Anti-Semitic Incidents in Vienna Parliament Cause Adjournment of Session

**Inkpots Aimed at Dr. Otto Bauer, as
Noted Socialist Leader Is Attacked
on Differences with Chancellor**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

VIENNA, Oct. 22 — Anti-Semitic scenes took place in Parliament yesterday following a controversy between Chancellor Dollfus and Dr. Otto Bauer, noted Socialist leader.

The incidents which started with verbal abuse soon developed into a free for all fight. The Christian Socialists started the fracas when they assailed Dr. Bauer as "You Dirty Jew!" Others shouted to the Socialist benches: "This is not a synagogue!"

Thereupon a Heimwehr deputy, Leichtenegger, using inkpots as missiles, proceeded to throw them at Dr. Bauer. He missed his aim, however, and hit instead Minister of Trade Jakoncig and a deputy, Dannenberg. None sustained injuries, but many were smeared with ink.

The Speaker adjourned the session amid cries: "Out with the dirty Jews!"

This is the second time that a Heimwehr deputy has attempted to perpetrate physical acts against Dr. Bauer. Last July 19, a Heimwehr deputy, Henzl, threw an inkstand at him during a controversy at a meeting of the Finance Committee of Parliament. Dr. Bauer sustained such serious injuries

Report Hungarian Government Considering Abolition of Numerus Clausus

**Government Circles State, However,
Consideration Being Given
to Mitigation**

BUDAPEST, Oct. 22—The abolition of numerus clausus obtaining at Hungarian Universities is now being contemplated by Premier Julius Gombos, the press here forecast yesterday.

An effort to secure confirmation from government circles elicited the information that the government is planning to further reduce the stringency of the numerus clausus law, but not its complete abandonment.

The reason given for the mitigation planned is that those studying abroad, export Hungarian currency with damaging results to national finances. The acceptance of larger numbers of students in Hungarian universities will prevent the export of money, they hold.

State Sir John Hope Simpson Failed to Get Danzig Post Owing To Unpopularity With Jews

**London Paper Points to Sir John's
Disrepute as Result of His
Palestine Report**

LONDON, Oct. 22—The failure of Sir John Hope Simpson to secure the High Commissioner of Danzig, in succession to the late High Commissioner, Gravina, is due to his unpopularity with the Jews, tonight's "Evening Standard" reports.

The paper states that Sir John's report on Palestine, as special investigator for the British government, has antagonized the Jewish world. Since there are more Jews in Poland than in any other country at present, Sir John Simpson's appointment failed to materialize.

Sir John will return to China to continue his relief work.

Three-Day Olympiad In Progress in Tel Aviv

TEL AVIV, Oct. 22—A three-day Olympiad in which 4,000 Jewish athletes are participating, opened here yesterday.

1,000 Certificates for Relatives of Palestine Residents Agency Decides

**Controversy Over Allotment of Part
of Certificates to Middle Class
Settlers**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM, Oct. 22—One thousand certificates of the 4,500 labor certificates granted to the Jewish Agency by the Palestine government for the current six month period will be reserved for relatives of Palestine residents according to a decision of the Immigration Commission of the Jewish Agency yesterday.

Serious differences regarding the proportion of certificates to be made available to middle class settlers who have not sufficient funds to be admitted under the capitalist category, have arisen.

The General Zionists declare that middle class elements are now more important for Palestine development than chaltzim and demand that 1,500 of the labor certificates be made available for these middle class elements and 1,400 for chaltzim.

Unless this is done, they threaten to break up the coalition reached at last year's World Zionist Congress and to recall the General Zionists from the Zionist Executive.

No decision has been reached as yet, but it is expected some compromise will be agreed upon with the allotment of between 500 and 1,000 certificates for middle class settlers.

Two New Attacks Upon Jews in Tunisia

Two Jews were injured at Zarzis by Arabs who perpetrated the attack.

A number of arrests were made by the police.

Askwith Named Director of American Office of Hebrew U.

Herbert Askwith, formerly managing editor of the "Menorah Journal," and of the "World Review," was appointed director of the American office of the Hebrew University, at a meeting of the Executive Committee of the American Friends of the Hebrew University, according to an announcement issued by Dr. A. S. W. Rosenbach, President, today.

Mr. Askwith, who is a graduate of Harvard University and a native of Boston, will take office immediately, it is announced. He will undertake to promote interest in the Hebrew University in this country, and to assist in raising the budget assumed by the American Friends of the Hebrew University.

