Polish University Authorities Legalize Protest Meeting Of Polish Students

Resolution Declares Jewish Action Provoked Lemberg Occurrences; Call Economic Boycott of Jews

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

WARSAW, Dec. 12—A protest meeting by the students of the Warsaw University, the Polytechnic and the Agricultural College, was held by permission of the University authorities.

The speakers repeated the contentions that had contributed so much to bringing about the excesses, emphasizing that it was Jewish action that had provoked the Lemberg occurrences.

Resolutions were adopted calling for an economic boycott of the Jews and the introduction of a numerus clausus in the Universities as well as the imposition of the death sentence on the murderer of Grotkowski, the Polish student who met his death in a drunken brawl.

It may be recalled that four Jews were originally arrested on suspicion of being implicated in the student's death, but were subsequently released.

High Court Recognizes Jewish National Fund's Right to Disputed 6,000 Dunams

Previous Decision by Land Court Annulled; Government to Settle Present Arab Squatters on Government Land

JERUSALEM, Dec. 12—The High Court today recognized as legal the Jewish National Fund's claim to the six thousand dunams of Wadi Hawareh land, which had been claimed by Arabs.

The court rejected as baseless the Arab claims to the land and annulled a previous decision by the land court in favor of the Arabs.

Arab squatters are still living on the land in question, but they are now to be settled by the government on new land together with those Arabs for whom the Palestine government leased the 4,500 dunams of Jewish National Fund land at Wadi Hawareh.

It is understood that the Arabs now living on the leased area of Jewish National Fund land are to move to government land on the expiring of the lease, which was for a period of twenty-three months.

Roumanian Anti-Semitic Movement Demonstrates on Anniversary of Foundation

Huge Police Forces Prevent Excesses; Returning Students Mercilessly Beat Two Aged Talmudists in Train

BUCHAREST, Dec. 12—The Roumanian Anti-Semitic movement here celebrated the tenth anniversary of its foundation by means of a demonstration throughout the city. A great number of anti-Semitic students assembled in the center of the city, but found themselves confronted with huge police forces which prevented the gathering proceeding to the excesses which had frequently been a feature of such demonstrations.

In addition, special police guards were stationed in the Jewish business quarters.

Demonstrators in Bucharest were compelled to satisfy themselves with raising anti-Semitic cries and painting swastikas on tram-cars and other vehicles.

Later it was learned that a number of students returning from Bucharest entered a third-class compartment in which Jews were travelling to Oradea Mare, and commenced beating up Jewish travellers. In order to secure protection, the Jewish travellers made a handsome payment to five soldiers

2 American Citizens Arrested In Havana on Suspicion of Speaking Against Government

One Is Business Representative of New York Yiddish Daily; To Be Tried by Military Court

(Jewish Telegraphic Agency)

HAVANA, Dec. 12—Two American citizens, Chaim Cohen and Elieser Aronowsky, have been arrested in Havana on the charge of speaking publicly against the Cuban Government. The latter is the business representative of the New York Yiddish daily, "Der Tog".

In view of the fact that Havana is now under martial law, the arrests are regarded with considerable seriousness. Without any investigation, the police have sent both the arrested persons for trial by the Havana military court.

Jewish public opinion here is very much concerned about the affair, but they are convinced of Aronowsky's innocence and are hopeful that he will be released. The Jewish institutions are to intervene with the government.

On inquiry by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency, in New York, it was elicited from the business department of "Der Tog", that Aronowsky has been the business representative of that journal in Havana during the past three years. He is described as a man

ZIONIST COMMITTEE IN POLAND EXPRESSES SOLIDARITY WITH PROTEST OF CLUB OF JEWISH DEPUTIES AGAINST EXCESSES

Excesses Described as "Zoological Hooliganism"; Earnestness of Grave Jewish Economic Situation Is Stressed in Resolution Adopted

WARSAW, Dec. 12—The United Zionist Central Committee, in which is incorporated the Zionist Executives of Warsaw, Lemberg and Krakau, has adopted a resolution expressing a vigorous protest against all directly and indirectly implicated in the anti-Jewish occurrences. It further expresses its sympathy with the victims of what it described as "zoological hooliganism".

