## ANTI-JEWISH DISTURBANCES FOR TWO DAYS IN LEMBERG; MORE THAN 100 JEWS INJURED

Riots Follow Death of Polish Student Killed After Drunken Brawl; Jews in State of Anxiety; Business Half Closed; Jews Afraid to Appear on Streets; Kehillah Committee Sitting Day and Night; Authorities Suggest Kehillah Issue Statement Condemning Killing of Polish Student

LEMBERG, Nov. 28—More than one hundred Jews have applied for treatment for injuries sustained in anti-Jewish disturbances which began yesterday and continued throughout the day and today as anti-Semites sought revenge for the death of a Polish student killed when he and a party of five other drunken revellers began to attack Jewish passersby early Sunday morning.

The student, Jan Gratkowski, twenty-two years old, succumbed to knife wounds after he and his companions had met with resistance from Jews who sought to defend themselves.

The College of Commerce of the University of Lemberg was closed this afternoon when the excesses spread to the University.

Reports received by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency indicate, however, that the number of the injured in the past two days is considerably higher, as many have not informed the authorities of their hurts.

Among those most gravely injured are a Dr. Hellman, an attorney Rawicz,

Kaufman, Jehuda Ostrower, an engineer Meilbum and his wife.

The Jewish business section is half deserted, many of the Jewish stores are closed and the streets empty of Jews, who are fearful of making an appearance.

The jewelry shop of a Jew, named Perlman, on Boimowstrasse, was attacked today, its furnishings demolished and the merchandise looted.

Police reinforcements have been summoned from the adjacent towns.

Polish students, augmented by mobs, are attacking individual Jews.

The Jewish Community has appointed a special committee, which is sitting day and night, to receive reports concerning the situation in the Jewish quarter. This committee is also in constant communication with the authorities, which keep it informed of the places where trouble is breaking out.

The Executive of the Jewish Community has resolved to protest to the authorities against the effort to fasten upon the Jewish population as a whole responsibility for events which occurred in the habitats of alcoholics.

The police today confiscated an appeal prepared by the National Democratic Party calling upon the workers to join with it in action against the government for siding with the Jews because the alleged government favoritism enabled the Jews to murder Polish sons without punishment.

## General Kurt Von Schleicher Mentioned as Possible New Chancellor of Germany

Nazi Confidential Questionnaire Seeks to Establish Jewish Strength at Leipzig University

BERLIN, Nov. 28—The possibility that General Kurt von Schleicher, Minister of Defense in the von Papen cabinet, will be named Chancellor of Germany is being discussed here.

In Jewish circles, the appointment is deprecated on the one hand because he is inclined to co-operate with the Nazi Party.

On the other hand, however, it is pointed out that General von Schleicher has endeavored to negate anti-Semitism. Recently in an interview with a French paper, General von Schleicher scored anti-Semitism as the greatest folly. He is also maintaining friendly relations with the Union of Jewish War Veterans.

## Maniu Promises Revision of Citizenship Law by Current Session of Parliament

Pledge Given to Jewish Parliamentary Club; Declines to Restore Under-Secretariat for Minorities

BUCHAREST, Nov. 28—Premier Iuliu Maniu has promised to introduce in the current session of Parliament a measure which would reform the citizenship law in accordance with the Paris Convention.

The pledge was given by the Premier to the Jewish Parliamentary Club whose members were received in audience with him.

Premier Maniu declined, however, to restore the minority under-secretariat, on the ground that equal citizenship rights are more important than a distinction between majority and minority citizens.

## Palestine Jewish Manufacturers Association Calls for Formation Of Neutral Labor Exchanges

Seek Way to End Conflict; Grossman to Be Brought Before Court of Honor

JERUSALEM, Nov. 28—The Association of Jewish Manufacturers of Palestine has decided to call upon the municipality of Tel Aviv and the Jewish Communities Council of Jerusalem to establish labor exchanges from whom the manufacturers will be obligated to hire laborers, without distinction of parties.

This announcement was made at a press conference today and the Association's resolve was explained as an effort to bring to an end Palestine labor disputes which are detrimental to industry.

**TEL AVIV, Nov. 28**—Meier Grossman, vice-president of the World Union of the Zionist Revisionists and the editors of the "Razsviet," the Revisionist organ, will be summoned to appear before the court of honor of the World Zionist Congress, to answer charges of libelous accusations against the Histadruth in articles, it was announced by the Histadruth at a press conference.