"Despite the serious obstacles to which the work of the Hebrew University has been exposed by economic crises in Europe and America," Dr. Rosenbach stated, "new developments have been initiated in several departments, and earlier activities have been intensified and expanded. Three important new developments were recently authorized at the Board of Governors' meetings. First, a School of Agriculture will be established by the University in conjunction with the Agricultural Experiment Station of the Jewish Agency, an enterprise of far-reaching importance for agriculture in Palestine. Another project includes a University Hospital to be built on Mt. Scopus, and a third, the establishment of a Chair for the Art and Archaeology of the Near East."

The eighth academic year of the Hebrew University will begin at the end of this month, Dr. Rosenbach stated. Plans have been made for the formal opening of the Physics Building of the Einstein Institute, funds for which have been contributed by the late Philip Wattenberg, and Solomon and Dora Shapiro of New York.

Report Make Party Had Agreed To Caste Goebbels Minister Of Education and Press

Promise Made During Negotiations
for Nazi-Center Coalition; Would
Have Controlled Kehiloth

BERLIN, Oct. 22.—The Center Party of former Chancellor Heinrich Brüning had agreed to appoint Paul Joseph Goebbels, chief of the Hitler party in Berlin, Minister of Press and Education in the event of a coalition with the Nazis.

This disclosure was made by Goebbels himself yesterday in the course of a heated debate with the Nationalists. The agreement was allegedly entered into during the progress of the Nazi-Center negotiations prior to the dissolution of the Reichstag.

The Minister of Education has under his jurisdiction the supervision of the Jewish Communities and Youth Education. Had Goebbels received the post, he would have been in a powerful position to wreak Nazi "vengeance" against the Jews.

Semi-Annual Clearance of Jewish National Fund Boxes

More than 50,000 Jewish homes and offices will be canvassed by Zionist volunteer committees in the semi-annual clearance of the Blue-White boxes of the Jewish National Fund of America for the yield of coin donations deposited since October 1st last.

A box clearance drive was begun on October 15th in more than 300 communities throughout the country. The average yield per box amounts to about \$1.00 a year, the results of the semi-annual clearances for many years show. This average continues to hold good even during the depression year. Nelson Rutenberg, President of the Fund, stated. While the income of the Fund from other sources had necessarily declined because of the depression, the yield of the coin donations deposited in the Blue-White boxes has been affected but slightly, he stated.

Mr. Rutenberg also announced that the Fund has decided, for the purpose of stimulating interest among the box holders, to award three prizes to the owners of the three boxes in which the largest sums will be found during the present clearance. The first prize constitutes an inscription in the Golden Book of the Keren Kayemeth Le Israel, which is a permanent record of names of persons who rendered unusual service to the upbuilding of Palestine; the second prize consists of a certificate of 50 trees being planted, in the name of the box owner, in the George Washington Forest in Palestine; the winner of the third prize will be able to select a valuable volume of Jewish literature in the English or Hebrew language.

Release 134 Imprisoned Since 1929 as Members of White Slave Traffic Ring

Members of Zwi Migdal Society Had
Been Exposed Through Jewish
Women's Association

BUENOS AIRES, Oct. 22.—One hundred and thirty-four members of the Zwi Migdal Society, which under the guise of a mutual aid society had been carrying on white slave traffic for a quarter of a century, were ordered released yesterday by the Court of the First Instance.

The 134 members had been arrested and imprisoned in 1929 largely through the efforts of the International Jewish Association for the Protection of Girls and Women.

For twenty-five years the Society had functioned, conducting a traffic in white slaves, the majority being young Polish Jewesses.

All the 450 members of the organization were implicated in the white slave plot. Three hundred fled Argentina when their affiliation was discovered and cannot ever return, being placed in the category of fugitives and rebels.

Two members of the Society, charged with corruption, were sentenced to prison by the Appeal court yesterday. The others were released, the appeal court holding that since the Province of Buenos Aires had given the Society a charter to function as a Jewish mutual aid and burial society, it could not be charged with being an illicit association.

At the time of the exposure in 1929, a sensation was created.

Prof. Freund, Authority On Jurisprudence, Dies

CHICAGO, Oct. 22.—Professor Ernst Freund of the University of Chicago, internationally known authority on jurisprudence, died in his sleep at the Billings Memorial Hospital, succumbing to a heart ailment.

Professor Freund was sixty-eight years old. Born in New York City on January 30, 1864, the son of Ludwig A. and Nannie Freund, he was educated at the Universities of Berlin and Heidelberg, and at Columbia University.

He had been a professor of jurisprudence and public law at the University of Chicago since 1902.

Professor Freund served as Commissioner of Uniform State Laws and was at one time the president of the American Political Science Association. He was a member of the Illinois and New York City Bar Associations and the Institut International du droit public.

Dr. Solomon Flink, of Elizabeth, N. J., has been appointed instructor in economics at Yeshiva College. Dr. Flink is also a member of the faculty of City College of New York.