Particular stress is laid on the necessity of paying the utmost attention to the economic situation of Jews in Poland. This part of the resolution refers to the economic restrictions and the present Polish economic system

which is forcing the Jews of Poland out of all avenues of gainful employment and commerce.

New \$650,000 Jewish Center Opened in San Francisco

(Jewish Daily Bulletin)

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 12—History was made in the Jewish community here yesterday when officials of state and city participated in the formal laying of the cornerstone for San Francisco's new \$650,000 Jewish Community Center.

Governor James Rolph, Jr. and Mayor Angelo J. Rossi were the principal speakers. Lloyd W. Dinkelspiel, secretary of the Center committee, presided.

Yesterday's ceremonies marked four months of progress since ground was broken for the new institution.

Laying of the cornerstone yesterday marked the realization of a dream of years by local Jewish leaders.

More than 40 local organizations, representing every shade of Jewry, united first in the movement for a center which would serve as a nucleus for Jewish religious, recreational and educational activities.

Then a drive for funds was launched, with the result that \$650,000 was secured for purchase of the property and erection of the building.

Thousands of members of the Jewish community, together with men and women of all creeds, attended the ceremonies yesterday.

Jewish Education Association Reports Continued Services To Jewish Religious Schools

Dinner at Hotel Astor on December 18th Will Celebrate Eleven Years of Activity

In spite of a reduced income, coupled with an increase in the number of destitute parents, the Jewish Education Association has in the past year maintained, at nearly the level of previous years, its various services to the Jewish religious schools of this city, according to a report issued by Israel Unterberg, President of the Association. The Talmud Torahs and other Jewish religious schools that received subsidies from the Association in the fiscal year ending September 30th, 1932, numbered 58. Through these subsidies 1,775 pupils of parents who are too poor to pay tuition fees were enabled to continue their religious education. Since its formation the Association, through its Scholarship Fund, has granted 19,650 such scholarships.

The Association will celebrate the eleventh year of its activities at a Dinner in the Biltmore Hotel on December 18th. The Committee of Sponsors for the Dinner is headed by Governor-elect Lehman, Adolph S. Ochs and Judge Otto A. Rosalsky as Honorary Chairmen. Bernard S. Deutsch, Mark Eisner, Jonah J. Goldstein, Mrs. Gabriel Hamburger, Louis J. Moss and Morris Rothenberg are the honorary Vice-Chairmen and James Marshall is the Chairman. The Dinner Committee is headed by Samuel Levy, President of the Borough of Manhattan, as Honorary Chairman, and Nathan Fluegelman as Chairman.

"Having won the respect and confidence of the Jewish religious schools," Mr. Unterberg's report states, "the Association has led them to adopt higher standards of safety, sanitation, and administration, from which all their pupils, numbering scores of thousands have benefited."

A Board of License for Teachers of Hebrew Schools, established by the Association, is described by Mr. Unterberg as "a most important educational step forward." Over 80% of all such teachers in Greater New York have already received permanent or temporary licenses, the report states.

Mr. Unterberg concluded his report with an account of the work of "Ivriah," the Women's Division of the Jewish Education Association. "Ivriah," the report states, "has eighteen branch organizations throughout the city and conducts a wide range of activities."

Says There Is No Jewish Question in Costa Rican Republic

Four Hundred Jews Live in Economic Security But Suffer from Cultural Poverty

HAVANA, Dec. 12—There is no Jewish question in the Central American Republic of Costa Rica. Jews live there in comfortable economic circumstances, but they suffer from cultural poverty.

The above statement is made to the correspondent of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency here by the Jewish Immigrant, Joshua Z. Efron, who arrived here from Costa Rica, where he lived for four years. He says that there are in the whole of Costa Rica, about four hundred Jews, mainly Polish and Russian, most of them engaged in the sale of clothing. According to Mr. Efron, there is no Jewish problem in Costa Rica. Aliens are generally held in high esteem and there are no special immigration difficulties. The sufferings of the Costa Rican Jews are not of a material nature, but spiritual. There is no Jewish social life whatever. Even Jewish newspapers do not reach the Jews there and their only association with Jewish affairs is through the newspapers which their friends send them from Europe. The only thing which the Jews in Costa Rica have succeeded in establishing during their five year sojourn, is a cemetery which was completed in 1930. The first Jewish death occurred a few months ago.

