POLISH STUDENT WOUNDED ON TUESDAY CONFESES HE WAS NOT SHOT, BUT HAND GRENADE HE CARRIED EXPLODED PREMATURELY

Release 3 Jews Who Had Been Arrested for Alleged Shot at Funeral Throng; Energetic Police Measures Prevent Planned Attacks on Jews During Services for Student; Mounted and Foot Police, Aided by Fire Brigade and Militia, Under Direct Orders from District Governor, Stand Guard; Sporadic Attacks Take Place; Disturbances Resumed at Wewelberg Technical High School; Jewish Physician Injured in Lwow Said to be in Hopeless Condition; Lectures Cancelled at Vilna University Owing to Disturbed Atmosphere; Catholic Press Agency Accuses Jews of Responsibility for Riots.

LWOW, Dec. 3.—A sensation was caused here today with the disclosure that the Polish student, Zamorski, who was wounded on Tuesday, when a shot was presumably fired from an open window at the funeral procession returning from services for Jan Grotowski, was not shot but wounded by a hand grenade which he himself carried and which had exploded prematurely.

Zamorski confessed to the premature explosion of the hand grenade and was immediately placed under arrest in the hospital, where he is lying in a hopeless condition.

The discovery that Zamorski was not shot, came about today when an operation performed on him disclosed no bullet wound, but rather pieces of tin in his hand and neck. The wounded youth finally confessed what had happened.

As a result of his confession, three Jews who had been held chained in prison, were released today. The wounding of Zamorski on Tuesday led to serious outbursts against the Jews.

The anti-Semitic National Democratic Organization, seeking to disclaim Zamorski, now declares that he is a pro-government student. An investigation,

however, affirmed that he is allied with the National Democrats.

The University of Lemberg was reopened today without incident.

WARSAW, Dec. 3.—Attempts to renew the anti-Jewish riots were made tonight in Warsaw.

Jewish students were attacked in Marszalkowka Street. A number of students and some policemen were injured. A Jewish student, Grin, was treated at a hospital.

Vienna U. Boycotts Spinoza Tercentenary

VIENNA, Dec. 3.—The University of Vienna has initiated a virtual official boycott of any celebrations of the tercentenary of the birth of Baruch Spinoza.

The University itself held no memorial services, and the philosophic faculty did not as much as mention his name. Moreover, when the Philosophic Union of Jewish Students approached the rector with the request to permit a memorial meeting to be held in a small University auditorium, the request was refused.

Revisionists Protest Legislative Council

JERUSALEM, Dec. 3.—More than one thousand persons participated in a Revisionist mass meeting here today to protest against the intention of the British Government to establish a Legislative Council.

A strong police guard was present during the meeting, which passed without incident.

Professor Einstein Reiterates Pacifist Views in Challenge to Women's Patriot Corporation

Says He Has No Political Party; State Department Sends Data on Alleged Communism to Consular Officers

POTSDAM, Dec. 3.—Strong reiteration of his views on pacifism was Professor Albert Einstein's answer yesterday to the charges of the Women's Patriot Corporation that his pacifist aims indicate his Communist alliances, on which ground they seek to have him excluded from admission to the United States.

"I belong to no political party," Professor Einstein stated. "Publicly I am a scientist, but as a private citizen I claim the right to feel and believe and fight for the interests of culture and of justice."

"I have always considered it my duty to intervene when justice is at stake, even though I am bitterly attacked for it."

"I feel honored because I have had a certain kind of enemies."

"I have always fought war—an attitude which the majority of sound political opinion in the United States appreciates."

"Proudly I rise to defend the so-called 'war resisters' whom I regard as greater heroes than those who allow themselves to be sacrificed upon the altar of misconceived patriotism."

Funeral services were held this afternoon and were attended by Ben Zvi and Joseph Lurie, representing the Palestine Jewish National Council and the Jewish Agency Executive.

Ben Amram was a picturesque Palestine figure and leader of the historic sect, known as Bene Yisrael, living in the city of Nablus which they still call Shechem.

Soviet to Guarantee Eleven Pound Matzoth Delivery for Passover at Reduced Rate

**Sum of Eleven Pound Package to Be
Reduced from Last Year's Price
of \$10 to \$4.30**

The Soviet government, through the Am-Derutra Corporation in this country has undertaken to guarantee the delivery of matzoth shipped into Soviet Russia for the Passover holidays, at a rate of \$4.30 per parcel, consisting of eleven pounds gross weight, nine pounds of which are matzoth.