Nazis Charge Fall of German Kaiser Due to Inter-marriage Of Royal Family With Jews

Assert von Papen Dominated by Powerful Jews; Calls for Overthrow

BERLIN, Oct. 22—The Nazis have managed to inject the Jewish question even into the controversy with regard to the fall of the monarchy in Germany, as part of their election propaganda.

The Nazi press, headed by the "Voelkischer Beobachter," declares that "the downfall of the Kaiser was due to the shameful blood mixture of the royal family with daughters of Jewish bankers and the transfer of Prussian trade to the Jews."

Today, the Nazis assert, Chancellor von Papen prefers the domination of powerful Jews. Whereas the old-time dukes and counts had their court Jews, today the powerful Jews have their court dukes and court counts.

Members of the Herren Club, they assert, the Jewish bankers, Herbert Guttman and Kleefeld, brother-in-law of the late Gustav Stresemann, and other powerful Jews, dominate the von Papen government. The nation has submitted to the rulership of the powerful Jews. Therefore it is necessary to overthrow the von Papen government and destroy the domination of the Jews, the Nazis urge.

Jewish Philanthropies of Boston Open Campaign

BOSTON, Oct. 22—Before a gathering of nearly 1,000 dinner guests, the 1932-33 campaign of the Associated Jewish Philanthropies was launched. Pledges totalling \$218,385 were announced to start the campaign fund for the support of the 18 institutions and agencies comprising Associated.

Setting an example for Boston and leaders of other communities to follow, Louis E. Kirstein, who in his address at the recent Washington conference stressed the business man's responsibility renewed his subscription of \$27,500. He also announced that the anonymous contribution of \$65,000 would be available for the third successive year. For the first time Mr. Kirstein revealed that the anonymous donor was a woman.

Speakers at the banquet were Professor Felix Frankfurter, Governor Joseph B. Ely, Dr. B. M. Selekan, executive director of the Philanthropies; Henry Penn, campaign chairman; Mrs. Hyman Freiman, chairman of the Women's Division, and Dr. Charles F. Wilinsky, director of Beth Israel Hospital.

Tribute to the leadership of Dr. Selekan in guiding the Philanthropies through three years of the depression, was paid by Mr. Kirstein.

National Council of Federations and Welfare Funds to Meet in Cleveland

First Formal Session to Be Held on October 30th

CLEVELAND, Oct. 22—The National Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds, organized at a meeting in Philadelphia last May, will hold its first formal session on Sunday, October 30, at the Hotel Statler, Cleveland.

An Organization Committee of twenty-five representative leaders from communities scattered all over the country has been working on plans of the Council under the Chairmanship of William J. Shroder of Cincinnati.

The National Council has for its purpose the consideration of the common interest and problems of Jewish federations and welfare funds and towards this purpose is attempting to organize its membership to develop standards and principles of effective community organization, to promote the organization of Jewish communities for social service and to coordinate intercommunity relationships in extra local activities. Membership in the Council is open to all local Jewish federations, welfare funds or similar organizations which have for their objective centralization of planning or financing for Jewish social work.

The meeting in Cleveland will devote itself to consideration of important problems which are facing all of the Jewish federations of the country today. Solomon Lowenstein, Executive Director of the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies of New York City will lead a discussion on the effect of the extending activities of public welfare agencies on Jewish social work. The increasing activities of the federal, state and municipal governments and the provision of relief and other welfare services is compelling the Jewish social agencies to modify their programs and the Jewish communities will accordingly have to decide what their relationship is to be to this rapidly changing condition.

Another problem of major significance to Jewish social work, to be discussed by Samuel A. Goldsmith, Director of the Jewish Charities of Chicago, is the raising of funds for Jewish social work in view of the increasing participation of Jewish agencies in joint emergency funds and community chests.

Washington Leader Indicts Brown for "Whitewashing" Polish Jewish Situation

Ninety Percent of Polish Jews Without Livelihood, Paul Himmelfarb Asserts; Has Just Returned from Abroad

WASHINGTON, Oct. 22—David A. Brown, publisher of the "American Hebrew," who recently characterized as exaggerated news emanating from Poland about the misery of the Jews there, was made the subject of a stinging indictment in a statement issued to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency today by Paul Himmelfarb, Washington communal leader, who has just returned from an extended visit in Europe where he devoted his time to a study of Jewish conditions in various countries.

Challenging Mr. Brown to cite facts which would uphold his views, Mr. Himmelfarb declared that in no country in Europe are the Jews as miserable and poverty-stricken as in Poland. Saying that Mr. Brown's remarks were obviously the result of imagination rather than a study of the actual situation, Mr. Himmelfarb asserted that "not only is Mr. Brown uninformed but his views, given wide publicity, unfortunately, are likely to be very harmful to the Jews of Poland who have sufficient misery now without having it multiplied by the unsolicited criticisms of a superficial and incompetent observer."