Dr. Lion Feuchtwanger to Be Guest of Harmonie Club

Dr. Lion Feuchtwanger, the well-known German novelist, will be the guest of honor at the Harmonie Club, Tuesday evening, December 20th at a reception given by Dr. A. S. W. Rosenbach, book-seller, author and bibliophile of New York and Philadelphia. Dr. Feuchtwanger who will speak on "The Cultural Renaissance of the Near East" is expected to sail for Palestine shortly, where he will lecture at the Hebrew University at Jerusalem.

Felix M. Warburg, James Marshall, Walter E. Meyer, Judge Julian W. Mack, Dr. Solomon Lowenstein, Roger W. Straus, Dr. Emanuel Libman, Eugene Untermyer and Elisha M. Friedman are among those included on the Committee on Arrangements. The reception to Dr. Feuchtwanger will be preceded by a dinner in his honor at the home of Dr. Rosenbach.

Hillel Zlatopolsky, Noted Zionist Leader, Founder of Keren Hayesod, Succumbs

Was a Leading Figure in Continental
Sugar Industry; Expect Body to
Be Interred in Palestine

PARIS, Dec. 12—Hillel Zlatopolsky, the well-known Zionist leader, one of the leading figures in the continental sugar industry, has succumbed to the wound received when he was shot last week by Leon Laval, a director of his sugar factory, who afterwards committed suicide.

Zlatopolsky, who was in his sixty-second year, played an important role in Russian-Jewish life before the Revolution. From the center of his business activities in Kiev, he influenced the formation of Zionist societies throughout Russia and contributed greatly, through the Tarbuth, to Jewish cultural activities.

He will be best remembered for his work in connection with the Keren Hayesod, the plan of which was worked out by him in 1920, in association with Isaac Naiditch.

In France, his work for the promotion of the French sugar industry was recognized by the government, by whom he was decorated with the order of the Legion of Honor.

JERUSALEM, Dec. 12—The whole of the Palestine Yishuv is in mourning for the death of the noted Zionist worker, Hillel Zlatopolsky. Arrangements are in hand for holding impressive memorial services throughout the country, and numerous organizations have cabled their condolences to Paris.

The Hebrew press appears today with large obituary notices devoted to the life and activities of Zlatopolsky. It is expected that the body of the deceased will be brought to Palestine for interment.

PARIS, Dec. 12—The funeral of the late Hillel Zlatopolsky will be held tomorrow in Paris to be of a National Zionist character. The Brith Trumpeldor will provide the guard of honor and the pall-bearers will be prominent Paris Zionists.

Plans are already in hand for perpetuating the memory of the deceased. His name is to be inscribed in the Golden Book of the Jewish National Fund and a school bearing his name will be created in Palestine. These projects were decided upon by a representative committee composed of Rabbi Eisenstadt, I. Naiditch, Vladimir Jabotinsky and Dr. Heinrich Sliosberg.

A Boom in Real Estate in Palestine;
Seeking for Avenues of Investment

JERUSALEM.—Palestine is usually used to see American visitors coming in the spring. This year, however, the flood of Americans into Palestine has been continuing all summer long and is promising to grow even now with the coming of winter.

The Americans coming now to Palestine are not the usual type of tourists. Almost all of them come with a certain purpose; with a purpose to explore the possibilities of settling in this country or of investing their capital in Palestinian enterprises. It has been assumed in the United States — and this assumption is partly justified, — that Palestine is the only prosperous corner of the world to-day where no crisis is felt; so that many Americans are stimulated by this assumption to come here and investigate whether there is opportunity here for any profitable investments.

Upon their arrival in Palestine and after spending some weeks in studying the industrial and commercial possibilities of the country, most of them find that there is no wide field for large investments. The opportunities they see for safe investment, so far, are in buying orange groves and in real estate; but they are in a predicament when trying to find other fields of investment, because Palestine is still not an industrial country.

