## NUMBER OF JEWISH INJURED REGISTERING FOR AID REACHES 146, AS LEMBERG DISTURBANCES CONTINUE

University Closed: Papers Reporting Disturbances Confiscated; Zionist Athletic Bowl Fired by Anti-Semites; Vice-President of Jewish Deputies Club Meets With Minister of Interior; Proceeds to Lemberg; Report Polish Authorities Bar Despatches Abroad Concerning Disturbances

LEMBERG, Nov. 29.—The number of Jews who applied for first aid treatment as the result of attacks by anti-Semitic rioters seeking revenge for the death of a Polish student, Jan Grotkowski, killed after a drunken brawl, today reached a total of 146.

Thousands of people participated in the funeral services conducted today for Grotkowski. The services scheduled to be held from the cemetery, were conducted instead from the Student's House. The entire faculty of the University attended in a body and their number was augmented by professors from other institutions. Many clergymen were also in the funeral procession.

Jewish stores were closed today as their owners feared reprisals.

The situation in Lemberg continues disturbed. Last night a mob of six hundred proceeded to attack the Jewish quarter. Thirty-three arrests were made by the police.

Wholesale looting of Jewish stores continues. The anti-Semites have smashed the street lamps in order to increase the confusion and to prevent the police from disturbing the attackers.

### Sir Daniel Levy Gets

£100 Damages for Libel

SYDNEY, Nov. 29.—Sir Daniel Levy, Speaker of the New South Wales Parliament was awarded £100 damages in the suit he brought against a labor daily which charged him with acting in a usurious manner during his term of office as Attorney General.

The paper called Sir Daniel a Shylock. Counsel for Sir Daniel stated that his client is a Jew and proud of it but objects to being called by the name of Shylock, one of the worst characters in the history of letters.

Sir Daniel's suit was for £5000.

Three Jewish students were seriously injured and were placed in a hospital.

LEMBERG, Nov. 29.—The University of Lemberg was closed in all its departments yesterday as rioting, the result of the death of a Polish student killed in a drunken brawl early Sunday morning, swept through the University.

Several Jewish and non-Jewish students were arrested as well as two Jewish youths named Markus and Goldmann who attacked a policeman.

Late in the night the anti-Semites fired the Zionist athletic bowl, "Chasmonai".

Among those seriously injured in the attacks are a former Jewish deputy, Dr. Inzler and a Christian student Ben.

A Jewish merchant returning home was followed by anti-Semites, attacked as he entered his dwelling and left in a critical condition.

In an effort to prevent new clashes at the funeral of Jan Grotkowski, the Polish student killed, the police last night brought the body to the cemetery

## New Municipality Ordinance Postponed Until 1934, Authoritative Report

Parallel Delay in Legislative Council;  
Opposition of Both Jews and  
Arabs Responsible

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

JERUSALEM, Nov. 29.—The municipality ordinance projected for early in 1933, whose promulgation is preliminary to the establishment of a Legislative Council will not be implemented before 1934, the Jewish Telegraphic Agency learns from an authoritative source.

The delay in the passage of the ordinance is due to the strong opposition to it both from Jewish and Arab sources. The government is compelled to take this opposition into consideration and lengthy negotiations will therefore have to be conducted.

This delay will bring about a corresponding delay in the creation of a Legislative Council, it is pointed out.

## Hungarian Students Strike in Demonstration for Reduction in Percentage of Jewish Students

Assure Minister of Education Fight  
Will Be Conducted by Legitimate Means

BUDAPEST, Nov. 29.—A strike of several hours as a protest against the projected modification of the numerus clausus regulation took place yesterday in all Hungarian Universities.

Delegations representing National student bodies presented memorandums to the authorities demanding not only that the government renounce its modification plans but that it reduce the proportion of Jewish students from five and nine-tenths percent to five and one-tenth percent.

The demand of the students is supported in part by the university authorities. This development has delayed a definition of the government's attitude.

BUDAPEST, Nov. 29.—Assurance that their fight against any modification in the numerus clausus regulations would be conducted by legitimate means was given today by a delegation of student bodies representing various Hungarian Universities who were received by the Minister of Education.

