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## Jewish Deputies Demand Government Compensate Jews For Damages Sustained in Riots

### Insurance Companies Refuse to Pay Damages to Property

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

LEMBERG, Nov. 15.—A demand that the government pay compensation to the Jews who sustained damages to their persons and their business enterprises as a result of the anti-Semitic disturbances in Lemberg was made today by the Jewish deputies, Dr. Heinrich Rosmarin and M. Sommerschein in representations to the District Governor, Mozniewski.

The Jewish representatives described the panic prevailing among the Jewish population and stated that enormous damage had been sustained by Jewish merchants and artisans owing to the riots.

The district Governor stated that peace would be re-established, but added that the other demands require consideration before any reply can be made.

The insurance companies from whom Jewish merchants sought compensation for such property damage as broken windows have refused to make payment declaring that the disturbances are the result of racial hatred, which is excluded from insurance policies.

The situation is quiet in Lemberg today.

## Roumanian Paper Charges Czernowitz Police With Medieval Torture of Jews

### Czernowitzer "Morgenblatt" Asserts That Methods Employed Rival Those of Yedinez

BUCHAREST, Nov. 15.—Charges that the police of Czernowitz are persecuting the Jews of the city in a manner that may be compared with medieval torture, are made by the Czernowitzer "Morgenblatt" editorially.

The paper protests against the "inhuman persecutions" of the Czernowitzer police. The methods of Yedinez are child play compared with the medieval tortures to which the people of Czernowitz are subjected, it says.

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## Breslau Law Faculty Requests Jewish Professor To Resume Lecture Series

### Appeal to Nazi Students to Permit Lectures to Be Given Undisturbed; State He Is Scientific Authority

BRESLAU, Nov. 15.—The members of the Law Faculty of the University of Breslau today issued an appeal to the Nazi students to permit the continuation of the lectures of the Jewish Professor Ernst Cohn without disturbing peace and order.

The appeal to the Nazi students was signed by the race anti-Semites and the Nazi professor, Wegner.

Professor Cohn is not a protege of the Socialist Ministers but secured his appointment as a scientific authority. He was honorably elected by the faculty, states the appeal.

The faculty has called upon Professor Cohn to resume his lectures on Thursday.

Yesterday the Nazi press announced that Professor Cohn's lectures had been discontinued. The Jewish professor was attacked at the opening of his lecture series last Thursday.

## 30,000 Polish Citizens Returned From France This Year

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

PARIS, Nov. 15.—A total of some five to six thousand Polish Jews who migrated to France last year have this year returned to Poland owing to the economic crisis in France.

A total number of 30,000 Polish citizens, including non-Jews, have departed from France for Poland since the beginning of 1932.

This migration is paralleled by the return to their native lands of large numbers of Roumanian and Hungarian Jews.

## Trotsky Enroute to Copenhagen for Lectures

ISTAMBUL, Nov. 15.—Leon Trotsky, exiled Communist leader, departed yesterday for Copenhagen, accompanied by his wife, daughter and secretary.

The Turkish authorities granted him permission to leave the country. Trotsky was invited to come to Copenhagen by the organization of Social-Democratic students, for a series of lectures.

The Danish Government has granted Trotsky a three months visa.

## Agency Will Not Countenance Legislative Council If Jews Are Minority Therein

### Similar Sentiment Expressed by Jews of Palestine and Jewish Press

JERUSALEM, Nov. 15.—The Jewish Agency Executive will not countenance a Legislative Council in Palestine so long as the Jewish representation therein will constitute a minority, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learns.

The Jewish Agency attitude, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency understands, is part of the general attitude among the Jews in Palestine that they will never agree to the Legislative Council as long as the Jewish representation is that of a minority.

Considerable surprise has been aroused here by the definite tone of the statement made in this connection by Sir Arthur Grenfell Wauchop, Palestine High Commissioner, in his address before the Mandates Commission of the League of Nations.

The entire Palestine Jewish press today comments on the High Commissioner's address the contents of which were made known through the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, along the lines mentioned above.

The Jewish Agency Executive will not approve of the Legislative Council if the Jews are a minority inasmuch as the Basle congress decided not to accept such a council.

