MASS RIOTING SHOWS SIGNS OF ABATING IN LWOW; ATTACKS IN WARSAW; CHARGED ATMOSPHERE IN VILNA, CRACOW AND CZENSTOCHTWA

Jews Venture Out in Lwow Streets for First Time; Stores Re-open But Business at Standstill; National Democratic Students Set Six Conditions Before They Will Permit Lwow University to Re-open; Authorities Ban Protest Meeting in Warsaw; Individual Baiting on Increase as Well as Train Attacks; Two Bombing Outrages; American Jewish Committee, Jewish Congress, Polish Federation in Joint Protest

LWOW, Dec. 2.—For the first time since the anti-Semitic attacks began in Lwow on Sunday, Jews ventured on the streets of the city today, and many bandaged heads attested to the size of the disorders.

Stores owned by Jews, which have been closed for the last five days, also reopened today, but complaints were heard everywhere that no business was being transacted.

While the mass rioting shows signs of abating here, a strengthening of the anti-Semitic boycott movement is evidenced as well as an increase in individual baiting of Jews which is particularly prominent on trains.

The train attacks reached serious proportions today as students boarded trains leaving Lwow for the specific purpose of baiting the Jewish passengers.

Several Jews travelling from Lwow to Lodz were attacked by students riding for several stations, causing a panic. Several of the passengers succeeded in bringing the train to a halt, but could not find succor as no police were available. As the train resumed its journey, a number of the Jews jumped out preferring to risk their lives in this fashion than to place themselves at the mercy of the anti-Semites. As soon as the train reached an intermediary station, other Jewish passengers alighted.

Among the Jews injured in the train attack are Abraham Handel and Samuel Lendrow.

District Attorney Lukasz of Lwow was attacked on a train and a high official, Krol, was beaten up on the

street because they were mistaken for Jews.

WARSAW, Dec. 2.—Attacks upon the Jews turned today to the Wovelberg Technical High School, founded by a Jew, and maintained largely by Jewish patronage, and led to its closing.

The institution was closed after Jews had been beaten up and thrown out of the school by the anti-Semites.

Attempts to renew disturbances at the College of Commerce were also made, but were halted owing to the energetic action of the rector.

A Jewish clerk, Alexander Stein, was attacked on Warsaw's principal thoroughfare and left in a grave condition. He was taken to a hospital with serious stab wounds in his head.

Baiting of Jewish students was attempted last night at the High School of Politics. Here the Jews resisted

Deny Agency Executive Has Received Legislative Bill for Observations

Deny That the Government Has Prepared Such a Bill as Yet

JERUSALEM, Dec. 2.—Official denial was made today by the Executive of the Jewish Agency in a statement to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that it has received a copy of the bill with regard to the projected Legislative Council with a request for its observations.

The Jewish Telegraphic Agency learns from an authoritative source, moreover, that the government has not even prepared such a bill as yet.

The report that Dr. Judah L. Magnes, Chancellor of the Hebrew University; Dr. Chaim Arlosoroff, member of the Jewish Agency Executive, and Moïse Blau, leader of the Agudath Israel, are being considered as the Jewish representatives in the Legislative Council, were also termed baseless.

General Von Schleicher Named Chancellor of Germany; Expect Peaceful Regime

Jewish Leaders Await Energetic Measures to Stamp Out Incitement

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

BERLIN, Dec. 2.—General Kurt von Schleicher, Minister of Defense in the cabinet of Franz von Papen, was this morning appointed Chancellor of Germany, ending the political controversy which has endured for the past two weeks. Chancellor von Schleicher retains the portfolio of Minister of Defense.

Jewish leaders expect a peaceful regime with energetic measures undertaken by the new Chancellor to combat anti-Semitic incitement.

Although General von Schleicher is believed to be friendly to the National Socialists, he has not been known to utter any anti-Semitic views, or to participate in anti-Semitic acts.

On the contrary he has frequently intimated that he considers incitement against the Jews damaging to Germany and a disgrace to its reputation.

Chancellor von Schleicher has repeatedly evinced a friendly attitude to the Jewish War Veterans organization. It is recalled that at a time when all public meetings were prohibited, he permitted the Central Union of German Citizens of the Jewish Faith and the Jewish War Veterans to hold a conference for the purpose of enlightening the public on the Jewish problem.

At a recent meeting of Jewish War Veterans, Colonel Ott accepted, in behalf of General von Schleicher, the memorial volume dedicated to the 12,000 Jewish soldiers who fell in the world war, declaring that General von Schleicher would cherish the volume in memory of the true and real sons of the German people.