The assurance was given after the Minister had warned them against acts of violence directed against the Jews.

The delegation insisted upon a return to the previous quota for Jewish students and prohibitions to prevent Jewish students who graduated abroad from practicing their professions in Hungary.

## Hundreds of Jewish Families Dismissed by Creditanstalt

VIENNA, Nov. 29.—Several hundred Jewish families are without means of livelihood as a result of the systematic elimination of Jews from the staff of the Creditanstalt.

The number of Jewish employes has fallen from forty to sixteen percent and the government is continuing its policy of excluding the Jews.

Jewish employes who have been eliminated have approached Leon de Rothschild for aid, owing to his influence as a representative of the foreign creditors of the institution and have also approached D'Avigdor Goldsmid, president of the Board of Deputies of British Jews.

### Butchers Group in Conflict With Kashruth Association

The Master Kosher Butchers Association, Inc. of New York, have issued a manifesto explaining their refusal to join the Kashruth Association of Greater New York and to submit to the latter's supervision.

The manifesto explains that the Master Kosher Butcher's Association is opposed to "taxation without representation."

The Kashruth Association states that it has refused to make concessions requested before the Master Butchers will consent to join it. Its demand was for representation in the Committee which is dealing with the matter of its business.

The manifesto points out that if the Kashruth Association has its way, it would require its members to sign a contract for an indefinite period to purchase its products from dealers it would name. Membership would also obligate the butchers to follow all the rules of the Association under penalty of having the Association insignia denoting kashruth withdrawn at a day's notice.

The manifesto asserts that the kashruth insignia would be withdrawn not because the butchers sell non-kosher products but simply because they are unwilling to pay the prices designated by the association.

### Reception Tonight in Honor of Madame Katzenelson-Rubashov

A public reception in honor of Rachel Katzenelson-Rubashov, secretary of the Women's Labor Organization of Palestine, who arrived in this country last week, will be held this evening at the Hotel Pennsylvania.

The reception has been arranged by the Pioneer Women's Organization, in the interests of whose work Madame Katzenelson-Rubashov will tour the country.

### Notes Sharp Drop in Preventive And Curative Health Work In Europe as Need Rises

**Dr. Jacob J. Golub, Back from Tour,  
Notes Cut in Health Work Due  
to Economic Conditions**

A sharp curtailment in the preventive and curative work of the organizations conducting health work among the Jewish population of Eastern and Central Europe coupled with an increased necessity for free medical treatment, is reported by Dr. Jacob J. Golub, executive director of the Hospital for Joint Diseases, New York City, who recently returned from a two months' trip through Austria, Germany and Poland where he conferred with officials of these bodies. The hospitals and clinics, especially, have had to restrict their activities as the result of drastic decreases in their income and the educational health propaganda credited with having taught thousands to avoid unsanitary and unhealthy conditions, has had to be almost completely discontinued as a result of economic conditions, Dr. Golub said.

While thus far there have been no epidemics with which to contend, he pointed out, the closing down of several X-Ray stations where new and recurrent cases of favus (a contagious scalp disease) have been treated, has been followed by an increase in the number of cases. Tuberculosis clinics also report an increase in the number of patients, he said.

Dr. Golub, who from 1920 to 1924 directed the medical activities conducted in Eastern Europe by the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, international relief agency, spoke highly of the work being done by the "TOZ", Polish Jewish health society, and the "OZE", Jewish health organization in the surrounding countries, which carried on the Joint Distribution Committee's medical and sanitary work and continued it with the aid of subsidies from the Committee.

"The work of these organizations and their institutions is of a very high grade," Dr. Golub declared, "and conforms to the highest medical standards."

The chief impression the visitor to Eastern and Central Europe receives, is of a spirit of hopelessness and discouragement, he asserted. "The difference between the depression in this country and over there," he pointed out, "is that here, it seems to lift after every hope, every sign of improvement. Over there, nothing indicates improvement and the spirit prevailing is one of hopelessness and discouragement. The people are at the end of their resources and do not know where to turn to help themselves. Compared to conditions there, we here in this country do not know what 'depression' is."