Mr. Grossman accused the Histadruth of giving to the police the names of Revisionists who entered Palestine illegally. This accusation was made in an article which appeared in the "Moment" and reiterated in articles in the "Razsviet." The Revisionists also charged that the leaders of the Palestine Labor Federation allegedly stated that they preferred Arab labor to Revisionist labor.

Speaking at a conference here last night, Ben Gurion, Histadruth leader, definitely denied that the Histadruth refuses to recognize the rights of Revisionist workers to labor. He cited documents endeavoring to show that

### **Accuses German Red Cross Heads of Anti-Semitism** (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

**BERLIN, Nov. 28**—Accusations of anti-Semitism are levelled at the heads of the German Red Cross by the "Welt am Montag."

Yesterday's paper stated that a prominent Jewish officer, with a distinguished war record, was excluded from membership in the Red Cross, because he is a Jew. The name of the officer is not disclosed.

The president of the Berlin Red Cross, General Bender, and the national president, Joachim von Winterfeld are charged with anti-Semitism.

### **Dr. Bochroch, Prominent Neurologist, Dies**

**PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 28**—Dr. Max Henley Bochroch, widely known neurologist and Professor of Psychiatry at the Temple University School of Medicine, died here today after an illness of several months in his seventy-second year.

Dr. Bochroch, who appeared as an alienist in many prominent court trials, was a member of the staffs of a number of leading hospitals.

He was born in Wilmington, Delaware, March 7, 1861, the son of Josiah and Lisette Bochroch. He was educated in the public schools of this city and graduated from Jefferson Medical College in 1880. He was a contributor to various medical journals.

His widow, a daughter and a sister survive.

### **Abraham Joffe, Rochester Philanthropist, Dies**

**ROCHESTER, Nov. 28**—Abraham Joffe, well known philanthropist, active in Jewish work for the last forty-two years, died here this morning at the age of eighty-eight.

Funeral services will take place tomorrow. Rabbis of all the synagogues in the city will take part in the services. Mr. Joffe was the founder of the Free Loan Society, the Jewish Children's Home and the Rochester Hebrew School.

He was a contributor to Zionist Funds and made generous gifts to Yeshivahs in this country and abroad.

### **To Hold Services Today For Edmund Schwarz**

Funeral services will be held this afternoon at Temple Emanuel for Edmund Schwarz, former president of the Jewish Memorial Hospital.

Mr. Schwarz succumbed to heart disease on Sunday morning, at the age of fifty-eight.

### **Herriot Condemns Anti- Semitism; Appeals for Peace** (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

**PARIS, Nov. 28**—Condemnation of the anti-Semitic movement and an appeal for work for peace is expressed in a message sent by Premier Edouard Herriot through his representative who attended the banquet meeting of the League to Combat Anti-Semitism here last night.

Among the speakers was Deputy George Pichot. The banquet was the culmination of the League's Convention. The League decided to adhere to the Amsterdam League for Peace. This is in accordance with a proposal by Bernhard Leacache, president of the League. The resolution was approved despite a vigorous protest from those circles which believe that the Amsterdam organization has some connection with the Soviets.

The conference confirmed its former stand of benevolent neutrality toward the Palestine movement, declaring that a solution of the Jewish question is to be found in the peace of the nations.

All the officers were re-elected.

### **Vienna Nazis Form Special Department to Combat Jews** (Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

**VIENNA, Nov. 28**—A special Nazi department for combatting Jewry and disseminating anti-Semitic information has been established at Nazi headquarters, the Nazi press announces today.

The official purpose of the department, according to the papers, is to conduct research on the Jewish question and to supply information to the public.

The department has inaugurated its activities with a repetition of the decisions of the spurious Elders of Zion and the part allegedly played by Achad Ha'am.

### **Expedition to Unearth Biblical City of Lachish**

**LONDON, Nov. 28**—An expedition will be sent to Palestine to excavate the city of Lachish, where the prophet Isaiah was believed to have prayed that the city be saved from the Assyrians, following which 18,000 Assyrians were destroyed overnight.

The expedition will be sent by Sir Henry Wellcome, fellow of the Royal Society. The city is believed to be situated some twenty-five miles south of Jerusalem.

### **Former Assemblyman Steinberg Succumbs**

Joseph Steinberg, for nine years a member of the State Assembly, died here on Sunday at the age of fifty-one, succumbing to an illness of three weeks.

His record as Assemblyman was commended by the Citizens Union. He is survived by his widow and a sister, Mrs. Rose Jacobs.

