American Producers Withdraw Ads from "Sunday Express" on Ground Film Critic Anti-Semite

Take Action When Paper Refuses to
Withdraw Critic After Anti-Semitic
Statement Over Radio

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LONDON, Nov. 2.—A controversy has developed between the film industry and the "Sunday Express" over the alleged anti-Semitism of the paper's film critic, Cedric Belfrage, formerly of Hollywood, who is also the critic of the government controlled radio station.

Speaking over the radio last week, Belfrage attacked the "oligarchy of rapacious Jews of filmland in America and England."

While Jewish leaders are contemplating drawing the attention of the government to racial prejudice over the government controlled radio, the film trade has taken matters into its own hands and demanded of the "Sunday Express" that it withdraw Belfrage as film critic. This the paper refused to do. Whereupon the largest American film producers, such as Goldwyn-Mayer, Paramount, Universal and Warner Brothers all united to boycott the paper and have withdrawn their advertisements.

Negotiations which have been going on between the management of the "Express" and the film producers have

Nazis Demand Dismissal Of Jewish Art Director

BERLIN, Nov. 2.—Nazi circles are demanding the dismissal of Max Friedlaender, famous art expert and director of the State Painting Gallery.

The Nazis make as their pretext for the demand against Friedlaender, who is a Jew, the allegation that he utilized for party purposes a fund created in 1927 on the occasion of his sixtieth birthday.

Friedlaender, it is learned, is so aroused by the Nazi allegations, that he is planning to resign. The General Director of State Museums, Wilhelm Woetzold, however, is determined to publicly denounce the Nazi allegations as lies, in an effort to prevent Friedlaender from resigning.

Einstein to Present Completed New Section of Researches To Prussian Academy Today

Work Represents Completion of Last
Year's Researches on Relativity
and New Field Theories

BERLIN, Nov. 2.—Professor Albert Einstein will tomorrow submit to the Prussian Academy of Science the new section, representing the completion of his researches of last year, according to exclusive information received by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency today.

The new section represents Prof. Einstein's conclusions on unifying his Relativity Theory and his New Field Theory, constituting a complete cosmogony.

Orders Discontinuation of Jewish Religious Instruction In Secondary Schools

Report Order Issued by Roumanian
Authorities; Rabbis Must Conduct
Religious Classes Outside of Schools

CZERNOWITZ, Nov. 2.—The immediate discontinuation of Jewish religious instruction in the secondary schools has been ordered by the government, states the "Czernowitzer Morgenblatt" today.

The paper states that Jewish teachers have received from the authorities instructions to this effect, with the announcement that in the future Rabbis will be required to conduct religious classes outside the schoolroom.

The "Morgenblatt" expresses surprise that the Jews should have been singled out for this change.

Riga Paper's Staff Resigns When Revisionists Take It Over

RIGA, Nov. 2.—The editorial staff of the "Ovnt Post" resigned today when the Revisionists, headed by the Revisionist leader, Jacob Hofman, acquired a controlling interest.

Deny Resignation of Agudath Israel Deputy From Government Club

Rumor Arose Because of Criticism of
Government; Suggests Trading
Law Compromise

WARSAW, Nov. 2.—Denial was made here yesterday that the Agudath Israel representative, Deputy Wislicki, had resigned from the Polish Government Club of Parliament.

The rumor of Wislicki's resignation spread following an address he delivered severely criticizing the government policy as ruinous to Jewish trade.

The Jewish deputy's address, delivered at a meeting of the Jewish Merchants Union, occasioned considerable surprise inasmuch as he is a member of a party known for its friendly attitude toward the government.

WARSAW, Nov. 2.—The Polish Merchants Union today proposed a compromise in the government regulations for Sunday trading to take the place of the modifications which have been withdrawn before even their publication.

The Union suggests that instead of modifying the Sunday compulsory closing law, all stores be permitted to remain open for two additional hours on Saturday evening. In this fashion the whole community will benefit, the organization holds.

Conservative M.P. Demands Preference for Palestine Products

LONDON, Nov. 2.—A demand that imperial preference status be granted Palestine imports was voiced in the House of Commons by the Conservative M. P., Williams.

It is absurd, he said, for Britain to be responsible for defense and preservation of law and order in Palestine, and yet to be debarred from giving Palestine imports preference. This is an anomalous situation which must be cleared up.