## German Nazis Establish Information Bureau in Washington

### Headed by Kurt Ludecke; Designed to Function as a News Agency for Nazi Press in Germany

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15.—A Nazi information bureau for the purpose of supplying "authentic information" concerning the German National Socialist Party has been established in this city, it was announced here yesterday.

The bureau is to be under the direction of Kurt G. W. Ludecke, former representative of the Nazis in Rome, who has permanently settled in this city.

In a statement issued by Mr. Ludecke, he declared that the information bureau will have a two fold task. It will function as a news agency for the en-

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tire Nazi press in Germany. Further it will "supply the American press and public with authentic information about the character and aims of the National Socialist movement and its relation to the Germany of today."

Mr. Ludecke, who married an American in 1927, has lived in this country much of the five years which have elapsed. He has been identified with the Nazi movement since 1921.

The bureau will also undertake to distribute information concerning the Nazi movement in the neighboring countries of Canada and New Mexico.

"These services are not frills," he said. "They are an essential part of what is known as American standards. Next in importance to food itself, are these no less tangible necessities which make life worth living."

## Vaad Leumi Committee to Draft Resolution on Income Tax; Opposed by Majority

Nine Hour Meeting Held; Majority  
Demand Immediate Expression  
of Opposition

JERUSALEM, Nov. 15.—The income tax proposed by the Palestine government was discussed here at a nine hour meeting of the Palestine Jewish National Council which concluded at two o'clock this morning.

The majority of the speakers pointed out that an income tax will harm the development of the country and frighten foreign Jewish capital away from making investments in Palestine.

The majority of those present demanded the passing of an immediate resolution expressing opposition to the tax. Upon the recommendation, however of Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, member of the Jewish Agency Executive in charge of political affairs, a special committee was appointed to draw up such a resolution.

The Committee was instructed to have the resolution ready within a fortnight and to co-ordinate its action in the matter with the Jewish Agency Executive.

## Chicago Zionists Hold Annual Conference

CHICAGO, Ill., Nov. 15.—Morris Rothenberg, president of the Zionist Organization of America was guest of honor at a dinner Tuesday at the Congress hotel which marked the close of the annual all-day conference of the Zionist Organization of Chicago. More than 400 Chicago Zionists applauded the Zionist head. The business sessions which preceded the banquet were attended by more than 500 members and delegates. Among those present was a delegation from the Upper Peninsula of Michigan.

Jacob M. Braude was re-elected president of the Zionist Organization of Chicago, as was Joel David Wolfsohn, secretary. Max M. Korshak was named vice president and John Rissman, treasurer. An executive committee of seventy-five members was elected and an administrative board of 13 was selected.

Mr. Rothenberg told his listeners that the Zionist movement was brought to the fore to cure the inferiority complex of Jews all over the world. Judge Harry M. Fisher was toastmaster. Judge Fisher, who is one of the members of the Democratic board of strategy and was active in Governor-elect Horner's campaign, revealed for the first time publicly that it was the policy of the campaign to keep Jews in the background. 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## Revisionists State Danger Of Restoration of Past Regime Still Acute

## Bamberger Honorary Head of State "Y's"

NEWARK, Nov. 15.—Preservation of Jewish ideals as a distinct contribution to American life, was urged here Sunday by Justice Irving Lehman, of the New York State Court of Appeals, in addressing the 21st annual convention of the New Jersey Federation of Y.M.H.A.'s and Y.W.H.A.'s.

Speaking here in his capacity of president of the National Jewish Welfare Board, Justice Lehman also urged continued regard for the "Y's and community centers as character-building institutions, particularly in times of stress. He declared:

"Our resources today are smaller than they were a few years ago. But we must draw upon these resources to relieve the unemployed, to care for the distressed and the sick, as we once drew upon our resources for Liberty Bonds. And that is not enough. Now as then, the best service we can render is to sustain the spirit of our youth—the most precious asset of today."

Justice Lehman commented upon his brother, Governor-elect Herbert H. Lehman's recent pledge to continue to maintain social service agencies of New York State despite economic conditions.