Mr. Himmelfarb, a business man, is a prominent figure in the Washington Jewish community, being Vice-President of the United Hebrew Charities, a leading personality in the Zionist movement there, and a member of the board of practically every important Jewish institution in the city. During his tour of Europe, Mr. Himmelfarb visited England, Holland, Germany, Palestine, Austria and Poland. The statement which he made is as follows: "I was deeply shocked upon reading in the 'Jewish Daily Bulletin' of the statement attributed to David A. Brown to the effect that reports reaching this country of Jewish conditions in Poland are exaggerated and that the

Jewish situation in that country is far from being the terrible thing that it is described to be. My amazement arose from two causes. In the first place, I was surprised that a man who has been in public life as long as Mr. Brown and who is presumed to have a sense of responsibility should have permitted himself to make a statement that is, on its very surface without basis. In the second place, I have just returned from Poland and am in a position to know that he has no facts whatsoever on which to base a judgment which is not only uninformed but likely to be very harmful to the Jews of Poland who have sufficient misery now without having it multiplied by the unsolicited criticisms of a superficial and incompetent observer.

"Mr. Brown's views emanate from Warsaw. There are two phases of life in that city. On the one side are the cabarets and amusement places and luxurious hotels, where life goes on much as it does in our own country. But on the other side are the Jews who live in conditions of squalor and poverty which are indescribable. Undernourished, living in physical conditions that are dangerous to health and horrible for their minds, these Jews stand as a striking rebuke to the superficiality of Mr. Brown's comments. Mr. Brown could not possibly have visited the Jewish hovels and talked with men and women from whom hope in the future has completely vanished. I did not content myself with relaxation in Warsaw's Bristol Hotel. I visited the Jewish districts. And then I went from one town to another stopping off at the loneliest railroad junctions as well as the larger centers of Jewish population. Where autos could not penetrate I hired a team of horses. For my visit to Europe was purely for the purpose of seeing how Jews there live at first hand.

"Whether I was in Warsaw, Rovno, Lutsky, Lvov, Olik, Dubnow, Berner, Truvitz, or Dmidavka, I saw hunger, unemployment, despair. I am safe in saying that ninety percent of the Jews of Poland are not making a living at the present time. Mr. Brown has whitewashed the Polish Government when he contends that economic conditions in Poland are alike for Jews and non-Jews. Even the slightest intimacy with the facts points in an entirely different direction. In the first place, the majority of Polish Jews try to make a livelihood from some mercantile trade. But the Government makes this practically impossible, by the inequitable and crushing burden of taxation which it levies upon the mer-

chants. Officials are ruthless in the collection of taxes, with the result that innumerable Jewish merchants find their property confiscated, their shops locked because they haven't the zlotys necessary to pay the Government.

"In the struggle for employment between Jew and Pole, the latter is always given the preference, without regard to the merits of the case. This applies to public works as well as to private establishments. Jews who have hopes of escaping from the pressure upon the merchant class find their way barred to the Universities and other higher institutions of learning. Their entry into the professions is halted by almost insuperable obstacles.

"But at the present time, in view of the critical conditions which exist, it is important that American Jews should be made to realize the immediate problem rather than confuse them with discussion of fundamental causes. These are not isolated cases but are typical of the entire country. The remnant of Polish Jews that is self-sustaining can not possibly cope with the problem.

"I believe that it is the duty of every person who returns from Poland to plead with his fellow Jews in America to do what they can immediately for Polish Jewry. It is not only money for food that is essential. Those who have clothes of any kind should turn them over to local agencies for shipment to Poland. With the Winter fast approaching, it means that Polish Jews will be the victims of the cold as well as of undernourishment.

"I consider it nothing less than cruel that Mr. Brown should have minimized the situation, that he should have pretended to give a review based on nothing more substantial than observations from a hotel window. It is unfortunate that Mr. Brown's views were given wide publicity. For my part, I can say that in no country in Europe are the Jews as miserable and poverty-stricken as in Poland. How can things be different when sources of livelihood are cut off from them by Government or private discrimination?"

Anti-Semite Disturbances Renewed in Vienna

VIENNA, Oct. 22—The anti-Semite attacks which were renewed on Thursday when the University of Vienna re-opened after three days of closing continued yesterday.

Jewish students were beaten up by the Nazis and thrown out of the college buildings.

All persons entering the campus are now required to show identification cards.

The University authorities have extended the period of registration for Jewish students until peace and order are restored. The aim of the Nazis is to prevent the Jewish students from enrolling for the current term. The Jewish student organizations therefore requested the rectorate to prolong the period of enrollment.