The price represents a reduction of \$5.70 from the \$10 price of last year for a matzoth package of similar weight.

This disclosure was made by the B. Manischewitz Company through Max Manischewitz, its treasurer, in a statement to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

The statement declares that the agreement as to price and guaranteed delivery was reached after conversations between Mr. Manischewitz, the president, the vice-president of the Am-Derutra Corporation, and Leo Broches, Assistant Secretary of the Am-Derutra Corporation.

The terms of agreement will apply to other matzoth companies as well as the Manischewitz Company.

Nineteenth Annual Tag Day on December 11th

American Jewish interest in the furtherance of the upbuilding of Palestine as a Jewish National Home, will again be manifested on a large scale in connection with the 19th annual Tag Day of the Jewish National Fund which will be observed on Sunday, December 11th, in New York City and in 300 other cities and towns throughout the country.

An active part in the conduct of Tag Day in New York will be taken by the J.N.F. Council for Greater New York.

Order Jewish Schools in Baghdad Open on Saturday

BAGHDAD.—The Government of Iraq has ordered Jewish schools to be closed on Friday and to be open on Saturday.

This order has aroused considerable indignation and protest among the Jewish population. Jewish circles point out that the compulsory non observance of the Sabbath is in contravention to the national minority guarantees which Iraq as a member of the League of Nations is in duty bound to observe.

Launch Effort to Counteract Christmas Among Jews

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 3.—A city wide effort has been launched here to counteract the Christmas spirit permeating Jewish homes by emphasizing the spiritual and national significance of Chanukah and substituting Chanukah gifts for the present vogue in Jewish families to give Christmas gifts.

The Chanukah Festival begins on December 23rd. The movement was started by the Philadelphia Jewish World, and has received the endorsement of leading rabbis, educators and laymen in this and other cities. Through its news columns and through the medium of large display advertisements the Jewish World is calling attention to the danger lurking in the adoption by Jews of the practice of Christmas giving. Simultaneously the newspaper is stressing the message Chanukah has for the older generation and especially for the Jewish youth.

The Jewish World's campaign is approved among others by Ben Rosen, Educational Director of the Associated Talmud Torahs of Philadelphia; Israel Unterberg, president of the Jewish Education Association of New York; Bernard Sempel, honorary secretary of the Jewish Education Association of New York; Dr. Solomon Solis Cohen of Philadelphia, distinguished scientist; Dr. Julius H. Greenstein, secretary of the Associated Talmud Torahs and a leading educator.

Morris Sigel Killed in Auto Crash in Hartford

HARTFORD, Dec. 3.—Morris Sigel, the youthful president of Hartford's largest advertising agency, was killed today in a automobile crash.

Four Jews Re-elected to Rochester Community Chest

ROCHESTER, N. Y., Dec. 3.—Four prominent members of the Jewish community who are very active in communal affairs here have been re-elected to the Board of Directors of the Rochester Community Chest for three-year terms. They are: Simon N. Stein, Sol Heumann, Joseph Michaels and Julius M. Wile.

The 1933 Community Chest campaign will be conducted May 15 to 22 and no supplementary campaign is planned for this winter, according to an announcement made at the annual meeting. The failure of the Community Chest campaign for 1932 had made it obligatory for the various Jewish and other Chest-supported agencies to operate on a basis below minimum standards. Payments on 1932 pledges are being made promptly and the 1932 collection record as of Nov. 1 is only slightly below that of 1931. The Jewish Children's Home, the Jewish Home for the Aged, the Jewish Young Men's and Women's Association and the Jewish Welfare Council are among the institutions supported by the Chest.

New "Little Temple" For 200 Formed Here

A new synagogue, to be known as the Little Temple has been organized in New York City with Rabbi Ralph A. Habas, as spiritual leader and Harold Riegelman, chairman of the Committee of Sponsors.

Membership in this congregation is limited to 200 and an effort will be made to restore something of the intimate spirit of the traditional synagogue.

"The Little Temple is a Reform Temple," according to its officers. "It is experimental. It is experimental in that its membership will be limited to 200, and also in the sense that it represents an effort to adjust religious administration to the modern need for religion—a need profoundly affected by educational, scientific, social and economic trends of the time."