The influx of Americans who come here with the intention of investing their capital is therefore responsible for the boom in real estate and in the citrus industries. Prices in real estate in Tel-Aviv have now perhaps reached the highest point possible and experts who have had real estate experience in America are afraid that the fate of the real estate boom in Tel-Aviv will eventually be the same as in Miami or any American city where people so lost their fortunes.

Such is not the case with the citrus industries here, however. Oranges and grapefruit are still a good article of export from Palestine for England, Germany, Holland and the Scandinavian countries. Even if the recent conference in Ottawa has resulted in imposing special duties upon Palestinian oranges in Great Britain the orange industry in Palestine is still a profitable enterprise.

Since the field for investment of capital, aside from the orange and building industries, is still limited, the Executive of the Jewish Agency here is now engaged in making a special study to discover what other industries can be developed in the country. It is believed here that Palestine can be the center of a large number of small industries which can find a good market in the entire

Colonel Josiah Wedgwood Raises Question on Polish Disturbances in Parliament

Refers to Report from British Ambassador in Poland That Situation
Is Almost Normal

LONDON, Dec. 12—Colonel Josiah Wedgwood asked, in the House of Commons today, whether the British Minister in Warsaw had already supplied the British government with information regarding the anti-Jewish excesses in Poland.

In reply, the under-secretary for Foreign Affairs, Mr. Eden, stated that according to a report received from the British Ambassador in Warsaw, the situation in Lemberg and other towns where Jewish persons were attacked, was now almost normal. Further trouble was not anticipated.

First Yiddish Talkie in Soviet Russia Now Complete

MOSCOW.—The first Yiddish talkie in Soviet Russia has now been completed. It is avowedly propagandist and tells the story of a young man who fled to America from Czarist persecution. He returns to Russia after the Revolution and takes part in the so-called process of productivization which is shown as the main feature of the new order. The chief role is played by Michaels, the well-known actor of the Yiddish Government Theatre in Moscow.

Fuchs, Head of Austrian Press Department, Dies

VIENNA, Dec. 12 — Dr. Bernhard Fuchs, Ministerial Councillor of the Foreign Ministry and head of the Government Press Department, succumbed at the age of 60.

Dr. Bernhard Fuchs was born in Vienna in 1873 and entered the Press Department of the Austrian Government in 1909, becoming Ministerial Councillor in 1922. He was a Zionist, a Hebrew writer, and a graduate of a Rabbinical Seminary.

East. Some small industries, like knitted goods and shoes, are already finding their way from Palestine to Syria, Iraq and even to Persia. 'marking time.' Some of them are trying to utilize their capital by organizing banks or loan associations. However, the present situation in Palestine is such that very few need loans. It is figured out that there are, at present, over a hundred banking firms in Palestine, each of them glad to grant loans at a very small percentage; but few of them having a demand for such loans.

In the history of Palestine it is perhaps for the first time that the supply of capital is larger than the demand. Whether this is a 'healthy' state of affairs or not it is a question for financial experts to decide; however, it certainly indicates that the condition of the country is, no doubt, more than normal. It indicates that at present Palestine is free from all those financial difficulties which the world is experiencing.

The present state of prosperity in Palestine, even though it is limited chiefly to the orange and building industries, will, undoubtedly, last as long as the world crisis will not subside. The worse the situation will get in the United States, in Germany and in Poland the greater will be the number of Jews who will leave these countries and will bring their capital to Palestine. The problem to-day in Palestine is, therefore, how to find a ground for development of new industries; the money is here, the market also.

travelling in the same compartment on condition that they would protect them for one hour. The soldiers then extracted more money by a continual threat that they would leave before the stipulated time. After the hour the soldiers departed and the students immediately fell upon Rabbi Jechial Taub, the aged Rabbi of Marghita, and beat him into unconsciousness, while the conductor and two policemen who had entered the train at an intermediary station refused their protection. Finally, the conductor took pity on the battered Rabbi Taub and transferred him to a second-class compartment. But the Rabbi was soon forced back by the ticket controller into the third-class compartment where the beating was resumed.

Alter Zsabo, an aged Talmudist, was also beaten up by the students.
