American Students in Vienna Ask Minister Whether They Ought to Return to U.S.

Stockton Assures Full Protection; Also Asks Government to Effectuate Stimson Issues Similar Statement Here; Community Protests

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

VIENNA, Oct. 29-A delegation of twenty-five American students, including non-Jews, representing the American student body at the University of Vienna visited the American Minister, G. B. Stockton, today to learn whether it is advisable for them to return to the United States, in view of the anti-Semitic disturbances or whether the American Minister will assure American citizens of protection.

The American Minister assured the delegation that the most far-reaching protection would be accorded. He advised the students to remain aloof from Austrian politics and to try to pursue their studies peaceably. If trouble recurs, an American self-defense group should be organized, the Minister said, and the students should immediately leave the University campus.

The meeting with the American Minister was followed by a stormy session where the delegation reported to the American student body the results of the interview.

A section of the student body expressed dissatisfaction with the results of the interviews between the American Minister and the Austrian government and educational authorities, de-

Arab Executive Decides To Reject Report of Lewis French, Land Commissioner

Complete Stoppage of Jewish Immigration

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) JERUSALEM, Oct. 29-The Arab Executive at its session today decided to reject the report of Lewis French. Palestine Land Commissioner.

The report, which was completed in the spring, will not be made public until the British government has received the views of the Jewish and Arab Executives and the recommendations of the High Commissioner, following which it will issue a statement

on policy. At the same time the Executive formulated plans for the calling of a gen-

eral strike on Balfour Day. It also called upon the government to call a complete halt to immigration of Jews to Palestine and to prevent Jews from purchasing land.

6 Jewish Students, Non-Jewish Instructor, Beaten Up at Budapest University

Belief That Numerus Clausus Will Be Modified Leads to Excesses; Vigorous Action Promised

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency) BUDAPEST, Oct. 29-Six Jewish students were severely beaten up today when anti-Semitic excesses were renewed at the University of Budapest, the fighting being particularly severe in the School of Philosophy.

A non-Jewish professor, Tomanovszky, was among those beaten up, when he came to the defense of the Jewish

The government took measures to suppress the disturbances, surrounding the University with a police cordon.

The excesses broke out when rumor became current that a modification of the numerus clausus regulation is in the offiing.

The indignation of the American students has further been aroused by the publication in the Nazi press of a list of the names of American students at the University which gives their num- Jewish students as well as torn clothes. ber as one hundred and twenty.

Their anger is particularly aroused because the list which is the property of the University officials, is supposed to be confidential.

The Nazi press states that 74% of the American students are Jews, 12% are atheists or converts to Christianity, or have names that sound Jewish. The Nazi organs conclude that "real Americans" constitute only 14% of the group. Therefore America should have no interest in protecting the Iews and the Austrian government should not take seriously the American Legation's protests, which should be regarded as purely formal.

In addition, the Nazi papers point out, it is impossible to ask German students, while they are engaged in beating up a student, to investigate whether, for example, the Jewish nose of Israel Chanin accidently settled in

To this the papers add that it is altogether untrue that Americans were injured. No official protocol exists and the injuries of not a single American are certified by the police doctor who treated the injured.

Stimson Assures Protection

The entire Jewish relief activity has to be re-established on a solid rational basis, as have all branches of business by re-organization, elimination of superfluous expenses, etc. Visible expression of former, similar, but unsuccessful attempts might have been seen

in several world welfare conferences. The present terrible crisis possibly should effectuate what in better times had failed for lack of psychical prem-

We begin, concludes the article, a new Jewish year. We face an emergency winter which unfortunately, it appears, will be more burdensome than the past ones. The consciousness of Jewish solidarity all over the world, the obligation of mutual help must be strengthened. In the union of Jewish communities of the entire world which should be brought about by the crisis, the German Jews must not stand aside. Though there is, in their own community, much opportunity for welfare work, they should never forget that to those Jews, who are suffering from an even greater spiritual and economic want than the Jews in Germany.