Mr. Williams expressed regret that the Ottawa conference decisions are prejudicial to the future progress of the orange industry in Palestine. He urged the British government to relieve Palestine's legitimate grievance in this regard.

Hebrew Congregation Advises Retrenchments

"One of the results of the depression has been the lapping off of unnecessary activities. In every factory, store and institution, this has been going on for three years. There is, of course, a great danger involved in retrenchment—the danger of going too far. Whatever is to be saved of the institutional life of America must be won by supreme effort. If we wish to lay the foundation for recovery, we must not neglect to honor the religion which has been our solace and guide."

This was the message of Ludwig Vogelstein, Chairman of the Executive Board of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, as he issued the call for the sixth consecutive Union Tour. This Tour of the Congregations of the Union is conducted annually for the purpose of strengthening organized Judaism in the United States.

Philanthropic Giving Is Duty Says Mrs. Felix M. Warburg

Affirming that giving to philanthropy should become a duty, comparable to paying taxes, Mrs. Felix M. Warburg, co-chairman with Mrs. Sidney C. Borg of the Women's Division of the Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies, spoke Tuesday afternoon at a rally and tea at the home of Adolph Lewishohn, when reports were given of the Women's Division's progress in the campaign of Federation to complete a budget of \$3,923,000 for the support of 91 affiliated institutions.

Mrs. Warburg pointed out that out of 900,000 Jews in New York City, only 30,000 were steady friends of the Federation.

"I should like to see the time come," she said, "when it would be necessary for the self-respect of the Jew who is well off to a member of Federation."

Preservation of Social

Agencies Asked by Kirstein

WORCESTER, Nov. 2.—Preservation of "social agencies in the era of social transition we are now living through" was stressed by Louis E. Kirstein, president of the Associated Jewish Philanthropies of Boston, in an address before the "Big Givers" luncheon of the Worcester Community Chest campaign here yesterday.

"We are in the midst of a social transformation," Mr. Kirstein said. "We are so close to it that it is impossible for us to appreciate the full magnitude of the change. I am confident that if we have the wisdom and the will we shall come out of this period with a healthier society and with a more enduring structure than we had before 1929. But the process is a slow one and it involves great strains and stresses."

"Social change is inevitable whether we like it or not. The transformation is in process. What I am anxious for, what I am pleading with you as businessmen, is to make sure that the change is an evolutionary rather than a revolutionary one. And if the change is to be evolutionary, then these social agencies are indispensable as a means of easing the tensions and the frictions which always accompany periods of great economic and social change. Certainly, if nothing else, intelligent and enlightened self-interest makes it imperative that we businessmen see this clearly and make it possible for our social agencies to maintain their efficiency during these critical days."

Lord Melchett Honorary President of Maccabee

LONDON.—Lord Melchett has accepted the office of Honorary President of the Maccabee Jewish Sports World Federation, following a meeting with Dr. Hermann Lelewer, president of the organization, and Mayer Dizenhoff, mayor of Tel Aviv.

Lord Melchett plans to take an active part in the work of the Maccabee and will endeavor to visit during December the large Maccabee centres in Poland, Czechoslovakia and Roumania.

A. M. Shinbane Vice-President Of Canadian Zionists

MONTREAL, Nov. 2.—At a meeting of the National Council of the Canadian Zionist Organization, A. M. Shinbane of Winnipeg was elected a vice-president, succeeding F. M. Sures, who resigned.

Mr. Shinbane is the president of the Western Canadian Zionist Region. He is a prominent Winnipeg attorney and has been special Crown Prosecutor for the Province of Manitoba.

Papers Laud Vladeck's Candidacy for Congress

The candidacy of B. C. Vladeck, General Manager of the Jewish Daily Forward, for the House of Representatives, on the Socialist ticket, is lauded in editorials which appeared in the New York World-Telegram and the Jewish Morning Journal.

The Telegram urges the election of Mr. Vladeck in the following terms:

"To voters of independent mind, irrespective of usual party leanings, we specially recommend B. Charney Vladeck, Socialist candidate for representative from the Eighth Congressional District, Brooklyn."

"Mr. Vladeck is a highly educated liberal who has made his business experience produce practical and progressive benefits of labor. He is not only a thinker, but an excellent speaker. When he ran in the same district in 1930, he got the biggest vote ever polled for a Socialist candidate for Congress in the East."

"Mr. Vladeck, we think, is the kind of a man a reconstructive Congress needs to help liberalize its thought and speed up its action. He should be elected."