Dr. Solomon Lowenstein, director of the New York Federation for the Support of Jewish Philanthropic Societies, was another convention speaker. In urging assistance for institutions such as community centers, he explained that the present trend of social service was to have the state take over activities of a direct relief nature, which would, in turn, permit communal and welfare agencies to devote themselves

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## Dr. Cadman Scores Nazis Anti-Jewish Drive Danger to German Unity; Injustice to Jews

Chairman of Good Will Committee Calls Anti-Semitic Agitation a Disgrace to Germany

Dr. S. Parkes Cadman, Chairman of the Committee on Good Will Between Jews and Christians of the Federal Council of the Churches of Christ in America, severely condemns the Nazi anti-Semitic movement as a danger to German unity and a flagrant injustice to the Jews in a lengthy article which appeared in the Sunday issue of the "Herald-Tribune."

Dr. Cadman traces the history of anti-Semitism in Germany and the reasons which gave rise to the present anti-Jewish campaign of the Nazis.

The Nazi leaders, he writes point to the Jews. "Strike the Jews!" they cry, as if, then, "all the German troubles will be at an end."

"It is this political warp of intolerance and hate that anti-Semitism in Germany is being woven. Jews are to blame, the Nazis say, for all the weaknesses in Germany's character, for all the shame of her history."

"It all seems preposterous, but in the tense desperation of today high-strung nerves and pitched emotions make for hysterical sentimentalism."

"This horrible stereotype of the Jew is driven home by an attempt to detach all pleasant, appreciative associations with him. For example, the astounding claim is put forth that Jesus of Nazareth was not a Jew at all, but rather was born of a Persian woman and of a German father who had wandered down into Palestine. And then in caricature, song and speech the most hideous distortions of Jews are broadcast. A placard caricature I have in mind depicts the murder for ritual purposes of a Christian child by rabbis (to stamp out that lie I may say there is no blood sacrifice of any kind in the Jewish synagogue)."

"Although the National Socialist political party has adopted anti-Semitism as 'the sentimental fundament of the movement,' to quote Gottfried Feder, it by no means created anti-Semitism in Germany," he continues. "Religious, political and social agitation against the Jews played a conspicuous part in the political struggles of the concluding quarter of the nineteenth century. The extreme section of the anti-Semites declared that it was a racial struggle."

"General prosperity no doubt would abate the fury."

"A careful scrutiny of the program, pamphlets, books, newspapers, weeklies, posters, speeches and lyrics composed, devised, published or uttered by the Nazis shows the anti-Semitism of the present to be in its essentials the same as that of the last century. The religious element, however, is almost no issue. Wilhelm Stapel, an editor of the not insignificant bi-monthly 'Deutsches

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## Sees Substantial Increase In Palestine Wine Imports Into This Country

Predicts Large Increase in Sales If Prohibition Is Repealed

A substantial increase in Palestine wine imports into the United States should prohibition be abolished was predicted here yesterday by Jacob Shapiro, head of the Rishon le Zion Wine Company, who arrived in the United States in the interests of this eventuality.

In an interview with a representative of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, Mr. Shapiro pointed out that before the prohibition law was enacted his company exported to America some 60,000 cases of wine annually. The sales were small at the time because the company itself was still young and had not grasped the opportunities which presented itself.

Palestine wine today has, however, a real clientele in this country among those who use wine for sacramental purposes, he said.

The Company has been scrupulous in its observance of the prohibition regulations and has been careful to sell its wine for sacramental purposes only. This, of course, has resulted in a tremendous drop in its sales, he pointed out.

Even in the eventuality that prohibition is not repealed, there will be 15,000 cases of Palestinian wine imported this year inasmuch as sufficient contracts for sacramental wine have already been placed, he stated.

Mr. Shapiro notes a growing tendency to use Palestine wine for religious purposes.

Asked concerning the competition of Palestine wine with the California product, Mr. Shapiro stated the rivalry is negligible. The wine production potentialities of Palestine are slight compared with those of California. Then too Palestine wine has a specific use—for sacramental purposes,—and is beginning to assume the character of a tradition.

Mr. Shapiro sees in the growth of the wine industry in Palestine a healthy companion to the growth of the orange industry.

At present Egypt and Syria are the greatest consumers of Palestine wine, although Palestine itself is developing a clientele for this product.

Mr. Shapiro is also identified with the Pica and its mills in Palestine.