As a consequence of these conditions, the health societies, which receive little governmental subsidies, are finding that thousands of Jews who formerly paid

### Lublin High Court Rules Czarist Restrictions on Land Purchase By Jews Still Operative

**Decision Handed Down in the Case  
Of a Jew Who Lent Money to  
A Peasant for a Mortgage**

WARSAW, Nov. 29.—The Czarist law prohibiting the purchase of land by Jews are still in force in Poland, the Lublin High Court ruled yesterday.

The decision was handed down in the case of a Jew who lent money to a peasant for a mortgage. When the peasant failed to pay, the Jew foreclosed and sold the land to another peasant.

The court declared the transaction to be illegal on the ground that a Jew cannot take over land in lieu of a mortgage and cannot sell the land, under the Czarist law of 1891.

### Want Centers to Aid Jewish Unemployed

SYRACUSE, Nov. 29.—That character building agencies such as Jewish Centers be enabled to provide for the unemployed who are not able to pay dues by securing a larger paying membership among those of the community who are in a position to contribute was urged by Bernard B. Given of Syracuse at the meeting of the Executive Board of the New York State Federation of Young Men's Hebrew Associations and Young Women's Hebrew Associations and Kindred Organizations at the Hotel Syracuse.

## Nazis Will Oppose Von Papen as "Jewish Chancellor" Goebbels Asserts

Threatens Jews Once Hitler Comes  
Into Power, the Imminence of  
Which "Angriff" Predicts

BERLIN, Nov. 29.—Should Franz von Papen be reappointed Chancellor of Germany, as now appears likely, "Der Angriff" will renew its campaign against him under the slogan: "Papen the Jewish Chancellor."

This announcement is made today by Paul Josef Goebbels, editor of the Berlin Nazi organ, in an article which carries the title: "German Jewry Breathing More Freely."

The Jews have been spared this time and it is choking us, says the article, but shortly Hitler will become Chancellor and stamp the Nazi imprint upon Germany.

## Paterson Jew Gets Outstanding Citizen Award

## Los Angeles Jewish Hospital Head Dies

## Rabbi Goldman Calls for Central Thinking and Planning Agency for United States Jewry

States Jewish Community Is Faced  
With Chaos; No Representative  
Organizations or Leadership

A call for the formation of a central thinking and planning agency to save the Jewish community of America from the chaos which now threatens it, is sounded in a statement made by Rabbi Solomon Goldman of Cleveland.

The past year, says Rabbi Goldman, has revealed how haphazard our organization of community life is; that our leaders are tired, impatient, quarrelsome, effete and inadequate; that our economy is faced with bankruptcy and our communal enterprises with disintegration.

The present situation in Jewish life in this country, Rabbi Goldman says, is due to the fact that there is no organized community. "There is no organization in the country that is either representative of, or has a program for the four million Jews of America," he asserts. Similarly there is no Jewish leadership and no Jewish leader who has the power of attorney from American Jewry.

"Every city can boast of at least one Jew who is a 'national' figure, but none of these grandiose figures can boast that he has his city solidly back of him," says Rabbi Goldman.

"Our leaders persist in neutralizing one another's effectiveness. One is tempted to speculate on what would have happened to Jewry had the gentlemen become absorbed in their own useful pursuits and relinquished the helm. Could the ship of state have floundered more?" he asks.

"The havoc the depression has wrought should make clear to us the futility of our present efforts. Without social engineering and efficiency we cannot extricate ourselves from the morass into which we have sunk. But social engineering and efficiency are improbable as long as there is no Jewish Community."

As an example of the disorganized state of Jewish life, Rabbi Goldman cites the fact that neither his own plan nor those proposed by Judge Horace Stern of Philadelphia, H. L. Lurie, Director of the Bureau of Jewish Social Research of New York, and Samuel Goldsmith, Director of the Chicago Jewish Charities, could be submitted to any one in particular.

"There has been no lack of effort in American Jewish life," according to Rabbi Goldman, "but what that effort needed most is a central thinking and planning agency to direct it. If we will develop in all the cities throughout the land community-consciousness, it will lead to community organization. A Federation of communities will then follow naturally."

