement of the sharp rise in license fees was announced, it aroused a storm of protest. Various representations have been made to the Cuban authorities to revoke the order.

A scroll signed by scores of Jewish leaders was deposited under the cornerstone.

Leib Jaffe presided. Messages of greeting were received from Baron Edmond de Rothschild, Dr. Chaim Weizmann, Nahum Sokolow, Oscar Wasserman, Dr. Leo Motzkin and others.

## Nine Injured as Revisionist, Histadruth Clashes Are Renewed in Jerusalem

Palestine Press Indignant; Blame Revisionists; Revisionist-Communist  
Clashes in Paris

JERUSALEM, Oct. 18.—Nine persons were injured, including two policemen, as clashes between striking Histadruth workers and Revisionists employed at the Prumin Biscuit factory were renewed today.

Twelve persons were arrested. Two of the injured were removed to the hospital in a serious condition.

Seven persons were injured yesterday in the clashes which resulted when the Histadruth workers objected to the employment of Revisionists in a factory against which they were striking.

Clashes between the Histadruth and the newly formed Revisionist Labor Union have been constant for the past two weeks. Despite a pledge given that hostilities would be held in abeyance for at least a month, they broke out in severe form yesterday, continuing today.

The Palestine press is indignant at the repetition of the clashes.

## 600 Attend First Paris Meeting in Connection With World Jewish Congress

Nahum Goldmann Addresses Session;  
Meeting Convened by Federation  
of Jewish Societies

PARIS, Oct. 18.—Six hundred people attended the first meeting held here last night in connection with the world Jewish congress which is scheduled to be summoned for the summer of 1934.

The meeting was convened under the auspices of the Federation of Jewish Societies. Addresses were made by Dr. Nahum Goldmann of Berlin, a leader in the congress movement; J. Joffe, Leon Bernheim and Albert Cremieux.

Messages of greeting were received from a number of leading personages.

## Newark Has First

### Jewish Commissioner

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

NEWARK, Oct. 18—For the first time since commission form of government went into effect in this city in 1917, Newark has a Jewish City Commissioner. Dr. Meyer C. Ellenstein was named by the four other commissioners to head the Department of Public Welfare, made vacant nearly a month ago by the death of the late Commissioner John F. Murray, Jr.

Dr. Ellenstein was a candidate for commissioner at the last city election in May, 1929, running sixth and polling more than 33,000 votes. In view of this a strong move was made to have him named to the Murray vacancy. The four remaining commissioners took more than 150 ballots before they finally agreed upon Ellenstein, and several days of discussion were occupied with this. Directors Egan and Gillen, Democrats, urged his selection from the very beginning of the balloting, while Mayor Congleton and Director Howe, Republicans, urged appointment of a member of Murray's official family.

Among the hundreds who appeared before the Commission to urge the Ellenstein appointment were Rabbi Solomon Foster, of Temple B'nai Jeshurun; Rabbi Julius Silberfeld, of Temple B'nai Abraham; Edgar S. Bamberger, and among others, a representative Negro as well as the head of the Greek-American Association of Newark. Director Egan specifically stated that he believed the Jews of Newark were entitled to have one of their faith on the City Commission because they were among the largest tax payers and representative of a strong business element.

Dr. Ellenstein is a native of Paterson but has lived here the greater part of his life. He is affiliated with many fraternal groups; is Exalted Ruler of the Elks and treasurer of the Hebrew Orphans Sheltering Institution.

# EINSTEIN CALLS ON JEWS TO HELP FOSTER INTERNATIONAL SPIRIT IN MESSAGE TO "JEWISH CURRENT EVENTS"

First Issue of Jewish Youth Weekly to Appear on October 28th; Break-down of Narrow Nationalism Significant for the Future of Jewish People Says Einstein

Professor Albert Einstein calls upon the Jews to help break down narrow nationalism and create a spirit of internationalism through the education of their youth in a message which is to appear in the first issue of "Jewish Current Events" on October 28th, a weekly journal devoted to the Jewish youth of America. The magazine is to be published by the "Jewish Daily Bulletin."

"Jewish Current Events" which was instituted five years ago and published by the Associated Talmud Torahs of Philadelphia will now appear in a new and enlarged form, with special added features. It has found its way into more than fifty cities, where it has been utilized by Hebrew Schools, Congregational Schools, Sunday Schools and Youth groups.

"Jewish Current Events" has been utilized in schools conducted by practically all of the Bureaus of Education throughout the country. Its educational usefulness is heartily endorsed by Jewish educators, rabbis and social workers throughout the country.