1,000 Attend Reception For Nahum Sokolow

JERUSALEM, Dec. 2.—Nahum Sokolow, president of the World Zionist Organization and the Jewish Agency for Palestine, was officially welcomed to Palestine yesterday at a reception given in his honor by the Jewish Agency.

More than a thousand people attended the reception, including high government officials and representatives of Palestine Jewry from various sections of the country.

Prayers at Wailing Wall for Polish Jews

Lehman Calls Special Session Of Legislature to Deal With New York's Financial Crisis

Will Authorize Salary Cuts and Also
Go Into Lehman's Study of Economy
and Reorganization It Is Believed

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

ALBANY, Dec. 2.—Acting Governor Herbert H. Lehman, who at the end of this month becomes the Governor of New York, today summoned a special session of the Legislature for December 9th, to meet the financial crisis which has imperiled the credit of New York City and jeopardized its unemployment relief conducted among 54,000 families.

The Legislature will be called upon to authorize a ten per cent cut in the city's mandatory salaries, without which the banks have refused to extend credit to the city.

Acting Governor Lehman will not, it is indicated, limit the work of the special session to this single act, but will permit, it is believed, further economies in line with his own study of the possible reorganization needed.

Tel Aviv Without Bread Due to Strike and Lock-Out

TEL AVIV, Dec. 2.—Tel Aviv is experiencing a bread shortage today in view of a bakers lock-out here.

The lock-out was in response to a strike declared by bakery workers who demanded the introduction of an eight hour day instead of the nine hour day which now prevails.

their attackers and later sent a delegation to the Minister of Education to protest. The Minister assured them that no efforts would be spared to insure peace.

The Club of Jewish Deputies made it known today that it would submit an interpellation regarding the riots as soon as the Sejm resumes its sessions.

LWOW, Dec. 2.—Two hundred sticks with razor blade points were confiscated today from rioters in Lwow (Lemberg) following the arrival of the Chief of the Department of Public Security.

Disquieting reports regarding serious excesses in the provinces of Lwow are received here today.

A report says that grave excesses took place last night in Grodek, where the Jews were beaten up and their places of business looted. An official communique issued in this connection states that disturbances were resumed last night towards evening and two were arrested for carrying arms. The police dispersed the rioters.

While the police of Grodek were busily engaged with the anti-Semitic disturbances, eight masked bandits entered the post-office and demanded money.

Post office officials offered resistance, fired and killed three. One of the masked figures carried a student's identification card.

WARSAW, Dec. 2.—A highly charged atmosphere continues in Vilna, Cracow and Czenstochta today.

The Rector of the University of Vilna last night advised Jewish students to absent themselves from their class rooms for the next few days in view of the disturbed situation.

The Rector's suggestion was made at a huge mass meeting in Vilna. At the same time he made known his intention of closing the University if the excesses are renewed.

Student demonstrations were held in Cracow yesterday, the demonstrators shouting abuses at the Jews. An official communique states that the demonstrators were dispersed.

In Czenstochta, students were forbidden to appear on the streets of the city after five o'clock in view of the prevailing tension.

LWOW, Dec. 2.—All synagogues and Beth Hamidrashim, houses of study, were placed under police guard today. The precautions were taken after the bombing outrages committed yesterday by anti-Semitic rioters.

LWOW, Dec. 2.—Two thousand stu-

dents, following a meeting at the University of Lwow yesterday, marched through the streets of the city in a demonstration to Mizkiewicz Park.

Police forces had to be augmented by a fire brigade which employed water hoses before the demonstration could be dispersed.

The students then formed into groups and scattered through the streets where attacks upon Jews were resumed.

Among those injured were Dayan Rabbi Anshel Schreiber, Dr. Karl Zippor, a Jewish war veteran, who has received the highest military award; Nahum Silber and a Miss Peck, sister of a Jewish soldier who was killed on the war front.

A new instrument of attack was introduced yesterday when two powder-bombs were exploded at the Gmilus Chassodim building and the Jewish cemetery. All the windows of the structure and those of the neighboring buildings were broken and their walls shaken.

The attacks upon Jews in running trains, which began in the suburbs, yesterday were extended to long distance trains, particularly on the Lemberg-Bratislava-Prezemysl lines.

Attempts to re-open the Jewish business places which have been closed throughout the week of the rioting were soon abandoned yesterday in view of the tense situation which has now been increased by the fact that the condition of Samorski, a Polish student shot following the funeral of Jan Grotowski, is worse.

