American Students in Vienna Ask Minister Whether They Ought to Return to U. S.

**Stockton Assures Full Protection;
Stimson Issues Similar Statement
Here; Community Protests**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

VIENNA, Oct. 29—A delegation of twenty-five American students, including non-Jews, representing the American student body at the University of Vienna visited the American Minister, G. B. Stockton, today to learn whether it is advisable for them to return to the United States, in view of the anti-Semitic disturbances or whether the American Minister will assure American citizens of protection.

The American Minister assured the delegation that the most far-reaching protection would be accorded. He advised the students to remain aloof from Austrian politics and to try to pursue their studies peacefully. If trouble recurs, an American self-defense group should be organized, the Minister said, and the students should immediately leave the University campus.

The meeting with the American Minister was followed by a stormy session where the delegation reported to the American student body the results of the interview.

A section of the student body expressed dissatisfaction with the results of the interviews between the American Minister and the Austrian government and educational authorities, de-

To Ask Government Action Against State Attorney for Allegations Against Jews

**Jews Aroused by Charge That Arson
Is Commonplace Among Jews,
Especially in London**

JERUSALEM, Oct. 29—Jewish circles are aroused by the open anti-Semitic avowal made for the first time in Palestine by State Attorney L. Elliott, during an arson trial in which a Georgian Jew, Turshvili, is the defendant.

"The Jews are necessarily arsonists," State Attorney Elliott declared, adding that it is well known in London that Jews always insure their stores and set fire to them in order to collect insurance.

Arab Executive Decides To Reject Report of Lewis French, Land Commissioner

**Also Asks Government to Effectuate
Complete Stoppage of Jewish
Immigration**

JERUSALEM, Oct. 29—The Arab Executive at its session today decided to reject the report of Lewis French, Palestine Land Commissioner.

The report, which was completed in the spring, will not be made public until the British government has received the views of the Jewish and Arab Executives and the recommendations of the High Commissioner, following which it will issue a statement on policy.

At the same time the Executive formulated plans for the calling of a general strike on Balfour Day. It also called upon the government to call a complete halt to immigration of Jews to Palestine and to prevent Jews from purchasing land.

Jewish Pupils Attacked As Teachers Stand By

WARSAW, Oct. 29—Jewish pupils at an evening school were attacked and severely beaten up by their class-mates last night.

One of the students, Isaac Gurfinkel, received serious head injuries.

Teachers who witnessed the attack and to whom the Jews appealed for aid, refused to intervene in their behalf.

Special Coach for Jews Migrating to Bira Bidjan

MOSCOW, Oct. 29—All trains running between Moscow and Vladivostok will in the future have a special coach for Jewish immigrants proceeding to Bira Bidjan, it was announced here today.

The coach will have signs in Yiddish and other Yiddish insignia to indicate that it is enroute to Bira Bidjan.

6 Jewish Students, Non- Jewish Instructor, Beaten Up at Budapest University

**Belief That Numerus Clausus Will Be
Modified Leads to Excesses;
Vigorous Action Promised**

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BUDAPEST, Oct. 29—Six Jewish students were severely beaten up today when anti-Semitic excesses were renewed at the University of Budapest, the fighting being particularly severe in the School of Philosophy.

A non-Jewish professor, Tomanovszky, was among those beaten up, when he came to the defense of the Jewish students.

The government took measures to suppress the disturbances, surrounding the University with a police cordon.

The excesses broke out when a rumor became current that a modification of the numerus clausus regulation is in the offing.

At today's session of Parliament, the deputies, Gal and Vaszonyi, again interpellated the government on the numerus clausus question and showed that the University is accepting students, not in accordance with their qualifications, but on the basis of racial origin.

The Minister of Education, replying to this interpellation, replied that there is no justification for such a system. He promised an improvement in conditions and the most vigorous action to maintain peace.

Jewish Mill Owners Offered to Buy 2 Tons of Home Wheat for Every Ton of American Wheat

**Offer Refused by Latvian Minister of
Agriculture Although Government
Would Have Benefitted**

RIGA, Oct. 29—The Latvian Minister of Agriculture publishes a statement in the organ, "Jaunakas Zinas," explaining why he sold to Latvian co-operatives American wheat, which, Jewish mills protest, he refused to sell them.

The Minister states he sold the wheat to the Latvian co-operatives "so that they may also benefit."

The Jewish press points out with indignation that Jewish mill owners offered to buy two tons of home grown

Urges Strengthening of Mutual Relief Work on New Sound Rational Basis

"Rundschau" Says This Is Urgent Necessity for Various Jewish Relief Organizations

Strengthening of Jewish mutual relief work on a new sound rational basis is an urgent necessity for the various Jewish relief organizations all over the world, according to an editorial in the "Juedische Rundschau" of Berlin, entitled "Community of Fate."