The Little Temple, which held its first service on Friday evening, will meet temporarily at 35 East 62nd Street.

Suggests That Basra and Baghdad Jews Go to Palestine: Arabs to Iraq

"India Times" Holds the Possibility of Interchange Deserves Serious Consideration

BOMBAY—The "Times of India" publishes a report from Basra, in Iraq, suggesting the possibility of an interchange of the numerous Jews living in Baghdad and Basra, who would go to Palestine and surplus Arabs from Palestine being sent in their place to Iraq.

The scheme is not as wild as it seems, the "Times of India" writes, and has much to recommend it. The paper makes a reference to the rapid drawing together of Iraq and Palestine, owing to the commencement of the construction of the Iraq Petroleum Company's pipe-line between Haifa and northern Iraq.

The more practical and thoughtful Zionists have been extremely concerned, it proceeds, with the future of Judaism in Palestine, owing to the numerical preponderance of the Arab population, and such a scheme, it says, is the outcome.

Wholesale deportations of populations, it continues, have no longer any terror for the Near Eastern world after the experience of the Greeks and the Turks, which has worked out very well; and the same sort of thing might be practicable as between Palestine and Iraq.

Iraq, it goes on, is overwhelmingly a

Harry Fischel Foundation for Research in Talmud Dedicated in Jerusalem

JERUSALEM — Palestine's newest institution was dedicated last week, the Harry Fischel Foundation for Research in the Talmud and Community Center for the Study of Torah and Daily Prayers.

The institution is the gift of Harry Fischel of New York, prominently identified with orthodox Jewish undertakings there, one of the largest donors to the fund which made possible the Yeshiva College in New York, and for a period acting president of the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary, a component part of the Yeshiva College.

The institution is housed in a building set in a large tract of land surrounded by four streets and is made possible through a \$20,000 gift from Mr. Fischel for the purchase.

Chief Rabbi Abraham I. Kook of Palestine is the head of the institution, while his brother, Rabbi Dov Kook, is the supervisor.

Thirteen Talmudic scholars have been chosen from various institutions in Palestine to undertake the research work. Mr. Fischel has arranged for their maintenance so that they may be enabled to devote their time to scholarship, without material worries. The income from a large building in New York has been assigned as a permanent maintenance fund for the scholars, it is understood.

The program of the institution calls for several hours daily of creative work.

Among the various subjects outlined by Rabbi A. I. Kook for his group of thirteen to work on are: Parallels in the Babylonian and Palestinian Talmuds, "Mishna" and "Toseftah"; to explain the "Shoth" of the "Rishonim" and the differences of their opinions according to the following rules: (a) Changes in the texts; (b) Differences in the accepted commentaries; (c) Differences in the rules of the Talmud; (d) Differences of opinions; to explain the "Halachoth" by reasons of the rules of the "Poskim"; to explain the "Halachoth" by the inferences derived from each "Halacha"; to fix the origin of each "Halacha" according to the "Hagra" (Rabbi Elia Landau—the Vilna Gaon); to point out at every treatise (sugya) at the Talmud, the "Halacha" derived from it; to compile an encyclopedia on the order of the "Shi'oth Mekubetzeth"; to compile a book of rules in alphabetical order for the different terms (hagdaroth) in Talmud and in the "Rishonim"; to compile a collection of all that was discovered and decided about the measures (Midroth) in which the Torah was commented; to set a plan for methodical literary work in subjects of "Agada,"

Await Indictment of Sixteen Members of Ku Klux Klan For Attack on Jewish Family

Grand Jury Will Act Against Attackers, According to Indications from County Prosecutor's Office

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 3.—Sixteen members of the Ku Klux Klan who were taken into custody by the police on charges of participating in the attack upon a Jewish family named Milder, in Long Beach, Calif., will be indicted by the Grand Jury when it meets, according to indications from reliable sources in the office of the County Prosecutor.

At first all but four of the Klansmen were released by the police. Later a summons was issued requiring the sixteen who had been taken into custody to appear before the Grand Jury Investigation Committee.

The arrested declared that they had attacked the Jewish tailor and his family because they were Communists. This the family denied. Leo Gallagher, attorney for the American Civil Liberties League, is representing the Milder family and this is causing some speculation.

The Milder family was attacked on the night of November 16th by a group of fifty garbed in Klan regalia, who broke into the house after burning a cross on the lawn outside the home. The inmates of the household and several visitors were beaten up.