The Morning Journal says: "... we recommend the Socialist candidate for Congress, Mr. B. C. Vladeck. He is an able and energetic person, an excellent speaker, familiar with general and Jewish problems, especially East European problems, a communal worker and leader, who occupies an important position in the public Jewish life of New York; a man of moderate views who is far from being a fanatical party man."

Avukah Executive Committee to Meet

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 2.—A program of activity for the coming year for Avukah, the student undergraduate Zionist Organization, will be formulated at the first meeting of the National Executive Committee to be held at the Jewish Student House, on the campus of the University of Pennsylvania, Sunday afternoon.

Reports of the renewed activities of the various Chapters will be considered and Rabbi Simon Greenberg, the President, will present a proposal for the cultural work that Avukah should undertake for the coming year. A number of inquiries have come to the national office from students of various Universities where there are no Avukah Chapters at present. An effort will be made at this meeting to provide for such cases.

Goglu Publication in New Attack Upon Jews For "International Finance"

Case of Non-Jew Offers Pretext for Accusations Against Jews

MONTREAL, Nov. 2 — The local anti-Semitic publications have temporarily ceased exploiting the blood ritual accusation but they have found a new field for their activities.

Recently one J. J. Harpell, the publisher of the financial publication, "Journal of Commerce," was arrested on the charge of libellous slander after publishing a series of articles purporting to show that the Sun Life Assurance Company is on the verge of bankruptcy and that its officials have been manipulating with figures on the same grand scale as the deceased Swedish Match King, Ivar Krueger, and the Insull Bros. of Chicago.

Although it is well-known that Harpell is a Gentile with no greater love for the Jew than for Sun Life officials, "Le Miroir," one of the trio of the anti-Semitic Goglu publications, appeared with a venomous attack against Harpell who is stated to be a Jew and a tool in the hands of international Jewish financiers who are out to destroy the well-known Canadian Life Insurance Company.

Continuing in its exploitation of the new so-called Jewish plot, "Le Miroir" last week concocted a story that a few Jewish millionaires in New York have made every endeavor to gain control of the Sun Life, having even offered as much as \$4,000 for each of the company's shares. Having failed in their endeavor, says the Goglu publication, the Jewish financiers hired Harpell to destroy the Canadian Company. The same publication even hints that the

Trial of Eighteen Nazi Terrorists Opens

BERLIN, Nov. 2—The trial of eighteen Nazi terrorists accused of complicity in a plot to bomb a warehouse in Allenstein owned by a Jew, A. Abraham, opened today.

One of the defendants confessed that the local Nazi leader had ordered him "to put Abraham on the spot", but added that this connoted not death, but injury to the Jew.

The public was excluded from the court-room when cross examination of the accused as to the source of their supply of explosives began.

The Nazi storm troop leader, Bruno Helwich confessed that hand grenades had been thrown into the bedroom of Abraham.

Several of the accused, questioned as to the reason for the outrage, replied: "Our superiors told us Hitler wants to become president, therefore we must support Hitler by subduing the Left elements."

J. D. B. NEWS LETTER

Tells of Ancient Jewish Concepts in Bankruptcy Proceedings

WASHINGTON. — Various ancient Jewish conceptions in connection with bankruptcy jurisprudence were discussed by Louis E. Levinthal, prominent Philadelphia Jewish attorney and authority on bankruptcy law, before the National Association of Referees in Bankruptcy at its annual conference in connection with the 55th annual meeting of the American Bar Association.

Mr. Levinthal read a paper on "Some Historical Aspects of Bankruptcy".

Mr. Levinthal, during the course of his paper, brought out many interesting comparisons between the ancient principles of Jewish bankruptcy and other systems of law, including the fact that Jewish, in common with Roman, French, Spanish and Italian systems, did not discharge the bankrupt.

"Some see in the Jewish Sabbatical Year of Release something analogous to a bankruptcy law", Mr. Levinthal said. "As a matter of fact, the Sabbatical discharge was intended to apply to all debtors, whether solvent or insolvent, honest or dishonest, after the lapse of a certain number of years". Hence, Mr. Levinthal pointed out, this cannot be construed as a bankruptcy discharge.