Professor Einstein states in his message: "It is important that an effort be made to interest the youth in questions and problems affecting the Jews. By devoting itself to this undertaking 'Jewish Current Events' will render a service."

"This is significant not only for the future of the Jewish people who everywhere stand in need of cohesion and mutual co-operation, but even more for the cultivation of the international spirit which is everywhere menaced by narrow nationalism."

"Since the days of the Prophets there has presented itself therein one of the grandest possibilities for our people scattered as it is all over the globe and united only by a common tradition."

# "Chronicle" Says Brown Allegations in Pat Interview Present Incredible Situation

**Asks Whether It Was Possible Mr. Brown Was Misquoted by Polish Newspaper; Awaits His Own Reply**

The "Detroit Jewish Chronicle" in its current issue publishes an editorial devoted to the interview with David A. Brown by the Polish Telegraphic Agency in which Mr. Brown is made the authority for the statement that no specific misery exists among Polish Jewry.

The "Chronicle" editorial calls the situation which presents itself as incredible in view of the fact that Mr. Brown was previously at the helm of the fund-raising effort which broadcast the cries of despair from Poland.

"The protest against the interview given by David A. Brown to the Polish Telegraphic Agency presents an incredible situation," the editorial says.

"Since the war, news agencies and spokesmen for all parties in Poland, as well as visitors to Poland have agreed that the position of the Jews in Poland is a horribly depressing one. Mr. Brown's statement to the Polish news-gathering agency not only belittles these reports, but brands as lies the description of poverty and oppression in Polish Jewry.

"For years Mr. Brown was at the helm of fund-raising groups who broadcast the cries of despair that emanated from Poland.

"The blackest pictures were drawn by the propagandists who worked under him. How is it possible that he should now proclaim to the world that these were exaggerations! Is it possible that he was misquoted by Polish newspapermen? No one doubts the statements that continue to come from the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, the Joint Distribution Committee, the American Jewish Congress and other groups relative to the despairing position of the Jews of Poland. Is it possible that Mr. Brown was wronged in the quotations of Polish newspapermen? We await his reply with great interest in order that the situation may be thoroughly clarified."

The "American Hebrew" in its current issue refers to the Polish Telegraphic Agency interview with Mr. Brown and states that since Mr. Brown is now in the Orient, it can make no reply in his behalf.

It points out its belief, however, that Mr. Brown must have been misquoted inasmuch as the Polish Telegraphic Agency interview credits Mr. Brown with statements concerning the plight of Polish Jewry, which are contradictory to what Mr. Brown says in the articles which he has been writing for the "American Hebrew."

# Roumanian Jewish Schools Are Doomed by Government Policy Asserts Jewish Deputy

**Deputy Manfred Reifer Declares Systematic Policy of Government Inimical to Every Kind of Minority School**

Jewish schools are doomed in Roumania, in spite of all provisions in peace treaties, etc., by systematic policy of the Government which is inimical to every kind of minority school, according to Dr. Manfred Reifer, Jewish Deputy in the Roumanian parliament, in an editorial appearing in the (Czernowitz) "Ostjuedische Zeitung" which has reached this country.

There are, says he, so many conflicts between the parties, and there is but little consistency in the policy of the various Governments, but in the fight against the minority schools all are united. Only before elections, a party is favorable to minorities, afterwards it becomes hostile. Press Departments of the Roumanian embassies abroad are very busy trying to spread the belief by propagating some speeches which had been delivered by leaders of the Opposition, that minorities in Roumania enjoy the full protection of the peace treaties. But the truth is far from this.

Ukrainian, German, Polish schools have been abolished by special acts. But, the worst has happened, continues the report, to the Jewish minority. Whatever might be connected with Jewish schools has been systematically destroyed. When there is anything to Roumanize, no laws are permitted to stand in the way. Not a single Jewish middle or elementary school is being subsidized by the State. The repeated demands for a Jewish teachers' seminary is being entirely ignored, so that in a short time, the Jewish minority will not even have Jewish teachers. The Government is destroying even such private schools as are not subsidized, by making difficult the obtaining of a license. The officials have done their best to Roumanize the existing schools and to wipe out any trace of Jewishness.