Burma Jew Gets High Award for Services

The Cochin government has appointed Solomon Hallegue honorary magistrate for Cochin. Another Jew, M. N. Yashua, has received a similar honor in Ernakulam.

the police, and the shop where they were printed closed.

WARSAW, Dec. 3.—Wholesale attacks upon the Jews, which had been planned in connection with the church memorial services held here today for Jan Grotowski, the Polish student killed following a drunken brawl last Sunday, were prevented by energetic police measures, although sporadic attacks in various sections of the city occurred.

Attacks upon Jewish students, moreover, were resumed at the Wewelberg Technical High School.

Mounted and foot police under the personal direction of police commissars, acting upon direct instructions from the District Governor of Warsaw stood guard today to prevent disturbances. In some instances the fire brigade with water hoses was called out to disperse demonstrators. Special police reserves and motor lorries were stationed in side streets, while the militia composed of government students also stood guard as the services were in progress in St. Hannan's church.

Thousands of students, whose numbers were augmented by representatives of the underworld, thronged the St. Hannan's church. A crowd of three thousand, unable to gain admission, stood outside in the rain shouting abuses at the Jews and hoisting caps of Chasidism on the lampposts. Agitators utilized the opportunity to distribute proclamations urging the Polish population to make the boycott against the Jews complete by refusing to buy from Jews.

Following the service, the throng demonstrated through the streets proceeding through Jerusalemka, Neiwelt Street to Napoleon Platz, thence to Krakauerstrasse, shouting imprecations at the Jews. Enroute several stores were demolished and the windows of the pro-government organ "Kurier Codzienny" in Chwilastrasse were broken. Windows of stores on Sweitzakziskastrasse were also smashed.

The demonstrators then proceeded in the direction of the Jewish students house, but were dispersed by the police with the aid of a fire brigade which employed water hoses.

The demonstration concluded at three o'clock in the afternoon.

A generally depressive mood obtains in the city. Trade is at a standstill, the theatres are empty and the Jews are still fearful of appearing on the streets unless absolutely imperative.

WARSAW, Dec. 3.—The official Catholic press agency here issued a communique today fastening blame for the disturbances of the past week upon the Jews.

Although the Catholic clergy of Lwow issued an appeal for peace condemning the disturbances because they do not

believe the doctrine of an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth, nevertheless this does not mean that the clergy does not realize that the Jews are in the main responsible for the occurrences. They simply desired to protect the Jews from the rage of the Christian population.

The "Gazeta Warszawska" was confiscated today for carrying inciting articles against the Jews. The publishers put out a second edition, however, when the first was confiscated.

The police, say the reports, raided a secret meeting where they came upon the documents revealing that an attack had been planned.

Patriot Corporation, which seeks to have him barred from admission to this country.

The material has been forwarded with instructions for such investigation as the particular consular officer to whom Professor Einstein applies for a visa will consider necessary.

The Women's Patriot Corporation, of which Mrs. Randolph Forthingham is president, charged that Professor Einstein is "affiliated with more Communist groups than Joseph Stalin himself."

Some surprise has been occasioned by the action of the State Department which had been expected to dismiss the matter.

Its present stand is interpreted, however, as a means of setting up an alibi should there be protests from other patriotic organizations when the visa, as anticipated, is granted.

Moslem country. But there is a large and important Jewish minority numbering 60,000 in Baghdad alone. Arab immigrants would be welcomed in Iraq, where there is plenty of room for new labor. Money is badly wanted for new developments to employ this labor, but presumably, the paper suggests, the Zionists could be persuaded to supply this on their own terms and in this way a solid Jewish bloc might be built up in Palestine in an otherwise entirely Arab world.

The policy on the face of it, the "Times of India" comments in an editorial, may appear feasible, especially with the precedent of the Greeks and Turks before them, but it is difficult to conceive how the Jewish commercial community in Baghdad could be suddenly exchanged for Arab labor without causing disastrous dislocation.

Labor and money are both badly needed in Iraq for further development, it concludes, however, and the Arab kingdom may welcome this suggestion as an opportunity for procuring both, but it asks, will the Jews of Baghdad?

activities of the institution has now facilities for class rooms, a library, writing room, synagogue, meeting hall, and a dwelling for Rabbi Dov Kook. Eventually, it is expected that additions will be built, including dormitory facilities.