LWOW, Dec. 2.—The anti-Semitic National Democratic students today set six conditions upon which they insist before they will permit the University of Lwow to resume classes with a promise that order will be maintained.

Their first condition is that the Jews accused of responsibility for the death of the Polish student, Jan Grotowski, killed after a drunken brawl, shall be court-martialed. Second that "the Jewish fighting brigades," meaning the Jewish self-defense, shall be liquidated. 3. The dismissal of the president of the Lwow municipality, Orjanowski. 4. The release of the arrested student rioters; 5. A law establishing numerus clausus. 6. The dismissal of all employees employed by Christian firms, who defended the Jews.

One hundred and sixty-five demonstrators who took part in yesterday's mass demonstration, were arrested by the police.

of Jewish Deputies, who has come to Lwow to investigate the excesses, yesterday requested the Bank Polski to extend the date of payments due from Jewish merchants since the closing of the stores has rendered business impossible.

A similar request was also presented by Dr. Rosmarin to the income tax authorities.

The "Gazeta Warszawska," organ of the anti-Semitic National Democratic Party, describes Lwow as presenting a tragic appearance, with police and police cars ubiquitous.

Poland is being flooded with cables of inquiry from friends and relatives in America and Germany.

WARSAW, Dec. 2.—Rectors of all the educational institutions which have been closed owing to the anti-Semitic disturbances met here today to discuss the resumption of classes.

The possibility that the colleges will be re-opened on Monday was discussed.

WARSAW, Dec. 2.—The Polish authorities have prohibited the holding of a meeting called by the Poale Zion for tonight to protest against the anti-Semitic rioting throughout the country.

The authorities have also banned a meeting called by the Jewish Socialist and Polish Socialist parties to discuss measures of protection to be taken in connection with tomorrow's memorial church service for Jan Grotowski, the Polish student killed. The memorial service was scheduled for today, but postponed for tomorrow.

The Polytechnic Institute and the College of Commerce were reopened today, but the University of Warsaw remains closed pending tomorrow's service to the church memorial services.

No Jews dared to appear at the Polytechnic Institute despite the resumption of classes.

The "Gazeta Warszawska," the National Democratic organ was confiscated today for publishing a description of the incidents in Lwow. The paper put out a special edition, however, calling for attendance at tomorrow's memorial service.

This is countered by an appeal for calm behavior which appears in the government press.

The former Jewish Deputy Insler, who was injured on Wednesday, is recovering from his injuries and plans action against the transport company. Mr. Insler asserts that when he was attacked, he sought refuge in a passing street car, but the conductor closed the door and refused to admit him.

LWOW, Dec. 2.—A belief is current

in Jewish circles here that an official occupying a responsible position received instructions from the Central government to suppress the disturbances, but instead suppressed the instructions and remained neutral to the National Democrats who were leading the riots.

The reason given for the sympathy of the official to the National Democrats is that he wished to gain the sympathy of students and professors for an elevation from the post of lecturer to professor at Lwow University. Leaflets addressed to the police urging them to take no action to prevent the riots, were distributed here today.

The leaflets were not signed. In some circles, they are viewed as a Communist provocation, while others maintain they emanate from National Democratic headquarters, and are an effort to secure the co-operation of the police.

Joint Protest Action Here

The American Jewish Committee, the American Jewish Congress and the Federation of Polish Jews in America have communicated to the representatives of the Polish government in this country "the profound distress of Jews of America at the recent occurrences and their anxiety as to the fate of their fellow Jews in Poland."

At the same time the three groups express their conviction that an end could be put to the disturbances if the government of Poland shows a firmer attitude.

This action followed a joint meeting of the three groups on Thursday afternoon, according to a statement made public through the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

The statement in its full text declares:

"The American Jewish Congress, the American Jewish Committee and the Federation of Polish Jews in America have received reliable reports to the effect that in addition to the outbreaks in Lwow there have been attacks upon Jews in the following cities: Warsaw, Vilna, Chenshtohowa, Cracow and in smaller towns in Poland.

"Although it appears that the authorities have taken measures to suppress the disorders, they have not succeeded in restoring order. Jewish lives and property are still menaced. The Jewish inhabitants of these and other cities are in a state of considerable anxiety as to future developments. It is reported that 360 Jews have been injured within the last few days.