As a special instance is described the fate of the so-called Jewish III State Gymnasium in Czernowitz. When this school was declared Jewish in 1918, Jewish professors taught Jewish students. Professors of Roumanian nationality were engaged to teach Roumanian language, history, and geography, since teachers who belong to a minority are not permitted to teach those branches. The Roumanian professors were not pedagogically trained and functioned more as spies than as teachers. Owing to these facts, the number of students decreased gradually from year to year, from 1,350 in 1919 to 271 in 1932. During the same period, the number of classes decreased gradually from 31 to seven. Furthermore, the Jewish professors were transferred to various sections of the land, and re-

# Colonel Lehman Officially Notified of Nomination; Campaign Gets Under Way

**Pledges Himself to Economy Program and to Make New York a Humane State**

The campaign of Lieutenant-Governor Herbert H. Lehman for governor of New York State was set officially under way last night with formal notification that he had been named a candidate for the office by the Democratic State Party.

The notification ceremonies took place at the National Democratic Club, Victor J. Dowling, former presiding judge of the Appellate Division, delivered the notification address and addresses were also delivered by Surrogate John P. O'Brien, Democratic candidate for Mayor; James A. Farley, National chairman of the Democratic Committee; M. William Bray, Democratic candidate for Lieutenant Governor; Elmer E. Studley and John Fitzgibbons, candidates for representatives at large.

Senator William F. Wagner was also notified of his nomination for re-election to the United States Senate at the same time.

The acceptance addresses of Lieutenant Governor Lehman and Senator Wagner were broadcast.

Colonel Lehman said in his address: "My conception of true economy is not the mere coining of a phrase, but an uncompromising fight against any waste, or corruption, or extravagance, and the elimination of all that is not essential or productive of specific economic and social progress. I pledge myself to the maintenance of this principle and I promise that so long as I am Governor there will not be a cent of the tax payers' money wasted or unnecessarily spent. The character of economy must be constructive and based on intimate knowledge of conditions as well as on the ability to plan far ahead. It must not be ruthless in destroying those great undertakings for which we have so bitterly fought so many years. This state, leader among the states of the nation in the pursuit of the happiness and well-being of its men, women and children cannot slip back now. New York must always be a humane state."

Colonel Lehman was the guest of honor on Monday at a luncheon given by the Naturalized Voters' Division of the Independent Citizens' Committee for the election of Herbert H. Lehman and M. William Bray.

The luncheon which was attended by leading editors and writers of the foreign language press was held at the Hotel Commodore.

Dr. Henry Moskowitz presided. Addresses were delivered by Colonel Lehman, Senator Robert F. Wagner and Surrogate John P. O'Brien.

Surrogate O'Brien said: "When I am in City Hall, there will be no timidity." (Continued on Page 4)

Czecho-Slovakia according to information received at the offices of the American Jewish Congress from Dr. Nahum Goldmann, who is in charge of the central office of the Executive Committee for the organization of the World Jewish Congress.

The report which has also been circulated among the members of the Executive Committee, states that Dr. Goldmann is proceeding with the establishment of the central office in Berlin and that public meetings were recently held at Prague and Vienna where Dr. Goldmann, Dr. Isaac Gruenbaum and Dr. Emil Margulies reported on the proceedings of the World Conference.

M. J. Jefroykin, of France, a member of the Executive Committee, will visit South America, including Brazil and Argentina and will report on the World Jewish Conference to the Jewish communities in both these countries.

Dr. Goldmann expects to spend some time in England the latter part of October and from there will proceed to Poland to help in setting up World Congress committees there.

The American Jewish Congress reports that the complete minutes of the World Conference have already gone to press and should be available sometime early in November.

Several meetings at which the American delegates to the World Conference will make their reports are scheduled to be held in Philadelphia, Washington, Baltimore, Pittsburgh, Chicago and Cleveland.

placed by younger Roumanian professors. Last year, the institution was changed into a Gymnasium with four classes, and into the first class, no more than 55 students are being admitted. This the fate of a "Jewish" Gymnasium, which is in truth non-existent, but is listed abroad as a Jewish school. The principal is a Roumanian, the students are now Jews and non-Jews. By transferring the Jewish professors, the Government has caused trouble, not only to the professors themselves, but has even ruined family life and livelihood, because it was not always possible to transfer the other members of the family.

There were, furthermore, many transfers of Jewish professors from Middle schools, Dr. Reifer continues. A law which prohibited the transfers was modified by Jorga so as to permit transfers of teachers of schools which are dissolved. But the restriction is being generally disregarded, and many Jewish professors were transferred from Czernowitz to distant sections; they were at once replaced by Roumanians, sometimes by very poorly qualified younger ones. A statement was made that the transfers were equally applied to Jews and non-Jews, but, while this is formally true, it is a matter of fact that the transferring of non-Jews was never put into effect, whereas the Jews who were concerned vainly fought against the transferring decree.

The Jewish minority is suffering its last pain, since there is nothing left of its minority rights to be taken away.