In spite of their own needs and wants, says the article, even the Jews in Warsaw and in Carpatho-Russia, among whom are the poorest of the poor, are highly interested in, and sympathetic with, the fate of the German Jews. "This fact proves, on the one hand, 'Jewish Solidarity,' but, on the other hand, it puts a high obligation on the Jews in Germany. German-Jewish organizations have always participated in relief activities in behalf of the Eastern Jews, together with other worldwide known organizations of other countries. This was the case even in post-war time, when German Jews were by far no longer the well-to-do part of the Jewish people, and when their contribution had to be reduced according to their own diminished resources, but the German Jews have never lost the consciousness of their obligation to cooperate with the other inter-territorial organizations. The manifestations of sympathy coming from Jews in all countries and also from the Jews in Eastern Europe have only intensified this consciousness.

But, to speak frankly, the crisis of the Jewish masses in Poland, Roumania, Carpatho-Russia, and other small countries is so acute that the best planned relief action can succeed only to a small degree. Certainly, it must not be overlooked that the Jews in all countries, including America, have considerably suffered, and all Jewish communities have to alleviate so much distress within their own countries that they cannot make great contributions to the Jews in Eastern Europe.

The Jewish crisis has become universal. Countries which were on the contributors list are now among the applicants for relief. The Jews in Germany have, by their own experience, learned to understand this. These considerations cry aloud for a change of attitude and procedure.

No Relief for Jewish Staatenlose in Roumanian Government's New Amending Bill

BUCHAREST — Parliament has passed the Government bill for the amendment of the Citizenship Law which prolongs the period for receiving applications for Citizenship for another year. Applications will be accepted, however, only from people who hold residential rights in one of the localities in the annexed territories, but could not claim their citizenship because they were out of the country when the Citizenship lists were compiled.

The legal position of the overwhelming mass of the Jewish Staatenlose in Roumania is consequently left where it was.

Objections on this ground were made by Deputy Landau on behalf of the Jewish Parliamentary Club, who was supported by Deputy Rosenberg, one of the Jewish members of the Government Party, who demanded that the basis for acquiring citizenship in the new provinces should not be administrative domicile as at present, but actual domicile at the time of the annexation.

Deputy Weissmann, of the Jewish Parliamentary Club, pointed out that thousands of Jews of Old Roumania who had fought for their Fatherland in the Great War, were still refused Roumanian citizenship, and the present bill did not take any account of their position.

The Minister of Justice, M. Mihai Popovici, said in his reply to the debate, that Roumania had always acted up to the obligations which she had assumed in the international treaties. At the same time, the Government was less influenced in this matter by the international treaties than by the desire to act justly towards all loyal inhabitants of the country.

The present amending law did not attempt to do anything more, he said, than prolong the term for receiving applications for entering names on the citizenship lists. That alone was an act of justice to thousands of people. Unfortunately the debate had not dealt with the bill before the House, but with the shortcomings of the citizenship laws as a whole. He wanted to say, he concluded, that the Government is now working on a bill to modify fundamentally the entire Citizenship law, and in this connection it would take into consideration all the arguments that had been advanced in the course of the debate.

Rev. Clinchy Says J.D.C. Activities Helped to Stem Spirit of Hitlerism

Secretary of Good Will Committee Lauds J. D. C. Work, Urges Support to Campaign

Reconstruction activities in Central and Eastern Europe supported by American Jewry through the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, not only are proving to be an important factor in the economic salvation of the Jewish population of those countries, but are invaluable in stemming the spirit of Hitlerism in Europe, Rev. Everett R. Clinchy, secretary of the Committee on Good Will Between Jews and Christians of the Federal Council of Churches in Christ, declared yesterday in urging support of the present campaign under the chairmanship of Rabbi Jonah B. Wise to raise \$2,500,000 to continue the work and furnish relief to the destitute.

"One of the most important results of the work," he asserted, "is that, by its means, American Jewry, through the Joint Distribution Committee, is painting a picture in positive strokes of what the Jews really are, instead of permitting the distorted grotesque exaggerations to be scattered freely by irresponsible people. Perhaps this is the most subtle and effective means of combating the spirit of Hitlerism in Europe."

The reconstructive work, declared Mr. Clinchy, who recently returned from an inspection trip in Germany, Poland and Russia, is not only of economic importance, but performs a valuable function in allaying anti-Semitism by "ministering to the dignity and sense of worthfulness which must not be lost among the less fortunate Jews. This end is also served by the distribution of the Jewish population in all normal economic pursuits rather than almost complete confinement to commerce."

Mr. Clinchy also said that the reconstruction and relief measures of the Joint Distribution Committee in Poland are regarded with approval by the Polish Government. "Government officials with whom I talked were enthusiastic about it even to the degree where they would include it in a list of national reconstruction measures of which they were very proud," he declared.