## Lengyel Calls on American Jews to Save Polish Jewry From Disaster

**Tells Congress Executive Polish Government Commissions Show Little Real Interest in Solving Jewish Problem**

The government in Poland was charged with evincing little real anxiety to find a solution of the difficulties of the Jews, while the Jews of America were called upon to save Polish Jewry from disaster by Emil Lengyel, publicist, in an address delivered on Sunday at a meeting of the National Executive Committee of the American Jewish Congress.

Mr. Lengyel has recently returned from a tour of Poland. In his judgment, Mr. Lengyel said that "under the present circumstances the Jews in Poland are quite helpless and their situation quite hopeless. The various fact-finding commissions of the Pilsudski government are not very anxious to find any real solution to the difficulties of the Jews. The Jews of Poland are too tired, too lethargic, too apathetic, to do anything. I am firmly convinced that it is the duty of the Jews in America, even though I am quite conscious of the difficulties with which we are confronted here, to help the Polish Jews if they are to be at all saved from disaster."

Dr. Joseph Tenenbaum, chairman of the Executive, presided. The meeting heard reports and statements relating to the various phases of the work of the congress from Dr. Stephen S. Wise, honorary president; Bernard S. Deutsch, president; Dr. Mordecai M. Soltes and Dr. Aaron Brown, chairman and co-chairman of the Committee on Problems in Colleges and Professional Schools; Nathan D. Perlman, chairman of the Administrative Committee; Abraham Goldberg; Z. ## Palestine Mayors Oppose Municipality Ordinance

JERUSALEM, Nov. 28—A meeting of sixteen Palestine mayors, including two Jews, today unanimously resolved that the projected municipality ordinance, which is to be preliminary to the establishment of a Legislative Council, is "inconsistent with the dignity and interests of the Palestine people."

A Committee of Six, including the two Jewish mayors, was appointed to carry on the fight against the ordinance.

## Gewerkschaften to Launch \$1,000,000 Drive; Clash With Revisionists

**Police Called When Revisionists Heckle Speakers at Conference**

The eighth convention of the Gewerkschaften campaign for Palestine Jewish labor institutions held here over the week-end, resolved to launch a campaign to secure \$1,000,000.

The convention went on record as sharply criticizing all organizations, particularly the Revisionists, which seek to place obstacles in the way of the Palestine Jewish Labor Federation and to break the unity of the Jewish workers.

The differences between the Palestine Revisionists and the Histadruth workers and sympathizers had their repercussion at the opening of the convention on Saturday evening in the auditorium of City College when Revisionists, some twenty in all, began to heckle speakers, culminating in a clash.

The clash occurred when Golda Meyerson, a representative of the Histadruth from Palestine, began her address. Revisionists scattered throughout the auditorium sought to interrupt her. Efforts of the presiding officer, A. Hamlin, secretary of the campaign, to restore order failed, whereupon the disturbers were ordered evicted. This led to a clash in which several suffered slight injuries. The police had to be summoned to restore order after the Revisionists had likewise sought to interrupt the addresses of I. Mereminski, leader of the Histadruth, Norman Thomas and Dr. May Baer.

Mr. Mereminski attacked those Zionist elements who would halt the immigration of chalutzim, substituting them with middle class elements. He stated that there are 5,500,000 dunams of land available for cultivation by scientific methods.

The entire campaign administration was re-elected. The convention concluded with a banquet.

## Wauchope Gets Volume On Jewish National Fund

JERUSALEM, Nov. 28—The Palestine High Commissioner, accompanied by his private secretary, spent an hour yesterday at the headquarters of the Jewish National Fund.

The High Commissioner evinced particular interest in the volumes of the Golden Book, in which are inscribed the names of those who have worked for the Fund and in the Herzl Room.

The High Commissioner expressed his admiration for the activities of the Jewish National Fund. A volume illustrative of the activities of the Jewish National Fund was presented to the High Commissioner by M. M. Ussishkin, president of the fund.

## Mizrachi Demand Immigration Be Placed Under Control Of Jewish Agency

**Want Joint Commission of Government and Jewish Representatives to Apportion Employment in Public Works**

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

BUFFALO, Nov. 28—The removal of immigration regulations from the control of the Palestine government and its transfer to the Jewish Agency for Palestine was demanded by the American Mizrachi Organization in a resolution adopted at the close of its four day convention here yesterday.

The convention also called for the formation of a Commission to be composed of government representatives and Jews to decide upon the distribution of employment in public works.