The Pica, he pointed out, has a matzoth factory in Palestine, established by Baron de Rothschild. The matzoth factory was established in the belief that Palestine matzoth might be exported for Passover use. This expectation has not yet been realized, however. While in this country, Mr. Shapiro will seek to arrange for their import. He will also endeavor to arrange for the

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## "Chronicle" Approves Trouncing of David A. Brown; "Exponent" Insists on Apology

"Exponent" States Brown Not Discreet Talker; Has Hurt Jews of Poland Whether Directly or Indirectly

The London "Jewish Chronicle" in its issue of November 4th, which has just reached this country, editorially approves the "trouncing" David A. Brown has received in the American Jewish press for his utterances on the situation of the Jews in Poland.

"The visit of Dr. Kahn to Poland and his report should serve as an effective antidote to the latest pronouncement of the egregious Mr. David A. Brown, who after a flying trip to that country, has declared that there is nothing to worry about," declares the editorial.

"He gave an interview to the Polish Telegraphic Agency in which he said that he saw no 'special misery' among the Jews in Poland, and that the alarming reports in the Jewish press which were perturbing American Jewry presented a 'false picture with regard to the position.' It is comforting to know that Mr. David A. Brown is so solicitous that only the truth shall be told about the economic position of the Jews in Poland, with the pauperization in their midst that has grown apace during the last few years, and it is strange that he should have chosen an organ of the Polish Government as the medium of his communication. Mr. Brown got his information in the luxurious hotel in which he stayed, or from an official in a Government department, it is not surprising that he should display such ignorance. But his ignorance may prove mischievous, and he therefore deserves the trouncing that he has received in the American Jewish press," the editorial concludes.

The Philadelphia "Jewish Exponent" insists editorially that Mr. Brown owes an apology to the Jews of Poland and that all else is irrelevant. The editorial declares:

"The controversy regarding the condition of Polish Jews provoked by the recent visit of David A. Brown to Poland has failed to shed new light on this subject. An editorial in the November number of 'Opinion,' entitled, 'Mr. Brown's Polish Slumming Party,' asserts that 'Mr. Brown has departed from more or less harmless vilification to infliction of grave hurt upon millions of Polish Jews.' In this we concur. It matters little whether or not Mr. Brown handed a signed statement to the Polish Telegraphic Agency minimizing the plight of the Jewish people in that country, or whether he simply talked. The fact is that he did talk to newspaper men; and he is not a discreet talker. Whether he calls the newspapermen himself or has someone else call them for him is beside the question. 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## Dr. Cadman Scores Nazi Anti-Jewish Drive Danger to German Unity; Injustice to Jews

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Volkstum—"German Peopledom"—says that anti-Semitism for religious reasons is dead. Nevertheless, in general it is apparent that the anti-Semitism of the National Socialists comprehends all walks of life. The anti-Semite of today has the support of a strong party, a party that has definitely adopted anti-Semitism—not the older anti-Semitism, which was not a state anti-Semitism, but a private one. Anti-Semitism would be a policy of state should the Nazis gain power. Hitler goes so extremely far as to say that anti-Semitism will be the bedrock of his political economy when and if he comes into power.

"Thus the current anti-Semitism of the Nazis threatens to outrun all earlier manifestations. The level of taste has sunk far below any human dignity. It betrays a wholly infantile insight into the solution of Germany's complicated problems. Anti-Semitism and its expression in a program of rigorous proscription of Jewish activities may seem a simple solution. Indeed it is all too simple.

"Moreover, the ideal working of such a program would lead to a sterility of culture as unwelcome as it is now unanticipated by the contemporary agitators. The solution of cultural divergencies is not through elimination, but rather through a painstaking integration of variety. This requires patience; but above all, it requires imagination.

"The 'solution' of the Nazis can hardly be said to manifest either. Anti-Semitism in Germany will die when the citizens of that splendid nation awaken to the new democracy. Civilization has passed the day of homogeneous tribal states. Thoughtful leaders of mankind now prize diversity of cultural groups in the interaction between which every group is stimulated to new growth, to the honor and glory of the nation. The present movement, as all anti-Semitic agitation in the past, can hardly be judged by intelligent and sympathetic critics as other than a shame and a disgrace to Germany, a blot on German culture, a danger to German unity and a flagrant injustice to the Jews themselves," Dr. Cadman concludes.