48 Students Register At Dropsie College

PHILADELPHIA, Oct. 29 — The Dropsie College for Hebrew and Cognate Learning announces that the enrollment for the first term of the present academic year numbers 48 students, of whom 40 are men and 8 women.

claring that insufficient guarantees of peace had been given by the Austrian authorities.

The American students, it is learned, are waiting to see what transpires in the next few weeks. Should the disturbances recur, a large group of American students, including non-Jews, is planning to leave Austria, it is learned.

The indignation of the American students has further been aroused by the publication in the Nazi press of a list of the names of American students at the University which gives their number as one hundred and twenty.

Their anger is particularly aroused because the list which is the property of the University officials, is supposed to be confidential.

The Nazi press states that 74% of the American students are Jews, 12% are atheists or converts to Christianity, or have names that sound Jewish. The Nazi organs conclude that "real Americans" constitute only 14% of the group. Therefore America should have no interest in protecting the Jews and the Austrian government should not take seriously the American Legation's protests, which should be regarded as purely formal.

In addition, the Nazi papers point out, it is impossible to ask German students, while they are engaged in beating up a student, to investigate whether, for example, the Jewish nose of Israel Chanin accidentally settled in America.

To this the papers add that it is altogether untrue that Americans were injured. No official protocol exists and the injuries of not a single American are certified by the police doctor who treated the injured.

The stories, the Nazi papers conclude, are therefore, based on the chattering and treasonous Jewish press reports.

Jewish Community Protests

VIENNA, Oct. 29—The praesidium of the Jewish Community of Vienna had an audience yesterday with Minister of Education, Dr. Anton Rintelen, to whom it presented a memorandum protesting against conditions at the University of Vienna.

The Jewish Community delegation charged that the government had taken measures to protect students only after a foreign power had protested. The promise of protection, further-

more, was given to foreigners chiefly, the delegation pointed out.

The Minister assured the Jewish group that the authorities are taking general measures to offer protection to the students regardless whether they are foreigners or natives.

Polish and Rumanian Consulates Protest

VIENNA, Oct. 29—The Polish and Rumanian Ambassadors today submitted to Chancellor Dollfuss energetic protests against the beating of Polish and Rumanian Jewish students during the anti-Semitic disturbances.

To the protests were affixed medical certificates and protocols of the injured Jewish students as well as torn clothes.

Stimson Assures Protection

Secretary of State Stimson, in a statement issued to Dr. S. Margoshes, editor of the New York Jewish "Day," has conveyed his assurance to American Jewry that American Jewish students pursuing their studies in the universities in Germany and Austria will receive full American protection against attacks by Hackenkreuzler and Hitlerites.

Secretary of State Stimson made his statement in response to a telegraphed message addressed to him by Dr. Margoshes, in which the latter called attention to the riots at the University of Vienna where four American students of the Jewish faith were injured by the Nazis.

Secretary Stimson declared: "In reply to your telegram of today I am glad to assure you that the United States Government will do everything within its power to protect American citizens abroad, regardless of their religious faith.

"We have received a full telegraphic report from our minister in Vienna in regard to the incidents there yesterday. Our Minister in Vienna, Mr. Stockton, has taken up this matter with the Chancellor of Austria and was assured last night by the Chancellor that he would take immediate action to prevent a recurrence of these attacks. The Chancellor expressed his profound regret at the incident. The Rector of the University called on Mr. Stockton today to express his regret and to assure him that there would be no repetition of such assaults."

CORRECTION

In the Jewish Daily Bulletin of October 20th, a headline on a New Haven story erroneously stated "First Jew Named to Yale University Faculty." The headline should have referred to an appointment on the faculty of Yale College. There are a number of distinguished Jews on the faculty of Yale University, notably Lafayette B. Mendel, professor of chemistry for many years; Dr. Winternitz, dean of the Medical School; Professor Schlesinger of the department of astronomy. The late Dr. Sigismund Waterman, related to Mrs. Stephen S. Wise, was at one time a member of the German Department.

the crisis and at re-establishing the Jewish social structure have to follow a unified plan. The more or less isolated working Jewish organizations must disappear as soon as possible. The entire Jewish relief activity has to be re-established on a solid rational basis, as have all branches of business, by re-organization, elimination of superfluous expenses, etc. Visible expression of former, similar, but unsuccessful attempts might have been seen in several world welfare conferences. The present terrible crisis possibly should effectuate what in better times had failed for lack of psychological premises.

We begin, concludes the article, a new Jewish year. We face an emergency winter which unfortunately, it appears, will be more burdensome than the past ones. The consciousness of Jewish solidarity all over the world, the obligation of mutual help must be strengthened. In the union of Jewish communities of the entire world which should be brought about by the crisis, the German Jews must not stand aside. Though there is, in their own community, much opportunity for welfare work, they should never forget that they are, by community of fate, bound to those Jews, who are suffering from an even greater spiritual and economic want than the Jews in Germany.