Another resolution asked that the Sabbath be recognized in government work.

The convention went on record as noticing the favorable change in the attitude of the British government to Palestine since the advent of the new High Commissioner, but expresses regret that he should have seen fit to advocate the formation of a Legislative Council in Palestine "which may create antagonism by Jews to the British government."

The convention approved a call to world orthodox Jewry to hold a congress in Palestine for the purpose of creating a united orthodox front for the Torah and Palestine. This resolution was adopted following a heated discussion.

The Zionist Executive was scored for its attitude to middle class settlers and gratitude expressed to Heschel Farstein of Poland for his work in the Executive.

The American Mizrachi organization by decision of the convention will prepare a curriculum to be used in American Yeshivas and Hebrew schools to be patterned after the curriculum in Palestine.

The Canadian Mizrachi organization will combine with the United States body, it was decided.

The convention went on record as favoring the five day week. Members of the Mizrachi were urged to buy Palestine products.

The following officers were elected: Rabbi Meier Berlin of Palestine, honorary president; Rabbi Wolf Gold of New York, president; Rabbi A. M. Ashinsky, Pittsburgh, A. L. Gellman, St. Louis, I. M. Kowalsky, Brooklyn, vice-presidents; Max Nadler, New York, treasurer; Harry Karp, New York, honorary secretary. Rabbi Jacob Levenson of New York was named Chairman of the National Executive Committee.

The convention concluded with a banquet last night attended by five hundred persons. Max M. Yellen presided. Addresses were delivered by Rabbi Berlin, Rabbi Wolf Gold, A. L.

ulation to such a pitch of anxiety that they feared to be seen on the streets and strong police guards were ordered to patrol the Jewish quarters.

The riots were the result of an incident which occurred when anti-Semitic students returning home drunk from an all night revel early Sunday morning began to attack Jewish passers-by. Among those with whom they entered into a clash were five Jews and a woman. The Jews sought to defend themselves and in the affray which ensued, knives were brought into play. Three Polish students were wounded, one of whom succumbed to his wounds in a hospital.

The dead student is Jan Gratkowski, twenty-two years old. Three Jews were arrested by the police and gave their occupation as bakers. A police communique, however, identifies them as members of the underworld with criminal records. The arrested Jews are M. Katz, S. Keller and N. Schmer. Katz is believed to be responsible for the death of the student. One of the arrested is in a critical condition as a result of the wounds he received at the hands of a student.

Of the 46 Jews wounded yesterday, three Chalutzim are in a serious condition in a hospital. A Jewish engineer, Rauch, sustained a broken hand.

Throughout the day yesterday students massed in the Jewish quarters, striking fear into the hearts of the inhabitants. The situation was particularly tense in the old city. Police were constantly on the watch, endeavoring to disperse the throngs.

The Jews are fearful of what may transpire tomorrow when the funeral of Gratkowski takes place.

The District Governor of Lemberg has advised leaders of the Jewish Community to issue a declaration condemning the occurrences.

The head of the municipality of Lemberg assured the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that measures to restore peace and order would be undertaken.

The official police communique dealing with the early Sunday morning events declares: "A night clash occurred between drunken student revelers and underworld characters during which a student, Gratkowski, was killed."

The rector of the University of Lemberg has issued an appeal to the students to remain calm. He terms the occurrences a criminal act which carries neither a political nor national character.

Mr. Deutsch appealed to members of the Executive to rally the masses to form a united and strengthened Jewish front under the Congress banner.

Dr. Soltes announced the organization of a Bureau of Information for Jewish applicants for admission into professional schools and colleges.

Dr. Wise told of the correspondence between the American Jewish Congress and Secretary of State Stimson with regard to the anti-Jewish riots in Vienna University and the service rendered in this connection by Judge Julian W. Mack.

Mr. Tygel described the mounting distress among Polish Jews. Mr. Wolfson expressed the belief that Roumanian Jewry will be represented at the world Jewish conference.

Dr. Rosmarin presented a report on a survey of the anti-anti-Semitic literature she has completed for the American Jewish Congress. She stated that the latest German defense literature against anti-Semitism was characterized by a high standard of objective scholarship in marked contrast to the anti-Semitic literature.

Mr. Goldberg described the attitude of the Yiddish and anglo-Jewish press to the world Jewish Congress.

The entire Yiddish press, with very rare exceptions, is now taking the world Jewish Congress for granted and is looking forward to the participation of masses of American Jews in the election of delegates, Mr. Goldberg stated.