"Notwithstanding indications that these riots have been instigated by anti-Semitic elements who are opposed to the government, for the purpose of embarrassing it, it is believed that if the

Morris Rothenberg to Be Honored at Testimonial Dinner Here Tonight

Messages of Greeting Received from
President Hoover, Governor-elect
Lehman and Dr. Weizmann

A committee of more than five hundred Jewish leaders in every part of the country and representative of every field of endeavor has joined to sponsor, the testimonial dinner to Morris Rothenberg, President of the Zionist Organization of America, to be held tonight at the Hotel Astor, Nathan Straus, Jr., Chairman of the Testimonial Committee, has announced. The other officers are Felix M. Warburg, Honorary Chairman; Cyrus Adler, Edward Lazansky, Louis Lipsky, Julian W. Mack, James Marshall, Bernard Semel and Stephen S. Wise, Vice-Chairmen; I. D. Morrison, Treasurer; and Harry L. Gluckman, Secretary.

The messages from President Herbert Hoover, Acting Governor Herbert H. Lehman and Dr. Chaim Weizmann, world Zionist leader, will be among those read tonight at the testimonial dinner.

The list of speakers who will pay tribute to Mr. Rothenberg includes Felix M. Warburg, Honorary Chairman, of the Committee; Dr. Cyrus Adler, President of the American Jewish Committee, Dr. Stephen S. Wise, Honorary President of the American Jewish Congress; Mrs. Rose Halprin, President of Hadassah; Julius Hochman, Vice-President of the International Ladies' Garment Workers' Union, and Mr. Straus himself. Part of the addresses will be broadcast over Station WJZ at 10:30 P. M.

A parchment scroll reciting Mr. Rothenberg's services to the Jewish people and to the community at large will be presented to him by the Committee.

The tribute to Mr. Rothenberg is in recognition of his service to Palestine and other Jewish causes, as well as of his service in the labor movement.

A graduate from the New York University Law School, and admitted to the Bar in 1905, Mr. Rothenberg has been specially interested in the field of labor law. The labor organizations for which he has served as counsel include the Amalgamated Clothing Workers of America, International Ladies' Garment Workers' Union, Board of Cloak, Suit and Reefers Makers' Union. A large majority of injunction cases in the needle trades has been tried by Mr. Rothenberg.

thenberg in the New York Supreme
Court.

Having played an outstanding role in the effort to establish the Palestine Foundation Fund in the United States in 1921, Mr. Rothenberg has since held the leadership in fund-raising efforts for Palestine. It is estimated that some \$20,000,000 were obtained from American Jews under his supervision for the rebuilding of the Jewish Homeland. Mr. Rothenberg is also regarded as having been largely responsible for the support given by American non-Zionists to the plan formulated by Dr. Chaim Weizmann and the late Louis Marshall to join Zionists and non-Zionists in the Jewish Agency for Palestine. Mr. Rothenberg was the American aide of Dr. Weizmann, then the World Zionist President.

Mr. Rothenberg was one of the small group which organized the Joint Distribution Committee in War days and has been a leader in its fund-raising efforts for the relief of Eastern European Jewry. He is also identified with the American Jewish Committee, the American Jewish Congress and the Jewish Welfare Board.

"To Zionism," Mr. Straus said, "Morris Rothenberg has given the richest fruits of his personality. Because the national ideal embraces all of Jewish life and points the way to the solution of the Jewish problem, Rothenberg has recognized that within Zionism the Jew can attain his fullest powers as an individual and as a member of a collective group. It is true that for more than ten years he bore the brunt of fund-raising responsibilities for Palestine. It is true that under his leadership American Jewry responded fullheartedly to the tasks which called them in Palestine. But Mr. Rothenberg's greatest service to Palestine lies in his winning over an increasing por-

tion of American Jewry to the idea and the content of Palestine rebuilding. He has been a propagandist in the deepest meaning of the term. Fund-raising efforts, of the Keren Hayesod or the enlarged Jewish Agency, were important to him just as much for acquainting the people with Palestine as for the amounts they brought in. He prided himself that this so-called prosaic collection machine was able to bring to this country from abroad one after another of the outstanding intellectual leaders of Jewry, so that the ferment of their minds might leaven the ideological substance of the Jewish people here.

"The leadership which Rothenberg has provided in the Zionist movement and in other Jewish enterprises has penetrated into the communal consciousness by a gradual process. It is now being recognized, on an ever wider scale, that the stability of his mind and the rationality of his action are qualities essential to insure the equilibrium of Jewish life. He is the symbol of wise serenity in the face of unnerving haste. It is to men like Morris Rothenberg that the Jews of America must look for the sane, constructive leadership that is to guide them out of clamor and confusion."

The formal installation exercises for Rabbi Philip Lipis of Congregation Emanu-El, Philadelphia, will take place today in the Synagogue Auditorium.