Rabbi Goldman points to the financial downfall of the Jews in this coun-

## Jewish Merchant to Be Tried In Spring on Charges of Shooting Peasants in 1918

Supreme Court Ruling Causes Surprise  
as Minister of Justice Had  
Promised Amnesty

PRAGUE, Nov. 29.—Samuel Weissberger, Jewish merchant of Michalovec, arrested in December of 1931 on charges of having shot two Christian peasants in 1918 during the early days of the formation of the Czechoslovakian Republic as a member of an expeditionary body, will be tried by a jury in the Spring, according to a decision of the Supreme Court.

Weissberger was released from prison in March under bail of \$3,000.

The decision to place Weissberger on trial is occasioning considerable surprise in view of the assurance given by the Minister of Justice to a Jewish delegation that no action would be taken against any one on charges connected with the events of 1918.

Weissberger has protested his innocence, declaring that he had already been demobilized in October 1918, when the shooting is alleged to have taken place and was serving customers in his store.

The Supreme Court has decided that political amnesty does not apply to Weissberger.

## Welfare Campaign Postponed for Spring

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 29.—The annual fall financial campaign of San Francisco's Jewish National Welfare Fund will not take place this year. Instead it will be conducted next spring, according to announcement by leaders of the organization.

Budget allotments were made for the 40 organizations which receive financial help from the center. These allotments will cover for a six months period or until the next drive is concluded.

The reason for the postponement is a change in the campaign plans of San Francisco's Community Chest by which the usual spring campaign will take place next month and the welfare fund organization chose not to interfere. Judge M. C. Sloss is president of the organization.

WARSAW, Nov. 29—The National Democratic press contents itself with the publication of the official reports regarding the death of the Polish student and riots, refraining from comment.

The Volkszeitung, organ of the Jewish Socialist Party declares that the four Jews arrested are actually bakers and not underworld characters as alleged.

The Jewish Telegraphic Agency was informed by government circles that the National Democrats are endeavoring to spread news of the occurrences in order to develop an anti-Semitic incitement on a large scale and place the government in difficulties.

The government is however determined to suppress the disturbances.

National Democratic students yesterday endeavored to provoke trouble at the University, shouting: "Murderers", at the Jewish students.

The University authorities threatened to close the University if disturbances occur.

Mounted and foot police have been stationed in the Jewish quarters to prevent any attacks.

VIENNA, Nov. 29—The Polish authorities have established a complete censorship on all despatches sent abroad concerning the anti-Semitic events in Lemberg which have been recurrent for the last three days.

This announcement is made by the official Austrian Telegraphic Agency today. The Austrian Agency declares that all telegrams from Poland for destinations abroad with regard to the Lemberg events are now barred by the Polish authorities.

try; to the fact that synagogues that have enjoyed national reputations for decades are now disintegrating, as an example of the changes taking place due to the depression. Sixty percent, he asserts, have either been foreclosed or owe their existence to Christian bankers. Rabbis' salaries have been cut in half and some have not been paid for months. Scores of Hebrew teachers are receiving no salaries; one community closed its schools for three months; another dismissed teachers employed by it for ten years; the theological seminaries have fabulous deficits and teachers institutions have been budgeted out of existence. Jewish literature are starving and the Yiddish theatre is breathing its last.

"No movement testifies as much to our hysteria and dizziness as anti-Semitism," Rabbi Goldman declares. "This year the world has been flooded with anti-Semitic bile? What has been the antidote we have offered? How far have we gone beyond orating, sermonizing and the appointing of committees?"

As a case in point he refers to the fact that while Adolph Hitler has been in the forefront of the Jewish newspapers, no attempt to present a study of the man has been undertaken.

there will be an increase in their budgets, but meanwhile, there is a greater dependence on outside aid such as has been furnished by the Joint Distribution Committee. Such aid will be needed more than ever this coming winter."

Rabbi Joseph Zeitlin, formerly of Congregation B'nai Jehshurun, of Philadelphia, has accepted the call to be the spiritual leader of Temple Anshe Chesed, New York City. Temple Anshe Chesed is the largest in the Conservative wing and the third oldest in the country, having started in 1828.