One of the most interesting contrasts brought out by Mr. Levinthal was that according to Jewish law, unlike the general practice, where there were several creditors, the estate was divided not pro-rata, but equally, it being of course provided that no creditor should receive more than the amount of his claim. In this way a higher percentage of the smaller as compared to the larger debts were paid in full, it being felt that the creditor who extended credit recklessly or over-generously should be penalized as against the conservative creditor with a smaller claim. This point evoked a great deal of interest among those attending the conference.

Mr. Levinthal stated in his paper. In both, Mr. Levinthal explained, a creditor placed himself before the debtor's doorway there to remain until the debt was paid. "The expected payment was seldom delayed," he said, "for public opinion would have punished severely and instantly the debtor who allowed his creditor to become exhausted or die of starvation before his door. President Hoover and Governor Roosevelt Laud Jewish Work in Palestine

Issue Messages on Fifteenth Anniversary of Balfour Declaration

The rebuilding of the Jewish National Home in Palestine is a project "which merits the sympathy and moral encouragement of everyone," President Herbert Hoover declared on the occasion of the fifteenth anniversary of the Balfour Declaration yesterday, in a message addressed to the Zionist Organization of America and made public today by Morris Rothenberg, President of the Zionist Organization.

A similar message lauding the achievements of reconstruction in Palestine as a "tribute to the creative powers of the Jewish people" was received from Governor Franklin D. Roosevelt, who pointed out that the establishment of the Jewish National Home in Palestine was close to the wish of President Wilson, who helped write the terms of the Balfour Declaration into the peace treaty.

The messages of President Hoover and Governor Roosevelt were issued in connection with the celebration by the Zionist Organization of the fifteenth anniversary of the Balfour Declaration.

The message from the President reads as follows:

"On the occasion of your celebration of the fifteenth anniversary of the Balfour Declaration, which received the unanimous approval of both houses of Congress by the adoption of the Lodge-Fish Resolution in 1922, I wish to express the hope that the ideal of the establishment of the National Jewish

Baltimore Hadassah Provides Luncheons for 6,000 Children

BALTIMORE, Nov. 2—Provision for 6,000 children was made when 600 members of the Hadassah sat down to a simple meal in the Lord Baltimore Hotel paying eleven times the price for the meal so that ten children of Palestine might have a meal for each Baltimore woman served.

The menu, a duplicate of a school lunch in Palestine, was composed of tomato soup, a fruit salad and a ginger cake. Coffee was served the women in place of the third of a glass of milk served in the school lunch.

The luncheon was served at a cost of 9 cents a plate, but each guest, in addition to purchasing her own meal, contributed 90 cents to feed ten Palestine children.

Rabbi Israel Goldstein, of B'nai Jeshurun Temple, New York, delivered the principal address. He described conditions in Palestine as he saw them on a recent visit.

Fifty members of the Hadassah acted as waitresses. The food was obtained as donations from local wholesalers.

former Mayor Camilien Houde, whom it once championed, will become the French editor of Harpell's "Journal of Commerce" and help the latter preach his "Jewish Bolshevik doctrines." For the ex-mayor "Le Miroir" has now only this to say: "As far as two years ago we have stated that Houde is a dangerous radical who is infecting the province with communist ideas. He is a Jew in mentality."

It is not yet clear why the Goglus are championing the cause of the Sun Life, but it is incomprehensible why they should attack Harpell who is of their ilk when it comes to Jew-baiting. The same Harpell also believes that the Jews are ruining world finance and has republished in an October issue the unsavory poem by Rudyard Kipling concerning the Fifth River of Paradise, and prefaced it with the following introduction.

"When the Israelites arrived on the scene (Paradise) the Lord had no river to assign to them, so he suggested the river of gold, on the banks of which they have been living ever since. Until lately this river of gold had no reservoir out of and into which it might flow. Such a reservoir has recently been completed two hundred feet into the earth under the City of Paris, the present headquarters of the House of Rothschild, the world's greatest gold mongers."

Polish Anti-Semites Smash Windows; Attack Passersby

LEMBERG, Nov. 2.—Windows of Jewish shops were smashed Sunday night by anti-Semitic National Democratic students in retaliation for their arrest the night before.

The students were arrested on Saturday night after they had beaten up Jewish passersby and broken windows of Jewish stores. Saturday night this was an outburst in protest against the prohibition of a demonstration called for spreading boycott agitation against the Jews.

The National Democratic students spread the rumor that Jewish students beat the Polish students in order to stimulate the attack.

A strong police guard was stationed around the Jewish quarter today as a precautionary measure.
